

11202 Bluey's Beach and Family Trip

Bluey's Beach & Family Car Trip (11202) sees Bluey, Bingo and Mum pack the car for a fun-filled day at the beach. This interactive preschool toy for fans of the Bluey TV show is ideal for kids aged 4 and up, offering endless imaginative play and developing their creative and problem-solving skills.

This LEGO® toy features the Bluey show's iconic vehicle, with 2 surfboards attached to the top and a trunk at the rear to store the cooler in. The car's flip-open roof gives kids easy access to the interior, where there are seats for the Bluey, Bingo and Chilli (Bluey's mum) minifigures. Beach features to inspire imaginative play include an impressive sandcastle, a sand-mermaid tail which a minifigure can fit into, reclining chair, beach umbrella and a palm tree. Accessories include a crab, an ice cream, sunglasses and sunscreen.

With a big Starter Brick to get the fun started quickly, and a colorful instruction booklet, LEGO sets for ages 4 and up are the ideal way for adults and kids to share the creative fun.

Welcome to text-based instructions from Bricks for the Blind. Before you start building, here are some terms we'll be using:

- In Front of/Front: towards you.
- Behind/Back: away from you.
- Up: towards the ceiling.
- Down: towards the floor.
- Stud: the bump on a LEGO brick. Example: A 2x1 brick has two studs on it.
- Vertically: with the longest side going from front to back
- Horizontally: with the longest side going from left to right.
- Upright: pointing up towards the ceiling.
- Standing upright: The piece is perpendicular to the ground, like a wall.
- Lying flat: The piece is parallel to the ground, like a piece of toast which fell off the table.
- That one/ppp: previously placed piece.
- Plate: piece with studs.
- Tile: smooth piece without studs (unless otherwise specified)
- A jumper plate is a 1x2 plate with a single stud on top, or a 1x3 plate with only two studs on top.
- "Anti-stud" is a term for the portion of a LEGO piece which accepts studs, like the bottom of a plate or brick.
- Symmetrically: a mirror image. Example: If you place a 2x1 brick with technic connector on the front wall at the right, connector to the front, and then place another such piece symmetrically on the back wall, at the right, the technic connector of the second piece should point to the back, since it will be placed symmetrically.
- Centered-vertically: even amount of space in front of and behind piece
- Centered-horizontally: even amount of space left and right of the piece.
- Row: studs lined up horizontally (left to right/side to side).
- Column: studs lined up upright or vertically (top to bottom/back to front).

For builders with low vision, or a sighted building partner who may want to follow along with the printed visual instructions that come with each kit, PDF versions are always online at LEGO.com:

Sorting the pieces:

To begin a successful build, it helps to sort the pieces into groups, bags or small containers. Have a friend or family member do this in advance following the instructions below. You will see that the pieces should be sorted according to the building steps in the kit. Doing this in advance makes locating the pieces for each step easier. See below on how to sort the pieces to correspond to the steps in this set. Number the containers using letters A-Z, numbers or meaningful names. The parts will be sorted into one or a small number of steps in the instructions. Example: Steps 1-3 means collect all the parts used in steps 1, 2 and 3, and put them in one container.

This LEGO set comes with three bags labeled 1-3, and an instruction booklet. Sort the pieces into groups as described below. Note that where there are multiple colors of the same brick in a step, the colors will be split across two groups to make telling the difference easier for the builder! LEGO includes a few spare parts in case you lose something. Set these into their own group away from the rest, in case you need them later.

A note for piece sorters: this set does not have numbered steps. I'll use the page numbers to identify which pieces go in which groups for sorting! I'll make numbered steps in the instructions, with the corresponding page in parenthesis.

This build is 133 pieces, and 76 building steps.

Bag 1 (5 groups of bricks)

Minifigure Group 1 contains the pieces for pages 6 - 9 of booklet #1.

Main Build 1: Family Car

Group 1 contains the pieces for pages 10 - 25 of booklet #1.

Group 2 contains the pieces for pages 26 - 45.

Group 3 contains the pieces for pages 46 - 63.

Group 4 contains the pieces for pages 64 - 77.

Bag 2 (4 groups of bricks)

Minifigure Group 2 contains the pieces for pages 4 - 5 of booklet #2.

Sub-Build 1: Sand Playtime

Group 5 contains the pieces for pages 6 - 21 of booklet #2.

Group 6 contains the pieces for pages 22 - 35.

Bag 3 (5 groups of bricks)

Minifigure Group 3 contains the pieces for pages 4 - 7 of booklet #3.

Main Build 2: Beach

Group 7 contains the pieces for pages 8 - 23 of booklet #3.

Group 8 contains the pieces for pages 24 - 41.

Group 9 contains the pieces for pages 42 - 51.

Group 10 contains the pieces for pages 52 - 77.

Building Instructions:

Bag 1.

Minifigure Group 1: Mum (Chilli)

Assemble the Mum minifigure by putting the torso on the legs and the head on the torso. Mum's fur is mostly orange, but she has a large patch of yellow fur on her tummy, a yellow stripe on her nose, and a brown patch covering one eye and ear. Mum can ride on the green surfboard!

Main Build 1: Family Car.

Group 1.

1. (Pages 10 & 11 of booklet #1) Place a dark orange 6x16x2 vehicle base, horizontally, in front of you. This piece has a wall of studs that goes around it, with the middle part lower than the walls.

2. (Pages 12 & 13) Place a tan 1x4 brick, vertically and centered vertically, to the left of the right wall of the car.

3. (Pages 14 & 15) Place a light gray 1x1 tile with a steering wheel, vertically with the steering wheel facing left, to the left of the front two studs of the last piece.

4. (Pages 16 & 17) Find a tan 2x6x2 bench seat. This piece is the front two seats of the car and it has two pairs of studs on one side which form the bottom of the seat. Place this, vertically with the studs on top and the back of the seat at the left, in the car to the left of the steering wheel.

5. (Pages 18 & 19) Place another tan 2x6x2 bench seat, vertically with the studs on top and the back of the seat at the left, to the left of the last piece.

6. (Pages 20 & 21) Place a light gray 2x4 brick, vertically and centered vertically, to the left of the last piece.

7. (Pages 22 & 23) Place a tan 1x4 brick, vertically, on the right column of the last piece.

8. (Pages 24 & 25) Place a light gray 1x4 tile, vertically, to the left of the last piece.

Group 2.

9.1. (Pages 26 & 27) Place a light gray 1x4 panel, vertically with the wall at the left, to the left of the last piece.

9.2. (Pages 26 & 27) Place the left stud of a dark orange 1x3 brick, horizontally, in front of the last piece. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

10. (Pages 28 & 29) Place a dark orange 1x6 brick, vertically, on the right stud of the last two pieces so it connects to both of them.

11. (Pages 30 & 31) Place a dark orange 1x6 brick, vertically, on the last piece.

12. (Pages 32 & 33) Place a dark orange 1x2x2 tall slope brick, horizontally with the slope on the left, on the front wall to the left of the last two pieces. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

13. (Pages 34 & 35) Place the left column of a light gray 2x6 plate, vertically, on the right studs of the last two pieces.

14. (Pages 36 & 37) Place a black 1x2 plate with a clip on top of one side, horizontally with the clip on the right, on the front row of the last piece. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

15. (Pages 38 & 39) Place a black 1x4 plate, vertically, between the left studs of the last two pieces.

16. (Pages 40 & 41) Place a dark orange 1x3 tile, vertically, on the leftmost column of the car so the front sides are even. The back two studs will be on the last piece. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

17.1. (Pages 42 & 43) Now let's add some detail to the left side of the car! There are two rows of six side studs on the left of the car. Place a light gray 2x2 plate, with the studs on the left, centered vertically on the left side studs.

17.2. (Pages 42 & 43) Place a light gray 1x2 grille tile, vertically, on the bottom row in front of the last piece. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

18. (Pages 44 & 45) Find a light gray 3x3 round tile. The bottom of this piece has four little circles on it. Place these four circles on the four studs of the sideways 2x2 plate on the left side of the car. This looks like the cover to a spare tire!

Group 3.

19.1. (Pages 46 & 47) Now we'll place some pieces on the right side of the car. There are two rows of six side studs on the right of the car. Place a black 2x2 tile, centered vertically, on the right side studs.

19.2. Place a dark orange 1x2 plate, upright, on the front column of side studs on the right side of the car. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

20. (Pages 48 & 49) Place a dark orange 2x6 tile with a car front pattern on it, vertically, on the last two pieces so it covers all the side studs on the right side of the car. This piece is printed with the headlights, grille, and licence plate of the car. The instructions show it with the licence plate at the bottom. You may want to ask a sighted person for help, or use an app to get the orientation right if that's important to you.

21. (Pages 50 & 51) Now we'll add the mirrors! Place a light gray 1x1 brick with a bar on one side, with the bar at the front, on the third stud from the right on the front row of the car. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

22. (Pages 52 & 53) Place the front row of a dark orange 2x3 slope brick, horizontally with the slope on the right, to the right of the front piece from the last step. The front side should be even with the front of the car and the right side should overhang just a little bit. Put two more behind the first one so the whole right side of the car is covered by slopes.

23. (Pages 54 & 55) Place a clear 2x6x2 windshield, vertically with the slope on the right, on the two rightmost columns of studs. The left side of the windshield should be over the mirrors.

24. (Pages 56 & 57) Place a light gray 1x6 plate, vertically, on the last piece.

25. (Pages 58 & 59) Place two dark orange 1x3 tiles, vertically, on the last piece.

26. (Pages 60 & 61) Now we'll put some handles on the car for the doors! Find the four studs on the front side of the car. Place a light gray 1x2 tile with rounded ends on the middle two studs on the front side.

27. (Pages 62 & 63) Turn the car around so the windshield is on the left now. Repeat the last step on this side of the car to add another door handle

Group 4.

28. (Pages 64 & 65) Let's add the roof to the car! Find a dark orange 6x6 plate with four bars on it. Find the two clips on the top of the car, near the right side. Clip the right two bars on the 6x6 plate with bars into the two clips. The left side of the plate should rest on top of the tiles over the windshield.

29. (Pages 66 & 67) Place a red 1x1 round tile with a ladybug pattern on the back left corner of the last piece.

30. (Pages 68 & 69) Next we'll add a roof rack to the car. Find a black 1x6 bar with four hollow studs on top and one on each end. Place this, vertically, on the second column from the left on top of the car. Place another on the rightmost column on top of the car.

31. (Pages 70 & 71) Place a black 1x5 plate with rounded ends, horizontally, on the front studs on top of the last two pieces. Repeat symmetrically on the back side. There should be two free studs between these two pieces.

32. (Pages 72 & 73) Place a purple surfboard, horizontally with the pointy side on the left, on the front piece from the last step.

33. (Pages 74 & 75) Find the four fenders on the car, there are two on the front and two on the back. Each one has a cross shaped hole inside of it. Find the four wheels. Each of these has an axle that goes inside the cross shaped holes. Push the axles of each of the wheels into the four holes.

34. (Pages 76 & 77) Now you can hinge the roof open to put Mum in the driver's seat! Her green surfboard can go on top of the car on the other side of the roof rack.

Bag 2.

Minifigure group 2: Bluey

Assemble the Bluey minifigure by putting the torso on the legs and the head on the torso. Bluey's fur is mostly medium blue, but she has a large patch of light blue fur on her tummy, her muzzle is light brown, and her head and ears are dark blue with a light blue stripe above her nose.

You can push the short bar on a pair of swimming goggles into a tiny hole between Bluey's ears. The goggles don't cover Bluey's eyes, instead they are flipped up like she's moved them out of the way. You can also clip a shovel into her left hand!

Sub-Build 1: Sand Playtime

Group 5.

35.1. (Pages 6 & 7 of booklet #2) We'll start by building a little pile of sand. Place a tan 2x2 half cylinder brick in front of you, with the studs horizontal on top.

35.2. (Pages 6 & 7) Push the bar of a bar with two little leaves on top, with the leaves on the left and right, into the right hollow stud of the last piece.

35.3. (Pages 6 & 7) Find a light brown 4x3 plant leaves. This has two regular studs with anti-studs, and four studs that don't have anti-studs. Place the right normal stud of this piece, horizontally with the angled arms looking like an arrow pointing to the right, to the left of the last piece

36. (Pages 8 & 9) Place Bluey next to the sand pile with her shovel so she can start digging!

37. (Pages 10 & 11) Now we'll build a bit of sand where the girls can bury each other in sand! Set Bluey and the sand pile aside. Place a tan 8x8 plate with one rounded end, with the rounded end on the left, in front of you.

38.1. (Pages 12 & 13) Place a light green 2x2 plate on the back right corner of the last piece.

38.2. (Pages 12 & 13) Place a sparkly blue 1x1 rock on the back row to the left of the last piece.

39. (Pages 14 & 15) Place a white 2x2 brick on the 2x2 plate in the back right corner.

40. (Pages 16 & 17) Place a dark brown 1x2 plate, horizontally, on the back row to the left of the rock.

41.1. (Pages 18 & 19) Place the back row of a light brown 2x2 curved slope tile, with the tallest side at the back, on the last piece so the back sides are even. This is the pillow of sand one of the girls can rest on while she's buried in sand!

41.2. (Pages 18 & 19) Place a light brown 2x3 tile, vertically, in front of the last piece. This tile will let the girls slide in and out of the pile of sand.

42. (Pages 20 & 21) Place a white 4x4 double wedge plate, with the studs at the front, so the left and right sides are on the left and right of the last piece. The studs should be in front of the 2x3 tile.

Group 6.

43. (Pages 22 & 23) Place a tan 4x4 double wedge plate, with the studs at the front, on the last piece.

44. (Pages 24 & 25) Place another tan 4x4 double wedge plate, with the studs at the front, on the last piece.

45.1. (Pages 26 & 27) Place a tan 4x4 triple curved slope, with the tallest, widest side at the back, on the last piece. This piece is printed with seashells, rocks, and a drawing of a mermaid tail! This makes it look like whoever is buried in the sand is a beautiful mermaid! There should be a hole at the back of the pile of sand that a minifigure's legs can go into.

45.2. (Pages 26 & 27) Place a red bucket on the second stud from the front on the second column from the left on the 8x8 plate. There should be one stud in front of it and none to the left.

46. (Pages 28 & 29) Place a white 2x2 tile with a bar with a stud sticking out of it on the 2x2 brick in the back right corner. This will be the pole for the beach umbrella!

47. (Pages 30 & 31) Place a transparent purple umbrella on the last piece

48. (Pages 32 & 33) Place an orange 1x1 round plate with a flower petal pattern on the last piece. This completes the sand mermaid!

49.1. (Pages 34 & 35) Now let's build a cooler! Place a blue 2x4 chest bottom, horizontally with the tallest side at the front, in front of you.

49.2. (Pages 34 & 35) Clip the white lid of the chest, horizontally, into the clips on the back of the last piece. The lid should hinge open and closed.

49.3. (Pages 34 & 35) Place a transparent blue popsicle and a yellow banana in the ice chest and close it.

Bag 3.

Minifigure group 3: Bingo

Assemble the Bingo minifigure by putting the torso on the legs and the head on the torso. Bingo's fur is mostly orange, but she has a large patch of yellow fur on her tummy, her muzzle is yellow, and her head and ears are brown with a yellow stripe above her nose.

Assemble a juice box for Bingo by placing an orange 1x1 round plate with a flower petal pattern on a white 1x1 brick with a juice box pattern.

Main Build 2: Beach

Group 7.

50. (Pages 8 & 9 of booklet #3) Now we'll start building the beach! Find a tan 8x8 base brick. This piece has a row of four recessed studs on three sides, and a row of four studs that overhang on the other side. Place this piece in front of you, with the overhanging studs on the right.

51.1. (Pages 10 & 11) Place a light brown 1x4 plate, horizontally, on the front recessed row on the last piece.

51.2. (Pages 10 & 11) Place the right column of a light brown 2x4 plate, vertically, on the left recessed row of the base brick. It will overhang one column to the left.

51.3. (Pages 10 & 11) Place the front row of a light blue 2x4 curved slope tile, horizontally with the tall side at the front, on the back recessed row of the brick base. It will overhang one column to the back.

52. (Pages 12 & 13) Place the rightmost column of a light brown 8x8 plate with one rounded end, with the rounded end on the left, centered vertically under the left overhanging column of the rest of the base.

53. (Pages 14 & 15) Place the front row of a light blue 4x8 half circle plate, horizontally with the flat side at the front, under the back overhanging row of the rest of the base so the right side is even with the right, non-overhanging, side of the base.

54.1. (Pages 16 & 17) Place a light blue 1x2 half circle tile, horizontally with the flat side at the back, in front of the right two studs of the 2x4 curved slope tile from step 51.3.

54.2. (Pages 16 & 17) Find a light blue 4x4 rounded corner tile. This tile is cut out so it looks like a macaroni noodle, I'll call pieces with this shape "macaroni" from now on. Place the back stud of this piece, with the flat sides at the back and the left, to the left of the last piece.

54.3. (Pages 16 & 17) Place a white 3x3 macaroni tile, with the flat sides on the back and the left, to the left of the last piece so the back and left sides are even.

55. (Pages 18 & 19) Place a light blue 2x2 curved slope tile, with the tall side on the right, to the left of the last two pieces.

56.1. (Pages 20 & 21) Place a light blue 1x2 tile, vertically, to the left of the last piece.

56.2. (Pages 20 & 21) Place a light blue 2x2 tile with a single stud to the left of the last piece.

57.1. (Pages 22 & 23) Place a light blue 1x2 tile, vertically, to the left of the last piece. Place another to the left of the first.

57.2. (Pages 22 & 23) Place a light blue 2x2 curved slope tile, with the tall side on the right, to the left of the left piece from the last step.

Group 8.

58. (Pages 24 & 25) Now we'll make a sand castle! Place a tan 1x4 arch brick, vertically, above the left 1x2 tile from step 57.1. One leg of the arch should be in front of the tile and the other should be behind it.

59. (Pages 26 & 27) Place a tan 1x4 arch brick, horizontally, to the right of the front stud of the last piece.

60. (Pages 28 & 29) Place the front stud of a tan 1x4 arch brick, vertically, to the right of the last piece.

61. (Pages 30 & 31) Place two tan 1x2x2 arched window frames, horizontally with the window at the front, in front of the front wall of the sand castle so there is a two stud gap between them.

62. (Pages 32 & 33) Place the front row of a tan 1x2x2 cone on each of the last two pieces.

63. (Pages 34 & 35) Push the bar of a bar with two little leaves on top, with the leaves facing left and right, into the hollow stud of each of the last two pieces.

63. (Pages 36 & 37) Place a light gray 2x2 tile with a pin sticking up on the front row of the beach so there are six free columns to the right of it.

64.1. (Pages 38 & 39) Rotate the beach 180 degrees so the sand castle is on the right. Place a red crab, with the claws at the front, on the stud on the tiles inside the sand castle.

64.2. (Pages 38 & 39) Place a light green 1x1 round plate with three leaves, with the leaves at the front, in front of both the left and right walls of the sand castle.

65.1. (Pages 40 & 41) Place a pink 1x1 round plate with a flower petal pattern on the front stud of the left wall of the castle, and another on the second stud from the front on the right wall.

65.2. (Pages 40 & 41) Place a sparkly blue 1x1 rock on the back wall of the castle, to the right of the left cone.

Group 9.

66. (Pages 42 & 43) Now, let's make a palm tree! Find the pin sticking up near the back of the beach, to the left of the sand castle. Find a dark brown 2L pin connector. This looks like a cylinder with a hole at each end. Push the bottom hole onto the pin.

67. (Pages 44 & 45) Find a black 2L pin. This is a thin cylinder with a ring around the middle. Push one side into the last piece.

68. (Pages 46 & 47) Push one side of a brown 2L pin connector onto the top side of the last piece.

69.1. (Pages 48 & 49) Find a brown wavy piece that has a pin on one side and a bar on the other. This will be the top of the tree trunk.

69.2. (Pages 48 & 49) Clip a light green set of seven leaves with a clip on one side onto the narrowest end of the previous piece. Clip another, facing the opposite direction from the first, right below the first one.

69.3. (Pages 50 & 51) Rotate the tree assembly we just made so the leaves are at the top and the pin side is at the bottom. Push the pin into the top pin connector. The leaves should be on the right and left.

Group 10.

70.1. (Pages 52 & 53) Now we'll start building a beach chair! We'll start by building the seat. Place a tan 2x2 plate in front of you.

70.2. (Pages 52 & 53) Place an orange 1x2 plate, horizontally, on the front row of the last piece.

70.3. (Pages 52 & 53) Place a white 1x2 plate with two clips on one side, horizontally with the clips at the back, behind the last piece.

70.4. (Pages 52 & 53) Place an orange 2x2 tile with two studs, with the studs at the front, on the last two pieces.

71. (Pages 54 & 55) Find the four studs overhanging the beach to the left. Place the seat of the chair to the right of the front two of these overhanging studs.

72.1. (Pages 56 & 57) Now let's build the back of the chair! Place a light gray 1x2 plate with a bar on one side, horizontally with the bar at the front, in front of you.

72.2. (Pages 56 & 57) Place the front row of an orange 2x2 curved slope tile, with the tall side at the front, on the previous piece.

73. (Pages 58 & 59) Clip the bar of the chair back onto the two clips on the back side of the base of the chair, then rotate the back so it is upright.

74. (Pages 60 & 61) Find a white sea shell. This can be hinged open and closed. Close it, and place it, with the round side at the front, on the second and third studs from the front on the third column from the left of the beach. There should be one free stud to the left of the back stud of this piece, and one free stud in front of it.

75. (Pages 62 & 63) Make a can of soda by placing a silver 1x1 round tile on a blue 1x1 round brick. Place the can of soda on the back right stud of the four studs to the right of the beach chair.

76. (Pages 76 & 77) Now we can extend the beach! Place the section of the beach with the umbrella in front of you, with the umbrella in the back right corner. Clip the overhanging four studs on the left side of the beach onto the right column in front of the umbrella.
