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Welcome to text-based instructions from Bricks for the Blind. Before you start building, here are some terms we'll be using:

- In Front of/Front: towards you.
- Behind/Back: away from you.
- Up: towards the ceiling.
- Down: towards the floor.
- Stud: the bump on a LEGO brick. Example: A 2x1 brick has two studs on it.
- Vertically: with the longest side going from front to back
- Horizontally: with the longest side going from left to right.
- Upright: pointing up towards the ceiling.
- Standing upright: The piece is perpendicular to the ground, like a wall.
- Lying flat: The piece is parallel to the ground, like a piece of toast which fell off the table.
- That one/ppp: previously placed piece.
- Plate: piece with studs.
- Tile: smooth piece without studs (unless otherwise specified)
- A jumper plate is a 1x2 plate with a single stud on top, or a 1x3 plate with only two studs on top.
- "Anti-stud" is a term for the portion of a LEGO piece which accepts studs, like the bottom of a plate or brick.
- Symmetrically: a mirror image. Example: If you place a 2x1 brick with technic connector on the front wall at the right, connector to the front, and then place another such piece symmetrically on the back wall, at the right, the technic connector of the second piece should point to the back, since it will be placed symmetrically.
- Centered-vertically: even amount of space in front of and behind piece
- Centered-horizontally: even amount of space left and right of piece.
- Row: studs lined up horizontally (left to right/side to side).
- Column: studs lined up upright or vertically (top to bottom/back to front).

For builders with low vision, or a sighted building partner who may want to follow along with the printed visual instructions that come with each set, PDF versions are always online at [<https://www.lego.com/en-us/service/building-instructions/60475>]. As low vision users may benefit from viewing the instructions on a personal device where they can zoom in on content and use assistive technologies to enhance the visuals.

The windows that we'll be opening are arranged in 4 rows of six windows. No grouping instructions are provided, since each build is very small.

We don't want to spoil each day's surprise for you, so we'll put lots of \*\*\*s between each day.

The upright panel, where the numbered windows are located, reveals a moonlit suburban street blanketed in snow. Houses glow warmly from within, golden light spilling onto the snowy ground. In the distance, skyscrapers rise above the horizon. City vehicles dot the scene; a police helicopter hovers, a LEGO semi-truck rolls along, and a train glides across an elevated track.

The box should be horizontally oriented and upright, with the fold-out mat placed flat on the table in front of you. Each window is orange-yellow with a red outline, numbered and centered on its punch-out section.

Happy Holidays from Bricks for the Blind. Let the countdown begin!

Day 1: Leftmost column, third row down from the top.

It's our first minifigure character, the polar bear!

Find 1 white minifigure torso with a light grey belly. A light teal blue scarf wraps around the neckline, decorated with white snowflakes. On the back is a small puffy tail and the continuation of the scarf. Connect the white short legs beneath the torso.

Next, locate the minifigure's head. It's double-sided: one side shows a small child with a cute smirk and dotted red cheeks. The other captures a wide open laugh, eyes closed in half circles with the same dotted red cheeks. Press the head onto the neck peg, then secure the white polar bear head on top, it has small round eyes and a black nose.

Finally, grab the dark transparent popsicle and place it in the minifigure's right hand.

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Day 2: Third column from the left, second row down from the top.

A bulldozer!

Find 1 light gray 1x2 short brick with side studs and an extended anti-stud. Orient it horizontally so the anti-stud is on the right. Place 1 dark yellow 1x2 plate with bar handle on the short end, horizontally on top, with the bar handle on the right and overhanging the extended anti-stud. Find 1 dark grey 1x2 slope tile and insert the center bar of the slope upright into the open stud on the left side, so it slopes to the top.

Find 2 black 1x3 round plates and place them horizontally and upright on the front- and back-facing studs to the right of the slope tile. Find 1 transparent 1x1 plate and place it on the right stud on top of the build. Then find 1 dark yellow 1x1 tile with a rounded side and place it on top of the transparent plate so the rounded side faces left.

Your bulldozer's ready to roll, and the holiday cheer keeps building!

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Day 3: Rightmost column, top row.

Oh, a white polar teddy bear!

Find 1 dark red 2x3 plate and place it horizontally in front of you. Then find 2 dark orange 1x2 log bricks and connect them underneath the left and right columns. Place your white polar teddy bear with small black eyes and nose, a light grey muzzle, and a light grey belly patch centered on the back row of the small bench you've just made, so he is facing you.

With the polar teddy bear settled on its cozy bench, today's festive builds come to a joyful close. Rest easy, builder. Tomorrow brings a new window, a new surprise, and another moment of joy waiting to be built.

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Day 4: Second column from the left, top row.

A Minifigure Scooter and riding helmet.

Place the yellow orange scooter frame horizontally in front of you so the stud is on the right. Attach a dark grey wheel to each clip underneath the leftmost and rightmost sides.

Find the dark grey bent bar with 2 clips and connect it to the left top-facing bar so the top clip points right. Vertically attach the black handlebars so they face right.

Don't forget the helmet. Safety first, even in festive builds.

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Day 5: Third column from the right, second row from the top.

The Minifigure Dad arrives!

Find 1 dark green minifigure torso with a holiday sweater pattern. The top and bottom are bordered with knitted wavy lines. On the left and right are large knit snowflakes, and in the center is a snowman with a tiny golden top hat and scarf. The back repeats the knitted wavy border and adds evenly spaced white dots.

Connect the tan minifigure legs beneath the torso.

Next, locate the minifigure's head. It's double-sided: one side shows Dad with half-rim glasses and a gentle smile. The other captures an open-mouthed grin with one eye closed in a festive squint. Press the head onto the neck peg, then secure the black, slightly tousled hair on top.

Find the camera and place 1 transparent 1x1 round tile on its stud. Now we know the reason for the squint—Dad's ready to capture the holiday fun on film!

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Day 6: Third column from the left, third row down from the top.

A red farm tractor.

Find 1 dark gray 1x1 brick with studs on all sides. Place 1 red 1x1 short brick on top. Then stack another dark gray 1x1 brick with studs on all sides on top of the red short brick.

Rotate the build 90° horizontally so the anti-stud is on the right and the open stud faces left. Find 1 red 1x3 plate and place it on top. The center stud will bridge the red short brick beneath it.

Place 1 transparent 1x1 plate on the rightmost stud. Then place 1 red 1x1 tile on top of the transparent plate.

Find 2 black saucers and place them upright on the left front- and back-facing studs. Finally, find 2 black 2x2 round tiles with pin hole and place them upright and centered on the right front- and back-facing studs, using the tube underneath each pin hole to connect them.

With the red farm tractor parked and the final tile pressed into place, today's builds are officially wrapped. From scooters to sweaters, teddy bears to tractors, each model has brought a little more joy to the countdown.

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Day 7: Leftmost column, bottom row.

It's a puppy! Always wanted a puppy!

Our medium nougat colored pup has small black eyes with white highlights. A dark brown muzzle runs centered slightly up toward the eyes, and a little black nose sits right at the tip.

Find 1 medium azure 1x2 round plate and orient it horizontally. On the left stud, place 1 transparent 1x1 round tile. On the right stud, place 1 medium nougat 1x1 round tile with a brown cookie print and a white icing paw print in the center.

The treat is ready, the puppy is watching, and the holiday joy continues.

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Day 8: Second column from the right, third row down from the top.

Dad's riding snowplow! For those snowy nights to come.

Find 1 blue 2x4 plate and place it horizontally in front of you. Place 1 light grey 2x2 plate with a pin hole underneath the 2 rightmost columns so the hole faces front and back. Place another light grey 2x2 plate with a pin hole underneath the 2 leftmost columns, also with the hole facing front and back. Insert 1 light grey technic pin into each of the front- and back-facing pin holes. Then find 4 black wheels with center groove, and place one on each pin.

Find 1 dark azure 1x2 plate with 2 side studs hanging down and place it vertically on the leftmost column with the two side studs facing left. Then find 1 black 1x2 plate with angled blade and place it horizontally upright on the 2 left facing side studs with the angled blade at the bottom.

Find 1 blue 1x2 slope tile and place it vertically on top of the 1x2 plate with the side studs, with the slope facing left. Finally, find 1 black tile with connected steering wheel and place it vertically to the right of the slope tile with the steering wheel angled up to the right.

Dad's riding snowplow is ready to go. The driveway's about to get a festive cleanup, just in time for cocoa, cookies, and twinkling lights!

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Day 9: Third column from the left bottom row.

It's our second minifigure character, the reindeer!

Find 1 medium nougat minifigure torso with a white fuzzy chest mark. A red knit scarf wraps around the neckline, decorated with wavy knit white lines. On the back is a small white triangular tail and the continuation of the scarf. Connect the medium nougat short legs beneath the torso.

Next, locate the minifigure's head. It's double-sided: one side shows a small child with small smirk and freckled cheeks. The other captures a wide open laugh, showing that this child has braces. The eyes are closed in half circles with the same freckled cheeks. Press the head onto the neck peg, then secure the nougat deer head on top, it has small round eyes and a bulbous black nose. Find the dark brown rounded antlers with a small pin. Find the small pin hole on the deer head and insert the antlers so they point left and right.

Find 1 gold metallic 1x1 round tile with a dark blue compass pattern with a small red arrow indicator and connect it in the minifigures hand.

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Day 10: Leftmost column, top row.

A blue RC car!

Find 1 blue 1x2 plate with vertical clip on the short end and orient it horizontally so the clip is on the left. Then connect 1 black 1x1 plate with a vertical clip underneath the stud on the right side with the clip facing right.

Find 1 dark azure 1x2 plate and horizontally place the left stud on top of the right stud of the 1x2 plate with vertical clip. The plate will overhang the black clip on the right.

Then place 1 blue 1x2 half circle jumper plate vertically on the right stud overhanging the clip, with the half circle facing left and the straight edge on the right. Place 1 transparent 1x2 curved slope tile horizontally to the left of the half circle, connecting 1 column left, with the curved slope facing left.

Now we will add the wheels! Find 2 black wheel and axle parts. These are barbell shaped with a thin rod between the wheel plates, and in the center will be a small bar. Place that small bar into each clip on the right- and left-sides.

The build now rolls with style! Find the black remote control and imagine driving it along, weaving past candy canes and snow piles as twinkling lights reflect off the windshield.

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Day 11: Second column from the left, second row from the top.

Tonight's window opens with a sprinkle of holiday magic and a soft little meow. Nestled in a 2x2 medium nougat crate is a tiny kitten, wide-eyed and ready to pounce on ribbon tails and cookie crumbs. No build challenge today, just pure seasonal sweetness.

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Day 12: Second column from the right, second row from the top.

Not much to build today. Just a skateboard and a helmet to keep the holiday momentum rolling. Clip the wheels into the clips underneath the skateboard. Don't forget to wear your helmet before you cruise past snowbanks and candy canes.

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Day 13: Third column from the right, top row.

The Minifigure Mom is here!

Find 1 sand blue minifigure torso with a space holiday sweater pattern. The top and bottom are bordered with black woven trim. Each end features a white braided knit band, and in the center is a cluster of knitted stars surrounding a knitted plant with a gold space swoosh and rocket, echoing the classic space logo. The back repeats the wavy knit border and adds evenly spaced white dots.

Connect the dark azure minifigure legs beneath the torso.

Next, locate the minifigure's head. It's double-sided: one side shows Mom with a cheek to cheek smile. The other side is open-mouthed with eyes closed as she sings a holiday carol. Press the head onto the neck peg, then secure the braided bun dark brown hair on top.

Mom's got a unique accessory, a lime green alien plushie with three oversized cartoon eyes. Each eye sparkles with white highlights and lower azure shadows. Green freckles cluster around the eyes, and small green stars decorate each cheek.

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Day 14: Leftmost column, second row from the top.

A model of the Galactic spaceship!

Find 1 black 1x2 short brick with side studs and an extended anti-stud. Orient it horizontally so the anti-stud is on the right.

Find 2 sand blue 1x3 jumper plates with 2 studs and place them horizontally on the front- and back- 2 studs of the short brick so they are centered horizontally. Then find 2 white 1x2 long slope tiles and place them horizontally upright on the front and back facing side studs so they each slope to the left.

Find 1 white 1x1 slope tile and place it on the right stud on top of the build, with the slope facing left. Find 1 red orange 1x1 tile with a rounded side and place it to the left of the 1x1 slope tile with the rounded edge facing left.

Find 1 white 1x1 short brick and place it upright on the left-facing stud. Then find 1 transparent 1x1 slope tile and place it upright on the 1x1 short brick so it slopes upward.

Swoosh! It's a sleek little spaceship with tapered wings and a glowing cockpit. It's ready for interstellar gift delivery or a quick orbit around the tree. Built for speed and sparkle, this festive flyer adds a dash of cosmic cheer to the countdown.

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Day 15: Rightmost column, third row from the top.

It's our interstellar visitor.

Find the white creature body with a black neckline and gold seams. There are small black patches above the legs, and in the center is the LEGO classic space logo with a red orange planet and a tiny black spaceship and swoosh.

Find the lime green minifigure head with three eyes and eyebrows, a small smirk, and green freckles. Place it on the peg of the creature body.

Find the dark azure minifigure helmet with a white back collar and place it on top so it opens to the front. Then find the transparent visor and connect it to the helmet with the raised angular bump on the top.

Ready for cosmic caroling or a zero-gravity gift exchange, this visitor brings holiday cheer from lightyears away.

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Day 16: Third column from the right, bottom row.

A wind-up Space Exploration pod is ready for assembly.

Find 1 black 1x1 plate with bar handles on both ends. With it horizontally in front of you, find 1 black 1x1 brick with studs on all sides and place it on top.

Place 1 white 1x1 round plate with open stud upright on the left- and right-facing studs of the 1x1 brick. Find 1 transparent light blue 1x1 round tile and place it upright on the left side stud. Find a silver metallic wind-up key and place it upright on the right side stud.

Find 1 red orange 1x1 tile with a rounded side and place it on the top stud with the rounded edge facing left.

Find 2 white 2x2 radar dishes and place them upright on the front- and back-facing studs of the 1x1 brick. Then find 2 black 1x1 round tiles with vertical bar and place them upright on the front- and back-facing studs of the radar dishes.

Find 2 dark grey bent bars with 2 clips. Clip them to the front- and back-pointing bars so that both have the bent angle down and the free clip end is facing left.

The wind-up Space Exploration pod is now fully equipped. It's ready to scan the stars and zip through peppermint asteroid fields. With radar dishes deployed and sensor arms angled for cosmic sleuthing, this little explorer hums with holiday energy.

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Day 17: Second column from the left, bottom row.

It's our third minifigure character, the Christmas tree!

Find 1 green minifigure torso with dark blue hands. Connect the brown short legs beneath the torso.

Next, find the minifigure's head. It's double-sided: one side shows a child with a big smile and a few buck-teeth. The other captures wide-eyed wonder, with the mouth shaped in a quiet "oh" of amazement. Press the head onto the neck peg, then secure the Christmas tree piece on top with the window for the face in front, decorated with red holiday ornaments and a few gold garlands.

Find 1 gold metallic 1x1 round flower plate and place it on top of 1 red 1x1 short brick. A small gift to give! Connect it on top of one of the minifigure's hands.

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Day 18: Third column from the left, top row.

Let's roll out a tiny yellow LEGO semi-truck!

Find 1 dark gray 1x4 plate and place it horizontally in front of you. Then place 1 red 1x1 short brick on the second stud from the right.

Make 2 sub parts. Stack 2 yellow 1x1 plates on top of each other, then build a second stack the same way. Place one stack to the left of the red brick and the other to the right. This should leave the leftmost stud of the 1x4 plate uncovered.

Find 1 yellow 1x3 tile and cover all the bricks on the right side of the build. The tile should sit flush, with no overhang. Find 1 transparent 1x1 plate and place it on the leftmost stud. Then find 1 yellow 1x1 tile with a rounded side and place it on top of the transparent plate with the rounded edge facing left.

Finally, find 2 black minifigure roller skates with rounded lip and connect them underneath the build, aligned beneath the right- and left-most stud locations with the rounded lip to the outside.

The tiny yellow semi-truck is complete! It's ready to haul gifts across snowy tabletops and deliver joy to every corner of the countdown.

Side Note: There is one extra black minifigure roller skate in the bag. You can connect this part underneath the build, aligned to the second-from-the-right stud, to give your truck even more wheels! Now it's a triple-axle powerhouse! Ready to haul heavy gingerbread freight or tow a sleigh full of surprises.

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Day 19: Second column from the left, third row from the top.

We are making a snowman!

Find 1 white 2x2 dome brick and place a black 1x1 round plate on top. This forms the base and the buttoned belly. Find 1 white 1x1 brick with 2 side studs and place it on top so the side studs face left and right.

Insert a brown bar with a clip into each side stud. These are the branch arms, ready to wave at passing reindeer. Place a red scarf on top of the 1x1 brick with the hanging end facing forward. Then press on a white minifigure head.

Finish with a black tri-point hat on top. Clip the broom upright in either clip on the right or left.

Your snowman is now complete—bundled up, branchy, and beaming with winter charm.

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Day 20: Second column from the right, bottom row.

The treat cart is rolling in.



Find 1 dark green 2x4 plate and place it horizontally in front of you.

Attach 1 light grey 2x2 round plate with bottom parallel clips underneath the two rightmost columns so the clips face front and back. Repeat with a second round plate underneath the two leftmost columns, matching the orientation.

Place 1 red 2x2 jumper plate in the center of the build. Then place 1 red 1x2 plate vertically on the column to the left of the jumper. On the right column, place 1 gold metallic 1x2 plate with a bar on the long side, positioned vertically so the bar handle overhangs to the right.

Find 1 dark tan 1x2 rounded plate and center it on the stud of the jumper plate. Top it with 2 tan 1x1 round tiles decorated with white icing and colorful sprinkles.

Place 1 white minifigure mug on the front stud of the leftmost column. Build a minifigure cupcake by placing 1 white swirl stud on top of 1 red minifigure cupcake part, then attach it to the back stud of the rightmost column.

Finally, find 2 black wheel and axle parts. These are barbell-shaped with a thin rod between the wheel plates and a small bar in the center. Clip one into each set of clips underneath the bottom of the build.

The treat cart is assembled and brimming with holiday charm.

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Day 21: Second column from the right, top row.

Mrs. Claus is ready to join the festivities.

Find 1 red minifigure torso with white hands. Her red shawl is trimmed with fluffy white edges and dotted with white pom poms. A black belt with a gold buckle wraps around the waist and continues onto the back. Connect the red minifigure dress slope beneath the torso, with the flat face to the front and the trailing slope to the back.

Next, locate Mrs. Claus's head. It's double-sided: one side shows a gentle smile with closed eyes and grey eyebrows behind red-rimmed glasses. The other side has a friendly gaze with white eyebrows and the same warm smile. Press the head onto the neck peg, then secure the short wave white hair on top.

She's dressed, coiffed, and glowing with holiday warmth.

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Day 22: Third column from the right, third row down.

Let's build the toy train with coal tender.

Find 1 black 1x2 short brick with side studs and an extended anti-stud. Orient it horizontally so the anti-stud is on the right. Then find 1 dark green 1x1 slope tile and place it upright on the left-facing stud so it slopes upward. Find 1 gold metallic 1x1 round tile with vertical bar and place it on top of the left stud of the short brick. Then find 1 transparent 1x1 plate and place it on top of the right stud. Find 1 green 1x1 tile with a rounded side and place it on top of the transparent plate with the rounded edge facing left.

Find 1 white plume with 3 fingers and, holding it upright, insert the small bar at the bottom into the vertical open hole at the top of the bar on the round tile. Turn the 3 fingers point to the right. Finally, locate 4 red 1x1 round tiles and press one onto each of the four side studs. Position two to face forward and two to face back.

Build the coal tender. Find 1 black 1x2 short brick with side studs and an extended anti-stud. Orient it horizontally so the anti-stud is on the right. Place 1 transparent 1x1 plate on top of each of the studs. Find 1 green 1x2 tile and place it horizontally on top of the two plates. Finally, locate 4 red 1x1 round tiles and press one onto each of the four side studs. Position two to face forward and two to face back.

Next, connect the left-facing stud to the extended anti-stud of the train. The train and coal tender should now be securely joined, forming a compact, festive locomotive.

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Day 23: Rightmost Column, second row from the top.

It's almost Christmas Eve. It's Santa's pull sled.

Find 1 dark green 2x4 plate and place it horizontally in front of you. Find 2 gold metallic 1x2 plates with 2 side bars. Place the 2 plates vertically under the left- and right-most columns of the 2x4 plate with the overhanging bars pointing toward each other and meeting in the middle. These form the runners of our pull sled.

Find 1 red 1x2 curved slope with no studs and place it vertically on the rightmost column with the flat side to the right. Place 1 red 1x2 plate with side vertical clip vertically on the leftmost column so the clip faces left. Find 1 red 2x2 tile with 2 studs on one edge and place it in the center 2x2 area between the last placed parts with the 2 studs vertically on the left edge of the tile.

Locate 1 dark red 1x2 jumper plate and place it vertically on the leftmost column. Then find 1 black bar holder with handle. Hold it upright so the bar is at the bottom and insert it into the clip on the left. Find 1 black T-bar and place the center bar into the bar hole of the bar holder.

The sled is ready to go.

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Day 24: Rightmost column, bottom row. The last window opens with a quiet sparkle.

Happy Holidays! Santa's here.

Find 1 red torso printed with white wool trim and a black belt. Connect 1 red pair of legs printed with black boots beneath the torso. Place 1 white beard on the neck peg of the torso. Then find 1 yellow head printed with black eyes with white highlights, thick white eyebrows and a full beard. Press it onto the neck peg, securing the beard in place. Place 1 red Santa hat with white wool on top so the brim is higher in the front.

Clip Santa's medium nougat bag of goodies in one hand. He's ready to ride.
