The second level is Dumbledore's actual office, with his desk, the baby phoenix Fawkes, and the Sorting Hat. The third level is a small room containing Dumbledore's Pensieve. The top level is a very small area hidden behind one of the pinnacles, containing the Sword of Gryffindor. Harry and Dumbledore are on the second level. On the first level, Madam Pince gives Hermione instructions, Snape and Argus Filch walk together while Mrs. Norris looks on. The back of the box also has five small inset pictures. The first shows how the build is modular, with all of the main elements being easily detachable so the builder can rearrange things as desired. The second shows Dumbledore talking to Harry in front of the pensieve. The third shows how one of the bookshelves can be moved to activate hidden steps on the outside of the tower. The fourth shows Harry looking alarmed as he reads a black book from the bookshelf! The last inset shows Harry smiling at the baby phoenix.

The build is 654 pieces, and 202 building steps.

Welcome to text-based instructions from Bricks for the Blind. Before you start building, here are some terms we'll be using:

- In Front of/Front: towards you.
- Behind/Back: away from you.
- Up: towards the ceiling.
- Down: towards the floor.
- Stud: the bump on a LEGO brick. Example: A 2x1 brick has two studs on it.
- Vertically: with the longest side going from front to back
- Horizontally: with the longest side going from left to right.
- Upright: pointing up towards the ceiling.
- Standing upright: The piece is perpendicular to the ground, like a wall.
- Lying flat: The piece is parallel to the ground, like a piece of toast which fell off the table.
- That one/ppp: previously placed piece.
- Plate: piece with studs.
- Tile: smooth piece without studs (unless otherwise specified)
- A jumper plate is a 1x2 plate with a single stud on top, or a 1x3 plate with only two studs on top.
- "Anti-stud" is a term for the portion of a LEGO piece which accepts studs, like the bottom of a plate or brick
- Symmetrically: a mirror image. Example: If you place a 2x1 brick with technic connector on the front wall at the right, connector to the front, and then place another such piece symmetrically on the back wall, at the right, the technic connector of the second piece should point to the back, since it will be placed symmetrically.
- Centered-vertically: even amount of space in front of and behind piece
- Centered-horizontally: even amount of space left and right of the piece.
- Row: studs lined up horizontally (left to right/side to side).
- Column: studs lined up upright or vertically (top to bottom/back to front).

For builders with low vision, or a sighted building partner who may want to follow along with the printed visual instructions that come with each kit, PDF versions are always online at LEGO.com: (https://www.lego.com/en-us/service/buildinginstructions/76402) As low vision users may benefit from viewing the instructions on a personal device where they can zoom in on content and use assistive technologies to enhance the visuals.

Sorting the pieces:

To begin a successful build, it helps to sort the pieces into groups, bags or small containers. Have a friend or family member do this in advance following the instructions below. You will see that the pieces should be sorted according to the building steps in the kit. Doing this in advance makes locating the pieces for each step easier. See below on how to sort the pieces to correspond to the steps in this set. Number the containers using letters A-Z, numbers or meaningful names. The parts will be sorted into one or a small number of steps in the instructions. Example: Steps 1-3 means collect all the parts used in steps 1, 2 and 3, and put them in one container.

This LEGO set comes with five bags labeled 1-5, some large loose pieces, and an instruction booklet. Sort the pieces into groups as described below. Note that where there are multiple colors of the same brick in a step, the colors will be split across two groups to make telling the difference easier for the builder! LEGO includes a few spare parts in case you lose something. Set these into their own group away from the rest, in case you need them later.

Bag 1 (5 groups of bricks)

Minifigure group 1 contains the pieces to build the Aldus Dumbledore minifigure.

Minifigure group 2 contains the pieces to build the Harry Potter minifigure and a lantern.

Sub-Build 1: Tower Second Floor

Group 1 contains the pieces for steps 1-9. Include one tan 1x8 plate from step 10 in this group.

Group 2 contains the pieces for steps 10-14. Place sticker #2 for step 13.

Group 3 contains the pieces for steps 15-22. To help the builder differentiate colors, stack the tan 1x8 plate on top of the light gray 1x8 plate.

Bag 2 (8 groups of bricks)

Minifigure group 3 contains the pieces to build the Argus Filch minifigure, a lantern, and the cat Mrs. Norris.

Group 4 contains the pieces for steps 23-27.

Group 5 contains the pieces for steps 28-34. There are a few extra sorting steps for this group:

- To help the builder differentiate colors, stack the 1x2 plates in this order from top to bottom: yellow, gray, blue, blue, dark red, blue, purple, yellow, purple.
- Stack the two dark red 1x1 bricks with a recessed stud on one side.
- Include two purple 1x1 half cylinder tiles from step 35.

Group 6 contains the pieces for steps 35-36.

Group 7 contains the pieces for steps 37-43. There are a few extra sorting steps for this group:

- To help the builder differentiate colors, stack the 1x2 plates in this order from top to bottom: dark red, gray, blue, blue, dark red, blue, purple, gray-green, purple.
- Stack the two dark red 1x1 bricks with a recessed stud on one side.
- Include two dark purple 1x1 half cylinder tiles from step 44.

Group 8 contains the pieces for steps 44-46.

Group 9 contains the pieces for steps 47-51. Place sticker #5 for step 47.

Group 10 contains the pieces for step 52.

Bag 3 (8 groups of bricks)

Minifigure group 4 contains the pieces to build the Professor Snape minifigure.

Sub-Build 2: Third Level

Group 11 contains the pieces for steps 53-61. Place sticker #2 for step 61.

Group 12 contains the pieces for steps 62-68.

Group 13 contains the pieces for steps 69-76.

Group 14 contains the pieces for steps 77-78.

Sub-Build 3: Top Level

Group 15 contains the pieces for steps 79-88.

Group 16 contains the pieces for steps 89-97. Place sticker #1 for step 93. Group 17 contains the pieces for steps 98-106.

Bag 4 (11 groups of bricks)

Minifigure group 5 contains the pieces to build the Madam Pince minifigure.

Sub-Build 4: Bottom Level

Group 18 contains the pieces for steps 107-116. To help the builder differentiate colors, stack the three light brown 1x1 bricks from this group. Leave the tan 1x1 brick unstacked.

Group 19 contains the pieces for steps 117-122.

Group 20 contains the pieces for step 123.

Group 21 contains the pieces for steps 124-127.

Group 22 contains the pieces for steps 128-136. To help the builder differentiate colors, stack the 1x2 plates in this order from top to bottom: light blue, dark purple, dark red. Also stack the two black 1x2 tall bricks with two studs on one side.

Group 23 contains the pieces for steps 137-141. To help the builder differentiate colors, stack the 1x2 plates in this order from top to bottom: blue, yellow, light blue, purple, dark red. Also include a blue 1x2 tile from step 142.

Group 24 contains the pieces for steps 142-145.

Group 25 contains the pieces for steps 146-151. Place sticker #3 for step 150.

Group 26 contains the pieces for steps 152-158. Place sticker #4 for step 156.

Group 27 contains the pieces for steps 159-166.

Bag 5 (5 groups of bricks)

Minifigure group 6 contains the pieces to build the Hermione Granger minifigure.

Group 28 contains the pieces for steps 167-177.

Group 29 contains the pieces for steps 178-187. Place sticker #6 for step 187.

Group 30 contains the pieces for steps 188-194.

Group 31 contains the pieces for steps 195-200.

Group 32 contains the pieces for steps 201-202

Building Instructions:

Open bag 1.

Open minifigure group 1: Aldus Dumbledore.

Assemble the Dumbledore minifigure by putting the torso on the legs, the beard on the torso, the head over the beard, and the hat on the head. Dumbledore's accessory is a light brown wand.

Open minifigure group 2: Harry Potter

Assemble the Harry Potter minifigure by putting the torso on the legs, the invisibility cloak on the torso, the head on the torso, and the hair on the head. The invisibility cloak has three holes, they all go over the stud on the torso, it doesn't matter which goes on first. The shiny side of the cloak should face out, so you can't see the decorated side from the outside. The cloak should wrap around Harry and be open at the front. Harry's accessory is a dark brown wand. He can also hold a golden lantern in his left hand. Push a transparent yellow 1x1 round brick into the bottom of the lantern.

Sub-Build 1: Tower Second Floor

Open group 1.

- 1. We'll start the tower in the middle by building the second level! Place a dark tan 8x16 plate, horizontally, in front of you. This will be the floor of the room.
- 2.1. Place a tan 1x1x3 tall brick on the back right corner of the previous piece.
- 2.2. Place a tan 1x4 brick, horizontally, to the left of the previous piece.
- 3.1. Place a tan 1x1x3 tall brick on the back left corner of the floor.
- 3.2. Place a tan 1x2 brick, horizontally, to the right of the previous piece.
- 3.3. Find a light brown 1x2 masonry brick. A masonry brick has a brick wall pattern on one side, and horizontal grooves on the other side. Place this, horizontally with the brick pattern at the back, to the right of the previous piece.
- 4.1. Place a dark tan 1x4 plate, horizontally, in front of you.
- 4.2. Place the back row of a tan 2x2 brick, centered horizontally, on the previous piece.
- 4.3. Place the front row of the previous piece centered horizontally on the back row of the floor so the 1x4 plate extends 1 row behind the back row of the floor.
- 5. Place the back stud of a tan 2x2 angled corner brick, with the angled corner at the back left, to the left of the back row of the 2x2 brick. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 6.1. Place a light gray 1x1 brick with a hole, with the hole on the left and right, in front of both of the 1x1x3 tall bricks on the back corners of the floor.
- 6.2. Place a light brown 1x1 plate on both of the previous pieces.
- 7. Place a tan 1x1x3 tall brick on the third stud from the left on the back row of the floor. There should be one free stud between this piece and the tall brick on the left corner. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 8.1. Place a brown 1x3 brick, horizontally, to the right of the 1x1 brick with a hole on the left side of the build. This is on the second row from the back of the floor. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 8.2. Place a brown 1x3 tile, horizontally, on both previous pieces.
- 9.1. Place a tan 1x1x2 tall brick with two studs on one side, with the side studs on the right, to the left of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 9.2. Now, find the two 2x2 angled corner bricks on the back two rows. Place the front left stud of a tan 3x3 rounded corner plate, with the rounded corner at the back left, on the left stud of the left 2x2 angled corner brick. There should be two free studs to the left of this piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

You should have one 1x8 plate left over when you finish this group. It is a tan and we'll use it in the next step.

Open group 2.

10.1. Place a light gray 1x8 plate horizontally in front of you.

- 10.2. Place four dark gray 1x2 plates with two studs sticking up from one side, horizontally with the side studs at the front, in a row on the previous piece.
- 10.3. Place a light gray 1x8 plate, horizontally, on the pieces from the previous step.
- 10.4. Place the tan 1x8 plate leftover from group one, horizontally, on the previous piece.
- 10.5. Place this assembly, horizontally with the side studs at the front, in front of the two 3x3 rounded corner plates from step 9.2. This assembly will go between the two 1x3 bricks with tiles on top of them.
- 11.1. Place the front row of a brown 2x2 tile with two studs, with the studs at the front, centered horizontally on the assembly from the previous step. There should be two free rows behind this piece. This will be the seat of Dumbledore's chair!
- 11.2. Place a brown 1x2 plate, horizontally, behind the previous piece.
- 11.3. Place a gold 1x2 grille tile, horizontally, on the previous piece.
- 12.1. Place a tan 1x1x5 tall brick behind the rightmost stud of the assembly from step 10. There should be one free stud between this piece and a 1x1x3 tall brick.
- 12.2. Find the two tall bricks on the back right corner of the floor. Place a light brown 1x2 masonry brick, vertically with the brick pattern at the right, on these two pieces.
- 13.1. Find the right 3x3 rounded corner plate from step 9.2. Place a tan 1x1 round plate on the rightmost stud on the back row of this piece, and another on the rightmost stud on the second row from the back.
- 13.2. Place a tan 2x2x5 quarter cylinder, with the rounded side at the back right, on the previous two pieces. This piece has a sticker on the back, showing old sandstone bricks.
- 13.3. Find a tan 2x2 rounded corner brick. This brick is cut out so it looks like a macaroni noodle, I'll call it a "2x2 macaroni brick" from now on. Place this piece, with the flat sides at the front and the left, on the previous piece. The curves on the back side should match up.
- 14.1. Assemble a window by attaching a gold 1x2x2 lattice into a brown 1x2x2 window frame. Find the lip in the window frame and rotate the window so that it is at the front, then push a lattice in from the front until it clicks. Repeat two times.
- 14.2. Place one window, horizontally with the lattice at the back, to the left of the back row of the 2x2x5 quarter cylinder.
- 14.3. Place a brown 1x2 plate with a 2x2 of studs hanging down from one side, horizontally with the side studs at the front, on the previous piece.
- 14.4. Place a brown 2x3 pentagonal tile, with the pointy side up, on the four side studs of the previous piece. This will be the back of Dumbledore's chair!
- 14.5. Stack the other two windows, horizontally with the lattice at the back, on the 1x2 plate with a 2x2 of studs hanging down from step 14.3.

Open group 3. There are two 1x8 plates stacked together in this group. The top one is a tan one from step 19.1 and the bottom one is a light gray one from step 22.1.

15.1. Find the left 3x3 rounded corner plate from step 9.2. Place a tan 1x1 round plate on the leftmost stud on the back row of this piece, and another on the leftmost stud on the second row from the back. This should be symmetrical to step 13.1.

- 15.2. Place a tan 2x2x5 quarter cylinder, with the rounded side at the back left, on the previous two pieces.
- 15.3. Place a tan 2x2 macaroni brick, with the flat sides at the front and the right, on the previous piece. The curves on the back side should match up.
- 16.1. Place a tan 1x1x5 tall brick to the left of the front row of the left 3x3 rounded corner plate from step 9.2. There should be one free stud between this piece and a 1x1x3 tall brick.
- 16.2. Find the two tall bricks on the back left corner of the floor. Place a tan 1x2 brick, vertically, on these two pieces.
- 17.1. Place the left stud of a tan 1x3 arch brick, horizontally, on the previous piece. The right stud of this piece should attach to a 1x1x3 tall brick. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 17.2. Place a tan 1x3 brick, horizontally, on both pieces from the previous step.
- 18.1. Place the leftmost stud of a tan 1x3 arch brick, horizontally, on the right stud of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 18.2. Place a tan 1x1 plate on the rightmost stud of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 19.1. Place a tan 1x8 plate, horizontally, so it attaches to both pieces from the previous step. This is the 1x8 plate that is loose in the group.
- 19.2. Place a tan 1x1 plate on the left and rightmost studs on the previous piece.
- 19.3. Place the front row of a tan 3x3 rounded corner plate, with the rounded corner at the back left, to the right of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically to the right.
- 20.1. Now we'll build a couple of potion bottles! To build the first one, stack two transparent clear 1x1 round bricks.
- 20.2. Place the stopper by pushing the bar of a transparent clear 1x1 round tile with a bar on top down into the hollow stud on top of the top piece from the previous step.
- 20.3. Now we'll place it. Find the seat of Dumbledore's chair. This is the 2x2 tile with two studs which is centered horizontally in front of the windows. Place the bottle two studs to the right of the back row of the seat. There should be one free stud in front of this piece.
- 20.4. Now to build the second bottle. Place a transparent clear 1x1 round brick in front of you.
- 20.5. Place a transparent gray 1x1 cone on the previous piece.
- 20.6. To make the stopper, push the bar of a transparent clear gem down into the hollow stud of the previous piece.
- 20.7. Place this bottle symmetrically to the first bottle on the left side of Dumbledore's chair.
- 21.1. Next, we'll make the curved steps that lead up to Dumbledore's chair and desk. Place a light gray 1x1 tile on the fourth stud from the left on the back free row on the floor. This is in front of a 1x3 brick with a 1x3 tile on top of it. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

- 21.2. Find a light gray 4x4 rounded corner tile. This tile is cut out so it looks like a macaroni noodle, I'll call it a "4x4 macaroni tile" from now on. Rotate this piece so it has one flat edge at the right and the other at the back. Place the left side of this piece in front of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side. There should be two free studs between the front part of these pieces, and one free row in front of them.
- 21.3. Place a light gray 1x2 tile, horizontally, between the front part of the previous two pieces. That's the bottom step!
- 22.1. Now we'll build the top step. Set the rest of the second floor aside for now. Place a light gray 1x8 plate horizontally in front of you.
- 22.2. Place a light gray 1x2 plate, horizontally, on the leftmost and rightmost pairs of studs on the previous piece.
- 22.3. Place two dark gray 1x2 plates with a 2x2 of studs sticking up from one side, horizontally with the side studs at the front, in a row between the pieces from the previous step.
- 22.4. Place a light gray 1x4x3 curved slope brick, horizontally with the stud on the right, on the left four studs of the step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 22.5. Place the second floor in front of you, so it is horizontal with the windows at the back. Find the row of eight side studs in front of Dumbledore's chair. Now, rotate the second step so the two studs from the curved slope bricks are at the front and the 2x4 of side studs is on top. Attach the step to the side studs in front of the chair.

Open bag 2.

Open minifigure group 3: Argus Filch

Assemble the Argus Filch minifigure by putting the torso on the legs, the head on the torso, and the hair on the head. Argus Filch holds a golden lantern in his right hand. Push a transparent yellow 1x1 round brick into the bottom of the lantern. Place the cat, Mrs. Norris, next to Argus Filch.

Open group 4.

- 23.1. Find the stud in front of the leftmost stud on the back wall. This stud will be two bricks lower than the stud behind it. Place a light brown 1x1 brick on this stud. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 23.2. Place a light gray 1x1 brick with a hole, with the hole on the left and right, on both pieces from the previous step.
- 24. Place a tan 1x6x7 arched door frame with round columns, vertically with the rounded side of the column at the right, on the leftmost column of the floor in front of the wall. Its front end should be even with the front of the floor. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 25.1. Place the front stud of a tan 1x3 brick, vertically, on the back studs of both pieces from the previous step.
- 25.2. Place a light brown 1x1 brick to the right of the back stud of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 26. Find two tan 1x1 scroll bricks. Scroll bricks are a 1x1 brick with a bar sticking out even with the top on one side, which has a stud on top and a circular decoration on the sides. Place one scroll brick, with the scroll at the right, on the front stud of the left 1x6x7 arched door frame from step 24. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

- 27.1. Place the front stud of a tan 1x3 brick, vertically, on both pieces from the previous step.
- 27.2. Place a tan 1x4 brick, vertically, behind both pieces from the previous step.
- 27.3. Place the leftmost stud of a tan 1x4 brick, horizontally, behind the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- Open group 5. There is a stack of 1x2 plates. These are all different colors and are stacked, from top to bottom in the order you will use them. This is, from top to bottom: yellow, gray, blue, blue, dark red, blue, purple, yellow, purple. There are also four 1x1 bricks with a recessed stud on one side, two of which are stacked together. The ones stacked together are dark red, and the loose ones are gray.
- 28. Now we'll start building a bookshelf! Set the second floor aside for now. Place a brown 1x8 plate horizontally in front of you.
- 29.1. Take the top 1x2 plate off the stack and place it, horizontally, on the left two studs on the previous piece. This 1x2 is yellow.
- 29.2. Take the next 1x2 plate off the stack and place it horizontally on the center two studs on the 1x8 plate. This 1x2 is gray. There should be one free stud between this 1x2 and the first.
- 29.3. Take the next 1x2 plate off the stack and place it horizontally on the right two studs on the 1x8 plate. This 1x2 is blue.
- 30.1. Take the next 1x2 plate off the stack and place it horizontally on the leftmost 1x2 plate. This 1x2 is blue.
- 30.2. Take the next 1x2 plate off the stack and place it horizontally on the rightmost 1x2 plate. This 1x2 is dark red.
- 31.1. Take the next 1x2 plate off the stack and place it horizontally on the leftmost stack of 1x2 plates. This 1x2 is blue.
- 31.2. Find the two loose 1x1 bricks with recessed studs on one side. These are gray. Place these, with the side studs at the front, in a row on the center 1x2 plate.
- 31.3. Unstack the other two 1x1 bricks with recessed studs on one side. These are dark red. Place these, with the side studs at the front, in a row on the rightmost stack of 1x2 plates.
- 32.1. Take the next 1x2 plate off the stack and place it horizontally on the leftmost stack of 1x2 plates. This 1x2 is purple.
- 32.3. Take the next 1x2 plate off the stack and place it horizontally on the center pair of 1x1 bricks with recessed studs on one side. This 1x2 is yellow.
- 33.1. There should only be one 1x2 plate left. Place this, horizontally, on the leftmost stack of 1x2 plates. This 1x2 is purple.
- 33.2. There should now be three 1x2 stacks on the 1x8 plate, with two gaps between them. Place a brown 1x1x2 tall brick with two studs on one side, with the side studs at the front, into each of the gaps.
- 34. Place a brown 1x8 tile, horizontally, on top of the bookshelf.

You should have two pieces leftover from group 4. These are purple 1x1 half cylinder tiles. We'll use them in the next step.

Open group 6.

- 35.1. Find the two side studs on the center 1x2 stack. Place the two leftover 1x1 half cylinder tiles, with the flat sides on the left and right, on these two studs. This is the spine of a really thick book!
- 35.2. Place two dark purple 1x1 half cylinder tiles, with the flat sides on the left and right, on the side studs on the right 1x2 stack.
- 35.3. Place a brown 1x2 tile, vertically, on each pair of side studs between the 1x2 stacks. These are the shelves between the books.
- 36. Now, place the second floor in front of you, so it is horizontal with the windows at the back. On the left side of the right wall, all the way at the back on the bottom, are two side studs. These are directly above a 1x3 tile. We'll attach the bookshelf here. Keeping the 1x2 tiles and 1x1 half cylinder tiles at the front, rotate the bookshelf 90 degrees counterclockwise so the 1x8 tile is standing upright on the left. The antistud of the 1x8 plate should be on the right. Attach the bottom two anti-stud onto the two studs we found at the beginning of this step.

Open group 7. There is a stack of 1x2 plates. These are all different colors and are stacked, from top to bottom in the order you will use them. This is, from top to bottom: dark red, gray, blue, blue, dark red, blue, purple, gray-green, and purple. There are also four 1x1 bricks with a recessed stud on one side, two of which are stacked together. The ones stacked together are dark red, and the loose ones are gray.

- 37. Now we'll build another bookshelf! Place a brown 1x8 plate horizontally in front of you.
- 38.1. Take the top 1x2 plate off the stack and place it, horizontally, on the left two studs on the previous piece. This 1x2 is dark red.
- 38.2. Take the next 1x2 plate off the stack and place it horizontally on the center two studs on the 1x8 plate. This 1x2 is gray. There should be one free stud between this 1x2 and the first.
- 38.3. Take the next 1x2 plate off the stack and place it horizontally on the right two studs on the 1x8 plate. This 1x2 is blue.
- 39.1. Take the next 1x2 plate off the stack and place it horizontally on the leftmost 1x2 plate. This 1x2 is blue.
- 39.2. Take the next 1x2 plate off the stack and place it horizontally on the rightmost 1x2 plate. This 1x2 is dark red.
- 40.1. Take the next 1x2 plate off the stack and place it horizontally on the leftmost stack of 1x2 plates. This 1x2 is blue.
- 40.2. Find the two loose 1x1 bricks with recessed studs on one side. These are gray. Place these, with the side studs at the front, in a row on the center 1x2 plate.
- 403. Unstack the other two 1x1 bricks with recessed studs on one side. These are dark red. Place these, with the side studs at the front, in a row on the rightmost stack of 1x2 plates.
- 41.1. Take the next 1x2 plate off the stack and place it horizontally on the leftmost stack of 1x2 plates. This 1x2 is purple.
- 41.3. Take the next 1x2 plate off the stack and place it horizontally on the center pair of 1x1 bricks with recessed studs on one side. This 1x2 is gray-green.

- 42.1. There should only be one 1x2 plate left. Place this, horizontally, on the leftmost stack of 1x2 plates. This 1x2 is purple.
- 42.2. There should now be three 1x2 stacks on the 1x8 plate, with two gaps between them. Place a brown 1x1x2 tall brick with two studs on one side, with the side studs at the front, into each of the gaps.
- 43. Place a brown 1x8 tile, horizontally, on top of the bookshelf.

You should have two pieces leftover from group 6. These are dark purple 1x1 half cylinder tiles. We'll use them in the next step.

Open group 8.

- 44.1. Find the two side studs on the center 1x2 stack. Place the two leftover 1x1 half cylinder tiles, with the flat sides on the left and right, on these two studs.
- 44.2. Place two yellow 1x1 half cylinder tiles, with the flat sides on the left and right, on the side studs on the right 1x2 stack.
- 45.1. Make the shelves like we did earlier by placing a brown 1x2 tile, vertically, on each pair of side studs between the 1x2 stacks.
- 45.2. Time to place the second bookshelf. On the right side of the left wall, all the way at the back on the bottom, are two side studs. These are directly above a 1x3 tile. We'll attach the bookshelf here. Keeping the 1x2 tiles and 1x1 half cylinder tiles at the front, rotate the bookshelf 90 degrees clockwise so the 1x8 tile is standing upright on the right. The anti-stud of the 1x8 plate should be on the left. Attach the bottom two anti-stud onto the two studs we found at the beginning of this step.
- 46.1. Next we make a couple more potion bottles. Place a transparent gray 1x1 cone in front of you.
- 46.2. Push the bar of a transparent clear gem down into the hollow stud of the previous piece to make the stopper.
- 46.3. Place this bottle to the left of the right bookshelf.
- 46.4. Place a transparent clear 1x1 round brick in front of you.
- 46.5. Place the stopper by pushing the bar of a transparent clear 1x1 round tile with a bar on top down into the hollow stud of the previous piece.
- 46.6. Place this bottle to the right of the left bookshelf.

Open group 9.

- 47.1. Now we'll build Dumbledore's desk! Set the second floor aside for now. Place a brown 2x4 brick with a decorative sticker on one side, horizontally with the sticker at the front, in front of you. The sticker shows an ornate wooden pattern.
- 47.2. Place a light brown 2x4 plate, horizontally, on the previous piece.
- 47.3. Place a white 1x2 tile with a letter pattern, horizontally and centered horizontally, on the back row of the previous piece.
- 47.4. Now we'll build an ink pot! Place a black 1x1 round plate on the front left stud of the 2x4 plate.
- 47.5. Place a transparent clear 1x1 round tile with a bar on top of the previous piece.

- 47.6. Place a quill pin into the ink pot by pushing the small bar of a red feather down into the hollow bar on the previous piece.
- 47.7. Next we'll build a desk lamp! Place a gold nozzle, with the nozzle at the back, on the front right stud of the 2x4 plate.
- 47.8. Place a transparent yellow minifigure head on the previous piece.
- 47.9. Place the second floor in front of you, so it is horizontal with the windows at the back. Find the two rows of four studs in front of the chair. Place the desk, horizontally with the sticker at the front, on these studs.
- 48.1. Next, we'll build a perch for the baby phoenix, Fawkes. Place a gold 2x2 dome on the second and third studs from the front on the second and third columns from the right side of the floor. This should be touching the arched door frame to the right.
- 48.2. Place a black 1x1 round brick on the previous piece.
- 48.3. Place a gold 1x2 jumper plate, centered, on the previous piece. This piece should be at a 45 degree angle, pointing kind of towards the desk.
- 48.4. Place a red bird figure on the previous piece. This is baby Fawkes!
- 49.1. Now we'll make a stand for the sorting hat! Place a gold 2x2 dome on the second and third studs from the front on the second and third columns from the left side of the floor. This should be touching the arched door frame to the left. This is placed symmetrically to the base for Fawkes' perch.
- 49.2. Place a black telescope, standing upright, on the previous piece.
- 49.3. Place the sorting hat on the previous piece.
- 50.1. Next, we'll make it easy to remove any pieces we put on top of this room! Place a dark tan 1x4 tile, vertically, on the front four studs of the left and right walls of the room.
- 50.2. Place a dark tan 1x4 tile vertically, behind both pieces from the previous step.
- 50.3. Place a dark tan 1x2 tile, horizontally, on the back wall to the right of the left piece of the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 50.4. Place a dark tan 1x4 tile with two studs, horizontally, to the right of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 50.5. Place the front row of a dark tan 2x3 tile, vertically, between the pieces from the previous step.
- 50.6. Place a dark tan 2x2 macaroni tile, with the flat sides at the front and the right, to the left of the back two rows of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 51.1. Find the two scroll bricks on the front side of the room. They are near the tops of the left and right walls. Place a tan 1x12 brick with a groove on one side, horizontally with the groove at front, on these two scrolls.
- 51.2. Place a dark tan 1x6 tile, horizontally and centered horizontally, on the previous piece.
- 51.3. Place a dark tan 1x4 tile with two studs, horizontally, to the left of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right. This can be removed to get better access to the room.

Open group 10.

- 52.1. Next we'll build the two roofs which cover the sides of the room. Place a dark tan 4x8 plate vertically in front of you.
- 52.2. Place a sand green 2x4 slope brick, with the slope at the back, on the back two rows of the previous piece.
- 52.3. Place a tan 1x4 tile with two studs, horizontally, on the previous piece.
- 52.4. Place two tan 1x1 pyramid slope tiles on the previous piece.
- 52.5. Repeat steps 52.1-52.4.
- 52.6. Place one roof, with the slope at the back, on the left four columns of the second floor. Its front, left, and back sides should be even with the sides of the room. Repeat symmetrically on the right side. Now the second floor is complete. Set it aside for now.

Open bag 3.

Open minifigure group 4: Professor Snape

Assemble the Snape minifigure by putting the torso on the leg piece, the head on the torso, and the hair on the head. Snape's accessory is a black wand.

Sub-Build 2: Third Level.

Open group 11.

- 53. Next we'll build the third level. Place a dark tan 3x3 plate with a rounded corner, with the rounded corner at the back left, in front of you. Place another symmetrically to the right. These two won't be connected yet.
- 54. Connect the previous two pieces by placing a tan 1x2 brick, horizontally, on the back studs of both pieces so it holds them together.
- 55. Place the back stud of a 2x2 macaroni brick, with the flat sides at the front and the right, to the left of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 56. Place a light gray 4x4 round plate, centered horizontally, on the front two rows of the two 3x3 plates with rounded ends. It should overhang two studs to the front.
- 57. Place the back two rows of a dark tan 8x8 plate with a grid pattern, centered horizontally, on the overhanging anti-stud of the previous piece.
- 58. Place the front row of a tan 2x2 angled corner brick, with the angled corner at the front right, on the left stud on the back row of the previous piece. The back stud of this piece should connect to the left 3x3 plate with a rounded corner. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 59. Place a light gray 1x1 brick with a hole, with the hole on the left and right, in front of the left stud of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 60.1. Assemble a window by attaching a gold 1x2x2 lattice into a brown 1x2x2 window frame. Find the lip in the window frame and rotate the window so that it is at the front, then push a lattice in from the front until it clicks. Repeat one more time.

- 60.2. Stack the windows together and place them, horizontally with the lattice at the back, centered horizontally on the back row of the room. This should be between the two 2x2 macaroni bricks.
- 60.3. Assemble an arched window by attaching a gold 1x2x3 arched lattice into a brown 1x2x3 arched window frame.
- 60.4. Place the arched window, horizontally with the lattice at the back, on the other two windows.
- 61.1. Place the back row of a tan 2x2x5 quarter cylinder with a sticker, with the rounded side at the back left to the left of the stack of windows. The sticker on this piece shows worn sandstone bricks.
- 61.2. Place a 2x2 macaroni brick, with the flat sides at the front and the right, on the previous piece.

Open group 12.

- 62.1. Place the back row of a tan 2x2x5 quarter cylinder, with the rounded side at the back right to the right of the stack of windows..
- 62.2. Place at a 2x2 macaroni brick, with the flat sides at the front and the left, on the previous piece.
- 63. Place the right stud of a tan 1x4 arch brick, horizontally, on the back stud of the previous piece.
- 64.1. Find the stud in front of the left column of the left 2x2x5 quarter cylinder. Place a light brown 1x1 brick on this stud.
- 64.2. Place a tan 1x1x3 tall brick on the previous piece.
- 64.3. Place a tan 1x1x3 tall brick on the stud in front of the right column of the right 2x2x5 quarter cylinder.
- 64.4. Place a light brown 1x1 brick on the previous piece.
- 65.1. Make a stack of three tan 1x2 bricks. Place this stack, vertically, on the back two studs on the leftmost column.
- 65.2. Place a light brown masonry brick, vertically with the brick pattern on the left, on top of the stack from the previous step.
- 66.1. Place a tan 1x2 brick, vertically, on the back two studs on the rightmost column.
- 66.2. Place a light brown masonry brick, vertically with the brick pattern on the right, on the previous piece.
- 66.3. Make a stack of two tan 1x2 bricks and place it, vertically, on the previous piece.
- 67. Place the front stud of a tan 2x2 angled corner brick, with the angled corner at the front left, on the back stud of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the left side of the tower.
- 68. Place a light gray 1x1 brick with a hole, with the hole on the left and right, in front of the left stud of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

Open group 13.

69.1. Now we'll make Dumbledore's Pensieve! Place a white 2x2 round tile with a single stud in front of you.

- 69.2. Place a transparent clear 1x1 round tile with a bar on top, on the previous piece.
- 69.3. Now, take a white 2x2 dome and flip it upside down. Push the hollow stud, which is now on the bottom, down onto the bar of the previous piece.
- 69.4. Place a transparent blue 2x2 inverted rounded tile on the previous piece.
- 69.5. Find the 4x4 round plate on the room and place the pensieve centered on the round plate.
- 70. Find the third row from the back on top of the room. This is the back studs of two 2x2 angled corner bricks.. Place a tan 1x2 inverted slope brick, vertically with the slope at the front, on the left and right studs in this row.
- 71.1. We're going to build a couple of small assemblies to detail the wall above the window. We'll start with the left side. Stack two tan 1x2 plates and set them vertically in front of you.
- 71.2. Place a tan 1x1 plate with a stud sticking up from one side, with the side stud at the front, on the front anti-stud of the stack from the previous step.
- 71.3. Place a tan 1x1 plate on the anti-stud behind the previous piece.
- 71.4. Place a tan 1x1 slope tile, with the thick side at the left, on the side stud.
- 71.5. Rotate this assembly 180 degrees so the previous piece is at the back. Place the assembly on the back two studs on the second row from the left on the top of the room. The slope tile should be next to a 1x4 arch brick.
- 71.6. Now we'll make the right side. Stack two tan 1x2 plates and set them vertically in front of you.
- 71.7. Place a tan 1x1 plate with a stud sticking up from one side, with the side stud at the front, on the front anti-stud of the stack from the previous step.
- 71.8. Place a tan 1x1 plate on the anti-stud behind the previous piece.
- 71.9. Place a tan 1x1 slope tile, with the thick side at the right, on the side stud.
- 71.10. Rotate this assembly 180 degrees so the previous piece is at the back. Place the assembly on the back two studs on the second row from the right on the top of the room. This side should be symmetrical to the left side.
- 72. Place a tan 1x6 brick, horizontally, in front of the two assemblies we just placed.
- 73. Place a tan 1x6x7 arched door frame with round columns, vertically with the rounded side of the column at the right, on the leftmost column of the floor in front of the wall. Its front end should be even with the front of the floor. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 74. Place the front stud of a tan 1x3 brick, vertically, on the back stud of both pieces from the previous step.
- 75.1. Place the back three studs of a tan 1x4 brick with three holes, vertically, on both pieces from the previous step.
- 75.2. Place a tan 1x3 brick, vertically, in front of both pieces from the previous step.
- 76. Place a tan 1x8x3 arch brick, horizontally, on the front studs of the two 1x6x7 arched door frames.

Open group 14.

- 77.1. Now we'll place tiles on top of the room to make it easier to assemble and disassemble. Place a dark tan 1x2 tile, horizontally and centered horizontally, on the back row on top of the room.
- 77.2. Place the back stud of a dark tan 2x2 macaroni tile, with the flat sides on the front and the right, to the left of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 77.3. Place the right column of a dark tan 2x2 corner tile, with the corner at the front right so it's oriented like a braille letter J, in front of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 77.4. Place a dark tan 1x4 tile, horizontally, between the front rows of the pieces from the previous step.
- 77.5. Place a dark tan 1x4 tile with two studs, vertically, on the left and right columns in front of the 2x2 corner tiles from step 77.3.
- 78.1. Place a dark tan 1x3 tile, vertically, in front of both pieces from the previous step.
- 78.2. Place a dark tan 1x6 tile, horizontally, between the front rows of the pieces from the previous step. Now the third level is complete. Set it aside for now.

Sub-Build 3: Top Level.

Open group 15.

- 79.1. Now we'll build the top level of Dumbledore's office! Place a dark tan 8x8 plate with a grid pattern in front of you. This will be the floor.
- 79.2. Place a tan 1x1 brick on both back corners of the previous piece.
- 80. Place a gold 1x4 low fence panel, vertically with the fence on the right, in front of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 81.1. Now we'll make a couple of short candles! Place a white 1x1 round tile with a bar on top, on each of the 1x1 bricks on the back row.
- 81.2. Push the short bar of a transparent orange flame down into the hollow bar of both pieces from the previous step.
- 82.1. Place a tan 1x8 plate, horizontally, on the third row from the front of the floor.
- 82.2. Place a tan 1x4 plate, horizontally and centered horizontally, behind the previous piece.
- 83.1. Place the back row of a brown 2x3 pentagonal tile, horizontally with the pointy end at the right, on the right three study of the previous piece.
- 83.2. Place a light brown 1x1 round plate on the left and right studs of the 1x8 plate.
- 83.3. Place a brown 1x2 jumper plate, vertically, to the left of the 2x3 pentagonal tile.
- 84.1. Place a gold 1x1 tile with a clip, oriented so the clip looks like a letter U when viewed from the side, on the previous piece.

- 84.2. Clip the handle of the Sword of Gryffindor, with the blade at the right, into the clip of the previous piece.
- 85.1. Now we'll make an arch which goes over the sword's resting place. We'll start by making two identical halves of the arch. Place a tan 1x3x3 half arch in front of you, with the arch at the right.
- 85.2. Place a tan 1x1 pyramid tile on the left stud of the previous piece. This is the lowest of the three studs on the half arch.
- 85.3. Place a tan 1x1 slope tile with a 1x1 plate on one side, horizontally with the slope on the left, on the right two studs of the half arch.
- 85.4. Repeat steps 85.1-85.3.
- 85.5. Place one half-arch assembly, with the arch on the right, on the left 1x1 round plate from step 83.2. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 86.1. Place a tan 1x1 brick on the rightmost stud of the left half arch. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 86.2. Place a tan 1x4 arch brick, horizontally, on the pieces from the previous step.
- 87. Place a sand green 8x4x6 half cone, with the open side at the back, on the front two rows of the floor in front of the arch.
- 88.1. Place a sand green 1x2 plate, horizontally, on the front row of the previous piece.
- 88.2. Place a sand green 2x4 plate, horizontally and centered horizontally, behind the previous piece.

Open group 16.

- 89. Place the back two rows of a dark tan 3x3 plate with a rounded corner, with the rounded corner at the front left, on the left three columns of anti-stud of the 8x4x6 half cone. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 90. Place a tan 1x2 curved slope brick, horizontally with the slope on the left, on the left two studs on the front row in front of the 8x4x6 half cone. Repeat symmetrically on the right.
- 91. Place a tan 1x2 brick with two studs on one side, horizontally with the side studs at the front, on the pieces from the previous step.
- 92. Place a sand green 1x2 double slope tile, horizontally, on the previous piece.
- 93. Place the middle row of a tan 2x3 pentagonal tile with a sticker, sideways with the pointy side pointing up, on the side stude from the piece from step 91. The sticker shows the Hogwarts crest.
- 94. Find the back row on top of the cone. Place a tan 1x2x3 tall slope brick, horizontally with the slope on the left, on the left two studs on this row. Repeat symmetrically to the right.
- 95. Place a sand green 4x2x3 half cone, with the open side at the back, in front of the pieces from the previous step.
- 96.1. Place a sand green 2x2 jagged cone on the previous three pieces.
- 96.2. Place a gold 1x1 round tile with a bar on top, on the previous piece.

- 96.3. Push the axle hole of a dark gray axle connector with four bars sticking out of the sides, with the bars facing front and back and left and right, down onto the bar of the previous piece.
- 96.4. Push the bar of a gold 1x1 round tile with a bar on top, down into the axle hole on top of the previous piece.
- 96.5. Place a dark gray 1x1 inverted cone with a bar on one side, with the bar on top, into the anti-stud of the previous piece.
- 97. Now we'll attach the top floor to the third floor! Place the third floor in front of you, with the window at the front. Keeping the sand green half cones at the front, place the top floor on top of the third floor. Set the combined third and top floors aside for now.

Open group 17.

- 98. Now we'll build some small spires. Place a tan 2x2 plate with one rounded end, horizontally with the rounded end at the right, in front of you. The rounded end of this piece has a hole through it.
- 99.1. Place a light gray 1x2 brick with two holes, vertically, on the leftmost column of the previous piece.
- 99.2. Place a tan 1x2 plate, horizontally, on the previous piece.
- 100.1. Place a tan 2x2 plate with one rounded end, horizontally with the rounded end at the right, in front of you.
- 100.2. Place a tan 1x2 brick, vertically, on the leftmost anti-stud column of the previous piece.
- 100.3. Place a tan 1x2 half cylinder brick, with the rounded side at the right, on the anti-stud to the right of the previous piece.
- 100.4. Place this assembly to the right of the 1x2 brick with two holes from step 99.1.
- 101.1. Place a tan 2x2 round brick on the left two columns of the assembly.
- 101.2. Place a sand green 2x2 jagged cone on the 2x2 round brick.
- 101.3. Place a sand green unicorn horn, with the point up, into the hollow stud on top of the previous piece.
- 102.1. Stack three 2x2 round bricks together. Place the left column of the stack on the right column of the assembly.
- 102.2. Place a sand green 2x2 jagged cone on the 2x2 round brick.
- 102.3. Place a sand green unicorn horn, with the point up, into the hollow stud on top of the previous piece.
- 103. Push two light gray 2L pins, from the left, into the two holes on the left side of the assembly.
- 104.1. Stack two tan 2x2 round plates together. Place them on the left two anti-stud columns of the assembly.
- 104.2. Place a light brown 1x1 round plate into the center anti-stud of the bottom 2x2 round plate from the previous step.

105. Place the third and top floors in front of you, with the windows at the front. Find the three holes to the right of the 8x4x6 half-cone. Push the two pins on the left side of the assembly into the front two of these holes.

106. Now we'll attach the top two floors to the second floor! Place the second floor in front of you, with the windows at the front. Place the top two floors on the second floor, between the two side roofs. The back of the top floors should be even with the top of the second floor.

Open bag 4.

Open minifigure group 5: Madam Pince.

Assemble the Madam Pince minifigure by putting the torso on the dress piece, the head on the torso, and the hat on the head. Finish the minifigure by pushing the short bar of a black feather down into the small hole on the top of the hat brim. Madam Pince's accessory is a black wand.

Sub-Build 4: Bottom Level

Open group 18. There are three 1x1 bricks which are stacked together. These are light brown. The unstacked 1x1 brick is the tan one for step 111.3.

- 107.1. Now we'll start building the bottom level of Dumbledore's office. Place a dark tan 8x8 plate with a grid pattern in front of you. This will be the floor.
- 107.2. Place a tan 1x4 plate, horizontally and centered horizontally, on the front row of the previous piece.
- 108. Place a tan 1x4 brick, horizontally, to the left and right of the previous piece.
- 109.2. Place a tan 1x2 plate, horizontally, on the right two studs of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 109.3. Place a tan 1x2 brick, horizontally and centered horizontally, on the front row.
- 110. Place the right stud of a tan 1x3 arch brick, horizontally, on the left stud of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 111.1. Place a light brown 1x1 brick on the left stud of the left piece from the previous step.
- 111.2. Place a tan 2x2 inverted slope brick, with the slope at the front, to the right of the previous piece. Place another to the right of the first.
- 111.3. Place a tan 1x1 brick to the right of the back row of the right piece from the previous step.
- 112. Make two stacks of two tan 2x2 angled corner bricks. Place the back stud of one stack, with the angled side at the front right, on the previous piece. The front stud should attach to one of the 2x2 inverted slope bricks from step 111.2. Repeat symmetrically on the left side.
- 113.1. Place a light brown 1x1 brick on the third stud from the left on the front row.
- 113.2. Place a tan 1x1x3 tall brick on the previous piece.
- 113.3. Place a tan 1x1x3 tall brick on the third stud from the right on the front row.
- 113.4. Place a light brown 1x1 brick on the previous piece.

- 114. Make two stacks of two tan 1x2 plates. Place the right stud of one stack, horizontally, on the previous piece. The left stud of the stack should be on the right stack of 2x2 angled corner bricks. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 115.1. Place a light brown 1x1 round tile on the front stud of both 2x2 angled corner bricks from step 112.
- 115.2. Place a brown 1x1 brick with a stud on one side, with the side stud at the front, on the right stud of the left stack of 1x2 plates from step 114. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 116. Place the top anti-stud of a tan 1x2 slope tile, with the thick side at the right, on the side stud of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

Open group 19.

- 117.1. Now we'll make a bit of a tree growing through the wall. Place a brown 1x1 brick with a stud on one side, with the side stud at the front, to the left of the right stack of 2x2 angled corner bricks from step 112.
- 117.2. Place a brown 1x3x2 half arch, with the arch at the front, on the previous piece.
- 117.3. Place a light green 1x1 round plate with a flower pattern on the front stud of the previous piece.
- 117.4. Place a green 1x1 slope tile, with the thick side at the back, behind the previous piece.
- 117.5. Push the bar of a brown flexible vine, with the vine hanging down, into the hollow side stud of the 1x1 brick with a side stud from step 117.1.
- 118.1. Place a brown 1x3x2 half arch, with the arch at the front, to the left of the 1x1 brick with a side stud from step 117.1.
- 118.2. Place a tan 1x1 brick on the back stud of the previous piece.
- 118.3. Place a light green 1x1 round plate with a flower pattern on the front stud of the 1x3x2 half arch from step 118.1.
- 119.1. Place the left column of a brown 2x2 corner plate, with the corner at the back left so it's oriented like a braille letter F, behind the previous piece.
- 119.2. Place a green 1x1 slope tile, with the thick side at the right, on the front stud of the previous piece.
- 119.3. Place the left stud of a tan 1x2 brick, horizontally, behind the previous piece.
- 120.1. Now we'll start building a very large bookshelf. We'll start with the bottom of it. Set the rest of the bottom floor aside for now. Place a black 2x8 plate horizontally in front of you.
- 120.2. Place a brown 1x2 tile, horizontally, on the left two studs on the front row of the previous piece.
- 120.3. Place the front row of two brown 2x2 tiles, in a row, to the right of the previous piece.
- 120.4. Place a brown 1x2 tile, horizontally, on the front row to the right of the right piece from the previous step.
- 120.5. Place a brown 1x2 brick with a log pattern, vertically, on the left and right anti-stud columns of the 2x8 plate.

- 120.6. Place the bottom floor back in front of you, with the wall at the back. Place the bottom shelf of the bookshelf, horizontally with the 1x2 tiles at the front, on the first two rows in front of the wall.
- 121.1. We'll come back to the bookshelf in a little bit. Find the bricks on the back row that overhang to the left and right of the floor. Place a dark tan 6x6 angled corner plate, with the angled side at the front left, on the anti-stud of the left overhanging brick so it extends one row behind the back wall of the room.
- 121.2. Place a light brown 1x2 masonry brick, horizontally with the brick pattern at the back, on the second and third studs from the left on the back row of the previous piece.
- 121.3. Place a tan 1x2 brick, horizontally, to the right of the previous piece.
- 122.1. Place a dark tan 6x6 angled corner plate, with the angled side at the front right, on the anti-stud of the right overhanging brick so it extends one row behind the back wall of the room.
- 122.2. Place a tan 1x4 brick, horizontally, centered horizontally on the back row of the previous piece.

Open group 20.

- 123.1. Next, we'll assemble two 1x4 hinge bricks. There are two 1x2 bricks which have a hole, and two which have a pin. Push the pins down into the holes. Now these can be folded up into a 2x2 brick, or unfolded to a 1x4 brick. They can also be any angle between.
- 123.2. Unfold the two pieces from the previous step into 1x4 bricks. Place the right two studs of one, horizontally with the round hinge portion at the back, on the left two studs on the second row from the back of the left 6x6 angled corner plate. The left side should be able to rotate away from you, but not towards you. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

Open group 21.

- 124.1. Place the left stud of a tan 2x2 angled corner brick, with the angled corner at the back left, on the second stud from the right of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 124.2. Find the tall center wall on the back of the room. Place the right stud of a tan 2x2 angled corner brick, with the angled corner at the back right, to the left of this wall. There should be two free studs between the left stud of this piece, and the right stud of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 125.1. Now we'll get back to making some books! Set the bottom floor aside for now. Place a black 1x1 brick in front of you.
- 125.2. Place a black 1x1 brick with side studs on two adjacent sides, with the side studs at the front and the left, on the previous piece.
- 126. Place a black 1x1x2 tall brick with two studs on one side, with the side studs on the left, on the previous piece.
- 127. Place a black 1x1x2 tall brick with two studs on one side, with the side studs on the front, on the previous piece.

Open group 22. There is a stack of 1x2 plates. These are all different colors and are stacked, from top to bottom in the order you will use them. This is, from top to bottom: light blue, dark purple, dark red. There is also a stack of two 1x1x2 tall bricks with two studs on one side. These are the black ones from steps 135 and 136.

- 128.1. Rotate the assembly you have 90 degrees clockwise so it lays flat in front of you. There should be a row of three side studs on the top, and a row of one, and then two, side studs on the front side. Take the top 1x2 plate off the stack and place its right stud, horizontally, on the left stud on top of the assembly. This 1x2 is light blue.
- 128.2. Take the next 1x2 plate off the stack and place its left stud, horizontally, on the right stud on top of the assembly. This 1x2 is dark purple.
- 129.1. Place the last 1x2 plate, horizontally, on the leftmost 1x2 plate. This 1x2 is dark red.
- 129.2. Place a sand green 1x2 tile, horizontally, on the rightmost 1x2 plate.
- 130.1. Place two dark red 1x1 bricks with recessed studs on one side, with the side studs at the front, in a row on the leftmost stack of 1x2 plates.
- 130.2. Place a brown 1x1x2 tall brick with two studs on one side, with the side studs at the front, to the right of the right piece from the previous step. There should be a gap between the 1x2 stacks for this piece.
- 131.1. Place a brown 1x1 tile on the previous piece.
- 131.2. Place a sand green 1x2 tile, horizontally, to the left of the previous piece.
- 132. Place two yellow 1x1 half cylinder tiles, with the flat sides on the left and right, on the side studs on the left 1x2 stack.
- 133. Place the bottom floor back in front of you, with the wall at the back. Locate the bottom shelf of the bookshelf, which is the two rows in front of the back wall. There are two free studs in the back left and right corners of the shelf. Rotate the stack of books we just made 90 degrees counterclockwise so it stands upright with the two 1x1 half cylinder tiles on the front side near the bottom. Place the bottom antistud on the rightmost stud on the bottom shelf of the bookshelf.
- 134.1. Now we'll start another set of books. Set the bottom floor aside for now. Place a black 1x1 brick in front of you.
- 134.2. Place a black 1x1 brick with side studs on two adjacent sides, with the side studs at the front and the right, on the previous piece.
- 135. Place a black 1x1x2 tall brick with two studs on one side, with the side studs on the right, on the previous piece. This is one of the two that are stacked together.
- 136. Place a black 1x1x2 tall brick with two studs on one side, with the side studs on the front, on the previous piece. This is the last one from the stack.

Open group 23. There is a stack of 1x2 plates. These are all different colors and are stacked, from top to bottom in the order you will use them. This is, from top to bottom: yellow, blue, light blue, purple, dark red.

- 137.1. Rotate the assembly you have 90 degrees counterclockwise so it lays flat in front of you. There should be a row of three side studs on the top, and a row of one, and then two, side studs on the front side. Take the top 1x2 plate off the stack and place its left stud, horizontally, on the right stud on top of the assembly. This 1x2 is blue.
- 137.2. Take the next 1x2 plate off the stack and place its right stud, horizontally, on the left stud on top of the assembly. This 1x2 is yellow.

- 138.1. Take the next 1x2 plate off the stack and place it, horizontally, on the rightmost 1x2 plate. This 1x2 is light blue.
- 138.2. Place a blue 1x2 tile, horizontally, on the leftmost 1x2 plate.
- 139. Place a brown 1x1x2 tall brick with two studs on one side, with the side studs at the front, between the two stacks of 1x2 plates and tiles.
- 140.1. Take the next 1x2 plate off the stack and place it, horizontally, on the rightmost stack of 1x2 plates. This 1x2 is purple.
- 140.2. Place the last 1x2 plate, horizontally, on the previous piece. This 1x2 is dark red.
- 141.1. Place two dark red 1x1 bricks with recessed studs on one side, with the side studs at the front, in a row on the previous piece.
- 141.2. Place a black 1x1 tall plate to the left of the left piece from the previous step.

You should have one 1x2 tile left over when you finish this group. It is blue and we'll use it in the next step.

Open group 24.

- 142.1. Place a brown 1x6 plate horizontally in front of you.
- 142.2. Place the leftover blue 1x2 tile, horizontally, on the right two studs of the previous piece.
- 142.3. Place a dark red 1x1 tile to the left of the previous piece.
- 142.4. Place a light green 1x2 tile, horizontally, to the left of the previous piece.
- 142.5. Place a dark red 1x2 plate, horizontally, on the second and third anti-stud from the left on the 1x6 plate.
- 142.6. Place this assembly on top of the rest of the stack of books so that the right sides are even.
- 143. Place two teal 1x1 half cylinder tiles, with the flat sides on the left and right, on the side studs on the right 1x2 stack.
- 144. Place the bottom floor back in front of you, with the wall at the back. We'll place this stack of books symmetrical to the ones on the right side. Locate the bottom shelf of the bookshelf, which is the two rows in front of the back wall. There are two free studs in the back left corner of the shelf. Rotate the stack of books we just made 90 degrees clockwise so it stands upright with the two 1x1 half cylinder tiles on the front side near the bottom. Place the bottom anti-stud on the leftmost stud on the bottom shelf of the bookshelf. The right side of this stack of books should touch the other stack of books.
- 145.1. Next, we'll add the upright wooden parts of the shelf, as well as another shelf. Make three stacks which consist of a brown 1x6 tile on a 1x6 plate.
- 145.2. There are columns of three side studs on both the left and right sides of the bookshelf. Place one of the stacks on each of these columns.
- 145.3. There is a row of four side studs midway up the stack of books. Place the last stack, horizontally, on this row.

Open group 25.

- 146.1. Now we'll make a hidden step! Set the bottom floor aside for now. When you push a book in, a step will appear on the outside of the wall! Place a brown 1x4 plate horizontally in front of you.
- 146.2. Place a light green 1x1 circular plate with three leaves, with the leaves at the back left, on the leftmost stud of the previous piece.
- 147.1. Place a brown 1x2 plate with rounded ends, horizontally, to the right of the previous piece.
- 147.2. Place a black 1x1 plate with two studs hanging down from one side, with the side studs on the right, to the right of the previous piece.
- 148. Place a brown 1x4 tile, horizontally, on top of the assembly.
- 149.1. Place a brown 1x1 panel with two adjacent walls, with the walls on the top and the back, on the top side stud on the right side of the assembly.
- 149.2. Place a brown 1x1 tile with a clip, oriented so the clip looks like a U when viewed from the top, on the side stud below the previous piece.
- 150.1. Assemble a book by placing a black book back with a sticker, in front of you with the spine on the left and the sticker facing up. This piece of the book does not have studs on it. The sticker shows lines of text, with an anguished face trying to reach up out of the page!
- 150.2. Attach the other side of the book, which has the studs on it, with the studs facing up, to the first part of the book. The left side of the book should have a rounded edge like a bar.
- 150.3. Clip the bar on the left side of the book to the clip from step 149.2. The top of the book should touch the 1x1 panel with two walls. Rotate the book so it is closed.
- 151. Place the bottom floor back in front of you, with the wall at the back. Find the 1x2 brick on the back wall. There should be a one brick gap to the right of this piece. Rotate the hidden step assembly so the tile is on top, and the leaf plate is at the back. Set it into the gap we identified in the wall. The assembly should slide forward and back.

Open group 26.

- 152.1. Now we'll build another hidden step! This will be almost identical to the first one. Set the bottom floor aside for now. Place a brown 1x4 plate horizontally in front of you.
- 152.2. Place a light green 1x1 circular plate with three leaves, with the leaves at the back right, on the rightmost stud of the previous piece.
- 153.1. Place a brown 1x2 plate with rounded ends, horizontally, to the left of the previous piece.
- 153.2. Place a black 1x1 plate with two studs hanging down from one side, with the side studs on the left, to the left of the previous piece.
- 154. Place a brown 1x4 tile, horizontally, on top of the assembly.
- 155.1. Place a brown 1x1 panel with two adjacent walls, with the walls on the top and the back, on the top side stud on the left side of the assembly.
- 155.2. Place a brown 1x1 tile with a clip, oriented so the clip looks like a U when viewed from the top, on the side stud below the previous piece.

- 156.1. Assemble a book by placing a brown book back with a sticker, in front of you with the spine on the left and the sticker facing up. This piece of the book does not have studs on it. This book's sticker is more boring. There are just lines of text, a capital N and F, and a few colored shapes.
- 156.2. Attach the other side of the book, which has the studs on it, with the studs facing up, to the first part of the book. The right side of the book should have a rounded edge like a bar.
- 156.3. Clip the bar on the right side of the book to the clip from step 149.2. The top of the book should touch the 1x1 panel with two walls. Rotate the book so it is closed.
- 157. Place the bottom floor back in front of you, with the wall at the back. Find the 1x2 brick on the back wall. There should be a one brick gap to the left of this piece. Rotate the hidden step assembly so the tile is on top, and the leaf plate is at the back. Set it into the gap we identified in the wall. The assembly should slide forward and back.
- 158. Place the back row of a tan 2x4 plate, horizontally and centered horizontally, on the 1x2 brick between the two hidden stairs.

Open group 27.

- 159. Place the right two columns of a brown 2x4 plate, horizontally, in front of the left two columns of the previous piece. Place another to the right of the first. This is the top of the bookshelf.
- 160.1. Place the front row of a brown 2x4 tile, horizontally and centered horizontally, on the back row of the pieces from the previous step.
- 160.2. Place a tan 1x2 brick with two studs on one side, horizontally with the side studs at the back, centered horizontally behind the previous piece.
- 160.3. Place a light green 1x1 circular plate with three leaves, with the leaves at the right, on the left side stud of the previous piece.
- 161. Place the back stud of a tan 2x2 angled corner brick, with the angled corner at the back left, to the left of 1x2 brick with two side studs from step 160.2. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 162. Place a dark tan 1x4 tile, horizontally and centered horizontally, on the back studs of the pieces from the previous step.
- 163. Now we'll work on the floor a bit more. Place the front stud of a dark tan 3x3 angled corner plate, with the corner at the back right on the second stud from the front on the left column of the 8x8 plate with a grid pattern which makes up the center part of the floor. The angled part of this plate should be even with the angled corner plate below it. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 164.1. Place a tan 1x1x6 round pillar on the left and right studs on the front row of the 8x8 plate with a grid pattern.
- 164.2. Place a tan 1x3 double inverted slope brick, horizontally, on each of the pieces from the previous step.
- 165. Place the front stud of a tan 1x6 arch brick, vertically, on the center stud of each of the pieces from the previous step.
- 166. Place a tan 1x6 arch brick, horizontally, between the front studs of the pieces from the previous step.

Open bag 5.

Open minifigure group 6: Hermione Granger

Assemble the Hermione minifigure by putting the torso on the leg piece, the head on the torso, and the hair on the head. Hermione's accessory is a light brown wand.

Open group 28.

- 167. Rotate the bottom floor 180 degrees so the wall is at the front. Find the four tan 2x2 angled corner bricks which are on the bottom floor. There are two on each side. Make four stacks of three tan 2x2 angled corner bricks and place one stack on each of the 2x2 angled corner bricks which are already on the floor. There should be a two stud gap between each pair of stacks.
- 168.1. Assemble a window by attaching a black 1x2x2 lattice into a brown 1x2x2 window frame. Find the lip in the window frame and rotate the window so that it is at the front, then push a lattice in from the front until it clicks. Repeat.
- 168.2. Place one window, with the lattice at the front, in each gap between the stacks of 2x2 angled corner bricks from step 167.
- 168.3. Assemble an arched window by attaching a gold 1x2x3 arched lattice into a brown 1x2x3 arched window frame. Repeat.
- 168.4. Place one arched window, with the lattice at the front, on each of the windows from step 168.3.
- 169. Place a tan 1x6 arch brick, horizontally, on the back studs of the left pair of 2x2 angled corner brick stacks. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 170. Place a tan 1x4 arch brick, horizontally and centered on the arched windows from step 168.4. in front of each of the pieces from the previous step.
- 171.1. Place a light brown 1x2 masonry brick, horizontally with the brick pattern at the front, on the sixth and seventh studs from the left on the second row from the front on the wall. This should be right up against the tallest part of the wall.
- 171.2. Place a tan 1x2 brick symmetrically to the previous piece on the right side.
- 172.1. Place the back row of a sand green 2x4 slope brick, horizontally with the slope at the front, to the right of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the left side.
- 172.2. Place a light brown 1x1 brick to the left of the back row of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 173. FInd the two vertical 1x6 arch bricks which are on top of the walls. These start at the 1x1x6 columns on the back row. Place a tan 1x2 brick, vertically, in front of each of these pieces.
- 174. Rotate the bottom floor 180 degrees so the wall is at the back. Now we'll make a pair of shelves which are partially recessed into the windows. Place a brown 1x1 round brick on the leftmost stud on the row in front of the walls. Place another on the fourth stud from the left. These should be in front of two other studs which are at the same height. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 175. Place the front row a light brown 2x4 tile with two studs, horizontally, on the left pair of pieces from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 176.1. Now we'll make a couple of lamps to put on the desks. These are identical so you can build them at the same time if you want. Place a gold nozzle, with the nozzle at the back, in front of you.

- 176.2. Place a transparent yellow 1x1 round plate on the previous piece.
- 176.3. Place a gold 1x1 short cone on the previous piece. This completes one lamp!
- 176.4. Repeat steps 176.1-176.4 if you only have one lamp.
- 176.5. Place one lamp on the right stud of the left 2x4 tile with two studs from step 175. Repeat symmetrically on the right.
- 177. Place a chocolate frog to the right of the right lamp from the previous step.

Open group 29.

- 178. Next we'll attach the rest of the floor! Find the hinge bricks on the bottom left and right sides of the back wall. Rotate the left hinge brick all the way forward so it is horizontal and in line with the wall. Place the back stud of a dark tan 8x8 angled corner plate, with the corner at the front left, on the left anti-stud of the left hinge brick. The front side of this plate should be even with the front of the rest of the bottom floor. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 179. Place a light gray 1x1 brick with a hole, with the hole on the left and right, in front of the left stud of the left hinge brick. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 180. Place a light brown 1x1 brick to the right of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 181. Place a tan 2x2x3 tall slope brick, with the slope on the left, on the left hinge brick and 1x1 bricks from the previous two steps. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 182. Place a tan 2x2 inverted slope brick, with the slope on the left, on the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 183. Place a tan 2x2 corner brick, with the corner in the back right so it's oriented like a braille letter D, on the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 184. Place a light gray 1x1 brick with a hole, with the hole on the left and right, to the left of the front stud of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 185. This next piece will go on the floor and it will be the base for a chair. Place a black 2x2 round tile with a single stud on the third and fourth studs from the front on the fourth and fifth columns from the left on the left 8x8 angled corner plate. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 186. Place a brown chair on each of the pieces from the previous step. The center anti-stud on the chair should attach to the single stud on the 2x2 round tile so the chair can be spun all the way around.
- 187.1. Place a tan 1x6x7 arched door frame with round columns, vertically with the rounded side of the column at the right, on the leftmost column of the left 8x8 angled corner plate.
- 187.2. The door frame on the other side of the room is a little different. Place a tan 1x6x7 arched door frame with round columns, horizontally with the rounded side of the column at the front, in front of you. Push a dark tan 1x6x7 arched window glass with a sticker on one side, from the front with the sticker at the back, into the door frame. The sticker is an image of a phoenix statue.
- 187.3. Place the door assembly from the previous step, vertically with the rounded side of the column at the left, on the rightmost column of the right 8x8 angled corner plate. The sticker will be on the right side now.

Open group 30.

- 188. Place a tan 1x2 brick vertically, on the back two studs on the second column from the left on the left side of the wall. This is just to the left of where the left side of the room hinges. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 189.1. Place the back two studs of a tan 1x3 brick, vertically, to the left of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 189.2. Place a light brown 1x1 brick on the front stud of each 1x6x7 arched door frame from steps 187.1 and 187.3.
- 190. Leaving four free bricks to the left of it, place a tan 1x4 brick, horizontally, on the back wall of the room. The top of this brick should be level with the bricks to the right of it. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 191.1. Assemble two 1x4 hinge bricks like we did in step 123.1.
- 191.2. Unfold the two pieces from the previous step into 1x4 bricks. Place one, horizontally with the round hinge portion at the back, to the left of the left 1x4 brick from step 190. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 192.1. Place a tan 1x2 brick, horizontally, in front of the left two studs of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 192.2. Place a tan 1x4 brick, vertically, in front of the left stud of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 193.1. Place a light gray 1x1 brick with a hole, with the hole on the front and back, on the front row to the right of the left 1x6x7 arched door frame. This is on the left 8x8 angled corner plate. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 193.2. Place a light brown 1x1 brick on the left piece from the previous step.
- 193.3. Place a tan 1x1x3 tall brick symmetrically to the previous piece on the right side.
- 193.4. Place a tan 1x1x3 tall brick on the 1x1 brick from step 193.2.
- 193.5. Place a light brown 1x1 brick symmetrically to the previous piece on the right side.
- 193.6. Place a light gray 1x1 brick with a hole, with the hole on the front and back, on the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the left side.
- 193.7. Place a tan 1x2 inverted slope, horizontally with the slope on the right, on the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 194. Place the right stud of a tan 2x2 corner brick, with the corner at the front left so it's oriented like a braille letter H, on the left stud of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

Open group 31.

195.1. Now we'll make a couple of small desks. We'll start by making the supports. There will be four of these, which are all identical. Place a brown 1x2 jumper plate horizontally in front of you.

- 195.2. Place a gold 1x1 tile with a clip, oriented so the clip looks like a U when viewed from the side, on the previous piece.
- 195.3. Clip the bar of a black 1x1 round plate with a bar on one side, with the stud facing up, into the clip of the previous piece.
- 195.4. Repeat steps 195.1-195.3 three times if you haven't already made four of these!
- 195.5. Leaving one free stud to the left of it, place one assembly, with the jumper plate horizontal, on the front row of the left 8x8 angled corner plate. Place another to the right of the first. There should be one free stud to the right of the second one. Repeat the two supports symmetrically on the right side.
- 196. Place a brown 2x4 tile with two studs, horizontally and centered vertically and horizontally, on each pair of supports.
- 197.1. Now we'll tile the tops of the walls! Leaving two free studs to the left of it, place a dark tan 1x4 tile, horizontally, on the left side of the back wall. The left half of a 1x4 hinge plate should be all that's to the left of this piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 197.2. Place a dark tan 1x4 tile with two studs, horizontally, to the right of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 197.3. Find the columns of studs in front of the pieces from the previous step. Place a dark tan 1x6 tile, vertically, on these columns in front of the previous pieces. There should be one free stud in front of them.
- 197.4. Place a dark tan 1x4 tile, horizontally and centered horizontally, on the front row on top. This is on a 1x6 arch brick.
- 198.1. Place a dark tan 1x4 tile, vertically, on the left and right walls, even with the fronts of the walls.
- 198.2. Place a dark tan 1x4 tile with two studs, vertically, behind each of the pieces from the previous step.
- 198.3. Place a dark tan 1x2 tile, vertically, to the right of the back two studs of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 199.1. Almost done! If you feel to the right of the front row on the left wall, you will find two studs, the right one lower than the left one. Place a tan 1x3 inverted slope, horizontally with the slope on the right, on the right one of these studs. The top of this piece should be even with the stud to the left of it. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 199.2. Place the right three studs of a dark tan 1x4 tile, horizontally, on the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 200.1. Find the horizontal 1x4 tile on the front row on top from step 197.4. This is on a 1x6 arch brick. There should be three free studs on each side of this, with the outer stud being lower than the other two. Place a tan 1x3 inverted slope brick, horizontally, with the slope on the left, on the leftmost stud to the left of the 1x4 tile. This is the lower stud. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 200.2. Place a dark tan 1x1 tile on the leftmost stud of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 200.3. Place a dark tan 1x4 tile with two studs, horizontally, to the right of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

Open group 32.

- 201.1. Now we'll build roofs over the sides of the bottom floor! Place a dark tan 4x8 plate, vertically, on the left four columns of the room. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 201.2. Place two sand green 1x2 slope tiles, horizontally with the thick side on the front, in a row on the back row of each of the pieces from the previous step.
- 201.3. Place a gold 1x4x2 ornate fence panel, horizontally, in front of each pair of pieces from the previous step.
- 201.4. Place a tan 1x4 tile, horizontally, on each of the pieces from the previous step.
- 202. Great job! Now the bottom floor is complete. All we need to do is attach the top three floors. Rotate the bottom floor 180 degrees so the windows and the vine with the hidden steps is at the front. Place the top three floors, with the windows at the front, centered horizontally on the bottom floor. The back side of the top floors should be even with the back of the bottom floor.

Congratulations! Now the Hogwarts™: Dumbledore's Office is complete!
