71801 Kai's Rising Dragon Strike

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This playset comes with 2 minifigures: Rising Dragon Kai, who comes with a katana sword accessory and can ride the buildable dragon action figure, and a Wolf Mask Guard with a crossbow accessory. Kids can stage battles between these LEGO NINJAGO characters to win a blue dragon power element from the dragon action figure toy's posable mouth.

Action-packed dragon toy for kids – Boys and girls aged 6 and up can play out battles from season 2 of the NINJAGO® Dragons Rising TV show with Kai's Rising Dragon Strike buildable dragon

Fantasy action toy – Kids can place Rising Dragon Kai on the back of the dragon action-figure toy, slam down its golden tail, and launch them both forward

2 LEGO® NINJAGO® characters – This ninja playset features a Kai minifigure armed with a katana sword accessory and an evil Wolf Mask Guard with a crossbow accessory

Dragon power element – LEGO® toy includes a blue dragon power element that the dragon can hold in its mouth

Measurements – This 24-piece LEGO® building set includes a buildable dragon measuring over 1 in. (2 cm) high, 7 in. (18 cm) long and 7 in. (18 cm) wide

The front of the box shows Kai flying his dragon to the front! He has a red mask and sword on his back and soaring through the skies on his dragon!

The back of the box shows Kai with his sword in hand standing on top of his dragon fighting an evil wolf mask guard that is shooting bolts from a crossbow at him! There is a full-sized image of Kai. There are 2 smaller pictures that show that the dragon has a launcher you can hit to make the dragon go flying! There are also 2 ads for 71802 Dragon Strike and 71803 Arin's Rising Dragon Strike.

The build is 24 pieces in total and is for ages 6+.

Bag 1 includes the pieces for Kai, an evil Wolf Mask Guard, and Kai's dragon.

Welcome to text-based instructions from Bricks for the Blind. Before you start building, here are some terms we'll be using:

- In Front of/Front: towards you.
- Behind/Back: away from you.
- Up: towards the ceiling.
- Down: towards the floor.
- Stud: the bump on a LEGO brick. Example: A 2x1 brick has two studs on it.
- Vertically: with the longest side going from front to back
- Horizontally: with the longest side going from left to right.
- Upright: pointing up towards the ceiling.
- Standing upright: The piece is perpendicular to the ground, like a wall.
- Lying flat: The piece is parallel to the ground, like a piece of toast which fell off the table.

- That one/ppp: previously placed piece.
- Plate: piece with studs.
- Tile: smooth piece without studs (unless otherwise specified)
- A jumper plate is a 1x2 plate with a single stud on top, or a 1x3 plate with only two studs on top.
- "Anti-stud" is a term for the portion of a LEGO piece which accepts studs, like the bottom of a plate or brick.
- Symmetrically: a mirror image. Example: If you place a 2x1 brick with technic connector on the front wall at the right, connector to the front, and then place another such piece symmetrically on the back wall, at the right, the technic connector of the second piece should point to the back, since it will be placed symmetrically.
- Centered-vertically: even amount of space in front of and behind piece
- Centered-horizontally: even amount of space left and right of piece.
- Row: studs lined up horizontally (left to right/side to side).
- Column: studs lined up upright or vertically (top to bottom/back to front).

For builders with low vision, or a sighted building partner may want to follow along with the printed visual instructions that come with each kit, or PDF versions are always online at LEGO.com for each set: (https://www.lego.com/en-us/service/buildinginstructions/71801) As low vision users may benefit from viewing the instructions on a personal device where they can zoom in on content and use assistive technologies to enhance the visuals.

Sorting the pieces:

To begin a successful build, it helps to sort the pieces into groups, bags, or small containers. Have a friend or family member do this in advance following the instructions below. You will see that the pieces should be sorted according to the building steps in the kit. Doing this in advance makes locating the pieces for each step easier. See below on how to sort the pieces to correspond to the steps in this set. Number the containers using letters A-Z, numbers, or meaningful names. The parts will be sorted into one or a small number of steps in the instructions. Example: Steps 1-3 means collect all the parts used in steps 1,2 and 3, and put them in one container.

This LEGO set comes with 1 bag labeled 1, 1 set of instructions, and some loose pieces. Sort the pieces into groups or piles as described below. Note that where there are multiple colors of the same brick in a step, the colors will be split into 2 groups to make telling the difference easier for the builder! LEGO includes a few spare parts in case you lose something. Set these into their own group away from the rest, in case you need them later.

Bag 1 - Kai, Evil Wolf Mask Guard, and Dragon

Group 1 - Upper Minifigure (red minifigure).

Group 2 - Lower Minifigure (dark blue minifigure).

Group 3 - Steps 1-8.

Let's get to building!

Building Instructions (Bag 1, Book 1):

Group 1 - Rising Dragon Kai

Sub-build 1. Locate 1 dark red pair of legs printed with a gold belt and red scale armor, 1 red torso printed with red and gold scale armor, 1 gold shoulder armor, 1 yellow head printed with a black and red eyemask, 1 red and gold helmet, and 1 gold katana. Assemble your minifigure and make sure the back of the shoulder armor is on the back of the minifigure. The smaller hole attaches to the neck and the larger hole holds the sword! Make sure the hole of the mask faces the front so the minifigure can see! Now put the katana in your minifigure's hand!

Group 2 - Evil Wolf Mask Guard

Sub-build 2. Locate 1 dark blue pair of legs printed with purple and dark grey drapes, 1 dark blue torso printed with purple and dark grey drapes, with light blue blades, 1 dark blue head printed with a wolf mask, 1 dark blue hood, and 1 dark grey crossbow. Assemble your minifigure then attach the small handle that is underneath the crossbow in his hand!

Group 3 - Dragon

- 1. Horizontally place 1 gold 2x12 dragon base with a rounded side with a hole in front of you so the rounded side faces the left. Then horizontally place 2 black 1x2 plates with 2 clips on the 2x2 rightmost studs so the clips face the front and back.
- 2. Place a red 2x2 plate on top of the dragon base so it is centered on the 2x4 studs.
- 3. Place 2 red 2x2 sloped curved tiles on top of the 2x2 plate so they slope to the left and right.
- 4. Place 1 top part of a red dragon head with 2 eye holes on the leftmost side of the build so the tip of the head faces the left and the right side attaches to the dragon base.
- 5. Open up the dragon head then place 1 transparent light blue ball inside.
- 6. Locate 2 red and gold wings with 2 bars and a short bar. Vertically attach the bar of the wing to the front-facing clips so the bars are to the left and the angled tips of the wings face the right. Repeat symmetrically to the back.
- 7. Locate 2 gold claws with a clip. There is a small bar at the left-facing end of the outer wing curve that is closest to the connection of the body. Attach 1 claw to the small bar so the claw slopes down to the left. Repeat symmetrically to the back.
- 8. Locate 1 long gold dragon tail with a bar on each side. Horizontally attach the bar of the wider side to the rightmost side of the dragon base so the bar attaches underneath the clip. Make sure it slopes down to the right.

You can hit down on the tail part to shoot out the ball of the dragon's mouth! Now put your Rising Dragon Kai minifigure on top of the dragon by putting his legs in the gap underneath where you attached the dragon's tail.
