

40711 Hedgehog Picnic Date

Celebrate any special occasion with this adorable LEGO® Hedgehog Picnic Date (40711) animal toy building set packed with fun features. Boys and girls aged 8+ can build, display and stage stories with a playset featuring 2 hedgehog models sitting beneath a heart-shaped mushroom on a heart-shaped base.

This colorful LEGO building set is packed with added play value for kids. The hedgehogs can be detached from the bench to stand freely or they can sit and enjoy a picnic with a blanket, rose, cups, pie and yellow butterfly. They also have paws that can hold the cups.

This playset makes a great LEGO gift for any special occasion including Valentine's Day and can be added to other LEGO building sets (sold separately) so kids can enjoy even bigger animal stories. The hedgehogs also make an attractive display item on a shelf or bedside table once playtime is over.

LEGO® animal toy playset:

2 Hedgehog models:

Welcome to text-based instructions from Bricks for the Blind. Before you start building, here are some terms we'll be using:

- In Front of/Front: towards you.

- Behind/Back: away from you.
- Up: towards the ceiling.
- Down: towards the floor.
- Stud: the bump on a LEGO brick. Example: A 2x1 brick has two studs on it.
- Vertically: with the longest side going from front to back
- Horizontally: with the longest side going from left to right.
- Upright: pointing up towards the ceiling.
- Standing upright: The piece is perpendicular to the ground, like a wall.
- Lying flat: The piece is parallel to the ground, like a piece of toast which fell off the table.
- That one/ppp: previously placed piece.
- Plate: piece with studs.
- Tile: smooth piece without studs (unless otherwise specified)
- A jumper plate is a 1x2 plate with a single stud on top, or a 1x3 plate with only two studs on top.
- "Anti-stud" is a term for the portion of a LEGO piece which accepts studs, like the bottom of a plate or brick.
- Symmetrically: a mirror image. Example: If you place a 2x1 brick with technic connector on the front wall at the right, connector to the front, and then place another such piece symmetrically on the back wall, at the right, the technic connector of the second piece should point to the back, since it will be placed symmetrically.
- Centered-vertically: even amount of space in front of and behind piece
- Centered-horizontally: even amount of space left and right of the piece.
- Row: studs lined up horizontally (left to right/side to side).
- Column: studs lined up upright or vertically (top to bottom/back to front).

For builders with low vision, or a sighted building partner who may want to follow along with the printed visual instructions that come with each kit, PDF versions are always online at LEGO.com: (<https://www.lego.com/en-us/service/building-instructions/40711>) As low vision users may benefit from viewing the instructions on a personal device where they can zoom in on content and use assistive technologies to enhance the visuals.

Sorting the pieces:

To begin a successful build, it helps to sort the pieces into groups, bags or small containers. Have a friend or family member do this in advance following the instructions below. You will see that the pieces should be sorted according to the building steps in the kit. Doing this in advance makes locating the pieces for each step easier. See below on how to sort the pieces to correspond to the steps in this set. Number the containers using letters A-Z, numbers or meaningful names. The parts will be sorted into one or a small number of steps in the instructions. Example: Steps 1-3 means collect all the parts used in steps 1, 2 and 3, and put them in one container.

This LEGO set comes with three bags labeled 1-3, and an instruction booklet. Sort the pieces into groups as described below. Note that where there are multiple colors of the same brick in a step, the colors will be split across two groups to make telling the difference easier for the builder! LEGO includes a few spare parts in case you lose something. Set these into their own group away from the rest, in case you need them later.

This build is 166 pieces, and 76 building steps.

Bag 1 (3 groups of bricks)

Sub-Build 1: First Hedgehog

Group 1 contains the pieces for steps 1-6 of the first hedgehog.

Group 2 contains the pieces for steps 7-13.

Sub-Build2: Lawn Chair

Group 3 contains the pieces for steps 14-18.

Bag 2 (4 groups of bricks)

Sub-Build 3: Second Hedgehog

Group 4 contains the pieces for steps 1-6 of the second hedgehog.

Group 5 contains the pieces for steps 7-12.

Group 6 contains the pieces for steps 13-18.

Sub-Build 4: Lawn Chair

Group 7 contains the pieces for steps 19-24.

Bag 3 (2 groups of bricks)

Sub-Build 5: Picnic Site and Toadstool

Group 8 contains the pieces for steps 1-8 of the picnic site. Include three light green 1x1 plates with a flower pattern from group 9.

Group 9 contains the pieces for steps 9-12.

Bag 4 (3 groups of bricks)

Group 10 contains the pieces for steps 13-20.

Group 11 contains the pieces for steps 21-28.

Group 12 contains the pieces for steps 29-34.

Building Instructions:

Bag 1.

Sub-Build 1: First Hedgehog

Group 1.

1. Let's start building our first hedgehog! We'll start at the bottom and work our way up. Place a white 1x3 jumper plate, horizontally, in front of you.

2. The bottom of the hedgehog is the feet! Let's add those now. Place the back stud of a white 1x2 plate with rounded ends, vertically, under the left stud of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side. These pieces should extend one stud past the first piece.

3. Place a white 1x3 jumper plate, horizontally, on the front studs of the previous two pieces.

4.1. Place a dark gray 1x2x2 tall brick with studs on three sides, vertically with the side studs at the front, left and back, on the left column of the hedgehog. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

4.2. Place a white 1x2 slope tile, horizontally with the tall side on top, on the bottom row of side studs on the front side of the hedgehog. This is the bottom of the hedgehog's white tummy.

5. Place a dark gray 1x2x2 tall brick with studs on three sides, horizontally with the side studs at the front, left and right, on the front row of the hedgehog. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

6. Place a brown 2x4 plate, upright so it is four studs tall with the anti-stud on the right, on the two columns of side studs on the left side of the hedgehog. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

Group 2.

7. Place a brown 1x2 plate, horizontally, on the second row from the top of the left previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

- 8.1. Now we'll build the hedgehog's face! Place a tan 2x3 plate, vertically, in front of you.
- 8.2. Place a white 1x2 half-circle tile, horizontally with the flat side at the front, on the front row of the previous piece. This is the top of the hedgehog's white tummy.
- 8.3. Place a tan 1x2 jumper plate, horizontally, behind the previous piece. The stud on this piece is where we'll place the hedgehog's nose!
- 8.4. Place a white 1x1 tile with a closed eye with long eyelashes on each stud behind the previous piece. These do have directionality, so you might want to ask a sighted person for assistance orienting them.
- 8.5. Place the face, with the eyes on the top, on the three rows of side studs on the front side of the hedgehog.
- 9.1. Now we'll build the hedgehog's arms. Place a tan 1x1 plate with a vertical clip on one side, with the clip at the front, in front of you.
- 9.2. Place the front stud of a brown 1x2 curved slope tile, vertically with the tall side at the front, on the previous piece.
- 9.3. Repeat steps 9.1-9.3.
- 9.4. Place one arm, with the clip at the front, on the second row of side studs from the bottom on the left side of the body. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 10.1. Now we'll add the hedgehog's back. Rotate the hedgehog 180 degrees so the face is at the back. Place a brown 2x4 plate, upright so it is four studs tall, on the side studs on the back of the hedgehog.
- 10.2. Place a brown 2x2 plate, upright and centered top to bottom, on the previous piece.
- 11.1. Rotate the hedgehog 180 degrees so the face is at the front again. Place a brown 2x2 plate on top of the hedgehog.
- 11.2. Place a red 1x1 slope tile, with the tall side on the left, on the front left stud of the previous piece. Place another symmetrically to the right of the first. These two pieces make the red bow this hedgehog wears in its hair!
- 12.1. Place a tan 1x1 cone on the 1x2 jumper plate on the front of the hedgehog. This is the hedgehog's snout.
- 12.2. Now we'll add the nose! Place a black 1x1 round plate on the previous piece.
- 13.1. Now, to finish this hedgehog, place the handle of a yellow mug in her left hand.
- 13.2. Place a 1x2 tile with a chocolate bar pattern in her right hand.

Sub-Build 2: Lawn Chair

Group 3.

14. Now we'll start on a lawn chair. Set the hedgehog aside for now. Place a brown 2x4 tile with two studs, horizontally, in front of you.
15. Place a dark brown 1x2 plate with a vertical clip on one short side, vertically with the clip at the back, under the left column of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

16. Clip the bar of a light brown 1x2 plate with a short bar on one short side, vertically with the bar at the front, into the clip of each of the previous two pieces. We'll use these to hinge the back of the chair up.

17. Place a brown 1x4 tile, horizontally, on the back studs of the previous two pieces so it connects the two. Place another in front of the first.

18.1. Place a dark brown 1x2 brick with a log pattern, vertically, under the front two studs of the left column of the chair. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

18.2. Now, hinge the back of the chair up so it points almost straight up. Place the hedgehog, with the nose at the front, on the two studs on the chair to have her sit in the chair.

Bag 2.

Sub-Build 3: Second Hedgehog with Flower

Group 4.

1. Let's build the second hedgehog! Place a white 1x3 jumper plate, horizontally, in front of you.

2. Now we'll build the feet. Place the back stud of a white 1x2 plate with rounded ends, vertically, under the left stud of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side. These pieces should extend one stud past the first piece.

3. Place a white 1x3 jumper plate, horizontally, on the front studs of the previous two pieces.

4.1. Place a dark gray 1x2x2 tall brick with studs on three sides, vertically with the side studs at the front, left and back, on the left column of the hedgehog. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

4.2. Place a white 1x2 slope tile, horizontally with the tall side on top, on the bottom row of side studs on the front side of the hedgehog. This is the bottom of the hedgehog's white tummy.

5. Place a dark gray 1x2x2 tall brick with studs on three sides, horizontally with the side studs at the front, left and right, on the front row of the hedgehog. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

6. Place a dark brown 2x4 plate, upright so it is four studs tall with the anti-stud on the right, on the two columns of side studs on the left side of the hedgehog. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

Group 5.

7. Place a dark brown 1x2 plate, horizontally, on the second row from the top of the left previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

8.1. Now we'll build the hedgehog's face! Place a tan 2x3 plate, vertically, in front of you.

8.2. Place a white 1x2 half-circle tile, horizontally with the flat side at the front, on the front row of the previous piece. This is the top of the hedgehog's white tummy.

8.3. Place a tan 1x2 jumper plate, horizontally, behind the previous piece. The stud on this piece is where we'll place the hedgehog's nose!

8.4. Place a white 1x1 tile with an open eye pattern on each stud behind the previous piece. These do have directionality, so you might want to ask a sighted person for assistance orienting them.

8.5. Place the face, with the eyes on the top, on the three rows of side studs on the front side of the hedgehog.

9.1. Now we'll build the hedgehog's arms. Place a tan 1x1 plate with a vertical clip on one side, with the clip at the front, in front of you.

9.2. Place the front stud of a dark brown 1x2 curved slope tile, vertically with the tall side at the front, on the previous piece.

9.3. Repeat steps 9.1-9.3.

9.4. Place one arm, with the clip at the front, on the second row of side studs from the bottom on the left side of the body. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

10.1. Now we'll add the hedgehog's back. Rotate the hedgehog 180 degrees so the face is at the back. Place a dark brown 2x4 plate, upright so it is four studs tall, on the side studs on the back of the hedgehog.

10.2. Place a dark brown 2x2 plate, upright and centered top to bottom, on the previous piece.

11. Rotate the hedgehog 180 degrees so the face is at the front again. Place a dark brown 2x2 plate on top of the hedgehog.

12.1. Place a tan 1x1 cone on the 1x2 jumper plate on the front of the hedgehog. This is the hedgehog's snout.

12.2. Now we'll add the nose! Place a black 1x1 round plate on the previous piece.

12.3. Now, to finish this hedgehog, place the handle of a yellow mug in his right hand.

Group 6.

13.1. Now we'll build the hedgehog's flower. Set the second hedgehog aside for now. Place a green four leaf flower in front of you, with the leaves pointing at angles. For example, north is away from you and south is towards you, the leaves should point northeast, northwest, southwest, and southeast.

13.2. Place a light green 1x1 brick with studs on all four sides, with the studs at the front, back, left and right, on the previous piece. These studs should be offset 45 degrees from the leaves.

14.1. Push a light gray 3L bar, from the top, through the hollow top stud of the previous piece. Push this bar down as far as it will go.

15. Place a yellow 1x1 round plate with a hollow stud on top of the 1x1 brick with studs on all four sides.

16.1. Now we'll make the four petals of the flower. Place a red 1x1 plate with a triangular tooth at one side, with the tooth at the back, in front of you.

16.2. Place the back stud of a red 1x2 curved slope tile, vertically with the tall side at the back, on the previous piece.

16.3. Repeat steps 16.1-16.2 three times.

16.4. Place the bottom stud of one petal, with the triangular tooth at the top, on the front side stud from the 1x1 brick with the stud on all four sides. Repeat with all four petals.

17. Place a green 1x1 round plate with an angled bar on the bottom on the bottom of the flower.

18. Place the hedgehog in front of you, with the face at the front. Clip the angled bar on the base of the flower into the hedgehog's right hand, so the flower is pointed up and towards the front.

Sub-Build 4: Lawn Chair

Group 7.

19. Now we'll start on a lawn chair. Set the hedgehog aside for now. Place a brown 2x4 tile with two studs, horizontally, in front of you.

20. Place a dark brown 1x2 plate with a vertical clip on one short side, vertically with the clip at the back, under the left column of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

21. Clip the bar of a light brown 1x2 plate with a short bar on one short side, vertically with the bar at the front, into the clip of each of the previous two pieces. We'll use these to hinge the back of the chair up.

22. Place a brown 1x4 tile, horizontally, on the back studs of the previous two pieces so it connects the two. Place another in front of the first.

23.1. Place a dark brown 1x2 brick with a log pattern, vertically, under the left column of the chair. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

23.2. Now, hinge the back of the chair up so it points almost straight up.

24.1. Place the hedgehog, with the nose at the front, on the two studs on the chair to have him sit in the chair.

24.2. We'll build a small log now by placing a dark brown 2x2 round tile with a log pattern onto a dark brown 2x2 round brick.

24.3. Set the log and a light orange picnic basket in front of the hedgehog on the lawn chair.

Bag 3.

Sub-Build 5: Picnic Site and Toadstool

Group 8.

1.1. Now we'll build the picnic site. Set the second hedgehog and the picnic supplies aside for now. Place a green 4x8 half circle plate, horizontally with the flat side at the front, in front of you.

1.2. Place a white 1x2 slope tile, horizontally with the tall side at the front, centered horizontally on the back row of the previous piece. This row only has two studs.

2.1. Place a white 1x2 slope tile, horizontally with the tall side at the back, centered horizontally on the front row of the half circle plate.

2.2. Place a tan 1x2 tile, vertically, on the back two studs on the third column from the left. Repeat symmetrically on the right side. There should be a 2x2 square of studs between the previous four pieces.

3. Place the back row of a green 2x3 plate, horizontally, on the left three studs on the front row of the picnic site. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

4. Place the back row of an 8x8 plate under the front row of the previous two pieces.

5.1. Place a light green 2x2 tile with two studs, with the studs on the right, on the left two columns so there are three free rows in front of it.

5.2. Place the right two columns of a green 2x3 plate, horizontally, behind the previous piece. This piece should overhang one column to the left.

6. Place the right column of a green 4x8 half circle plate, vertically with the flat side on the right, under the overhanging column of the previous piece, so the front side is even with the front of the 8x8 plate.

7.1. Place a red 1x1 round tile with a ladybug pattern to the right of the back stud of the 2x2 tile with two studs from step 5.1.

7.2. Place the back row of a light green 2x2 tile with two studs, with the studs on the left, to the right of the previous piece. Place another, with the studs on the right, to the right of the first one. There should be one column to the right of the second one.

8.1. Place a green 2x3 plate, vertically, on the front three rows so there are two free columns to the left of the back two rows. It should connect the 8x8 plate to the left 4x8 half circle plate.

8.2. Place the right column of a light green 2x2 tile with two studs, with the studs on the left, behind the left column of the previous piece.

You will have three light green 1x1 round plates with a flower pattern leftover when you finish this group.

Group 9.

9.1. Now we'll make some flowers. Place a leftover light green 1x1 round plate with a flower pattern in front of you.

9.2. Place a pink 1x1 round plate with a flower pattern on the previous piece.

9.3. Repeat steps 9.1-9.2 two times.

9.4. Place one flower assembly on the front and back studs of the second column from the left.

9.5. Place the last flower assembly on the third stud from the back on the rightmost column. This is in front of a 2x3 plate.

10.1. Now we'll place a small toadstool! Place a white 1x1 cone on the back stud on the leftmost column. This column only has two studs.

10.2. Place a red 2x2 dish on the previous piece.

10.3. Place an orange butterfly on the previous piece.

11.1. Now we'll build the picnic blanket! Place a white 1x1 quarter circle tile, with the flat sides at the right and back, on the third stud from the right on the front row. This is to the right of a 2x3 plate.

11.2. Place a red 1x1 tile behind the previous piece.

11.3. Place a white 1x1 quarter circle tile, with the flat sides at the right and front, behind the previous piece.

12.1. Place a red 1x2 tile, horizontally, to the right of the previous piece.

12.2. Place a white 1x2 jumper plate, horizontally, in front of the previous piece.

12.3. Place a red 1x2 tile, horizontally, in front of the previous piece.

12.4. Place a white 1x1 quarter circle tile, with the flat sides at the left and back, to the right of the previous piece.

12.5. Place a red 1x1 tile behind the previous piece.

12.6. Place a white 1x1 quarter circle tile, with the flat sides at the left and front, behind the previous piece. Now the blanket is complete!

Bag 4.

Group 10.

13. Now we'll start building the toadstool. We'll start on the stem. Set the picnic aside for now. Place a brown 2x2 plate in front of you.

14. Place a white 1x2x2 tall brick with four studs on one side, vertically with the side studs on the left, on the left column of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

15. Place a tan 2x2 grooved tall brick on the previous two pieces.

16. Place a white 2x2 brick on the previous piece.

17. Place a white 1x2x2 tall brick with four studs on one side, vertically with the side studs on the left, on the left column of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

18. There should now be four side studs on both the left and right sides of the toadstool stem. Place a white 1x6 curved slope brick, upright with the studs on the bottom left, on each column of side studs on the left side of the toad stool. Repeat symmetrically on the right side. You'll place a total of four 1x6 curved slope bricks.

19.1. Place a brown 2x2 plate on top of the stem.

19.2. Place a black 2x2 round plate on the previous piece.

20. Place the picnic area back in front of you, with the curved sides at the back and the left. Find the two 1x2 slope tiles near the back of the back curved section. Remember these form an open square with some 1x2 tile. Place the bottom of the stem in this square.

Group 11.

21.1. Now we'll build the top of the toadstool! This is called the cap. Set the picnic area aside for now. Place a dark gray 4x4 plate in front of you.

21.2. Place a brown 2x2 plate on the previous piece so the back and right sides are even.

22.1. Place the left two columns of a green 2x3 plate, horizontally, in front of the previous piece.

22.2. Place a brown 2x2 plate to the left of the previous piece.

22.3. Place a green 2x3 plate, vertically, behind the previous piece.

23. Place a dark gray 2x2 corner plate, with the corner at the front left so the studs form a braille letter H, on the third and fourth columns from the left so there are two free rows in front of it.

24. Place the right two studs of a black 3x3 corner plate, with the corner at the front left, in front of the previous piece.

25. Place the front row of a red 2x2 tile on the left two studs on the front row of the previous piece.

26.1. Place a red 2x3 curved slope tile, vertically with the tall side at the back, in front of the previous piece.

26.2. Place a red 2x3 curved slope tile, horizontally with the tall side at the right, to the left of the 2x2 tile from step 25.

27.1. Place the second and third rows from the front of a red 2x6 plate with two rounded corners, vertically with the rounded corners on the left, under the left two columns of the previous piece.

27.2. Place the second and third columns from the left of a red 2x6 plate with two rounded corners, horizontally with the rounded corners at the front, under the front two rows of the vertical 2x3 curved slope tile from step 26.1.

28.1. Place a red 3x3 quarter low dome, with the flat sides on the back and right, to the left of the vertical 2x3 curved slope tile from step 26.1.

28.2. Place a 1x3 curved slope tile, vertically with the tall side at the back, on the third column from the right on the cap, so the front sides are even.

28.3. Place a 1x3 curved slope tile, horizontally with the tall side at the back, on the third row from the back on the cap, so the left sides are even.

Group 12.

29.1. Rotate the cap 180 degrees so the previous piece is in the back right corner. Place the back two studs on the right column of a red 2x3 plate, vertically, under the third and fourth studs from the back on the second column from the left. The left side of this piece should be even with the left side of the cap.

29.2. Place the right two studs on the back row of a red 2x3 plate, horizontally, under the third and fourth studs from the right on the second row from the front. The front side of this piece should be even with the front side of the cap.

30.1. Place a red 1x1 tile in front of the 1x3 curved slope tile on the third column from the left of the cap.

30.2. Place a red 1x2 left wedged curved slope tile, vertically with the point at the front and the longest side at the left, in front of the previous piece.

30.3. Place a red 1x1 tile to the left of the 1x3 curved slope tile on the third row from the front of the cap.

30.4. Place a red 1x2 right wedged curved slope tile, horizontally with the point at the left and the longest side at the front, to the left of the previous piece.

Note for sighted helpers, the order of parts for steps 31 and 32 have been changed.

31. Place the right two columns of a red 3x3 quarter low dome, with the flat sides on the front and right, on the left two columns of the cap, so the back sides are even. Place another symmetrically in front of the first.

32. Place the back two rows of a red 3x3 quarter low dome, with the flat sides on the back and left, on the front two rows of the cap, so the right sides are even. Place another symmetrically to the left of the first.

33. Flip the cap upside down so the two half circular sides are at the back and right. Place a light gray 4x4 hollow round plate, upside down, on the cap so there are two free rows in front, and two free columns to the left of it.

34.1. Place the picnic area back in front of you, with the 4x8 half circle plates on the left and back sides. Flip the cap upright so the two half circular sides are at the back and right. Place the cap on the stem so the 4x4 hollow round plate goes around the 2x2 round plate on top of the step.

34.2. Now we can place the hedgehogs and their lawn chairs! Find the two pairs of 2x2 tiles with two studs. These are on the fourth and fifth rows from the front. Place the legs of the lawn chair with the hedgehog holding the flower, with the back of the chair at the back, on the right pair. Place the other hedgehog's chair on the left pair. Place the picnic basket on the stud on the picnic blanket, and place the stump on the front right corner of the picnic area. Now the build is complete!
