

10795 Crafting with Baby Box

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LEGO® 4+ Gabby's Dollhouse Crafting with Baby Box (10795) is a pretend-play toy for kids aged 4 and up designed to develop creative skills and inspire imaginative play. This dollhouse playset for children is bursting with bright colors, familiar characters, and fun features that fans of DreamWorks Animation's Gabby's Dollhouse will know and love.

This LEGO toy for girls and boys is also an arts-and-crafts playset. The pretend-play building set includes a paintbrush, paint, scissors, and a spray can, plus a Gabby mini-doll figure and a Baby Box figure. Together, Gabby and Baby Box paint a picture and build a model of Gabby's dollhouse. There's even a ladder to help the characters reach the top of the model. The playset has an art-covered wall with cat ears poking out at the top. Packed with engaging details to inspire creative play, the set comes with a Starter Brick to help kids get building underway. Intuitive instructions are provided in the form of a colorful picture-story guide.

Dollhouse craft toy for kids – Fans of DreamWorks Animation's Gabby's Dollhouse can get creative with Crafting with Baby Box, especially designed to inspire the imaginations of girls and boys aged 4+.

Creative playset for children – Includes a Gabby mini-doll figure, a Baby Box figure, and a variety of arts-and-crafts supplies, including paint, a paintbrush, scissors, and a spray can.

Pretend-play toy – Kids help Gabby and Baby Box paint a picture and build a model of Gabby's dollhouse, with help from a ladder for the characters to reach the high bits.

60-piece painting playset – The main craft room measures over 3 in. (8 cm) high, 5 in. (13 cm) wide and 2.5 in. (6 cm) deep.

The front of the box shows Gabby painting on her easel with her spray paint and paintbrush! In the back is her arts and crafts room! It has a cabinet, a cloud table, and a ladder to reach more supplies. Most importantly, in the back of the room is her wall of art supplies cat portraits, and cat decorations!

The back of the box shows all of the things that this build comes with. It comes with Gabby, a cat figure, an easel, scissors, a paintbrush and cup, 1 can of spray paint, 2 bottles of paint, and the arts and crafts room!

The top of the box shows the cute cat figurine waving hi!

The build is 60 pieces in total and is for ages 4+.

Bag 1 includes the pieces for Gabby, a cat, and a painting set!

Welcome to text-based instructions from Bricks for the Blind. Before you start building, here are some terms we may be using:

- In Front of/Front: towards you.
- Behind/Back: away from you.
- Up: towards the ceiling.

- Down: towards the floor.
- Stud: the bump on a LEGO brick. Example: A 2x1 brick has two studs on it.
- Vertically: with the longest side going from front to back
- Horizontally: with the longest side going from left to right.
- Upright: pointing up towards the ceiling.
- Standing upright: The piece is perpendicular to the ground, like a wall.
- Lying flat: The piece is parallel to the ground, like a piece of toast which fell off the table.
- That one/ppp: previously placed piece.
- Plate: piece with studs.
- Tile: smooth piece without studs (unless otherwise specified)
- A jumper plate is a 1x2 plate with a single stud on top, or a 1x3 plate with only two studs on top.
- "Anti-stud" is a term for the portion of a LEGO piece which accepts studs, like the bottom of a plate or brick.
- Symmetrically: a mirror image. Example: If you place a 2x1 brick with technic connector on the front wall at the right, connector to the front, and then place another such piece symmetrically on the back wall, at the right, the technic connector of the second piece should point to the back, since it will be placed symmetrically.
- Centered-vertically: even amount of space in front of and behind piece
- Centered-horizontally: even amount of space left and right of piece.
- Row: studs lined up horizontally (left to right/side to side).
- Column: studs lined up upright or vertically (top to bottom/back to front).

For builders with low vision, or a sighted building partner may want to follow along with the printed visual instructions that come with each kit, or PDF versions are always online at LEGO.com for each set: (<https://www.lego.com/en-us/service/buildinginstructions/10795>) As low vision users may benefit from viewing the instructions on a personal device where they can zoom in on content and use assistive technologies to enhance the visuals.

Sorting the pieces:

To begin a successful build, it helps to sort the pieces into groups, bags, or small containers. Have a friend or family member do this in advance following the instructions below. You will see that the pieces should be sorted according to the building steps in the kit. Doing this in advance makes locating the pieces for each step easier. See below on how to sort the pieces to correspond to the steps in this set. Number the containers using letters A-Z, numbers, or meaningful names. The parts will be sorted into one or a small number of steps in the instructions. Example: Steps 1-3 means collect all the parts used in steps 1,2 and 3 and put them in one container.

This LEGO set comes with 2 bags labeled 1 and 2, 2 sets of instructions, and some loose pieces. Sort the pieces into groups or piles as described below. Note that where there are multiple colors of the same brick in a step, the colors will be split into 2 groups to make telling the difference easier for the builder! LEGO includes a few spare parts in case you lose something. Set these into their own group away from the rest, in case you need them later.

The steps in this set correspond to the page numbers

Bag 1 - Gabby, Cat, and Painting Set

Group 1 - Steps 6 - 11.

Group 2 - Steps 12 - 25.

Group 3 - Steps 26 - 33 and 1 white 1x6 plate and 1 light pink 2x2 angled sloped curved tile from step 34.

Group 4 - 1 light green 2x2 angled sloped curved tile from step 34.

Group 5 - 1 light orange 2x2 angled sloped curved tile from step 34 and steps 38 - 55.

Group 6 - Steps 56 - 63.

Group 7 - Steps 64 - 69.

Group 8 - Steps 70-71.

Let's get to building!

Building Instructions (Bag 1, Book 1):

Group 1 - Gabby, Cat, and Easel

6. Locate 1 blue pair of legs with white and pink shoes, 1 torso with a pink sweater over a black and white striped shirt, 1 nougat head with a smiling female print, 1 dark brown hair, and 1 white and pink cat headband.

7. Assemble your minifigure, then attach your headband to the hair using the little bar. You built Gabby!

8. Locate 1 light green 1x1 round brick, 1 light grey 1x1 nozzle, and 1 light tan cat figure shaped like a milk box with pink hair and a blue body. Attach the nozzle to the round brick using the wide end.

9. Put the narrow end of the nozzle in Gabby's hand. This is a can of spray paint! Then put her cat beside her! Put these aside for now while we build the rest.

10. Locate 1 light orange 3x3 quarter circle plate, 1 tan 1x2 tile with a top handle, and 1 white 2x3 tile with 2 clips. This 2x3 tile has a print of Gabby and her cat with a pink, green, and purple rainbow with cat ears over them!

11. Place the quarter circle tile in front of you so the curve is in the front left corner. Then horizontally place the 1x2 tile with a top handle in the back right corner of the plate so the handle is in the back. The handle is a horizontal bar that's on top of the tile. Now attach the clips of the 2x3 tile to the bar so it is upright and the tile side faces the front.

Group 2 - Arts and Crafts Room

12-13. Locate 1 light orange 8x8 plate and place it in front of you. This plate has 4 gaps, 1 on each side.

14-15. Locate 1 white 1x4 tile with 2 studs. Horizontally place it in the back gap of the 8x8 plate.

16-17. Locate 2 orange 2x4 plates. Vertically place them in the left and right gaps so they overhang to the left and right by one column.

18-19. Locate 2 light orange 4x8 half-circle plates. Vertically place them underneath the overhang of the previously placed 2x4 plates so that together with the 8x8 plate, they make a big oval.

20-21. Locate 1 tall teal 2x8 window frame. Horizontally place it on the back 2 rows so it is centered to the left and right. Make sure the window side is facing the back.

22-23. Locate 1 white 1x6 brick. Horizontally place it in between the walls of this window frame. The brick will be mounted in front of the frame itself.

24-25. Locate 1 tall white 1x6 wall that has a bunch of pictures of cats. One cat is looking through some spray paint cans! Some pink, purple, and yellow cats are connected to a string that is hung across the wall. There is a portrait of a yellow cat in a pink outline. There are even more in the bottom right shaped as boxes! Horizontally place it on top of the previously placed 1x6 brick. Ask a sighted person to make sure the print side is facing the front.

Group 3 - Arts and Crafts Room

26-27. Locate 2 light yellow 2x4 plates. Horizontally place them next to each other so they sit on the studs of the window frame and 1x6 wall. Make sure there is no overhang.

28-29. Locate 1 white 1x6 brick and 2 purple 1x2 sloped curved bricks. Horizontally place the 1x6 brick in the middle of the back row on top of the previously placed 2x4 plates. Then vertically place the 1x2 sloped curved bricks to the left and right of this brick so they curve outwards.

30-31. Locate 2 tan 1x2 bricks with side studs and 1 white 1x2 brick. Horizontally place the 1x2 bricks with side studs in front of the white 1x6 brick on the left and right. Then horizontally place the white 1x2 brick in between these 2 bricks.

32-33. Locate 2 light purple 1x2 sloped curved bricks and 1 light purple 2x4 tile. Horizontally place the 2x4 tile on top of the previously placed bricks so it is centered. Now vertically place the 1x2 sloped curved bricks next to the previously placed tile so they slope inwards.

34-35.1. Put aside your build while we build a banner. Locate 1 white 1x6 plate and 1 light pink 2x2 angled sloped curved tile. Horizontally place the 1x6 plate in front of you. Then place the tile on the leftmost 2 studs so it slopes to the front.

Group 4 - Arts and Crafts Room

34-35.2. Locate 1 light green 2x2 angled sloped curved tile. Place it to the right of the previous piece so it slopes to the front.

Group 5 - Arts and Crafts Room

34-35.3. Locate 1 light orange 2x2 angled sloped curved tile. Place it to the right of the previously placed tile so it slopes to the front.

36-37. Bring back your main build so it is oriented the same way. Place your sub-build upright on the 4 front-facing side studs that are above the 1x6 wall so the angled tiles point down.

38-39. Locate 1 pink 1x3 plate. Vertically place it to the right of the vertically placed orange 2x4 plate that connects the 8x8 plate and 4x8 half-circle plate. This plate should sit to the right of the back 3 rows of the 2x4 plate at the right.

40-41. Locate 1 pink 2x3 plate. Vertically place it on top of the previously placed 1x3 plate so the right column of this plate sits on top of it.

42-43. Locate 1 light pink 2x2 brick. Place it on the back 2 rows of the previous piece.

44-45. Locate 1 blue 1x2 plate and 1 light grey 1x2 plate with 2 clips. Vertically place the blue 1x2 plate on the left column of the previously placed 2x2 brick. Then vertically place the plate with clips to the right so the clips face the right.

46-47. Locate 1 blue 2x2 tile with a stud. Place it on top of the previously placed plates so there is no overhang.

48-49. Locate 1 light purple ladder with 4 rungs. Horizontally attach the leftmost rung to the 2 clips of the 1x2 plate. Make sure to push down on the right side of the ladder so it touches the plate.

50-51. Put your build aside for now while we build a cat statue! Locate 1 white 2x2 round plate, 1 mint 2x2 round brick with little pink and purple cats on it, and 1 light pink 2x2 round smooth brick with cat ears. Place the 2x2 round plate on the table. Then place your 2x2 round brick on top of the plate. Then place your brick with cat ears on top so the ears are on the left and right.

52-53. Bring back your main build so it is oriented the same way. The ladder should be facing the right. Now take your cat statue and place it on top of the blue 2x2 tile with a stud so the cat ears are on the left and right.

54-55. Locate 1 blue 2x2 tile with a stud. Place it to the left of the orange 2x4 plate that is on the left and connects the 8x8 and 4x8 plates together. Make sure this tile is to the left of the back 2 rows of the 2x4 plate.

Group 6 - Arts and Crafts Room

56-57. Locate 1 blue 2x3 cabinet, 1 pink 2x3 drawer, 1 brown paintbrush with a green tip, and 1 silver pair of scissors. Put the scissors and paintbrush into the pink drawer. Then insert the drawer into the bottom row of the cabinet.

58-59. Horizontally place the drawer on top of the blue 2x2 tile with a stud and the left column of the 2x4 plate so the drawer opens to the front.

60-61. Locate 1 light green 2x2 round brick. Place it to the right of the cabinet so the back row of this brick is aligned with the front row of the cabinet.

62-63. Locate 1 light purple 2x2 round tile with a stud and 1 pink mug. Place the 2x2 round tile on top of the previously placed round brick. Then place the mug on the front stud of the 3rd column from the left. Make sure the handle is overhanging to the left.

Group 7 - Arts and Crafts Room

Now we'll make a cloud-shaped table!

64-65. Locate 1 light yellow 2x2 brick, 1 white 2x2 round plate and 1 white cloud tile with 3 studs. Place the 2x2 round brick in front of you, then place the 2x2 round plate on top of it. Then horizontally place your cloud tile on top of it so it is centered.

66-67. Now horizontally place your cloud table in the middle of the 2nd and 3rd rows from the front. It should sit in the middle behind the front 1x4 gap.

68-69. Locate 1 transparent light purple 1x1 round brick and 1 white 1x1 round tile with a little bar facing up. Place the tile on top of the round brick. This is a bottle of purple paint! Now place it on the right stud of the pink 2x3 plate in front of the cat statue.

Group 8 - Arts and Crafts Room

70-71. Locate 1 transparent light blue 1x1 round brick and 1 white 1x1 round tile with a little bar facing up. Place the tile on top of the round brick. This is a bottle of blue paint! To the right of the front 1x4 middle gap, there is a raised 1x2 set of studs. Place this paint bottle on the right stud.
