The Advent calendar contains LEGO figures of magical creatures such as Buckbeak™, Aragog and a Stag Patronus™. There are also 8 LEGO minifigures of popular characters, including Harry Potter, Cho Chang™, Draco Malfoy™ and Luna Lovegood™, each wearing Hogwarts™ Christmas sweaters and with wand elements. Fun, collectible mini builds of iconic items such as a Hogwarts acceptance letter, a box of Bertie Bott's Every-Flavor Beans™, the Sorting Hat™, various magical potions and The Monster Book of Monsters add to the play possibilities.

Welcome to text-based instructions from Bricks for the Blind. Before you start building, here are some terms we'll be using:

- In Front of/Front: towards you.

- Behind/Back: away from you.
- Up: towards the ceiling.
- Down: towards the floor.
- Stud: the bump on a LEGO brick. Example: A 2x1 brick has two studs on it.
- Vertically: with the longest side going from front to back
- Horizontally: with the longest side going from left to right.
- Upright: pointing up towards the ceiling.
- Standing upright: The piece is perpendicular to the ground, like a wall.
- Lying flat: The piece is parallel to the ground, like a piece of toast which fell off the table.
- That one/ppp: previously placed piece.
- Plate: piece with studs.
- Tile: smooth piece without studs (unless otherwise specified)
- A jumper plate is a 1x2 plate with a single stud on top, or a 1x3 plate with only two studs on top.
- "Anti-stud" is a term for the portion of a LEGO piece which accepts studs, like the bottom of a plate or brick.
- Symmetrically: a mirror image. Example: If you place a 2x1 brick with technic connector on the front wall at the right, connector to the front, and then place another such piece symmetrically on the back wall, at the right, the technic connector of the second piece should point to the back, since it will be placed symmetrically.
- Centered-vertically: even amount of space in front of and behind piece
- Centered-horizontally: even amount of space left and right of piece.
- Row: studs lined up horizontally (left to right/side to side).
- Column: studs lined up upright or vertically (top to bottom/back to front).

For builders with low vision, or a sighted building partner who may want to follow along with the printed visual instructions that come with each set, PDF versions are always online at [https://www.lego.com/enus/service/building-instructions/76456]. As low vision users may benefit from viewing the instructions on a personal device where they can zoom in on content and use assistive technologies to enhance the visuals.

The windows that we'll be opening are arranged in 4 rows of six windows. No grouping instructions are provided, since each build is very small.

We don't want to spoil each day's surprise for you, so we'll put lots of ***s between each day.

The box should be horizontally oriented and upright with the fold-out mat on the table towards you. The windows themselves are white-numbered and centered on the punch-out window sections of the calendar. Happy Holidays from the wizarding world and Bricks for the blind!

Day 1: Leftmost column, third row down from the top.

Let's kick things off with Harry Potter, front and center in festive Gryffindor red.

Find Harry's torso, the red holiday sweater with an owl flying across clutching a candy cane. Connect the black short legs beneath the torso. Next, locate Harry's head and tousled hair. Press the head onto the neck peg, then secure the hair on top. Finally, grab the dark brown wand sprue. Remove one wand and place it in Harry's right hand. He's now ready to cast some holiday magic.

Day 2: Third column from the left, second row down from the top.

It's Hedwig, Harry's loyal snowy owl and holiday sidekick.

Build Hedwig's body. Find 1 white 2x2 tall brick with 2 studs on each side and 4 studs on one face. Turn the brick horizontally so the 4-stud face points to the back. Next, find 2 black 1x1 plates with horizontal clips. Place them side by side underneath the tall brick, with both clips facing forward.

Place 1 white 2x2 slope upright onto the back face with 4 studs. Make sure the slope faces upward, with the 2 studs of the slope at the bottom. Find 1 white 2x2 left wedge plate and 1 white 2x2 right wedge plate. Place them upright on the left and right vertical studs of the tall brick. Make sure the pointed ends face upward and the straight edges are connected underneath and face forward.

Build Hedwig's head. Find 1 white 2x3 plate and hold it horizontally. Place 1 white 1x3 plate horizontally across the back row, covering all 3 rear studs. Find 3 white 1x1 bricks with 1 side stud. Place one on each of the 3 studs in the front row, making sure the side studs all face forward.

Place 3 white 2x1 slopes with cutout and no studs vertically on top of the 1x1 bricks. Make sure each slope faces the back and connects to the white 1x3 plate behind.

Find 1 black 1x1 slope tile and place it upright on the center stud facing you, with the slope up. Let's add Hedwig's eyes. Find 2 black 1x1 round tiles with white highlight and place them on each of the left and right studs facing you.

Connect the head centered and facing front, using the tubes underneath the 2x3 plate to connect to the 2 studs of the tall brick.

Hedwig is complete and ready to soar!

Day 3: Rightmost column, top row.

Congratulations, your magical mail has arrived, wax seal and all! Hedwig delivered it with precision!

Find 2 tan 2x6 plates and place them horizontally in front of you, one behind the other. Align them to form a 4x6 plate. Find 3 tan 2x3 tiles, place them vertically across the front three rows of the 4 x 6 plate you made. This will leave only the back row of six studs exposed.

Find 1 dark tan 1x6 plate and place it horizontally on the back row.

Find 2 tan 3x3 wedge plates and place them with the 90° corners on the back row. Connect them forward with the angled edges facing outward. The points should meet in the center, forming an envelope flap. Find 1 red 2x2 round tile with the letter "H" in the center representing the wax seal. Place it centered on the front two rows of the envelope flap.

Your Hogwarts journey begins now. Time to pack your trunk and brush up on your spells. First stop: Platform 9¾. Let's build what's next!

Day 4: Second column from the left, top row.

It's Cho Chang, Ravenclaw Seeker and Harry's first crush, with a sharp eye and steady hand.

Find Cho's torso, the blue sweater with Ravenclaw detailing. Connect the black short legs beneath the torso. Next, locate Cho's head and smooth black hair. Press the head onto the neck peg, then secure the hair on top. Finally, grab the brown wand sprue. Remove one wand and place it in Cho's right hand. She's ready to take flight as Ravenclaw Seeker.

Day 5: Third column from the right, second row from the top.

It's the Sorting Hat, creased, crooked, and full of secrets. This enchanted relic has sorted generations of Hogwarts students with a whisper and a grin.

Find 1 dark brown 4x4 round plate and place 1 medium nougat 2x2 round plate in the center. Find 4 brown 1x2 curved tiles and place them around the centered 2x2 round plate, following the curve of the 4x4 round plate.

Find 1 dark brown 1x2 plate and place it horizontally on the back row. Then place 1 brown 1x2 log brick on top of the plate. Find another brown 1x2 plate and place it on top of the previous piece, forming a stack on the back row.

Find 1 brown 2x2 tall brick with 4 side studs and place it in front of the stacked bricks, side studs facing forward. The tall brick and stack should match height at the center of the build. Place 1 brown 2x2 cone centered on top.

Find 2 black 1x1 round tiles with white highlight and place them upright on the top row, one on each of the left and right studs facing you. The sorting hat can see the students now! Find 2 brown 1x1 quarter round tiles and place them upright on the bottom row, one on each of the left and right studs facing you, with the curved sides facing up and outward to form an upright half circle facing up.

Brilliant work, the Sorting Hat is complete. It's perched and ready to whisper your house destiny.

Day 6: Third column from the left, third row down from the top.

Delightfully unpredictable and dangerously delicious: it's a box of Bertie Bott's Every-Flavor Beans. From chocolate and peppermint to earwax and sardine, every bite is a gamble.

Locate 1 white 2x2 brick and place it as your base. Stack 2 white 2x2 tall bricks with 2 studs on each side and 4 studs on one face, back to back on top of the base brick. Align them so the studded faces point outward, forming a symmetrical column. Locate 2 red 1x2 corner end slopes and place them back to back on top of the build, forming a pointed lid.

Locate 4 white 2x3 tiles with red pinstripes and a window showing multi-colored jellybeans inside. Each tile features a small minifigure head of Bertie between a fleur-de-lis decoration, with a yellow flourish banner at the bottom reading "Every-Flavor Beans." Place 1 tile upright on each face of the column, aligning the top edge of each tile with the row of 4 vertical studs.

The Bertie Bott's box is built, striped, and sealed with a pointed lid. Each face gleams with jellybean chaos and Bertie's mischievous grin.

Day 7: Leftmost column, bottom row.

It's Draco Malfoy: sharp, smug, and unmistakably Slytherin. With platinum-blond hair and a perpetual sneer, Draco is the perfect foil to Harry's earnest charm, strutting through Hogwarts and tossing barbed remarks with aristocratic menace, dampening everyone's holiday spirits!

Find Draco's torso, the green Slytherin sweater with the holiday Grindylow. Side note: if you don't remember the Grindylow, it's a water-dwelling creature with tentacles like an octopus and a generally bad attitude. Not the friendliest thing to meet in the lake. Connect the black short legs beneath the torso. Next, locate Draco's head and slicked blond hair. Press the head onto the neck peg, then secure the hair on top. Finally, grab the black wand sprue. Remove one wand and place it in Draco's right hand. He's ready to cast spells with Slytherin perfection.

Day 8: Second column from the right, third row down from the top.

Buckbeak arrives, wings spread and talons poised—half eagle, half horse, all majestic. Whether perched beside Hagrid's hut or circling the towers of Hogwarts, he brings a rush of wild magic to your holiday scene.

Find 1 white 2x3 plate and place it horizontally in front of you. Flip the plate upside down. Connect 2 light gray 1x1 round bricks to the leftmost column and 2 to the rightmost column. Flip the build back right side up.

Keeping the build horizontal, place 1 dark gray 1x2 brick with a single centered side stud vertically on the leftmost column. Make sure the side stud faces left. On the back row, just to the right of the 1x2 brick, place 1 light gray 1x1 brick with a vertical side clip facing back. On the front row, directly in front of the first 1x1 brick, place a second light gray 1x1 brick with a vertical side clip facing front.

Find 1 white 1x2 log brick and place it vertically on the right column of the build. Next, find 1 dark gray 2x2 plate and place it on top of the right and center columns. Then locate 1 light gray 2x2 slope tile and place it on the center column, connecting to the left column, with the slope facing left.

Find 2 white 1x1 bricks with side studs on 2 adjacent sides (corner). Place the first 1x1 brick on the back rightmost stud, with one side stud facing back and the other facing right. Place the second 1x1 brick directly in front of the first, with one side stud facing front and the other facing right. Locate 1 light gray 1x2 slope tile and place it vertically on top of the two corner bricks with the slope facing right.

Let's finish Buckbeak's head. Find 1 dark gray 1x2 corner end slope and place it upright horizontally on the right-facing studs, with the slope upward and the flat edge down. Let's add Buckbeak's eyes. Find 2 black 1x1 round tiles with white highlight and place them upright on the back- and front-facing studs of the corner bricks.

Let's build the left wing first. Find 1 light gray 1x2 plate with a short end bar handle, and place it horizontally with the bar handle on the left. Find 1 dark gray 2x2 left wedge plate. Place the wedge on top of the 1x2 plate so the straight edge aligns with the 1x2 plate and the point of the wedge faces away from the bar handle.

Now build the right wing. Find 1 light gray 1x2 plate with a short end bar handle, and place it horizontally with the bar handle on the right. Find 1 dark gray 2x2 right wedge plate. Place the wedge on top of the 1x2 plate so the straight edge aligns with the 1x2 plate and the point of the wedge faces away from the bar handle.

Clip the wings onto Buckbeak's body, using the vertical clips in the front and back. Make sure each wing is attached with the straight edge facing toward Buckbeak's head. Find the white plume with 3 points and insert the small bar into the open stud hole on the left side of Buckbeak.

His tail is attached. Buckbeak is ready to soar! Whether he's gliding over the Forbidden Forest or bowing to a respectful young wizard, your magical creature is complete!

Day 9: Third column from the left bottom row.

Today's door brings no bricks, no clips, no studs—just a quiet moment and a bit of wizarding treasure. Inside, you'll find two shimmering gold round tile galleons. Each one gleams with deep red ink on a gold background, crowned with the words "Unum Galleon" along the top curve, the number "1" at the bottom, and a tiny LEGO classic dragon nestled in the center.

Day 10: Leftmost column, top row.

Welcome, Hannah Abbott—our first Hufflepuff! Known for her kindness, loyalty, and steady wand work, Hannah brings a touch of warmth to the advent lineup.

Find Hannah's torso, the yellow holiday sweater with a holly mandrake in a festive pot. Connect the black short legs beneath the torso. Next, locate Hannah's head and her wavy light blonde hair. Press the head onto the neck peg, then secure the hair on top. Finally, grab the dark brown wand sprue. Remove one wand and place it in Hannah's right hand.

Day 11: Second column from left, second row from the top.

A treat on the way to Hogwarts. A chocolate frog!

Find 1 dark purple 4x4 round plate. Turn the plate so the studs form a "plus" sign. Locate 2 medium nougat 1x2 round plates and place them horizontally side by side on the third row from the front. Then find 2 more medium nougat 1x2 round plates and place them vertically side by side, centered horizontally on the front two rows.

Find 2 brown 1x2 inverted slope bricks. Place the first inverted slope brick on top of the second stud from the left in the third row, with the slope point facing left. Place the second inverted slope brick directly to the right of the first, with the slope point facing right. This creates a 4-stud third row from the front, one brick high. Next, place 1 brown 1x2 log brick horizontally and centered in front of the inverted slope bricks.

Find 2 brown 1x1 half cylinder bricks. Place one cylinder brick on the leftmost stud of the third row from the front and the other on the rightmost stud of the same row. Orient both cylinder bricks horizontally, with the flat sides facing front and back. Then find 1 medium nougat 2x3 plate and place it vertically between the arches, aligned to the back edge. The plate will overhang by one row to the front.

Find 1 brown 2x2 slope and place it on top of the back rows of the centered 2x3 plate with the slope facing the back. Then find 2 brown 1x1 bricks with 1 side stud. Place one on the front-left stud of the 2x3 plate with its stud pointing left. Place the other on the front-right stud with its stud pointing right.

Find 2 black 1x1 round tiles with white highlight. The chocolate frog can see! You've added the eyes! Place them upright on the left- and right-facing studs of the front bricks. Then find 1 brown 2x2 round tile and place it on top of the chocolate frog's head.

Your chocolate frog is done. Built, placed, and ready to hop into the holiday lineup!

Day 12: Second column from the right, second row from the top.

It's a Polyjuice Potion! Inside today's door, you'll find a flask. This potion's famous for transforming witches and wizards into someone else entirely.

Find 1 light gray 2x2 round plate and stack 1 transparent neon green 2x2 round brick on top. Then locate 1 transparent neon green 2x2 round brick with an old yellowed label. The label reads "Polyjuice Potion" with "A0045" and a tiny scribble at the bottom. On the lower right corner of the label is a red seal. Stack this labeled brick on top of the first neon green brick to continue building the potion flask.

Find 1 transparent 2x2 dome brick and place it on top of the stack. Place 1 light gray 1x1 round tile with vertical bar on top of the dome. Flip 1 transparent 2x2 radar dish upside down and connect its open stud to the bar. Finally, press 1 medium nougat 1x1 round plate into the anti-stud at the very top.

Polyjuice is ready for mischief, transformation, or a sneaky Slytherin scheme.

Day 13: Third column from the right, top row.

It's Angelina Johnson. Gryffindor Quidditch star, fierce Chaser, and one-time captain of the team!

Find Angelina's torso, the red holiday sweater with a flying owl clutching a candy cane. Connect the black short legs beneath the torso. Next, locate Angelina's head and her long straight hair with pony tail. Press the head onto the neck peg, then secure the hair on top. Finally, grab the dark tan wand sprue. Remove one wand and place it in Angelina's right hand. She's now ready to join Harry for some holiday magic.

Day 14: Leftmost column, second row from the top.

Inside today's door, you'll find the infamous Acromantula with a massive black body, spindly legs, and a face only Hagrid could love. Aragog! Raised in a cupboard at Hogwarts, he later ruled the Forbidden Forest with his many-legged brood.

Find 1 brown 2x4 plate and place it horizontally in front of you. Find 3 black 1x2 plates with bar handles on both short ends. Place them vertically, centered on the left 3 columns. Find 1 brown 1x2 brick with 2 side studs and place it vertically on the rightmost column with the side studs facing right.

Find 1 dark tan 2x2 plate and place it centered on the build. Place 1 brown 2x2 slope tile on the right 2 columns with the slope facing left. Place 2 brown 1x2 log bricks vertically on the left 2 columns. Place 1 dark brown angled slope with 3 teeth on top of the log bricks with the teeth pointing left.

Find 6 brown robot arms with clips and attach one to each bar handle, 3 in front and 3 in back. Let's add eyes to Aragog. Find 2 black 1x1 round tiles with white highlight and place them upright on the 2 right-facing studs.

Aragog is complete! Whether he's guarding the shadows or waiting for an unsuspecting visitor, he's ready to haunt your holiday shelf.

Day 15: Rightmost column, third row from the top.

You've earned it. Now it's time to kick back with a frothy mug of Butterbeer. Whether you're settling into the Three Broomsticks or just admiring your shelf of magical mischief, enjoy the moment.

Find 1 light grey 2x2 round plate and place 3 dark grey 1x1 round plates on 3 of the studs. Place 1 dark grey 1x1 rounded plate with side bar handle on the remaining stud with the bar handle turned directly outward from center. Stack 2 transparent orange 2x2 round bricks and place them on top.

Find 1 light gray bar holder with clip and clip it onto the side bar handle at the bottom of the Butterbeer. Place 1 sand blue cow horn with bar into the bar holder and push it toward the center to create a mug handle. Find 1 white 2x2 round plate with icing drips and place it on the top 2x2 round brick.

Butterbeer assembled. Handle secured, foam topped, and ready to sip—just don't let the house-elves sneak a taste.

Day 16: Third column from the right, bottom row.

Luna Lovegood joins the festivities! Whether she's hanging ornaments upside down or explaining the magical properties of pudding skin, Luna brings a sparkle that no spell can replicate. The holiday shelf just got a little more enchanted.

Find Luna's torso, the blue sweater with Ravenclaw detailing and a touch of whimsical flair. Connect the black short legs beneath the torso. Next, locate Luna's head and her long, wavy blonde hair. Press the head onto the neck peg, then secure the hair on top. Finally, grab the brown wand sprue. Remove one wand and place it in Luna's right hand. She's ready to charm the room with pudding facts and holiday cheer.

Day 17: Second column from the left, bottom row.

The Thestral. This skeletal winged creature may look fearsome, but it's loyal to those who've seen death and understand its quiet strength.

Find 1 dark gray 2x3 plate and place it horizontally in front of you. Flip it upside down. Connect 2 black 1x1 round bricks to the leftmost column and 2 to the rightmost column. Flip the build back right side up.

Keeping the build horizontal, place 1 dark gray 1x2 brick with a single centered side stud vertically on the leftmost column. The side stud should face left. On the back row, just to the right of the 1x2 brick, place 1 black 1x1 brick with a vertical side clip facing back. On the front row, directly in front of the first 1x1 brick, place a second black 1x1 brick with a vertical side clip facing front.

Find 1 black 1x2 grill brick and place it vertically on the right column of the build with the horizontal grill pattern facing right. Next, find 1 dark gray 2x2 plate and place it on top of the right and center columns. Then locate 1 black 2x2 slope tile and place it on the center column, connecting to the left column, with the slope facing left.

Find 2 dark gray 1x1 bricks with side studs on 2 adjacent sides (corner). Place the first 1x1 brick on the back rightmost stud, with one side stud facing back and the other facing right. Place the second 1x1 brick directly in front of the first, with one side stud facing front and the other facing right. Locate 2 black 1x1 slope tiles and place them on top of each of the two corner bricks with the slopes facing inward to each other.

To finish the head, find 1 black 1x2 corner end slope and place it upright horizontally on the right-facing studs, with the slope upward and the flat edge down. So our Thestral can see, find 2 black 1x1 round tiles with white highlight and place them upright on the back- and front-facing studs of the corner bricks..

Let's build the left wing first. Find 1 black 1x2 plate with a short end bar handle, and place it horizontally with the bar handle on the left. Find 1 dark gray 2x2 left wedge plate. Place the wedge on top of the 1x2 plate so the straight edge aligns with the 1x2 plate and the point of the wedge faces away from the bar handle.

Now build the right wing. Find 1 black 1x2 plate with a short end bar handle, and place it horizontally with the bar handle on the right. Find 1 dark gray 2x2 right wedge plate. Place the wedge on top of the 1x2 plate so the straight edge aligns with the 1x2 plate and the point of the wedge faces away from the bar handle.

Clip both wings onto the Thestral's body using the vertical clips on the front and back. Each wing's straight edge should face the head.

Finish by inserting the black curved long cattle horn into the open stud hole on the left side of the Thestral.

Your Thestral is now fully assembled. Invisible to most, its presence is unmistakable. Whether perched beside Luna or pulling a carriage toward Hogwarts, it brings quiet strength to the scene.

Day 18: Third column from left, top row.

It's a bottle of Skele-gro! This potion isn't for the faint of heart. It regrows bones—slowly, painfully, and with a fizzing hiss that makes even Madam Pomfrey wince. Build from the base up, layering bricks into a sturdy silhouette with just enough magical detail to hint at its potent contents.

Find 1 black 2x2 round plate. Stack 1 white 2x2 round brick with the words "Skele-Gro" printed in the center. Above the title is a small note of "1100 drops" and below, the name of the purveyor "R.W. & Co.". Place another black 2x2 round plate on top.

Find 2 white 1x2 round plates and place them vertically side by side on top of the round plate, aligned over the title. Place 1 black 2x2 round plate on top. Repeat with 2 more white 1x2 round plates, aligned with the first pair.

Find 1 white 2x2 round jumper tile and place 1 gold metallic fez cone on top. Place the skeleton minifigure head at the top of the cone, with the skeletal face aligned to the round plates and positioned over the text.

Your potion is complete. It's unmistakably Skele-gro—ready for the hospital wing, but best kept at arm's length.

Day 19: Second column from the left, third row from the top.

Welcome Blaise Zabini. Blaise celebrates in style—quiet, polished, and perfectly composed. No loud sweater or clumsy charm spells. Just a flick of gold, a shadow of green, and a look that says he's already three steps ahead of the party.

Find Blaise's torso, the green Slytherin sweater with the holiday Grindylow. Connect the black short legs beneath the torso. Locate Blaise's head and semi-smooth dark hair. Press the head onto the neck peg, then secure the hair on top. Grab the dark brown wand sprue. Remove one wand and place it in Blaise's right hand. Now he's ready to cast some spells.

Day 20: Second column from the right, bottom row.

Monster book of monsters. It growls. It snaps. It's wrapped in festive ribbon and still trying to bite your fingers off. A Hogwarts classic—equal parts textbook and creature, best opened with caution and a firm grip.

Find 2 brown 2x3 plates and arrange them vertically side by side. Place 1 medium nougat 2x2 plate centered on the back two rows. Place 1 white 1x2 plate with 3 side teeth in front of the 2x2 plate, teeth facing you. Find 6 medium nougat 1x1 round plates with horizontal side bar. Place one on each of the three study of the leftmost and rightmost columns, bars facing outward and angled in various directions.

Build the book cover. Find another 2 brown 2x3 plates and arrange them vertically side by side. Again, place 1 medium nougat 2x2 plate centered on the back two rows. Place 2 medium nougat 1x3 tiles vertically on the leftmost and rightmost columns. Find 4 black 1x1 round tiles with white highlight. Place them side by side, centered on the front row and the second row from the front. Our book has 4 eyes!

Place the cover on top of the first section. The Monster Book of Monsters is complete!

Wrapped and wild, your Monster Book of Monsters is complete. Four eyes, six limbs, and one very bad attitude. Perfect for holiday havoc under the tree. Just don't let it near the mince pies.

Day 21: Second column from the right, top row.

This is no ordinary brew. The Love Potion shimmers and swirls, smelling faintly of peppermint and poor decisions. Whether crafted for romance or revenge, it's dangerously effective and just festive enough to pass as a holiday gift.

Find 1 magenta 2x2 plate. Place 2 pink 2x1 inverted slopes horizontally on the back row, points facing left and right. Repeat with 2 more pink 2x1 inverted slopes on the front row. Find 2 pink 1x2 bricks with single side stud. Place one centered on the back row, stud facing back. Place the second brick in front of it, stud facing front. Find 2 dark pink 1x2 plates and place them vertically on the columns to the left and right of the centered bricks.

Find 2 pink 1x2 curved slope bricks with no studs. Place them vertically on each of the 1x2 plates, curves facing outward to give the bottle a smooth rounded profile. Place 1 magenta 2x2 plate in the center, between the curved bricks. Locate 2 gold metallic 1x1 round plates and place them on the back row. Find 1 more gold metallic 1x1 round plate and place it on the left stud of the front row.

Find 1 gold metallic 1x1 round plate with horizontal side bar. Place it on the right stud of the front row, bar pointed right. Place 1 dark pink 2x2 round dome brick on top. Add 1 magenta 1x1 round plate to the top of the dome. Then find 2 gold metallic heart-shaped tiles and place them upright on the back and front-facing side studs. Finally find the gold metallic tassel with open stud and insert it onto the horizontal bar on the right.

The shimmer is sealed. The hearts are in place. The tassel sways with suspicious charm. Your Love Potion is complete—festive, fragrant, and just potent enough to cause trouble at the holiday feast.

Day 22: Third column from the right, third row down.

Cedric Diggory arrives like a snowflake in golden robes—graceful, rare, and quietly dazzling. Hufflepuff's champion trades his Triwizard gear for festive flair, wand at the ready beneath twinkling lights.

Find Cedric's torso, the yellow holiday sweater with a holly mandrake in a festive pot. Attach the black short legs beneath the torso. Next, locate Cedric's head and his neatly parted brown hair. Press the head onto the neck peg, then secure the hair on top. Finally, grab the dark tan wand sprue. Remove one wand and place it in Cedric's right hand.

Day 23: Rightmost Column, second row from the top.

The second from last window. A festive little mandrake, holly-trimmed and pot-bound, ready to scream some seasonal cheer.

Find 1 brown 1x2 rounded plate and orient it horizontally. Find 2 medium nougat 1x1 bricks with 1 side stud. Set one on each stud of the 1x2 rounded plate, with the side studs facing left and right. Find 1 dark tan 2x2 tall brick with 4 side studs and place it on top, with the 4 studs facing front. Then find 1 medium nougat 1x2 jumper plate and place it horizontally on top of the tall brick.

Find 1 green 2x2 angular plant flower and place it on top of the jumper plate. Find 1 green carrot top with bar and insert the bar into the open stud of the plant flower. Gently push down to seat. Find 2 black 1x1 round tiles with white highlight. Place them side by side, upright on the top row of the four studs facing front. Then find 1 medium nougat 1x2 half circle tile and place it upright, curve up, on the bottom row of the four studs facing front.

Find 2 dark tan 1x1 round plates with open stud and connect them side by side underneath the 1x2 round plate at the bottom of the mandrake. Finally, find 4 brown plant pieces with 3 short stems and a bar. Insert one bar into each of the open side studs on the left and right sides of the mandrake. Insert the final 2 bar side up, underneath the mandrake and into the open anti-studs of the 1x1 round plates at the bottom. The mandrake will not stand, but lie flat on its back.

The mandrake is complete! Its leafy crown and expressive face may scream with seasonal cheer, but don't worry. It's lying flat and cozy, ready for a long winter's nap.

Day 24: Rightmost column, bottom row. The last window opens with a quiet sparkle.

It's Harry's Patronus, a stag in full winter glory. Noble, swift, and shimmering with protective magic, it bursts forth like a silver comet, antlers raised, scattering Dementors like snowflakes in its wake. More than a guardian, it's a memory wrapped in light, a gift from the past that shields the present.

Find 1 light blue 2x3 plate and place it horizontally in front of you. Flip it upside down so it's still horiztonal. Connect 2 transparent light blue 1x1 round bricks to the leftmost column and 2 to the rightmost column. Flip the build back right side up.

Keeping the build horizontal, place 1 light blue 1x2 plate vertically and centered in the middle of the 2x3 plate. Find 2 transparent light blue 2x1 curved slopes with 1x1 side plate. Place them horizontally on top of the 1x2 plate, connecting to the left, one in front of the other, with the curved slope to the left. Then find 1 light blue 1x2 plate and place it vertically and centered on top. Place 1 transparent 1x2 brick vertically on the rightmost column.

Find 1 light blue 1x2 plate and place it vertically on top of the 1x2 brick on the right. Find 2 white 1x1 bricks with side studs on 2 adjacent sides (corner). Place the first 1x1 brick on the back rightmost stud, with one side stud facing back and the other facing right. Place the second 1x1 brick directly in front of the first, with one side stud facing front and the other facing right.

Find 2 transparent light blue 2x1 curved slopes with 1x1 side plate. Place them vertically on top of each of the 1x1 corner bricks, with the curved slopes meeting in the middle and the 1x1 plate sections to the front and back respectively. Find 2 transparent 1x1 slope tiles and place them on the 1x1 plate sections, with the slopes facing the middle of the build and continuing the curve.

Let's make a final part. Find 1 light blue 1x2 plate and orient it horizontally. Then place 2 transparent 1x1 slope tiles, one on each stud, with the slopes facing away from each other to create a peak in the middle. Connect the part upright to the two horizontal studs on the right side of the Patronus. Finally, we'll add eyes to the Patronus, find 2 black 1x1 round tiles with white highlight and place them upright on the backand front-facing studs of the corner bricks.

Harry's magical Patronus is finished. The stag stands tall, shimmering with protective light, its antlers raised in quiet triumph. It's a moment of courage and connection—built from memory, shaped by magic, and glowing with winter warmth.

As the final brick clicks into place, the wizarding world sends its warmest wishes. May your holidays be filled with laughter, light, and a touch of enchantment. Whether you're building by candlelight or conjuring joy with every stud, remember: magic is real, and it lives in the moments we create.
