The set shows Paisley and Aliya visiting Paisley's beekeeper grandparents and features sweet details and surprises at every turn. Discover cute bee and ladybug tiles, plus flowers and trees based on real-world plant species. Fun accessories include a seed packet, watering can, compost bin, a yarn ball and more.

Explore how honey is made, with hives that open to reveal the honeycomb inside. Realistic details include the beekeeper's protective hat and smoker. Tend to the flowers, then head inside to see the bedroom or explore the store, where the grandparents sell seeds, candles, honeycomb and honey.

- 1,161-piece set with a model measuring over 7 in. (18 cm) high, 14 in. (36 cm) wide and 7.5 in. (19 cm) deep.

Welcome to text-based instructions from Bricks for the Blind. Before you start building, here are some terms we'll be using:

- In Front of/Front: towards you.
- Behind/Back: away from you.
- Up: towards the ceiling.
- Down: towards the floor.
- Stud: the bump on a LEGO brick. Example: A 2x1 brick has two studs on it.
- Vertically: with the longest side going from front to back
- Horizontally: with the longest side going from left to right.
- Upright: pointing up towards the ceiling.
- Standing upright: The piece is perpendicular to the ground, like a wall.
- Lying flat: The piece is parallel to the ground, like a piece of toast which fell off the table.
- That one/ppp: previously placed piece.
- Plate: piece with studs.
- Tile: smooth piece without studs (unless otherwise specified)
- A jumper plate is a 1x2 plate with a single stud on top, or a 1x3 plate with only two studs on top.
- "Anti-stud" is a term for the portion of a LEGO piece which accepts studs, like the bottom of a plate or brick.
- Symmetrically: a mirror image. Example: If you place a 2x1 brick with technic connector on the front wall at the right, connector to the front, and then place another such piece symmetrically on the back wall, at the right, the technic connector of the second piece should point to the back, since it will be placed symmetrically.
- Centered-vertically: even amount of space in front of and behind piece
- Centered-horizontally: even amount of space left and right of the piece.
- Row: studs lined up horizontally (left to right/side to side).
- Column: studs lined up upright or vertically (top to bottom/back to front).

For builders with low vision, or a sighted building partner who may want to follow along with the printed visual instructions that come with each kit, PDF versions are always online at LEGO.com: (<https://www.lego.com/en-us/service/building-instructions/42669>) As low vision users may benefit from viewing the instructions on a personal device where they can zoom in on content and use assistive technologies to enhance the visuals.

Sorting the pieces:

To begin a successful build, it helps to sort the pieces into groups, bags or small containers. Have a friend or family member do this in advance following the instructions below. You will see that the pieces should be sorted according to the building steps in the kit. Doing this in advance makes locating the pieces for each step easier. See below on how to sort the pieces to correspond to the steps in this set. Number the containers using letters A-Z, numbers or meaningful names. The parts will be sorted into one or a small number of steps in the instructions. Example: Steps 1-3 means collect all the parts used in steps 1, 2 and 3, and put them in one container.

This LEGO set comes with eight bags labeled 1-8, some loose parts, a sticker sheet, and three instruction booklets. Sort the pieces into groups as described below. Note that where there are multiple colors of the same brick in a step, the colors will be split across two groups to make telling the difference easier for the builder! LEGO includes a few spare parts in case you lose something. Set these into their own group away from the rest, in case you need them later.

This build is 1161 pieces, and 328 building steps.

Bag 1 (8 groups of bricks)

Mini-Doll Group 1 contains the pieces to build the Terence mini-doll.

Sub-Build 1: Vegetable Garden

Group 1 contains the pieces for steps 1-9.

Group 2 contains the pieces for steps 10-11.

Group 3 contains the pieces for steps 12-16.

Group 4 contains the pieces for steps 17-23.

Group 5 contains the pieces for steps 24-29.

Group 6 contains the pieces for step 30.

Group 7 contains the pieces for steps 31-32. Stack the three orange 1x1 round plates from this group.

Group 8 contains the pieces for steps 33-34.

Bag 2 (3 groups of bricks)

Mini-Doll Group 2 contains the pieces to build the Aliya mini-doll.

Main Build: Beekeeper's House

Group 9 contains the pieces for steps 1-9 of the house.

Group 10 contains the pieces for steps 10-17.

Group 11 contains the pieces for steps 18-26. Stack the three purple 1x1 round plates with a flower pattern, but leave the pink ones loose.

Group 12 contains the pieces for steps 27-33.

Group 13 contains the pieces for steps 34-36.

Bag 3 (3 groups of bricks)

Group 14 contains the pieces for steps 37-45, including a transparent orange 1x1 round plate, a transparent orange 1x1 cone, and two orange 1x1 round tiles from steps 46-47.

Group 15 contains the pieces for steps 46-49.

Group 16 contains the pieces for steps 50-62. Place sticker #8 from step 50.

Group 17 contains the pieces for steps 63-68, including four light purple 1x1 bricks from step 69.

Group 18 contains the pieces for steps 69-70.

Group 19 contains the pieces for steps 71-73. Place sticker #3 from step 73.

Group 20 contains the pieces for steps 74-83. Place stickers #2 and #6 from step 74. Place two sticker #9s from step 82.

Group 21 contains the pieces for steps 84-96.

Bag 4 (5 groups of bricks)

Group 22 contains the pieces for steps 97-105. Stack the two white 1x2 plates from step 97. Place sticker #5 from step 103.

Group 23 contains the pieces for steps 106-116, including a dark green 1x2 ingot tile from step 119.

Stack the two brown 1x6 bricks from step 109.

Group 24 contains the pieces for steps 117-122. Place sticker #7 from step 119.

Group 25 contains the pieces for steps 123-127, including a light green 1x1 round plate with three leaves from step 129. Place two sticker #1s from step 123.

Group 26 contains the pieces for steps 128-133.

Bag 5 (7 groups of bricks)

Group 27 contains the pieces for steps 134-137.

Group 28 contains the oranges pieces for steps 138-141, including the 1x1 and 1x2 tiles.
Group 29 contains the other pieces for steps 138-141.
Group 30 contains the pieces for steps 142-145. Place two sticker #4s from step 144.
Group 31 contains the pieces for steps 146-153.
Group 32 contains the pieces for steps 154-159.
Group 33 contains the pieces for steps 160-168.

Bag 6 (5 groups of bricks)

Mini-Doll Group 3 contains the pieces to build the Paisley mini-doll.

Sub-Build 2: Flower Garden with beehives

Group 34 contains the pieces for steps 1-7 of the flower garden.

Group 35 contains the pieces for steps 8-15.

Group 36 contains the pieces for steps 16-23.

Group 37 contains the pieces for steps 24-29.

Bag 7 (9 groups of bricks)

Mini-Doll Group 4 contains the pieces to build the Orla mini-doll and her smoker.

Group 38 contains the pieces for steps 30-38.

Group 39 contains the pieces for steps 39-48.

Group 40 contains the pieces for steps 49-56.

Group 41 contains the pieces for steps 57-58.

Group 42 contains the pieces for steps 59-60, including the two transparent blue 1x1 round plates from step 59.

Group 43 contains the pieces for steps 61-71.

Group 44 contains the pieces for steps 72-82.

Group 45 contains the pieces for steps 83-91.

Bag 8 (6 groups of bricks)

Group 46 contains the pieces for steps 92-98.

Group 47 contains the pale purple 1x1 round plates with a flower petal pattern from step 102.

Group 48 contains the pieces for steps 99-103, not including the pale purple 1x1 round plates with a flower petal pattern from group 47.

Group 49 contains the pieces for steps 104-110. Stack the three green 1x1 round plates with three leaves from step 106.

Group 50 contains the pieces for steps 111-119.

Group 51 contains the pieces for steps 120-126.

Building Instructions:

Bag 1.

Mini-Doll Group 1: Terence

Assemble the Terence mini-doll by placing the torso on the legs, the head on the torso, and the hair on the head. Clip a shovel into Terence's right hand. Terence has gray hair, moustache and goatee. He's wearing glasses, a light purple shirt, and red pants held up by suspenders. His shoes are brown, lace-up work boots for working in the garden!

Sub-Build 1: Vegetable Garden

Group 1.

1.1. Let's start building the vegetable garden! Place a green 4x6 plate, horizontally, in front of you.

1.2. Place a light gray 1x2 brick with a hole, horizontally, on the back row of the previous piece so the left sides are even.

2.1. Place a tan 3x3 plate in front of the previous piece so the left sides are even.

2.2. Place a dark tan 1x6 plate, horizontally, on the back row of the 4x6 plate to the right of the 1x2 brick. It should overhang two studs to the right.

3. Place the left two studs on the back row of a green 4x10 plate, vertically, under the overhanging studs of the previous piece. The back side should be even with the back of the 4x6 plate.

4. Place a light gray 1x2 brick with a hole, horizontally, on the back row of the previous piece so the right sides are even.

5.1. Place a light gray 1x1 round tile in front of the third stud from the left on the 1x6 plate on the back row of the garden.

5.2. Place the right stud of a light gray 1x2 tile with rounded ends, horizontally, in front of the previous piece.

5.3. Place a dark tan 2x2 tile with a single stud in front of the previous piece. It will overhang one row to the front.

6. Place the back row of a green 6x6 plate with one rounded corner, with the rounded corner at the front left, under the previous piece so the right side touches the 4x10 plate from step 3.

7. Place a tan 3x3 plate in front of the right three studs of the 1x6 plate on the back row of the garden. Place another to the right of the first so it overhangs one column to the right.

8. Place the leftmost column of a green 4x6 plate, horizontally, under the overhanging column of the previous piece so the back side is even with the back of the vegetable garden.

9.1. Place a light gray 1x1 round tile on the back right corner of the previous piece.

9.2. Place the back row of a dark tan 2x2 tile with a single stud to the left of the previous piece.

9.3. Place a light gray 1x2 tile with rounded ends, vertically, to the left of the previous piece.

9.4. Place a light gray 1x1 round tile to the left of the front stud of the previous piece.

9.5. Find the tan 3x3 plate to the left of the previous piece and put a dark tan 1x1 plate behind its rightmost column.

Group 2.

10. Find the two black 1x2 bricks with holes on the back row of the garden. Push a black 2L pin into the back side of each of these pieces. These pins have friction ridges and should not spin easily.

11.1. Place a clear 1x1 round tile with a turquoise beetle pattern on the left stud of the left 1x2 brick with holes on the back row of the garden.

11.2. Place a dark gray 1x1 tile with a 1x1 slope tile on one side, horizontally with the slope on the right, to the right of the previous piece.

11.3. Place the right stud of a dark gray 1x1 tile with a 1x1 slope tile on one side, horizontally with the slope on the left, on the left stud of the right 1x2 brick with a hole. Place another, symmetrically, to the right of the first.

Group 3.

12.1. Place a tan 3x3 plate in front of the leftmost 3x3 plate on the vegetable garden. The left side should be even with the left of the garden and there should be three free rows in front of it.

12.2. Place a light gray 1x2 tile with rounded ends, horizontally, to the right of the middle row of the previous piece.

12.3. Place a light gray 1x1 round tile in front of the right stud of the previous piece.

13. Place the front row of a dark tan 2x2 tile with a single stud to the right of the 1x2 tile with rounded ends from step 12.2. Place two more to the right of the first. These should be in front of two 3x3 plates.

14. Place the leftmost column of a green 6x6 plate with one rounded corner, with the rounded corner at the front right, under the right column of the rightmost piece from the previous step so the front side is even with the front of the garden.

15. Place the front two rows of a dark tan 4x4 quarter circle plate, with the rounded corner at the front right, to the right of the rightmost 2x2 tile with a single stud from step 13.

16. Place two 3x3 plates in front of the three 2x2 tiles with single studs from step 13. There should be one free row in front of these pieces.

Group 4.

17.1. Next, we'll start building our first raised bed! Find the two 3x3 plates on the left three columns of the garden. Place a tan 1x1 corner wall panel, with the walls on the back and left, on the back left corner of the back 3x3 plate.

17.2. Place a tan 2x2 corner wall panel, with the walls on the back and right, to the right of the previous piece.

17.3. Place a tan 1x3 wall panel, vertically with the wall on the left, in front of the 1x1 corner panel.

18. Place a black 1x2 plate, vertically, to the right of the front two studs of the previous piece.

19.1. Place the back two studs of a tan 1x3 panel, vertically with the wall on the right, to the right of the previous piece.

19.2. Place a tan 1x1 corner wall panel, with the walls on the front and right, in front of the previous piece.

19.3. Place the front row of a tan 2x2 corner wall panel, with the walls on the front and left, to the left of the previous piece. The raised bed should have walls on all four sides now!

20.1. Now we'll start two more planter boxes! Find the two pairs of 3x3 plates, one in front of the row of three 2x2 tiles with single studs, and one behind it. These are the bases of our next two raised beds! Place a tan 1x1 corner wall panel, with the walls on the front and left, on the front left corner of the left 3x3 plate on each of the two raised beds.

20.2. Place the left column of a tan 2x2 corner wall panel, with the walls on the left and back, behind each of the previous two pieces.

20.3. Place a tan 1x3 panel, horizontally with the wall at the back, to the right of the back row of each of the previous two pieces.

20.4. Place a tan 1x1 corner panel, with the walls at the back and right, to the right of each of the previous two pieces.

21. Place a black 1x2 plate, horizontally, in front of the left two studs of each of the 1x3 panels from step 20.3.

22.1. Place the right two studs of a tan 1x3 panel, horizontally with the wall at the front, in front of each of the previous two pieces. The left sides of these pieces should touch a 1x1 corner panel.

22.2. Place the front row of a tan 2x2 corner panel, with the walls at the front and right, to the right of each of the previous two pieces. Now these two raised beds should have walls on all four sides!

23.1. Now we'll make some dirt to go in the raised beds! Place a brown 2x3 plate, horizontally in front of you.

23.2. Place a brown 1x2 jumper plate, vertically and centered horizontally, on the previous piece.

23.3. Place a brown 2x2 tile with a single stud to the left of the previous piece. This piece will overhang one column to the left. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

23.4. Place a black 1x2 plate, vertically, under the left column of the left previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

23.5. Repeat steps 23.1-23.4 two times.

23.6. Attach the two circular anti-studs on the 2x3 plate of each dirt assembly to the 1x2 plate in the center of each raised bed. The left dirt assembly needs to be vertical and the right two need to be horizontal.

Group 5.

24.1. Great job so far! Now let's start building some veggies! We'll start with some beans. Place a dark green 1x1 round tile with a short bar sticking up in front of you.

24.2. Find a bright green plant stalk with a branch. This looks like a cylinder with a hole on one side, a short bar on the other, and another short bar with a stud coming out of the side. It looks kind of like a letter Y. Push the hole of this piece, with the arm of the Y on the left, onto the bar of the previous piece.

25. Find a bright green candle. This piece looks like a cylinder with a hole on one side and a short bar on the other. Push the hole onto the bar of the previous piece.

26. Push the hole of a bright green plant stalk with a branch, with the branch on the right, onto the bar of the previous piece.

27. Place a green 1x1 round plate with three leaves, with the leaves pointing to the left, on the lower left branch of the plant. Place another, with the leaves pointing to the right, on the upper right branch.

28. Push the short bar of a light green pair of cherries, with the cherries pointing away from the leaves, into the hollow stud of each of the previous two pieces.

29. Repeat steps 24.1-28. Place one plant, with the branches at the front and back, on the front and back studs of the dirt in the leftmost raised bed. Leave the middle stud empty.

Group 6

30.1. Now we'll make some cabbages! Place a lime green 1x1 brick with studs on all four sides in front of you.

30.2. Place a pale blue 1x1 round plate with a flower petal pattern on the top stud of the previous piece.

30.3. Place a dark turquoise 1x1 round plate with three leaves, with the leaves pointing up and to the right, on the front side stud of the 1x1 brick with four side studs. Place another on each of the remaining side studs.

30.4. Place a lime green 1x1 quarter circle tile, with the corner pointing up, on each of the previous pieces.

30.5. Repeat steps 30.1-30.4.

30.6. Place a cabbage on the left and right studs of the dirt in the back right raised bed.

Group 7. There are three 1x1 round plates stacked together in this group. These are orange.

31.1. Now we'll make some carrots! Take an orange 1x1 round plate off of the stack and place it in front of you.

31.2. Place a green 1x1 round plate with a flower pattern on the previous piece.

31.3. Push the bar of a green bar with three leaves on top into the hollow stud of the previous piece.

31.4. Repeat steps 31.1-31.3 two times.

31.5. Place a carrot on each of the studs in the front right raised bed.

32.1. Place a clear 1x1 round tile with a honey bee pattern on the stud of the rightmost cabbage.

32.2. Place a dark blue 2x2 x2 open box to the right of the back two rows of the front right raised bed.

32.3. Place a white rabbit on the second stud from the right on the fourth row from the front. There should be two free studs in front of the rabbit.

Group 8.

33. Assemble two carrots by pushing the bar of a green bar with three leaves into the hole on the wide side of an orange carrot piece. Place the carrots inside the dark blue box.

34.1. Place a green 1x1 round plate with three leaves, with the leaves pointing to the front and right in front of the left stud of the dark blue box.

34.2. Place a pink 1x1 round plate with a flower petal pattern on the previous piece. This completes the vegetable garden!

Bag 2.

Mini-Doll Group 2: Aliya

Assemble the Aliya mini-doll by placing the torso on the legs, the head on the torso, and the hair on the head. Aliya has dark brown, curly hair and dark skin. She's wearing a light blue skirt and a light purple sweatshirt with the letters "HLC" on the front. She is wearing dark blue shoes with white socks.

Main Build: Beekeeper's House

Group 9.

- 1.1. Now let's start building the beekeeper's house! Place a tan 16x16 plate in front of you.
- 1.2. Place a light gray 1x2 brick with a hole, vertically, on the back two studs of the leftmost column of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.
- 1.3. Place a dark gray 1x6 brick, vertically, in front of each of the previous two pieces.
- 1.4. Place a light gray 1x2 brick with a hole, vertically, in front of each of the previous two pieces.
2. Place a dark gray 2x3 brick, vertically, to the right of the left row of bricks so the back sides are even. Place another in front of the first so the front side is even with the front of the left wall. There should be two columns of four studs between these two bricks.
3. Find a dark gray 2x3 bracket. This piece looks like two 2x2 plates connected by a 1x2 brick. Rotate it so it's horizontal with the left plate higher than the right and place the lower plate behind the front piece from the previous step. The higher plate should connect to the left row of bricks. Place another behind the first.
4. Place a green 2x3 plate, vertically, behind the left plate of the back piece from the previous step. Place another in front of the left plate of the front piece from the previous step.
- 5.1. Place a dark tan 1x1 tile in front of the column of bricks on the right side of the house.
- 5.2. Place a dark tan 1x4 tile, horizontally, to the left of the previous piece.
- 5.3. Place the front row of a dark tan 2x4 plate, horizontally, to the left of the previous piece.
- 5.4. Place a dark tan 1x4 tile, horizontally, to the left of the front row of the previous piece.
- 5.5. Place a dark tan 1x1 tile to the left of the previous piece.
- 5.6. Place a green 1x2 plate, horizontally, to the left of the previous piece. The left side should be even with the left of the 16x16 plate.
- 5.7. Place the left two studs of a green 1x8 plate, horizontally, in front of the previous piece. Place another to the right of the first.
- 6.1. Place a tan 2x4 tile, vertically, in front of the leftmost two studs of the left piece from the previous step. The front side should be even with the front of the 16x16 plate.
- 6.2. Place a light brown 2x6 plate, vertically, to the right of the previous piece so the back sides are even. This piece should overhang two rows to the front.
7. Place the back two rows of a tan 4x8 half circle plate, horizontally with the flat side at the back, under the overhanging rows of the previous piece so the left side is even with the left side of the 16x16 plate.
- 8.1. Place a light brown 2x6 plate, vertically, to the right of the first 2x6 plate from step 6.2.
- 8.2. Place a tan 2x4 tile, vertically, to the right of the previous piece so the back sides are even.
- 8.3. Place a tan 2x2 tile with a single stud to the right of the previous piece so the front sides are even.

8.4. Place the left two columns of a tan 2x3 pentagonal tile, horizontally with the point at the right, behind the previous piece.

8.5. Place a tan 2x3 pentagonal tile, vertically with the point at the back, to the right of the 2x2 tile with a single stud from step 8.3. The back left angled side should touch the front right angled side of the previous piece.

8.6. Place a tan 2x2 triangular tile, with the corner at the back right, behind the previous piece so the right sides are even. It should fit perfectly into the triangular shape formed by the previous two pieces in front of a 1x8 plate.

9.1. Place another tan 2x2 triangular tile symmetrically to the right of the first.

9.2. Place a tan 2x3 pentagonal tile, horizontally with the point on the left, to the right of the previous piece.

9.3. Place a tan 2x2 tile with a single stud in front of the right two columns of the previous piece.

9.4. Place a tan 2x3 pentagonal tile, vertically with the point at the back, to the left of the previous piece so the front sides are even.

Group 10.

10. Now we'll start building a fireplace and chimney! Place a dark brown 1x1 brick with a recessed stud on one side, with the side stud on the right, on the fourth stud from the back on the third column from the left. This is on the right column of the left wall of bricks, and the top should be level with the bricks to the left of it. Place three more in front of the first.

11.1. Find a dark gray 1x2 masonry brick. A masonry brick has a brick wall pattern on one side, and horizontal grooves on the other side. Place this, vertically with the brick pattern on the left, on the leftmost column of the house, leaving four free studs behind it.

11.2. Place a brown 1x1 round tile with a short bar sticking up, to the right of each of the two studs of the previous piece.

12. Push the short bar of a transparent small flame into the hollow top of the bar of each of the previous two pieces.

13.1. Place a dark gray 1x2 jumper plate, vertically, to the right of the two 1x1 round tiles with bars sticking up.

13.2. Place a light gray 1x1 tile in front of the previous piece, and another behind it.

13.3. Place a dark gray 1x2 masonry brick, horizontally with the brick pattern at the front, to the left of the front piece from the previous step. Place another, with the brick pattern at the back, to the left of the back piece from the previous step.

14.1. Now we'll make the front of the fireplace. Place a dark gray 1x2 jumper plate, horizontally, in front of you.

14.2. Place a light gray 1x4 double curved slope tile, horizontally and centered horizontally, on the previous piece.

14.3. Place this assembly, vertically with the anti-studs on the left, on the four recessed side studs to the right of the fireplace.

15.1. Place a dark gray 1x1 brick on the back stud of the rightmost column of the left wall.

15.2. Place a dark gray 1x2 masonry brick, vertically with the brick pattern on the right, in front of the previous piece.

15.3. Place a light gray 1x1 brick with a stud on one side, with the side stud at the front, on the front stud of the rightmost column of the left wall.

15.4. Place a dark gray 1x2 masonry brick, vertically with the brick pattern on the left, behind the previous piece.

16.1. Place a light gray 1x2 brick with a hole, vertically, on the back two studs of the right wall.

16.2. Place a dark gray 1x1 brick in front of the previous piece.

16.3. Place a dark gray 1x6 brick, vertically, in front of the previous piece.

16.4. Place a light gray 1x1 brick with a stud on one side, with the side stud at the front, in front of the previous piece.

17. Place the top stud of a light gray 1x2 tile, upright, on the side stud of the previous piece. Place another on the front side stud on the rightmost column of the left wall.

Group 11. There are three 1x1 round plates with a flower pattern stacked together in this group. These are purple and the loose ones are pink.

18.1. Now we'll start building the walls on the front side of the house. Place a dark gray 1x4 plate, horizontally, in front of you.

18.2. Place two tan 1x2x2 tall bricks with four studs on one side, horizontally with the side studs at the front, on the previous piece.

18.3. Place a dark tan 1x1 quarter circle tile, with the flat sides at the left and top, on the top left corner side stud of the wall. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

18.4. Place the left stud of a light gray 1x2 tile with rounded ends, horizontally, below the previous piece. Place the left stud of another, horizontally, above the right stud of the first.

18.5. There should only be two side studs left. Place a dark gray 1x2 half circle tile, horizontally with the flat side on the bottom, on the remaining side studs.

18.6. Repeat steps 18.1-18.5.

18.7. Place one wall to the left of the front stud of the right wall. Repeat symmetrically to the right of the left wall.

19. Rotate the house 90 degrees counterclockwise so the 4x8 half circle plate is on the front right corner. Place a brown 1x2x2 arched window frame, vertically with the flat side on the left, on the leftmost column in front of the back wall. Skip one column to the right and place another symmetrically.

20.1. Make three purple flowers by placing a purple 1x1 round plate with a flower petal pattern on a green 1x1 round plate with three leaves.

20.2. Place one purple flower, with the leaves pointing to the front and left, on the third stud from the left on the second row from the front. This is to the left of the base of the chimney.

Place another purple flower, with the leaves pointing to the front and right, on the second row from the front to the right of the walls.

Place the last purple flower, with the leaves pointing to the right and back, on the third stud from the back on the second column from the right on the 4x8 half-circle plate.

20.3. Make two pink flowers by placing a pink 1x1 round plate with a flower petal pattern on a green 1x1 round plate with three leaves.

20.4. Place a pink flower, with the leaves pointing to the right and front, in front of the third purple flower.

Place the last pink flower, with the leaves pointing to the front and right, on the third stud from the right on the second row from the front of the front wall.

21. Place a brown 3x3 plate shaped like a plus sign on the two 1x2x2 arched window frames so the back stud attaches to the back wall.

22.1. Place a light purple 1x1 plate to the left of the back stud of the previous piece.

22.2. Place a light purple 1x6 plate, horizontally, to the right of the back stud of the 3x3 plus sign plate.

22.3. Place a light purple 1x2 plate, horizontally, to the right of the previous piece.

23.1. Now we'll make a small counter with a calculator! Stack two light brown 1x3 bricks and place the stack vertically in front of you.

23.2. Place a brown 1x2 jumper plate, vertically, on the front two studs of the stack.

23.3. Place a white 1x1 tile with a clip, with the clip fingers at the front and back, on the previous piece.

23.4. Clip the short bar of a white 1x1 plate with one rounded end and a short bar, upright with the stud at the front, into the previous piece.

23.5. Place a light gray 1x1 tile with a calculator pattern on the previous piece.

23.6. Find the gap in the right wall of the house. Place the counter, horizontally with the calculator at the left, to the left of the stud behind the gap in the wall. This gap is the doorway to the house.

24. Rotate the house 90 degrees counterclockwise so the 4x8 half-circle plate is at the back right corner now. Push a black 2L pin onto each of the three holes on the left side of the house.

25. The wall with the doorway is now the back wall. Stack two light brown 1x1 bricks and place them in front of the stud to the right of the doorway.

26.1. Place a light purple 1x2 plate, vertically, on the front two studs on the left column of the right wall. Repeat symmetrically on the back side of the right wall.

26.2. Place a light purple 1x1 plate behind the front piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the back side of the right wall.

Group 12.

27.1. Next we'll start making the chimney taller. Rotate the house 90 degrees clockwise so the 4x8 half circle is on the front right. The chimney is the raised bricks on the front two rows which has a flower on either side of it. Place a light gray 1x2 brick with two studs on one side, horizontally with the side studs at the front, on the left two studs on the front row of the chimney. Place another to the right of the first.

27.2. Place a dark gray 1x1 brick behind the left stud of the left piece from the previous step, and another behind the right stud of the right piece from the previous step.

28.1. Place a light gray 1x2 brick with two studs on one side, vertically with the side studs on the right, on the right column of the chimney.

28.2. Place a dark gray 1x2 masonry brick, horizontally with the brick pattern at the front, to the left of the front stud of the previous piece.

28.3. Place the front stud of a dark gray 1x2 masonry brick, vertically with the brick pattern on the left, to the left of the previous piece.

29. Place the left stud of a dark gray 2x2 inverted slope brick, with the slope at the back, on the back stud of the previous piece. The right stud will not attach to anything. Place another to the right of the first. The left stud of this piece won't attach to anything.

30.1. Place a dark gray 1x2 masonry brick, horizontally with the brick pattern at the front, in front of the right piece from the previous step.

30.2. Place a light gray 1x2 brick with two studs on one side, horizontally with the side studs at the front, to the left of the previous piece.

31.1. Place a light gray 1x2 brick with two studs on one side, horizontally with the side studs at the front, centered horizontally on the front row of the chimney.

31.2. Place the front stud of a dark gray 1x2 masonry brick, vertically with the brick pattern on the left, to the left of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right column of the chimney.

32.1. Now we'll add some detail to the exterior of the chimney using the side studs. There should be two side studs on the right side of the chimney and eight side studs on the front side. Place the bottom row of a dark gray 2x2 round tile on the two side studs on the right side of the chimney.

32.2. Place the top row of a dark gray 2x2 round tile on the left two studs on the bottom row of side studs on the front side of the chimney.

32.3. Place a light gray 1x2 tile with rounded ends, horizontally, to the right of the previous piece.

32.4. Place a light gray 1x2 tile with rounded ends, horizontally, on each of the two remaining rows of side studs on the front side of the chimney.

33.1. Rotate the house 90 degrees counterclockwise so the 4x8 half circle plate is at the back right. Place a dark gray 2x2 plate, centered vertically, on the left two columns of the chimney. This piece should sit to the left of a light gray 1x2 brick with two studs on the right side.

33.2. Place a brown 2x2 plate with two studs on one side, with the side studs on the left, on the previous piece.

Group 13.

34.1. Now we'll start on the wall next to the fireplace. Place a white 1x2 brick, vertically, in front of you.

34.2. Stack two white 1x1 bricks and place the stack on the back stud of the 1x2 brick.

34.3. Place a white 1x1 plate in front of the stack.

34.4. Place a white 1x1x2 tall brick with two studs on one side, with the side studs on the left, on the previous piece.

34.5. Place the assembly we just made, vertically with the side studs on the left, on the second and third studs from the front on the left column of the right wall. The top of this piece should be level with the front left stud of the chimney.

35.1. Place the front two studs of a white 1x3 brick, vertically, on the previous piece so the back stud connects to the front left stud of the chimney.

35.2. Place a white 1x1 brick on the back left stud of the chimney.

36. Now we'll place a pot of honey next to the fireplace to heat up! Place a light orange 1x1 round tile into a black pot and place the pot on the 1x2 jumper plate to the left of the fireplace.

Bag 3.

Group 14.

37. Rotate the house 90 degrees counterclockwise so the 4x8 half circle plate is at the back left. Place a light gray 2x2 slope brick, with the slope on the right, on the right two studs on the back two rows of the chimney. Place another symmetrically to the left of the first.

38.1. Place a light purple 1x4 brick, horizontally, in front of the previous two pieces.

38.2. Place a white 1x2 brick, horizontally, to the right of the previous piece.

39.1. Now we'll build up the wall to the left of the chimney. Place a white 1x1x3 tall brick, horizontally, on the second and third studs from the left on the third row from the back. This brick goes on the back wall to the left of the fireplace where the pot of honey is and there should be one free stud to the left of it.

39.2. Place a white 1x1 brick on the right stud of the previous piece.

39.3. Place a white 1x2 inverted slope brick, vertically with the slope at the front, to the left of the previous piece.

39.4. Place the left stud of a white 1x2 brick, horizontally, on the previous piece.

40. Place a light purple 1x1x5 tall brick to the left of the wall we just worked on. Place another on the front right corner of the back wall.

41.1. Place the left stud of a light purple 1x2 plate, horizontally, on the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

41.2. Place a light purple 1x6 plate, horizontally, between the previous two pieces.

41.3. Place a dark gray 2x2 plate, centered horizontally, behind the previous piece.

42. Now we'll make a display of honey to go in the beekeeper's window! Place a light gray 1x4 plate, horizontally, in front of you.

43. Place a white 1x2 plate with a 2x2 of side studs sticking up from one side, horizontally with the side studs at the back, under the left two studs of the previous piece. Place another to the right of the first.

44. Place a light purple 1x2 plate with a 2x2 of anti-stud at one side, horizontally with the anti-studs at the front, on the left two studs of the 1x4 plate, Place another to the right of the first.

45. Place a white 1x4 tile, horizontally, on the previous two pieces.

When you finish this group, you will have a transparent orange 1x1 round plate, a transparent orange 1x1 cone, and two orange 1x1 round tiles left over.

Group 15.

46.1. Now we'll add some jars of honey up for display! Rotate the assembly towards you so the side studs are at the top, the two rows of anti-studs are at the bottom and the single row of anti-studs are at the back. Place the leftover transparent orange 1x1 cone on the back right stud of the previous piece.

46.2. Place a transparent yellow 1x1 cone to the left of the previous piece.

46.3. Place the leftover transparent orange 1x1 round plate to the left of the previous piece.

46.4. Place a transparent yellow 1x1 round plate to the left of the previous piece.

47.1. Place a leftover orange 1x1 round tile on the rightmost cone, and another on the second 1x1 round plate from the left.

47.2. Place a yellow 1x1 round tile on the other cone and round plate.

48.1. Now we'll assemble a window that can hinge open. Place a light purple 1x4x3 window frame, horizontally with the inside ridge near the front, in front of you.

48.2. Push a clear pane of glass, with the corner pegs at the top, from the front into the previous piece. The pegs at the top of the glass should click into the top of the window frame and the bottom should be able to open towards you.

48.3. Place the window, horizontally and opening to the front, in front of the honey jars.

49. Rotate the house counterclockwise so the 4x8 half circle plate is at the front left. Place the window and honey display on the wall to the left of the doorway.

Group 16.

50.1. Now let's make the front door! Place a brown 1x4x6 door in front of you, with the stud for the handle on the right.

50.2. Push a small window pane with a sticker into the window hole of the previous piece. This sticker shows a stained glass picture of a bee!

50.3. Place a light purple 1x4x6 door frame, horizontally with the inside ridge near the front, in front of you and push the door into the frame so the pegs on the left side of the door click into the door frame.

50.4. Place a gold 1x1 round plate on the stud on the front side of the door to make the door handle.

50.5. Place the door, horizontally with the door knob at the front, in the doorway so the front is even with the front of the surrounding walls.

51.1. Now we'll place an entry mat. Place a gold 2x4 tile with rounded ends, horizontally, in front of the door.

51.2. Place the front row of a light purple 2x6 plate, horizontally, on the front wall to the right of the left wall of the house, over the window and on the left two studs of the door.

52. Now let's make another window! Place a light gray 1x4 plate, horizontally, in front of you.

53. Place a white 1x2 plate with a 2x2 of side studs sticking up from one side, horizontally with the side studs at the back, under the left two studs of the previous piece. Place another to the right of the first.

54. Place a light purple 1x2 plate with a 2x2 of anti-stud at one side, horizontally with the anti-studs at the front, on the left two studs of the 1x4 plate, Place another to the right of the first.

55. Place a white 1x4 tile, horizontally, on the previous two pieces.

56.1. Rotate the assembly towards you so the side studs are at the top, the two rows of anti-studs are at the bottom and the single row of anti-studs are at the back. Place a white 1x1 tile on the back left corner of the window assembly. Place another symmetrically on the right side.

56.2. Place a white 1x2 jumper plate, horizontally, between the previous two pieces.

57.1. Let's make another window! Place a light purple 1x4x3 window frame, horizontally with the inside ridge near the front, in front of you.

57.2. Push a clear pane of glass, with the corner pegs at the top, from the front into the previous piece. The pegs at the top of the glass should click into the top of the window frame and the bottom should be able to open towards you.

57.3. Place the window, horizontally and opening to the front, on the front row of the window assembly.

58. Place a brown cat on the jumper plate behind the window.

59. Place the window with the cat on the wall to the right of the door.

60. Place a light purple 1x1x5 tall brick to the right of the window we just placed so it's even with the front of the window.

61.1. Now we'll build another one of the walls! Rotate the house 180 degrees so the 4x8 half-circle plate is at the back right. Place a white 1x2x3 tall brick, vertically, on the leftmost wall, in front of the 1x1x5 tall brick at the back left corner.

61.2. Place a white 1x2 inverted slope brick, horizontally with the slope on the right, on the back stud of the previous piece.

61.3. Place a white 1x1 brick in front of the left stud of the previous piece.

61.4. Place the front stud of a white 1x2 brick, vertically, on the previous piece.

62. Find the 2x6 plate on the back wall. Place another light purple 2x6 plate, horizontally, to the left of it.

Group 17.

63.1. Place a white 1x2x3 tall brick, vertically, on the second and third studs from the front on the left wall.

63.2. Place a light purple 1x1 brick behind the previous piece.

63.3. Place a white 1x2 brick, vertically, behind the previous piece.

63.4. Place a light purple 1x1 brick behind the previous piece.

64.1. This wall needs a window too! Place a light purple 1x4x3 window frame, horizontally with the inside ridge near the front, in front of you.

64.2. Push a clear pane of glass, with the corner pegs at the top, from the front into the previous piece. The pegs at the top of the glass should click into the top of the window frame and the bottom should be able to open towards you.

64.3. Place the window, vertically and so it opens to the left, in the four stud gap on the left window.

64.4. Place a light purple 1x1 brick on the front stud of the window.

64.5. Place a white 1x2 brick, vertically, behind the previous piece.

64.6. Place a light purple 1x1 brick behind the previous piece.

65.1. Find the two 1x2x2 arched window frames that are to the right of the left wall, near the front. We'll make these into a display stand for selling seed packets! Place a brown 1x3x3 window frame, vertically, on the left stud of these two pieces so it is up against the wall.

65.2. Place a brown 1x1 panel with walls on two sides, with the walls at the front and right, to the right of the front stud of the previous piece. Place another, symmetrically, to the right of the back stud of the 1x3x3 window frame.

66.1. Place a white 1x1 tile on the front stud of the 1x3x3 window frame from step 65.1.

66.2. Place the right column of a white 2x2 tile with two studs, with the studs on the left, behind the previous piece.

67.1. Place a white 1x2x2 tall brick with four studs on one side, with the side studs on the right, on the previous piece.

67.2. Place a light purple 1x1x5 tall brick in front of the previous piece. This piece should go on the front stud of the left wall.

68.1. Place the front stud of a light purple 1x2 plate, vertically, on the previous piece.

68.2. Place a light purple 1x6 plate, vertically, behind the previous piece.

68.3. Place a light purple 1x2 plate, vertically, behind the previous piece.

You will have four light purple 1x1 bricks leftover when you finish this group.

Group 18.

69.1. Place a leftover light purple 1x1 brick on the back studs of both the left and right walls of the house.

69.2. Place a white 1x2 brick, vertically, in front of each of the previous two pieces.

69.3. Place a leftover light purple 1x1 brick in front of each of the previous two pieces.

69.4. Place a light gray 1x1 brick in front of each of the previous two pieces.

70.1. Place a dark gray 1x2 masonry brick, horizontally with the brick pattern at the back, to the right of the right piece from the previous step. This should be on the back row of the chimney.

70.2. Place the right two studs of a light gray 1x16 brick, horizontally, in front of the previous piece. The leftmost stud should attach to the left wall of the house.

Group 19.

71.1. Place a light purple 1x1 brick in front of the leftmost stud of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right wall.

71.2. Place a white 1x2 brick, vertically, in front of each of the previous two pieces.

71.3. Place a light purple 1x1 brick in front of each of the previous two pieces.

72.1. Now we'll make stacks of seed packets to put in our display case! Place a light brown 2x2 inverted curved slope tile in front of you, with the more sloped side on the right. If you do it this way, the right column of studs will be higher than the left.

72.2. Place the right stud of a white 1x2 tile with a seed packet print, horizontally, on each of the studs on the left column of the previous piece so they overhang one stud to the left.

72.3. Place the right stud of a white 1x2 tile with a seed packet print, horizontally, on each of the studs on the right column of the inverted curved slope.

72.4. Set the stack of seeds, upright with the curved slope at the bottom on the left, in between the two 1x1 panels on the seed display. The top row of seed packets should stick above the curved slope. Lean the top of the seeds to the left until it rests on the left wall. The seeds should be held in place!

73. There are four side studs on the left wall above the seed packet shelf. Place a white 2x3 tile with a pollen chart sticker, horizontally, on these side studs so the left side is even with the left wall. This chart shows a bunch of different colored dots in a grid pattern. The colors correspond to different shades of honey possible with different types of pollen!

Group 20.

74.1. There are two side studs on the right wall over the fireplace. Place the circular anti-studs of a brown 2x3 tile with a family portrait sticker, horizontally, on these side studs.

74.2. Place the top two circular anti-studs of a tan 2x4 tile with a bee chart sticker, upright, on the remaining two side studs on the right wall. This picture shows three different bees with the plants they pollinate.

75. Now we'll build a crate used as a table to sell honey and beeswax products! Place a light brown 3x4x2 crate, horizontally, in front of you.

76. Place a brown 2x3 plate, vertically, on the left column of the previous piece. Place another to the right of the first. The crate doesn't have studs on top, but the edges will hold the plates in place.

77.1. We'll start by making some beeswax candles! Place a gold 1x1 round plate with a hollow stud on the back right stud of the crate.

77.2. Place a gold 1x1 round brick to the left of the previous piece.

77.3. Place a brown 1x2 jumper plate, horizontally, in front of the previous two pieces.

78.1. Place a gold 1x1 round plate with hollow stud on the previous piece.

78.2. Find a gold candlestick. This looks like a cylinder thinner than a round brick with a short bar on one side and a hole on the other side. Push the short bar into the hollow stud of the 1x1 round plate on the back right corner of the crate.

79. Push the short bar of a transparent orange flame into the hole on top of the previous piece. Push another into the hollow stud of both the 1x1 round brick and 1x1 round plate.

80.1. Now we'll make a stack of honeycomb. Place a gold 1x1 round plate with a hollow stud in front of you.

80.2. Stack three transparent yellow 1x1 plates, with every plate angled off a little bit from the one below it. This makes the stack look organic and a bit chaotic, just like a big piece of honeycomb! Place this on the 1x1 round plate.

80.3. Place the round plate of the honeycomb in the middle of the back left four studs on top of the crate. The four studs should hold it in place.

81. Place a clear 2x2x2 hollow domed case over the honeycomb. We wouldn't want anyone's fingers getting sticky!

82.1. Now we'll make a couple packages of honeycomb. Place a 1x2 transparent yellow 1x2 plate, horizontally, in front of you.

82.2. Place a clear 1x2 tile with a honeycomb package sticker, horizontally, on the previous piece.

82.3. Repeat steps 82.1-82.2.

82.4. Place one honeycomb, horizontally, on the left two studs on the front row of the crate. Place the other to the right of the first.

83. Now we'll place the crate! The house should be in front of you, with the 4x8 half-circle plate at the back right. Place the crate, horizontally with the candles at the back right, on the floor so there is one free row in front of it, and three free columns between it and the right wall. There should be three free columns to the left between it and the seeds display.

Group 21.

84. Now we'll make a picnic table! Set the beekeeper's house aside for now. Place a white 1x4 plate with a 1x1 inverted slope on each end, horizontally, in front of you.

85. Place a white 1x2 slope brick, horizontally with the slope on the left, on the second and third studs from the left on the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically to the right.

86. Place a white 1x2 plate with a 1x1 inverted slope on each end, horizontally and centered horizontally, on the previous two pieces.

87. Place the back stud of a white 1x5 plate, vertically, on the second stud from the left on the previous piece. Place another to the right of the first.

88.1. Now we'll make the other end of the picnic table. Place a white 1x4 plate with a 1x1 inverted slope on each end, horizontally, in front of you.

88.2. Place a white 1x2 slope brick, horizontally with the slope on the left, on the second and third studs from the left on the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically to the right.

88.3. Place a white 1x2 plate with a 1x1 inverted slope on each end, horizontally and centered horizontally, on the previous two pieces.

88.4. Place the previous piece under the front studs of the two 1x5 plates from step 87. The picnic table should now have an identical end on each side.

89. Place a white 1x2 jumper plate, horizontally and centered horizontally, on the front row of the picnic table. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

90. Place the front and back circular anti-studs of a light brown 2x6 plate, vertically and centered vertically, on the previous two pieces. This will be the start of the top of the table.

91. Next we'll attach the seats of the picnic table. Find the leftmost two studs on the table, these are on inverted slopes and are lower than the top of the table. Place the front and back circular anti-studs of a light brown 2x6 tile, vertically and centered vertically, on these two studs. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

92. Place a light brown 1x6 tile, vertically and centered vertically, to the left of the 2x6 plate on top of the table. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

93.1. Now we'll set the table! Place a yellow basket, horizontally with the handles at the front and back, on the back row of the 2x6 plate.

93.2. Place a white mug on the front left corner of the 2x6 plate. Place another on the fourth stud from the front on the right column of the 2x6 plate.

93.3. Place a clear saucer on the second stud from the front on the right column of the 2x6 plate. Place another on the third stud from the front on the left column of the 2x6 plate.

94. Place a transparent yellow 1x1 plate on each of the saucers from the previous step.

95. Place a dark tan chopsticks and a pink ball of yarn into the basket on the back side of the table. The chopsticks are used as either crochet hooks or knitting needles!

96. Place the house back in front of you, with the 4x8 half-circle plate at the back left, in front of you. Rotate the picnic table so it is horizontal, with the knitting basket on the right. Find the two 2x6 plates which are on the 4x8 half-circle plate. Place the picnic table on these plates.

Bag 4.

Group 22. There are two 1x2 plates stacked together in this group. These are white and the loose ones are light purple.

97.1. Now we'll start on the wall above the doorway. First, we'll build a decoration to place above the door. Place a white 1x2 plate from the stack, horizontally, in front of you.

97.2. Place a tan 1x2 plate with a 2x2 of studs sticking up from one side, with the side studs at the front, on the previous piece.

97.3. Place the last white 1x2 plate from the stack, horizontally, on the previous piece.

97.4. Place a green 2x2 round plate on the side studs of the assembly.

97.5. The house should be in front of you, with the 4x8 rounded plate at the front left. Place the assembly we just made, with the 2x2 round plate at the front, on the front row of the front wall, centered horizontally above the door.

98. Place a light purple 1x1 brick to the left of the assembly we just placed. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

99. Place a light purple 1x4 brick, horizontally and centered horizontally, on the previous two pieces.

100.1. Now we'll build a couple of decorative wall panels. Place a light gray 1x4 plate, horizontally, in front of you.

100.2. Place the back row of a white 2x2 plate with two studs on one side, with the side studs at the front, under the left two studs of the previous piece. Place another to the right of the first.

100.3. Place a light gray 1x4 plate, horizontally, on the front row of the previous two pieces.

100.4. Place a light purple 1x2 plate with a 2x2 of anti-stud on one side, horizontally with the side anti-studs at the back, on the left two studs behind the previous piece. Place another to the right of the first.

100.5. Place a white 1x2 tile, vertically, on the leftmost column of the wall panel. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

100.6. Place a white 2x2 tile with two studs, with the studs at the back, between the previous two pieces.

100.7. Find a light purple 2x2 rounded corner tile. This tile is cut out so it looks like a macaroni noodle, I'll call pieces with this shape "macaroni" from now on. Place the rightmost stud of this piece, with the flat sides on the left and back, on the left stud of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

100.8. Repeat steps 100.1-100.7.

100.9. Rotate one of the wall panels so the side anti-studs are at the bottom, with the macaroni tiles at the front. Place it on the front wall to the left of the center decoration. Repeat symmetrically on the right side with the other wall panel.

101.1. Place a light purple 1x1 plate on the back stud of the left wall. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

101.2. Let's add the ceiling to the first floor, which will also be the floor of the second floor! Place a tan 6x14 plate, horizontally, in front of the previous two pieces.

102.1. Place a tan 2x14 plate, horizontally, in front of the previous piece. It will overhang one row to the front.

102.2. Place a light purple 2x6 plate, horizontally, in front of the previous piece so the left sides are even. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

102.3. Place a light purple 1x2 plate, vertically, to the left of the right piece from the previous step. Place another to the left of the first.

103. Place a gold 2x4 tile with rounded ends and a sticker, horizontally and centered horizontally, on the 2x2 round plate above the door. The sticker on this piece shows a bee flying over a couple of vines.

104.1. Place a white 2x12 plate, horizontally and centered horizontally, on the second and third rows from the front on the ceiling.

104.2. Place a light purple 1x2 plate, vertically, to the left of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

105.1. Place a light purple 1x2 plate, vertically, behind each of the previous two pieces.

105.2. Place a light purple 1x1 plate behind each of the previous two pieces.

105.3. Place a light purple 1x6 plate, vertically, behind each of the previous two pieces. These pieces will overhang one stud to the back.

Group 23. There are two 1x6 bricks stacked together in this group. These are brown and the loose ones are white.

106. Place seven light gray 1x2 plates with rails, horizontally with the rails at the front, on the front row of the ceiling.

107.1. Place a dark blue 1x2 slope brick, vertically with the slope at the back, on the back two studs on the leftmost column of the ceiling. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

107.2. Place a white 1x3 brick, vertically, in front of the left piece from the previous step.

108.1. Now we'll make a small fireplace for the second floor. Stack two brown 1x2 plates with rounded ends and place the stack, vertically, in front of the previous piece.

108.2. Push the short bar of a transparent orange flame into each of the hollow studs of the top piece on the stack.

109.1. Place a white 1x3 brick, vertically, in front of the fireplace.

109.2. Place a white 1x8 brick, vertically, in front of the 1x2 slope brick on the rightmost column of the ceiling.

109.3. Place a brown 1x6 brick from the stack, horizontally, to the left of the front stud of the previous piece. Place another to the left of the first piece.

110.1. Now we'll build another decorative part for the front wall. Stack two light gray 1x4 plates and place them, horizontally, in front of you.

110.2. Place a green 1x2 plate with two vertical clips on one side, horizontally with the clips at the front, on the left two studs of the previous piece. Place another to the right of the first.

110.3. Place a white 1x2 brick, horizontally and centered horizontally, on the previous two pieces.

110.4. Place this assembly, horizontally with the clips at the front, centered horizontally in front of the two 1x6 bricks from step 109.3.

111.1. Place a dark blue 2x2 slope brick, with the slope at the front, on the left two studs on the front two rows of the ceiling. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

111.2. Place a dark blue 2x2 slope brick, with the slope at the front, to the right of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

111.3. Place a dark blue 1x2 slope brick, vertically with the slope at the front, to the right of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

112.1. Place the front stud of a dark blue 1x1 plate with a 1x1 slope tile on one side, vertically with the slope at the front, on the front left corner of the roof. It should go on top of a 2x2 slope brick. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

112.2. Repeat the previous step symmetrically on the back side.

113.1. Place a white 1x1 brick in front of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the front side.

113.2. Place a white 1x4 arch brick, vertically, between the previous two pieces.

113.3. Place a white 1x6 brick, vertically and centered vertically, on the right wall.

114.1. Place a light gray 1x1 brick with one rounded end and a stud on the opposite side, with the side stud at the right, in front of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

114.2. Repeat the previous step symmetrically on the left side.

115.1. Place the back row of a dark blue 2x2 slope brick, with the slope at the front, to the right of the front piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

115.2. Place a white 1x1 brick to the right of the left piece from the previous step so the back sides are even. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

116.1. Place a light purple 1x1 plate in front of each of the previous two pieces.

116.2. Place a white 1x1x2 tall brick with two studs on one side, with the side studs at the front, on each of the previous two pieces.

You will have a dark green 1x2 ingot tile leftover when you finish this group.

Group 24.

117.1. Rotate the house 180 degrees so the picnic table is at the back right. Now we'll start adding details to the second floor, starting with a bookshelf! Place a black 1x3 plate, horizontally, in the back right corner of the second floor.

117.2. Place a brown 1x3 tile, horizontally, in front of the previous piece.

118. Place a brown 1x1x2 tall brick with two studs on one side, with the side studs at the front, on both the left and right studs of the 1x3 plate.

119.1. Place a brown 2x3 plate, horizontally, in front of you.

119.2. Place the leftover dark green 1x2 ingot tile, vertically, on the right column of the previous piece.

119.3. Place a purple 1x2 ingot tile, vertically, to the left of the previous piece.

119.4. Place a teal 1x2 tile with a book spine sticker, vertically, to the left of the previous piece. This sticker has an image of a bee on it.

119.5. Rotate the 2x3 plate so the anti-studs are at the back and place it on the side studs of the 1x1x2 tall bricks with side studs from step 118.

120. Now we'll build a dresser on the other side of the room. Stack two white 1x3 bricks and place the stack, horizontally, in the back left corner of the second floor.

121. Place three brown 1x1 bricks with a recessed stud on one side, with the side stud at the front, in front of the stack from the previous step.

122. Place a brown 1x1 brick with a recessed stud on one side, with the side stud at the front, on each of the previous three pieces.

Group 25.

123. Place a light brown 1x3 tile with a drawer sticker, horizontally, on each row of side studs from the previous two steps.

124. Place the back two rows of a reddish brown 3x3 plate on the two rows of the dresser. Repeat symmetrically on the bookshelf on the right side.

125. Place the front two studs of a white 1x3 brick, vertically, on the back two studs on the right column of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

126.1. Now we need to fill in the gap on the wall above the door. Rotate the house 180 degrees so the picnic table is at the front left. Place a brown 2x2 plate with two studs on one side, with the side studs at the front, in front of you.

126.2. Place a brown 1x2 plate with rounded ends, horizontally, on the back row of the previous piece.

126.3. Place a light purple 1x2 plate with a 2x2 of anti-studs on one side, with the side anti-studs at the back, on the previous piece.

126.4. Place a brown 1x2 plate with rounded ends, horizontally, in front of the previous piece.

126.5. Place a white 1x1 plate behind the left stud of the previous piece.

126.6. Place the left stud of a white 2x2 corner tile, with the corner at the front right so it's shaped like a braille letter J, in front of the previous piece.

126.7. Place the left stud of a light purple 2x2 macaroni tile, with the flat sides on the back and right, on the 1x1 plate from step 126.5.

126.8. Rotate the wall piece so the side anti-studs are at the bottom and the macaroni tile is at the front. Find the 1x2 brick that's centered on the front wall of the house above a row of clips. Place the wall piece to the left of this brick so the front sides are even.

127.1. Now we'll do the same for the other side. Place a brown 2x2 plate with two studs on one side, with the side studs at the front, in front of you.

127.2. Place a brown 1x2 plate with rounded ends, horizontally, on the back row of the previous piece.

127.3. Place a light purple 1x2 plate with a 2x2 of anti-studs on one side, with the side anti-studs at the back, on the previous piece.

127.4. Place a brown 1x2 plate with rounded ends, horizontally, in front of the previous piece.

127.5. Place a white 1x1 plate in front of the right stud of the previous piece.

127.6. Place the right stud of a white 2x2 corner tile, with the corner at the front left so it's shaped like a braille letter H, in front of the previous piece.

127.7. Place the right stud of a light purple 2x2 macaroni tile, with the flat sides on the back and left, on the 1x1 plate from step 127.5.

127.8. Find the 1x2 brick that's centered on the front wall of the house above a row of clips. Place the wall piece to the right of this brick so the front sides are even.

You will have a light green 1x1 round plate with three leaves leftover when you finish this group.

Group 26.

128.1. Place the back stud of a light purple 1x2 plate, vertically, on the left stud of the wall we just placed. Place two more to the right of the first.

128.2. Repeat the previous step symmetrically on the left side.

128.3. Place a light purple 1x1 plate behind the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

129.1. Now we'll add some flowers to the clips above the door! Place a green 1x2 jumper plate, horizontally, in front of you.

129.2. Place the left stud of a green 1x2 plate with a bar on one long side, horizontally with the bar at the back, under the left stud of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

129.3. Place the leftover light green 1x1 round plate with three leaves, with the leaves pointing to the front, on the jumper plate.

129.4. Place a green 1x1 round plate with three leaves, with the leaves pointing to the front and left, on the leftmost stud of the assembly. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

129.5. Push the short bar of an orange flower with a bar on one side into the hollow stud of each of the previous two pieces.

129.6. Place a purple flower on the middle 1x1 round plate with three leaves.

129.7. Place a purple 1x1 round plate with a flower petal pattern on the previous piece.

129.8. Clip the two bars on the flower assembly, horizontally with the bars on top and the flowers at the front, into the four clips on the front side of the house, above the door. Hinge the flower assembly down as far as it will go.

130.1. Now we'll work inside the second floor some more, starting by making the headboard for the bed. Rotate the house 180 degrees so the picnic table is at the back right. Place a brown 1x6 plate, horizontally, in front of you.

130.2. Place a brown 1x1 round plate under the leftmost stud of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

130.3. Place a brown 1x1x3 tall brick on the leftmost stud of the 1x6 plate. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

130.4. Place the assembly we just made, centered horizontally, on the back row of the second floor. This should be between the back rows of the 3x3 plates from step 124.

131.1. We've made the posts for the headboard, now we'll place a board between them. Place a light brown 2x2 tile in front of you.

131.2. Place the right column of a brown 2x2 inverted tile under the left column of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

131.3. Find the gap at the center of the back wall. There is an upright column of two anti-studs to both the left and right of this gap. Rotate the assembly we just made so it is horizontal with the studs at the back, then place the studs on the anti-studs we just found.

132.1. Now we'll make the chimney a little bit taller! Place a light gray 1x2 brick with two studs on one side, horizontally with the side studs at the front, on the front row of the chimney. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

132.2. Place a light gray 1x2 tile with rounded ends on the side studs of the back piece from the previous step.

132.3. Place a dark gray 1x2 masonry brick, vertically with the brick pattern on the right, on the leftmost column of the chimney.

132.4. Place a light gray 1x2 brick with two studs on one side, vertically with the side studs on the right. To the right of the previous piece.

132.5. Place a dark gray 1x2 masonry brick, horizontally with the brick pattern at the front, on the front row of the chimney. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

133. Place the top row of a dark gray 2x2 round tile on the front row of side studs of the chimney. Place the top row of another on the row of side studs on the right side of the chimney.

Bag 5.

Group 27.

134. The house should be in front of you with the picnic table at the back right. Place the leftmost stud of a white 1x3 brick, horizontally, on the third stud from the back on the leftmost wall of the house. The right two studs should be over the dresser we built earlier. There should be five free studs in front of its left stud. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

135. Place a white 1x1 brick to the right of the left piece from the previous step. This will go one brick higher than the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

136.1. Now we'll make the bed! Set the house aside for now. Place a brown 6x6 plate, upside down, in front of you.

136.2. Place a brown 1x1 round plate on each of the corners of the previous piece. These go on the anti-studs.

137.1. Flip the 6x6 plate over so the previous pieces are at the bottom. Place a blue 2x4 brick, vertically and centered horizontally, on the 6x6 plate so the back sides are even.

137.2. Place a pale blue 1x1 plate with a 1x1 curved slope on one side, with the curved slope on the left, on the back row to the left of the previous piece. The right side of this piece won't connect to anything. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

Group 28 and 29. Group 28 contains the orange pieces for the next few steps. All the other pieces are in group 29.

138.1. Place an orange 1x1 plate with a 1x1 curved slope on one side from group 28, with the curved slope on the left, in front of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

138.2. Place a yellow 1x1 plate with a 1x1 curved slope on one side from group 29, with the curved slope on the left, in front of the left piece from the previous step. Place another in front of the first. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

139. Place a yellow 1x1 plate with a 1x1 curved slope on one side from group 29, with the curved slope at the front, in front of each of the two columns of the 2x4 brick.

140. Place an orange 1x1 plate with curved slopes on two sides from group 28, with the curved slopes at the front and left, to the left of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

141.1. Place a dark orange 1x1 tile from group 28 on each of the previous two pieces.

141.2. Place an orange 1x2 tile from group 28, horizontally, between the previous two pieces.

141.3. Place a yellow 2x2 tile from group 29 behind the previous piece.

141.4. Place an orange 1x2 tile from group 28, vertically, to the left of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

141.5. Place a dark orange 1x1 tile behind each of the previous two pieces.

141.6. Place an orange 1x2 tile from group 28, horizontally, between the previous two pieces.

141.7. Place two light gray 1x2 jumper plates, horizontally, on the back row of the bed.

Group 30.

142. Let's add some pillows! Place the center anti-stud of a pale blue 2x2 tile on each of the previous two pieces.

143. Now let's put the bed in the house. Place the house in front of you, with the picnic table at the back right. Place the bed, with the pillows at the back, on the second floor in front of the headboard so the front side is even with the front of the floor. There should be three free columns on the floor to the left and right of the bed.

144. Place a medium brown 2x4 tile with rounded ends and a rug pattern, vertically, to the left of the bed so the front side is even with the front of the floor. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

145.1. Now we'll make a fancy clock! Place a light gray 1x1 brick with one rounded end and a stud on the opposite side, with the rounded end on the left, in front of you.

145.2. Push the short bar of a gold 1x1 round tile with a short bar sticking up into the hollow side stud on the left side of the previous piece. This will be the base of the clock.

145.3. Place a gold 1x1 round tile with a clock pattern on the top stud of the clock.

145.4. Rotate the clock so the previous piece is at the front and the base is at the bottom. Place the clock to the right of the bed, on the 1x3 ledge over the bookshelf.

Group 31.

146.1. Place a green 1x1 round tile with a four leaf clover pattern to the right of the clock.

146.2. Place a black 1x2 slope tile with a typewriter pattern, horizontally with the tall side at the right, on the right two studs of the 1x3 ledge over the dresser to the left of the bed.

147.1. Now we'll keep building up the roof. Rotate the house 180 degrees so the picnic table is at the front left. Find the 1x3 brick behind the right three columns of sloped bricks on the roof. Place a dark blue 2x2 slope brick, with the slope at the front, in front of the right two studs of this brick. Repeat symmetrically on the left side.

147.2. Place a dark blue 1x2 slope brick, vertically with the slope at the front, to the right of the left previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

148.1. Now we'll add a window for the bedroom. Find the center two studs on the front wall above the three flowers. Place a white 1x2 plate, horizontally, on these two studs.

148.2. Now we'll assemble a window. Place a light purple 1x2x2 window frame, horizontally with the inside ridge near the front, in front of you.

148.3. Push a clear pane of glass, from the front into the previous piece.

148.4. Place the window on the 1x2 plate we just placed.

149.1. Place a white 1x2 brick, horizontally, to the left of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

149.2. Place a white 2x3 inverted slope brick, vertically with the slope at the back, behind each of the previous two pieces.

150.1. Place a dark blue 1x3 plate, vertically, to the left of the left piece from the previous step so the front side is even with the front of the wall. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

150.2. Place the left stud of a dark blue 1x1 tile with a 1x1 slope tile hanging down from one side, horizontally, with the slope on the left, on each of the three studs on the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

151.1. Now we'll build the roof on top of the window. Place a 2x3 plate, vertically, in front of you.

151.2. Place the left column of a brown 2x2 plate with two studs on one side, with the side studs at the front, on the front two studs of the right column of the previous piece.

151.3. Place the front two studs of the left column of a white 2x3 plate, vertically, under the right column of the previous piece.

151.4. Place a brown 1x4 plate, vertically, on the right column of the previous piece so the front sides are even. Repeat symmetrically on the left side.

151.5. Place a dark blue 1x6 plate, horizontally and centered horizontally, under the back studs of the previous two pieces.

151.6. Place the back row of a dark blue 2x2 curved slope tile, with the tall side on the right, on the left two studs of the previous piece. Place another in front of the first.

151.7. Repeat the previous step symmetrically on the right side.

151.8. Place the roof assembly we just made, centered horizontally, above the window so the front sides are even.

152. Now we'll add an arched border around the window! There are two side studs above the window, and two on either side of it. Place the top stud of a light purple 4x4 macaroni tile, with the anti-studs at the back and the flat sides at the right and bottom, on the left side stud above the window. The bottom stud of the macaroni tile should attach to the top side stud to the left of the window. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

153. Place a light purple 1x1 tile below the left stud of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

Group 32.

154.1. Let's add some more slopes to the roof! Place a dark blue 1x2 slope brick, vertically with the slope at the front, on the front two studs on the rightmost column of the roof. This should attach to other slope bricks. Repeat symmetrically on the left side.

154.2. Place a dark blue 2x2 slope brick, with the slope at the front, to the right of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

155.1. Next, we'll build up the walls of the second floor. Rotate the house 180 degrees so the picnic table is at the back right. Place a dark blue 1x2 slope brick, vertically with the slope at the front, on the front two studs of the left wall. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

155.2. Place a white 1x1 brick behind each of the previous two pieces.

155.3. Place a white 1x3x3 half-arch, horizontally with the arch on the right, behind the left piece from the previous step. Place another behind the first.

155.4. Repeat the previous step symmetrically on the right side.

156.1. Place a light purple 1x2 brick, vertically, on the rightmost studs of the previous two pieces. Repeat symmetrically on the left side.

156.2. Place a dark blue 1x2 slope brick, vertically with the slope at the front, in front of each of the previous two pieces.

157.1. Now we'll work on the chimney a little bit. Stack two dark gray 1x2 plates and place them, vertically, in front of you.

157.2. Place a dark tan 1x1 slope tile, with the thick side at the back, on the front stud of the stack. Place another symmetrically behind the first.

157.3. Place the stack with slope tiles, vertically, on the left column of the chimney.

158.1. Place a light gray 1x2 brick with two studs on one side, vertically with the side studs on the right, on the right column of the chimney.

158.2. Place a light gray 1x2 tile with rounded ends on the side studs of the previous piece.

159.1. Now we'll work on the roof again. Place a dark blue 1x2 slope brick, vertically with the slope at the front, on the front two studs on the left wall. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

159.2. Place the left column of a dark blue 2x2 slope brick, with the slope at the back, behind the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

Group 33.

160.1. Place the left stud of a white 1x2 brick, horizontally, in front of the right column of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

160.2. Place the left column of a dark blue 2x2 slope brick, with the slope at the back, behind the right stud of the left piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

161.1. Now we'll extend the sloped portions of the roof past the walls. Rotate the house 90 degrees clockwise so the picnic table is at the front right. Find a dark blue 1x4 hinge plate. This looks like two 1x2 plates connected at one corner. You can open it all the way out so it looks like a 1x4 plate, or close it all the way so it looks like a 2x2 plate. When it is all the way open, the hinge will stick out like a little half-circle. Open this piece so it forms a 90 degree angle with one 1x2 plate vertically at the front and the other horizontally at the left, and place it in front of you. The corner should be at the back right.

161.2. Place the right two studs of a dark blue 1x4 tile, horizontally, on the horizontal portion of the previous piece so it overhangs two studs to the left.

161.3. Place the right two studs of a dark blue 1x3 plate, horizontally, under the two overhanging studs of the previous piece.

161.4. Place the back two studs of a dark blue 1x4 tile, vertically, on the vertical portion of the hinge plate so it overhangs two studs to the front.

161.5. Place the back two studs of a dark blue 1x3 plate, vertically, under the two overhanging studs of the previous piece.

161.6. The front wall of the house, which is the wall with the chimney, has two side studs on it. These are near the left and right ends where the sloped portions end. Rotate the hinged assembly we just made so the corner is at the top, the anti-studs at the back, and so the legs point down symmetrically to the left and right. Place the bottom stud of each leg onto the side studs. The angle of this assembly should match the slope of the roof and should rest on the sloped tiles on the chimney.

162.1. Now we'll extend the hinged assembly a bit. Place a dark blue 1x3 plate, horizontally, in front of you.

162.2. Place a dark blue 1x4 tile, horizontally, on the previous piece so it overhangs one stud to the right.

162.3. Repeat steps 162.1-162.2.

162.4. Place the right stud of one of the assemblies we just made, with the anti-stud at the back and the overhanging portion on the right, on the leftmost stud of the hinged assembly. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

163.1. Place a dark gray 1x2 masonry brick, horizontally with the brick pattern at the front, on the front row of the chimney.

163.2. Place a dark gray 1x2 brick with a horizontal clip on one side, horizontally with the clip at the back, on the previous piece.

164.1. Now we'll make a hinged assembly for the other wall! Rotate the house 180 degrees so the picnic table is at the back left. Place a dark blue 1x4 hinge plate, opened so it forms a 90 degree angle with one 1x2 plate vertically at the front and the other horizontally at the left, in front of you. The corner should be at the back right.

164.2. Place the right two studs of a dark blue 1x4 tile, horizontally, on the horizontal portion of the previous piece so it overhangs two studs to the left.

164.3. Place the right two studs of a dark blue 1x3 plate, horizontally, under the two overhanging studs of the previous piece.

164.4. Place the back two studs of a dark blue 1x4 tile, vertically, on the vertical portion of the hinge plate so it overhangs two studs to the front.

164.5. Place the back two studs of a dark blue 1x3 plate, vertically, under the two overhanging studs of the previous piece.

164.6. The front wall of the house has two side studs on it. These are near the left and right ends where the sloped portions end. Rotate the hinged assembly we just made so the corner is at the top, the anti-studs are at the back, and so the legs point down symmetrically to the left and right. Place the bottom stud of each leg onto the side studs. The angle of this assembly should match the slope of the roof.

165.1. Now we'll extend the hinged assembly a bit. Place a dark blue 1x3 plate, horizontally, in front of you.

165.2. Place a dark blue 1x4 tile, horizontally, on the previous piece so it overhangs one stud to the right.

165.3. Repeat steps 165.1-165.2.

165.4. Place the right stud of one of the assemblies we just made, with the anti-stud at the back and the overhanging portion on the right, on the leftmost stud of the hinged assembly. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

166. Rotate the house 90 degrees clockwise so the picnic table is at the back right. Place a dark blue 2x16 plate, horizontally, on top of the roof to the left of the chimney. It will overhang one column to the left.

167.1. Place a dark gray 1x2 masonry brick, horizontally with the brick pattern at the front, on the rightmost two studs on the top of the roof. The right stud should attach to the chimney. Place another symmetrically behind the first.

167.2. The window on the back wall still has two columns of exposed studs. Place a dark blue 2x6 tile, vertically, on these studs so its front side is even with the front of the 2x16 plate.

168.1. Place a dark gray 2x2 plate on the chimney.

168.2. Place a light gray 1x2 jumper plate, horizontally, on the front row of the chimney. Place another behind the first.

168.3. Place a medium brown 1x1 round brick on each of the previous two pieces to finish the chimney. Now the beekeeper's house is complete! Great job!

Bag 6.

Mini-Doll Group 3: Paisley

Assemble the Paisley mini-doll by placing the torso on the legs, the head on the torso, and the hair on the head. Paisley has long, straight, burgundy hair. She's wearing a khaki skirt and a yellow tank top. She is wearing light blue flip-flops.

Sub-Build 2: Flower Garden with Beehives

Group 34.

- 1.1. Let's build the beehive and flower garden! Set the other builds aside. Place a green 16x16 plate in front of you.
- 1.2. Place a dark gray 1x12 brick, horizontally, on the back row of the previous piece with the right sides even.
- 2.1. Place a brown 2x4 brick with axle holes between the studs, vertically, to the left of the previous piece so the back sides are even.
- 2.2. Place a dark gray 1x2 masonry brick, vertically with the brick pattern on the left, to the left of the previous piece so the back sides are even.
- 2.3. Place a brown 2x4 brick with axle holes between the studs, horizontally, in front of the right four studs of the 1x12 brick.
- 2.4. Place a dark gray 1x6 brick, vertically, in front of the rightmost column of the previous piece.
- 3.1. Place a lime green 1x1 tile with one rounded end, with the rounded end at the front, on the front stud of the previous piece.
- 3.2. Place a lime green 1x3 tile, vertically, behind the previous piece. Place another behind the first.
- 3.3. Place the right column of a lime green 2x2 angled corner plate, with the angled corner at the front left so the studs form a braille letter D, behind the previous piece.
- 3.4. Place a lime green 1x3 tile, horizontally, to the left of the back row of the previous piece.
- 3.5. Place a lime green 1x1 tile with one rounded end, with the rounded end on the left, to the left of the previous piece.
- 3.6. Place a dark gray 1x2 masonry brick, horizontally with the brick pattern at the front, on the left two studs on the back row of the wall.
- 3.7. Place a lime green 1x3 tile, horizontally, to the right of the previous piece.
- 3.8. Place a lime green 1x1 tile with one rounded end, with the rounded end at the right, to the right of the previous piece.
4. Stack two light gray 1x2 bricks with holes, and place the stack, vertically, on the back left corner of the 16x16 plate.
- 5.1. Place the left column of a lime green 2x2 angled corner plate, with the angled corner at the front right so the studs form a braille letter F, on the stack from the previous step.
- 5.2. Place a lime green 1x1 tile with one rounded end, with the rounded end on the right, to the right of the back row of the previous piece.
- 6.1. Find the 2x4 brick on the right wall. Place a dark gray 2x4 tile, vertically, in front of the second and third columns of this brick.
- 6.2. Place a dark gray 2x2 tile to the left of the previous piece so the front sides are even.
- 6.3. Place a dark gray 2x4 tile, vertically, to the left of the previous piece so the back sides are even.
- 7.1. Place a light gray 1x2 tile with rounded ends, horizontally, behind the previous piece.

7.2. Place a light gray 2x2 round tile with a single stud to the left of the back two rows of the last 2x4 tile.

7.3. Place a light gray 1x2 tile with rounded ends, vertically, in front of the right column of the previous piece.

7.4. Place a light gray 1x2 tile with rounded ends, horizontally, in front of the last 2x4 tile.

7.5. Place a light gray 2x2 round tile with a single stud to the right of the front two rows of the last 2x4 tile.

Group 35.

8.1. Find the vertical 2x4 brick on the back wall. Place a tan 2x6 plate, vertically, in front of this brick.

8.2. Place a tan 2x2 triangular tile, with the 90 degree corner at the front left, to the right of the back two rows of the previous piece.

8.3. Place a tan 2x2 tile with a single stud in front of the previous piece. Place two more in front of the first.

8.4. Place a tan 2x2 tile with a single stud to the right of the front previous piece. Place another behind the first.

8.5. Place a tan 2x2 triangular tile, with the 90 degree corner at the front left, behind the back previous piece.

9. The pieces for step 9 in the instructions were placed in the previous steps.

10.1. Place a tan 2x3 pentagonal tile, vertically with the point at the back, on the 16x16 plate so there are four free columns to the left of it and so the front is even with the front of the 16x16 plate.

10.2. Place a tan 2x2 triangular tile, with the 90 degree corner at the back left, behind the previous piece so the left sides are even. The left side should also be even with the 2x2 tile with a single stud behind it.

10.3. Place a tan 2x3 pentagonal tile, horizontally with the point at the left, to the right of the previous piece so the back sides are even. The angled parts of the previous three pieces should all interlock.

11.1. Place a tan 2x2 triangular tile, with the 90 degree corner at the back left, in front of the right two columns of the previous piece.

11.2. Place a tan 2x2 triangular tile, with the 90 degree corner at the back left, to the right of the last 2x3 pentagonal tile. Place another symmetrically behind the first.

12.1. Place a tan 2x2 tile with a single stud on the front left corner of the 16x16 plate.

12.2. Place a tan 2x3 pentagonal tile, horizontally with the point at the right, behind the previous piece so the left sides are even.

12.3. Place a tan 2x2 triangular tile, with the 90 degree corner at the back right, to the right of the previous piece so the back sides are even.

12.4. Place a tan 2x3 pentagonal tile, vertically with the point at the back, in front of the previous piece so the right sides are even. The front of this piece should be even with the front of the 16x16 plate.

13.1. Place a green 1x1 round plate with a flower petal pattern on the leftmost column of the 16x16 plate behind a 2x3 pentagonal tile. Place another to the right of the first.

13.2. Place a light gray 1x2 plate, horizontally, behind the previous two pieces.

13.3. Place a green 1x1 round plate with three leaves, with the leaves pointing to the front and right, to the right of the previous piece.

13.4. Place a light gray 1x2 plate, vertically, behind the right stud of the last 1x2 plate.

14. Place a light gray 1x2 brick with a hole, vertically, to the left of the previous piece.

15.1. Place the back stud of a dark gray 1x1 tile with a 1x1 slope tile hanging down from one side, vertically with the slope at the front, on the front stud of the previous piece.

15.2. Place the left stud of a dark gray 1x1 tile with a 1x1 slope tile hanging down from one side, horizontally with the slope on the right, behind the previous piece.

Group 36.

16.1. Place a green 1x1 round plate with a flower petal pattern in front of the right wall on the 16x16 plate.

16.2. Place a green 1x4 tile, vertically, in front of the previous piece.

16.3. Place a green 1x3 plate, horizontally, to the left of the previous piece so the back sides are even.

16.4. Place a light brown 1x1 round tile in front of the left and right studs of the previous piece.

17.1. Place a brown 1x3 jumper plate, horizontally, in front of the previous two pieces.

17.2. Place a brown 1x3 jumper plate, vertically, on each of the three columns in front of the previous piece.

17.3. Place a green 1x4 tile, vertically, in front of the other 1x4 tile to the right of the previous piece. This piece should overhang two studs to the front.

18. Place the right column of a green 6x6 plate with one rounded corner, with the rounded corner at the front right, under the overhanging studs of the previous piece.

19.1. Place a green 1x1 quarter circle tile, with the flat sides at the left and back, in front of the 1x4 tile on the right column of the previous piece.

19.2. Place a green 1x3 plate, horizontally, to the left of the previous piece.

19.2. Place a brown 1x3 jumper plate, horizontally, behind the previous piece. Place another behind the first.

20.1. Place a green 1x4 tile, vertically, to the left of the previous two pieces so there are four free studs in front of it. Place another in front of the first.

20.2. Place a green 1x1 round plate with three leaves, with the leaves pointing to the front and right, to the right of the back stud of the front 1x4 tile from the previous step.

20.3. Place a green 1x1 round plate with a flower petal pattern to the right of the previous piece. Place another in front of the 1x1 round plate with three leaves.

20.4. Place a green 1x1 quarter circle tile, with the flat sides at the front and right, behind the back 1x4 tile from step 19.3.

21.1. Place a green 2x2 macaroni tile, with the flat sides at the front and right, so it curves around the previous piece. The front and right sides should be even.

21.2. Place a green 1x4 tile, vertically, in front of the left column of the previous piece.

21.3. Place a green 4x4 rounded corner plate, with the rounded corner at the back left, to the left of the previous piece. The front row should overhang.

22. Place the right four columns of a 6x6 plate with one rounded corner, with the corner at the front left, under the overhanging studs of the previous piece. It should touch the other 6x6 plate with rounded corners.

23.1. Place a green 1x2 jumper plate, vertically, on the front right corner of the previous piece. Place one to the right of this piece, and another to the left.

23.2. Place a green 2x2 macaroni tile, with the flat sides at the right and back, to the left of the left piece from the previous step so the front sides are even. There should be one free stud to the left of the back stud of this piece.

23.3. Place a green 1x1 quarter circle tile, with the flat sides at the right and back, inside the curved cutout of the previous piece.

23.4. Place a green 2x2 tile behind the previous two pieces.

23.5. Place a brown 1x3 jumper plate, horizontally, to the right of each of the two rows of the previous piece.

Group 37.

24.1. Now we're going to start making some hexagonal planters. Place a light brown 1x3 plate with rounded corners, horizontally, in front of you.

24.2. Place a medium brown 1x1 plate on the center stud of the previous piece.

24.3. Place a light brown 1x1 tile on the previous piece.

24.4. Repeat steps 24.1-24.3 two more times. These will be the first three sides of the planter.

24.5. Let's place the first side. The back half of the rightmost column of the flower garden has a low wall. In front of this wall is a 1x1 round plate, and two 1x4 tiles. To the left of the back stud of the back 1x4 tile is a horizontal 1x3 plate. Rotate two of the planter sides so they are vertical and place the back studs on the left and right studs of the 1x3 plate. These sides will need to angle out a little bit so they don't hit the studs of the jumper plates.

24.5. In front of the 1x3 plate where we put the first two sides are two 1x1 round tiles, then a horizontal 1x3 jumper plate, and then three vertical 1x3 jumper plates. Place the other planter side, horizontally, on the back row of studs formed by the three vertical jumper plates.

25.1. Now we'll make the other walls of the planter. Place a medium brown 1x1 plate in front of you.

25.2. Place a light brown 1x3 plate with rounded ends, horizontally and centered horizontally, on the previous piece.

25.3. Place a light brown 1x1 tile, centered horizontally, on the previous piece.

25.4. Place a light brown 1x1 round tile on each side of the previous piece.

25.5. Repeat steps 25.1-25.4 two more times to make the other sides of the planter.

25.6. Place the first side, horizontally, on the back studs of the two vertical sides.

25.7. Next we'll connect the left side. Since the planter is a hexagon, the left and right sides will angle out at the center. Rotate the left vertical side clockwise about 30 degrees (so it points to about 8 o'clock on a clock face). Connect another side to the front stud of this side and the left stud of the front horizontal side. You may need to adjust the angles to make this work.

25.8. Repeat the previous step symmetrically with the right sides of the planter.

26.1. Now we'll make another planter! Place a light brown 1x3 plate with rounded corners, horizontally, in front of you.

26.2. Place a medium brown 1x1 plate on the center stud of the previous piece.

26.3. Place a light brown 1x1 tile on the previous piece.

26.4. Repeat steps 26.1-26.3 two more times.

26.5. Place the first side, horizontally, in front of the front horizontal side of the first planter.

26.6. In front of the first side are two horizontal 1x3 jumper plates, and in front of those jumper plates is a 1x3 plate. Place the front studs of the other two sides, almost vertically but angled out and to the back to avoid the jumper plates, on the left and right studs of this plate.

27.1. Now we'll make the other sides. Place a medium brown 1x1 plate in front of you.

27.2. Place a light brown 1x3 plate with rounded ends, horizontally and centered horizontally, on the previous piece.

27.3. Place a light brown 1x1 tile, centered horizontally, on the previous piece.

27.4. Place a light brown 1x1 round tile on each side of the previous piece.

27.5. Repeat steps 27.1-27.4 two more times to make the other sides of the planter.

27.6. Place the first side, horizontally, on the front studs of the two vertical sides of the second planter.

27.7. Attach the left and right sides just like we did with the first planter.

28.1. We have one more planter to build! Place a light brown 1x3 plate with rounded corners, horizontally, in front of you.

28.2. Place a medium brown 1x1 plate on the center stud of the previous piece.

28.3. Place a light brown 1x1 tile on the previous piece.

28.4. Repeat steps 28.1-28.3 two more times.

28.5. There are three vertical 1x2 jumper plates on the front two rows of the flower garden. Behind these are two horizontal 1x3 jumper plates. Behind the 1x3 jumper plate is a 4x4 rounded corner plate. Place the left two studs of the first side of the planter, horizontally, on the right two studs on the front row of the rounded corner plate.

28.6. Place the front studs of the other two sides, almost vertically but angled outward to avoid the jumper plates, on the left and right vertical 1x2 jumper plates on the front two rows.

29.1. Let's make the last sides! Place a medium brown 1x1 plate in front of you.

29.2. Place a light brown 1x3 plate with rounded ends, horizontally and centered horizontally, on the previous piece.

29.3. Place a light brown 1x1 tile, centered horizontally, on the previous piece.

29.4. Place a light brown 1x1 round tile on each side of the previous piece.

29.5. Repeat steps 29.1-29.4 two more times to make the other sides of the planter.

29.6. Place the first side, horizontally, on the front studs of the two vertical sides of the first planter.

29.7. Attach the left and right sides just like we did with the first two planters. Great work!

Bag 7.

Mini-Doll Group 4: Beekeeper Orla

Assemble the Orla mini-doll by placing the torso on the legs and the head on the torso. Orla can wear a beekeeper's hat and face mask. Otherwise, she has brown shoulder length hair. She wears a white beekeeper's suit, which has lots of pockets, and white gloves which are attached to the sleeves so the bees can't accidentally get stuck inside the suit and sting her!

Assemble a smoker by placing the anti-stud of a silver mug onto the stud of a 1x1 round stud with an angled bar on one side. The angled bar should be on the opposite side from the handle of the mug. Smokers are used to put bees to sleep so that beekeepers can safely collect the honey!

Clip the handle of the mug into Orla's right hand.

Group 38.

30.1. Now we'll make a tree, starting with the trunk. Set the flower garden aside for now. Place a brown 2L axle connector, horizontally, in front of you.

30.2. Push a black 2L axle into each end of the previous piece.

31. Push a brown 2L axle connector onto the left piece from the previous step.

32.1. Push a black 2L axle into the left side of the previous piece.

32.2. Find a brown axle and pin connector #3. This piece has two 1L axle connectors which form an angle almost 180 degrees, and a perpendicular pin hole between them. Push the right side of this piece, with the axle connectors at 3 and 8 o'clock onto the previous piece.

33. Find a brown axle connector with three, evenly spaced axles. Push one of the axles, with the other axles at 10 and 6 o'clock, into the left side of the previous piece.

34.1. Push the right axle connector of a brown #3 axle and pin connector, with the axle connectors at 9 o'clock and 4 o'clock onto the 10 o'clock axle of the previous piece.

34.2. Push the anti-stud of a brown 1x1 cone onto the 6 o'clock axle of the axle connector with three axles.

35. Push a dark gray 1L pin with a stud on one side, with the stud at the front, into each of the pin holes on the top of the tree trunk.

36.1. Place a brown 1x1 round tile with a tree ring pattern on the right piece from the previous step.

36.2. Push a brown 2L bar with a middle stop into the axle hole on the left side of the tree.

37.1. Push the bar of a brown 1x1 round plate with a bar on one side, with the round plate on top and the stud on the left, into the axle hole on top of the tree trunk.

37.2. Place a pink 1x1 round plate with three leaves, with the leaves on top, on the previous piece.

38. Place the flower garden back in front of you with the hexagonal planters at the front right. Find the 2x4 brick with axle holes between the stud that's near the back right corner of the garden. The right column of this piece is covered. Rotate the tree trunk so the exposed axle is at the bottom, with the 1x1 cone pointing to the left. Push the axle into the axle hole between the second and third columns from the left on the 2x4 brick. The flower on the tree should be at the front and the 2L bar should be at the top of the tree trunk.

Group 39.

39. Now we'll make a birdhouse for the tree! Set the flower garden aside for now. Place a tan 1x2 plate, horizontally, in front of you.

40. Place a tan 1x1 round plate with a bar on one side, with the bar on the left, on the left stud of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

41.1. Place a black 1x1 brick with studs on two opposite sides, with the studs at the front and back, on the left piece from the previous step.

41.2. Place a tan 1x1 brick with a hole, with the hole facing left and right, to the right of the previous piece.

42. Place the left stud of a tan 1x2 plate, horizontally, on the front side stud on the birdhouse. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

43. Place the top row of a tan 2x2 curved slope tile, upright with the tall side at the top, on the front piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

44. The birdhouse will have a purple roof! Place a purple 2x3 plate, vertically and centered vertically, on the birdhouse.

45.1. Place a red 1x1 tall plate, centered vertically, on the left column of the previous piece.

45.2. Place a purple 1x1 slope tile, with the tall side at the back, in front of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

46.1. Place a purple 1x1 slope tile, with the tall side at the back, to the right of the front piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

46.2. Place a light gray 1x1 brick with one rounded end and a stud on the opposite side, with the side stud on the right, between the previous two pieces.

47.1. Place a white boomerang, with the arms hanging down, on the side stud of the previous piece. The arms of the boomerang should hang down almost in line with the roof of the birdhouse.

47.2. Place a purple 1x2 tile, horizontally, on the birdhouse.

48. Place the flower garden in front of you, with the tree at the back left. Find the single hollow stud facing to the right on the tree, near the top. Push the left bar of the birdhouse, with the boomerang on the right, into this hollow stud.

Group 40.

49.1. Next, we'll make a small home for bees! This is a box on a pole which has a bunch of hollow, wooden tubes in it. Native bees like making their homes in places like this! Set the flower garden aside for now. Place a brown 2L axle connector, horizontally, in front of you.

49.2. Push a black 2L axle into each end of the previous piece.

50.1. Push a brown 2L axle connector onto the left piece from the previous step.

50.2. Push a black 6L axle into the left side of the previous piece.

51. Push the axle hole of a tan 1x2 brick with an axle hole, upside down, onto the previous piece. Push it all the way to the right. Repeat three more times. This is the box of the bee home.

52. Place a tan 1x1 round plate with a hollow stud, upside down, on each of the anti-studs on the right three pieces from the previous step. You'll place a total of six. These are the openings of the individual tubes the bees live in!

53.1. Now, let's add a bee flying out of one of the homes. Push the bar of a clear 1x1 round plate with an angled bar on one side, with the stud facing up to the left, into the hollow anti-stud of the front right 1x1 round plate on the bee home.

53.2. Place a clear 1x1 round tile with a bee pattern on the previous piece.

54. We want the bees to feel nice and cozy in their homes, so we'll add a little roof to keep the rain out! Place the side studs of a tan 1x2 plate with two studs sticking up from one side, vertically with the side studs on the bottom and the anti-studs on the right, on the anti-studs to the left of the bee tubes.

55. Let's slope the roof so the rain can run down the sides. Place a dark orange 1x1 slope tile, with the tall side at the back, on the front stud of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

56. Place the flower garden back in front of you, with the tree at the back left. Find the 2x4 brick with axle holes between the studs that's near the front left corner. Rotate the bee home so the box is at the top with the tubes facing the right. Push the axle on the bottom into the axle hole between the right two columns of the 2x4 brick.

Group 41.

57.1. Now we'll add some more detail to the base of the flower garden. Place a dark green 1x1 round plate with a long, jagged leaf, with the leaf at the back, in front of you. Place another, with the leaf on the right, on the previous piece.

57.2. Place the back stud of a dark gray 1x1 tile with a 1x1 slope tile hanging off one side, vertically with the slope at the front, on the previous piece.

57.3. Place this assembly, vertically with the leaves at the back and right, to the right of the 2x4 brick with the bee home on it.

58.1. Rotate the flower garden 180 degrees so the tree is at the front right. Find the two slopes on the back two rows of the flower garden, to the right of some 1x1 round plates with flower petal patterns. Place a dark gray 2x2 sloped corner brick, with the corner at the back right so the the studs form a braille letter D, in front of the left two studs of the slopes on the back row. The front row should be on the back row of a 2x6 plate.

58.2. Place a green 1x2 jumper plate, vertically, on the right column of the previous piece.

58.3. Place a clear 1x1 round tile with a ladybug pattern to the left of the back stud of the previous piece.

You will have two transparent blue 1x1 round plates leftover when you finish this group.

Group 42.

59.1. Now let's add a rain bucket! Place a brown 2x2x2 bucket on the 2x6 plate to the right of the 2x2 corner brick from step 58.1.

59.2. Now we'll add some water. Stack the leftover two transparent blue 1x1 round plates.

59.3. Place a transparent light blue 1x1 round tile on the stack. Place the entire stack into the barrel.

59.4. There are two rows of 2x2 tiles with a single stud in front of the barrel. The back row has three and the front row has two. Place a lime green watering can on the back right 2x2 tile with a single stud.

60.1. Next we'll build an old-school pump! Place a black 1x1 plate with one rounded end and a short bar on the opposite side, with the bar on the left, in front of you. We'll mount the handle here later.

60.2. Place a black 1x1 round brick on the previous piece.

60.3. Place a black 1x1 plate with a triangular tooth, with the tooth on the right, on the previous piece. This will be the spout of the pump.

60.4. Place a black 1x1 round plate with a hollow stud on the previous piece.

60.5. Push the short bar of a black 1x1 round tile with a short bar sticking up, with the anti-stud on top, into the hollow stud of the previous piece.

60.6. Place a black 1.5x1 cone, upside down, on the previous piece.

60.7. Flip the pump over so the previous piece is at the bottom, with the spout on the right. The 1x1 plate with a rounded end and a bar should be on top. Clip a black crowbar, with the clip on top and the rest of the crowbar hanging down, onto the bar at the top of the pump. This is the handle for the pump.

60.8. Find the 1x2 jumper plate on the brick to the left of the barrel. Place the pump on the jumper plate and rotate it so the spout is above the barrel.

Group 43.

61.1. Now we'll start building the beehives. There will be two hives which will be placed on the same base. Place a white 4x6 plate, horizontally, in front of you.

61.2. Place a white 2x3 tile, horizontally, on the back two rows of the previous piece so the left sides are even. Place another to the right of the first.

61.3. Place a white 1x2 tile, vertically, on the leftmost column of the 4x6 plate so the front sides are even. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

61.4. Place a white 1x2 tile, vertically, on each of the two middle columns of the 4x6 plate so the front sides are even. There should be two vertical 1x2 gaps in the tiles on the base.

61.5. Flip the base over so the anti-studs are on top. Place a white 1x1 tall plate on each of the four circular anti-studs on the corners of the 4x6 plate.

61.6. Flip the base right side up and rotate it so it is horizontal with the 1x2 gaps at the front. Rotate the flower garden so the beehome and the tree are both on the back row. To the right of the watering can there is a 2x2 round tile with a single stud, and another behind the back hexagonal planter. Rotate the base of the beehives about 45 degrees clockwise and place the front left and back right legs on these two studs. The 1x2 gaps should be on the front left diagonal side of the beehive base.

62.1. Let's build the first beehive! Place a white 2x3x2 cupboard, horizontally with the open side at the front, in front of you.

62.2. Place a white 1x3 tile, horizontally, on the back row of the previous piece.

63. Place a white 2x3 tile, horizontally, in front of the previous piece.

64. Place the back row of a white 2x3x3 cupboard, horizontally with the open side at the front, under the front row of the previous piece.

65. Place a white 1x3 tile, horizontally, on the front row of the previous piece.

66. Flip the beehive upside down so the anti-stud is at the top and the open side of the last cabinet is at the front. Place a white 1x2 plate with two anti-studs on one side, upside down and vertically with the side anti-studs at the back, centered horizontally on the back two rows of the beehive so the side anti-studs overhang to the back.

67. Place a white 1x3 plate, upside down and vertically, to the left of the previous piece so the back sides are even. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

68. Place a white 1x1 plate with a stud hanging down from one side, upside down with the side stud at the front, in front of each of the previous two pieces.

69. Place a pale yellow 1x3 inverted tile, upside down and horizontally, on the back row of anti-studs of the beehive. Place three more in front of the first. These are the drawers of the beehive!

70. Rotate the beehive so the previous pieces are at the front and the 1x2 of anti-studs is at the bottom. Place the anti-studs on the left 1x2 gap on the base.

71. Now we'll place some honeycomb inside! Slide four light brown 2x2 tiles with a honeycomb print, upright, into the top of the open cabinet on top of the beehive.

Group 44.

72.1. Now we'll make the roof of the beehive. This will be easily removable to access the honeycomb inside. Place an orange 2x3 plate, horizontally, in front of you.

72.2. Place a light gray 1x1 brick with one rounded end and a stud on the opposite side, with the side stud at the back, centered horizontally on the back row of the previous piece.

73. Place an orange 1x1 slope tile, with the tall side on the right, to the left of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

74. Stack two tan 1x2 plates and place the back stud of the stack, vertically and centered horizontally, on the front row of the 2x3 plate.

75. Place the back row of an orange 2x3 plate, horizontally and centered horizontally, under the front stud of the stack from the previous step.

76. Place an orange 1x2 slope tile, vertically with the tall side on the right, to the left of the stack of 1x2 plates. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

77.1. Place a light gray 1x1 brick with one rounded end and a stud on the opposite side, with the side stud at the front, in front of the stack of 1x2 plates.

77.2. Place an orange 1x1 slope tile, with the tall side on the right, to the left of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

78. Place a white boomerang, with the arms hanging down, on the front side stud of the roof. The arms of the boomerang should hang down almost in line with the slopes of the roof. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

79.1. Place a clear 1x1 round tile with a bee print on the stud of the front piece from the previous step.

79.2. Place an orange 1x4 tile, vertically, on the top of the roof.

80. Place the roof on the beehive. The boomerangs should be at the front and back

81. Now we'll make another beehive! Stack two white 1x3 bricks and place them, horizontally, in front of you.

82. Place the back row of a white 2x3 tile, horizontally, on the previous piece.

Group 45.

83. Place the back row of a white 2x3x3 cupboard, horizontally with the open side at the front, under the front row of the previous piece.

84. Place a white 1x3 tile, horizontally, on the front row of the previous piece.

85. Flip the beehive upside down so the anti-stud is at the top and the open side of the cabinet is at the front. Place a white 1x2 plate with two anti-studs on one side, upside down and vertically with the side anti-studs at the back, centered horizontally on the back two rows of the beehive so the side anti-studs overhang to the back.

86. Place a white 1x2 plate, upside down and vertically, to the left of the previous piece so the back sides are even. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

87. Place a white 1x1 plate with a stud hanging down from one side, upside down with the side stud at the front, in front of each of the previous two pieces.

88. Place a blue 1x3 inverted tile, upside down and horizontally, on the back row of anti-studs of the beehive. Place two more in front of the first.

89. Rotate the beehive so the previous pieces are at the front and the 1x2 of anti-studs is at the bottom. Place this beehive to the right of the first one.

90. Let's add some honeycomb to this hive as well. Slide four light brown 2x2 tiles with a honeycomb print, upright, into the top of the open cabinet on top of the beehive.

91.1. The roof for this hive is a lot simpler! Place a blue 1x4 plate, vertically, in front of you.

91.2. Place the left column of a blue 2x3 tile, horizontally, on the back two studs of the previous piece. Place another in front of the first.

91.3. Place a blue 1x4 plate, horizontally, under the rightmost column of the previous two pieces.

91.4. Place the roof on top of the second beehive.

Bag 8.

Group 46.

92.1. Now we'll build some flowers for the flower garden, starting with sunflowers. Set the flower garden aside for now. Place a green 1x2 plate with a bar sticking up from one long side, horizontally with the bar at the front, in front of you.

92.2. Place a dark green 1x2 brick, horizontally, on the previous piece.

93.1. Place a green 1x1 cone on the left stud of the previous piece.

93.2. Place a green 1x1 round plate with three leaves, with the leaves pointing to the back and left, on the previous piece.

93.3. Place a green 1x1 round tile with a short bar sticking up on the previous piece.

94.1. Place a green 1x1 round plate with three leaves, with the leaves pointing to the back and right, on the right stud of the 1x2 brick.

94.2. Place a green 1x1 round tile with a short bar sticking up on the previous piece.

95.1. Push one of the hollow studs of a green bar with a hollow stud on each end onto the short bar sticking up from the left sunflower stem.

95.2. Place a green 1x1 round plate with three leaves, with the leaves pointing to the back and left, on the previous piece.

96.1. Now we'll make the first flower. Place a dark green 1x1 round plate with a bar on one side, with the bar at the front, in front of you.

96.2. Place a yellow flower on the previous piece.

96.3. Place a dark orange 1x1 round tile on the previous piece.

96.4. Rotate the flower so the bar is at the bottom and the round tile points to the back left. Push the bar into the hollow stud of the left stem.

97.1. Now we'll make a couple smaller sunflowers. Place a green bar with a hollow stud on each end, upright, in front of you.

97.2. Place a green 1x1 round plate with three leaves, with the leaves at the front and left, on the previous piece.

97.3. Push the short bar of a 1x1 round plate with an angled bar, with the stud at the front, into the hollow stud of the previous piece.

97.4. Place a yellow flower on the previous piece.

97.5. Place a dark orange 1x1 round tile on the previous piece.

97.6. Repeat steps 97.1-97.5 to make another flower.

97.7. Push the hollow stud at the bottom of one sunflower, with the flower at the right, on the short bar of the right stem.

97.8. Push the hollow stem at the bottom of the last sunflower, with the flower at the front, onto the bar on the front of the sunflower assembly.

98. Place the flower garden in front of you, with the tree at the back right. Rotate the assembly of sunflowers 180 degrees so the 1x2 brick is horizontally at the front. Place it on the row of studs in the back hexagonal planter.

Group 47 and 48. Group 48 contains the pale purple 1x1 round plates with a flower petal pattern from step 102.2.

99. Place a brown 2x2 round brick in the middle hexagonal planter.

100. Place a dark green 1x1 round plate with three leaves, with the leaves pointing to the back, on the back right stud of the previous piece. Place another, with the leaves pointing to the front, on the first.

101. Push the short bar of a green set of three flower stems, with the stems at the top, into the hollow stud of the previous piece. Push another, with the stems offset so they are between the first set of stems, into the first set of stems.

102.1. Now we'll make some lavender flowers. Stack two purple 1x1 round plates with flower petal patterns.

102.2. Place a pale purple 1x1 round plate with a flower petal pattern from group 47 on the stack.

102.3. Repeat steps 102.1-102.2 five times.

102.4. Push the hollow anti-stud of a stack of flowers onto each of the six stems.

103.1. Push the short bar of a clear 1x1 round plate with an angled bar, with the stud at the front, into the hollow stud of one of the leftmost stacks of 1x1 flower plates.

103.2. Place a clear 1x1 round tile with a bee pattern on the previous piece.

Group 49. There are three green 1x1 round plates with three leaves stacked together. The loose ones are pink.

104.1. Let's build another flower! Place a brown 2x2 round brick in front of you.

104.2. Place a dark green 2x2 round plate on the previous piece.

104.3. Place a green 2x2 round tile with a single stud on the previous piece.

105. Push the short bar of a dark green set of six flower stems into the hollow stud of the previous piece.

106.1. Place a green 1x1 round plate with three leaves from the stack, with the leaves at the left, in front of you.

106.2. Place a bright pink flower on the previous piece.

106.3. Place a light pink 1x1 round plate with a flower petal pattern on the previous piece.

106.4. Repeat steps 106.1-106.3 two more times.

106.5. There are two sets of three stems on top of the stack of 2x2 round pieces, one higher and one lower. Push the hollow anti-stud of one of the flower assemblies, with the leaf pointing to the left, on the leftmost flower stem in the lower set of stems. Repeat symmetrically on the other two lower stems. The leaves should point down.

107.1. Place a bright pink flower in front of you.

107.2. Place a light pink 1x1 round plate with a flower petal pattern on the previous piece.

107.3. Repeat steps 107.1-107.2 two more times.

107.4. Push the hollow anti-stud of one of the flower assemblies onto each of the remaining three flower stems.

108. Place a clear 1x1 round tile with a bee pattern on the front flower on the lower group of stems.

109. Place the flower assembly in the front hexagonal planter.

110.1. Now we'll turn our attention to the tree. Find a pink 4x3 plant leaves. This piece has six studs, only two of which have anti-studs on the bottom. Place this, horizontally, in front of you so the angled arms look like an arrow pointing to the left.

110.2. Place a pink 1x1 round plate with three leaves, with the leaves pointing to the right, on the rightmost stud, and the left stud on both the front and back rows of the previous piece.

110.3. Find a brown large horn. This is a curved cylinder which is wider at one end, with a short bar at the wide end. The narrow end is also a bar. Push the narrow end, with the wide end at the bottom curving to the right, into the leftmost hollow anti-stud of the 4x3 plant leaves.

110.4. Find the 1x1 cone which points to the left on the trunk, to the left of the birdhouse. Push the short bar on the wide side of the previous piece into the hollow stud of the cone. Rotate the 4x3 plant leaves so they point towards the birdhouse.

Group 50.

111.1. Rotate the flower garden 90 degrees clockwise so the tree is at the front right. Find the bar on top of the tree. Push the middle hollow stud of a black 1x3 plate with rounded ends, vertically, onto this bar.

111.2. Find a brown elephant trunk. This looks like a wavy cylinder, with a short bar at the wide end and a hollow stud at the narrow end. Push the short bar at the wide side, with the trunk pointing to the front left, into the front hollow stud of the previous piece. Push the short bar of another, with the trunk pointing to the back left, into the back hollow stud of the 1x3 plate with rounded ends.

112.1. Now we'll make some more leaves. Place a pink 4x3 plant leaves, horizontally, in front of you so the angled arms look like an arrow pointing to the left. The studs with anti-studs should be on the left and right and the studs without should form rows of two at the front and back.

112.2. Place a pink 1x1 round plate with three leaves, with the leaves pointing to the right, on the rightmost stud, and the left stud on both the front and back rows of the previous piece.

112.3. Repeat steps 112.1-112.2.

112.4. Place the leftmost stud of one leaf assembly on the front elephant trunk. Rotate the other leaf assembly 180 degrees and place its rightmost stud on the other trunk.

113. Push the bar of a light purple bar with three leaves into the right hollow stud of the back leaf assembly, and another into the left hollow stud of the front leaf assembly.

114.1. Now we'll build another tree, which will go on top of the bee home. Place a brown 2L axle connector, horizontally, in front of you.

114.2. Push a black 2L axle into the hole on the right side of the previous piece.

115. Push a brown 2L axle connector, horizontally, on the right side of the previous piece.

116. Push a yellow 3L axle into the hole on the right side of the previous piece.

117.1. Push a brown axle connector with two perpendicular bar holders, with the bar holders at the top and bottom, onto the previous piece. Push it all the way to the left so the axle extends 1L past it.

117.2. Push a brown 2L axle connector onto the axle on the right side of the tree.

118. Push a yellow 3L axle into the hole on the right side of the previous piece.

119.1. Push a brown axle connector with two perpendicular bar holders, with the bar holders at the front and back, onto the previous piece. Push it all the way to the left so the axle extends 1L past it.

119.2. Push a brown 2L axle connector onto the axle on the right side of the tree.

Group 51.

120. Push the short bar at the wide side of a brown large horn, with the narrow end pointing to the right, into the front bar hole on the tree. Push another, with the narrow end pointing to the right, into the top bar hole.

121. Push a lime green 4L bar into the hole on the right side of the tree.

122.1. Now we'll make some leaves for the tree. Place a green 4x3 plant leaves, horizontally, in front of you so the angled arms look like an arrow pointing to the right. The studs with anti-studs should be on the left and right and the studs without should form rows of two at the front and back.

122.2. Place a light green 1x1 round plate with three leaves, with the leaves pointing to the left, on the leftmost stud of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the right side.

122.3. Place the back stud of a light green 1x2 plate with big leaves, vertically with the leaves at the front, on the left stud on the front row of the 4x3 plate leaves. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

122.4. Push the bar of a green bar with three leaves on top into the back hollow stud of the front piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

122.5. Push the short bar of a yellow flower bud with a short bar into the hollow stud in front of the front piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

122.6. Place a brown 1x1 cone on the rightmost stud of the leaf assembly. This is on a light green 1x1 round plate with three leaves.

123.1. Now, take the tree trunk we made and rotate it so the bar is at the top and the curved tree limbs are at the front and right. Push the axle hole on the bottom onto the axle on top of the bee home.

123.2. Push the hollow anti-stud under the brown cone on the leaf assembly onto the bar on top of the tree trunk.

124.1. Let's make some more leaves for the tree! Place a green 4x3 plant leaves, horizontally, in front of you so the angled arms look like an arrow pointing to the left.

124.2. Place a light green 1x1 round plate with three leaves, with the leaves pointing to the left, on the leftmost stud of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

124.3. Place a clear 1x1 round tile with a bee print on the right piece from the previous step.

124.4. Place the back stud of a light green 1x2 plate with big leaves, vertically with the leaves at the front, on the right stud on the front row of the 4x3 plate leaves. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

124.5. Push the bar of a green bar with three leaves on top into the back hollow stud of the front piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

124.6. Push the short bar of a yellow flower bud with a short bud into the hollow stud in front of the front piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

124.7. Push the hollow anti-stud under the left 1x1 round plate with three leaves onto the front limb of the tree we've been working on.

125.1. Now we'll make some more leaves. Place a green 4x3 plant leaves, horizontally, in front of you so the angled arms look like an arrow pointing to the left.

125.2. Place a light green 1x1 round plate with three leaves, with the leaves pointing to the left, on the leftmost stud of the previous piece. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

125.3. Place the back stud of a light green 1x2 plate with big leaves, vertically with the leaves at the front, on the right stud on the front row of the 4x3 plate leaves. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

125.4. Push the bar of a green bar with three leaves on top into the back hollow stud of the front piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

125.5. Push the short bar of a yellow flower bud with a short bud into the hollow stud in front of the front piece from the previous step. Repeat symmetrically on the back side.

125.6. Repeat steps 125.1-125.5.

125.7. Push the hollow anti-stud under the left 1x1 round plate with three leaves onto the right limb of the tree. Repeat with the other leaf assembly on the bar on the top of the tree.

126.1. Now we can attach all three of the builds together! Make sure the flower garden is in front of you, with the trees at the back. Place the beekeeper's house in front of you, with the picnic table at the front left, in front of you. There should be three pins on the right side of the house. Push these three pins into the three holes on the left side of the flower garden.

126.2. Place the vegetable garden, with the rounded corners at the left in front of you. Push the two pins on the right side of the vegetable garden into the holes on the left side of the house. This completes the beekeepers' house!
