

## 10457 Winnie the Pooh's Birthday Party

Parents and toddlers enjoy creative playtimes and learn through play with LEGO® DUPLO® I Disney Winnie the Pooh's Birthday Party (10457) building set. This colorful educational construction toy helps toddlers aged 18 months and up practice early skills while enjoying imaginative play.

Preschoolers imagine attending a party with the 3 LEGO DUPLO figures: Winnie the Pooh, Tigger, and Piglet. Each character has a double-sided face with different expressions, sparking limitless creative play and story-making. This fun feature also provides social-emotional learning activities for toddlers as they explore the different emotions toddlers can feel at parties, from the joy of opening gifts to discomfort after eating too many treats!

This construction toy lets preschool kids practice their color-sorting as they match the birthday gifts with the animal characters. As each gift is numbered, preschoolers can even start taking their first steps toward counting.

This set has 22 pieces, and it is for ages 1 ½+.

Welcome to text-based instructions from Bricks for the Blind. Before you start building, here are some terms we'll be using:

- In Front of/Front: towards you.
- Behind/Back: away from you.
- Up: towards the ceiling.
- Down: towards the floor.
- Stud: the bump on a LEGO brick. Example: A 2x1 brick has two studs on it.
- Vertically: with the longest side going from front to back
- Horizontally: with the longest side going from left to right.
- Upright: pointing up towards the ceiling.
- Standing upright: The piece is perpendicular to the ground, like a wall.
- Lying flat: The piece is parallel to the ground, like a piece of toast which fell off the table.
- That one/ppp: previously placed piece.
- Plate: piece with studs.
- Tile: smooth piece without studs (unless otherwise specified)
- A jumper plate is a 1x2 plate with a single stud on top, or a 1x3 plate with only two studs on top.
- "Anti-stud" is a term for the portion of a LEGO piece which accepts studs, like the bottom of a plate or brick.
- Symmetrically: a mirror image. Example: If you place a 2x1 brick with technic connector on the front wall at the right, connector to the front, and then place another such piece symmetrically on the back wall, at the right, the technic connector of the second piece should point to the back, since it will be placed symmetrically.
- Centered-vertically: even amount of space in front of and behind piece
- Centered-horizontally: even amount of space left and right of piece.
- Row: studs lined up horizontally (left to right/side to side).

- Column: studs lined up upright or vertically (top to bottom/back to front).

A note on LEGO Duplo: DUPLO parts are different from regular LEGO parts because they are much bigger, wider, and thicker. This makes them easier for small hands to hold and safer for young children. Even though DUPLO parts look larger, many of them can still connect with standard LEGO parts.

For builders with low vision, or a sighted building partner who may want to follow along with the printed visual instructions that come with each kit, PDF versions are always online at LEGO.com: (<https://www.lego.com/en-us/service/building-instructions/10457>) As low vision users may benefit from viewing the instructions on a personal device where they can zoom in on content and use assistive technologies to enhance the visuals.

Sorting the pieces:

To begin a successful build, it helps to sort the pieces into groups, bags, or small containers. Have a sighted friend or family member do this in advance following the instructions below. You will see that the pieces should be sorted into groups according to the building steps in the set. Doing this in advance makes locating the pieces easier. See below on how to sort the pieces to correspond to the steps in this set. Number the containers using letters A-Z, Numbers, or meaningful names. The parts will be collected into a small Number from steps in the instructions. Example: Steps 1-3 means collecting all the parts used in steps 1, 2 and 3, and putting them in one container.

This set includes 2 unlabeled paper bags, some loose pieces, and one instruction book.

Sort the pieces into groups or piles as described below. Note that where there are multiple colors of the same brick in a step, the colors will be split into different groups to make telling the difference easier for the builder. LEGO includes a few spare parts in case you lose something.

Book 1

All bags

Group 1: Piglet, page 6.

Group 2: Tigger, page 6.

Group 3: Winnie the Pooh, page 6.

Birthday party scene

Group 4: contains the pieces for step 1, page 7.

Group 5: contains the pieces for step 2, page 7.

Group 6: contains the pieces for step 3, page 7.

Tree house

Group 7: contains the pieces for steps 1-5, pages 8-12.

Description:

Imagine a small outdoor birthday party set in front of a tree house. In front of you, at the center of the scene, there is a table with honey placed on top. This is the main focus of the setup. To the left of the table sits Winnie the Pooh. Winnie the Pooh is a small bear with a rounded, soft

body and a large head with small, rounded ears. He is yellow and wears a short red shirt. In this scene, he is facing the table, leaning slightly forward, and licking his lips, as if eager to eat the honey. Directly behind Winnie is Piglet, seated on a chair. Piglet is smaller and slimmer than Winnie. He has a narrow body, a slightly elongated head, and long, thin ears that point upward. He is light pink with a darker pink striped torso. His expression is gentle and calm, and he appears to be quietly watching the scene. To Piglet's left, there is an empty chair, suggesting space for another guest.

To the right of the table, there is a chair with unopened presents on top. Further to the right stands Tigger. Tigger is similar in size to Winnie but has a more upright and energetic posture. He is orange with black stripes. His head is rounded, and his expression is lively. He is facing toward the left, looking at the table and the others, as if excited about the celebration.

Behind the table, forming the background of the scene, is a tree house built into the tree. Only its front door is visible, opening toward the table and the characters, making it feel like the natural setting for the party. At the very top of the tree, right above the tree house that forms the backdrop of the scene, there is a LEGO brick with two printed sides: one shows 3 balloons and the other shows honeybees. This small detail catches the eye and nods to one of the most iconic moments in the Winnie the Pooh story.

Overall, the characters are arranged in a loose semicircle around the table, creating a cozy and playful birthday atmosphere centered on sharing honey, gifts, and time together. Let the Birthday party begin!

Let's get to building!

Building Instructions (All bags, Book 1):

Group 1 – Piglet

Locate a dark pink 2×2×2 curved-top brick with pointed ears printed with Piglet's pattern. Piglet is a dark pink pig with a pale pink face and pale pink legs, a dark pink nose, and black-and-white bulging eyes.

This brick has two faces: one smiling and one serious. Choose the expression you want to display and ask a friend to help you position the face in the right direction.

Group 2 – Tigger.

Locate a black-and-orange 2×2×2 curved-top brick with Tigger's print. Tigger is orange with black stripes. He has rounded ears, a yellow face, a pink nose and tongue, and black eyes.

This brick has two faces: one smiling and the other surprised. Choose the expression you want to display and ask a friend to help you position the face in the right direction.

Place Tigger on an orange 2×2×2 brick with flex.

Group 3 – Winnie the Pooh.

Locate an orange 2×4×2 brick with two rounded sides printed with Winnie the Pooh's torso, and a yellow 2×4×2 brick with rounded sides, two rounded ears, and a dual-sided Winnie the Pooh face — one smiling and the other sad.

Winnie the Pooh is a yellow bear wearing a red T-shirt. He has a black nose, a red tongue, and he holds a white spoon in his hand.

Place the orange 2×4×2 brick with Winnie the Pooh's torso horizontally in front of you, with the printing facing the front. Then place the yellow 2×4×2 brick with rounded sides and ears on top, positioning it so the smiling face points forward. Ask a friend to help you orient the face correctly.

#### Birthday party

Group 4: Presents.

1. Place a lime 4×4 rounded flower brick with 2×2 studs on top in front of you. This is the table. Locate a yellow 2×2×2 brick printed on two sides: one side shows an orange honey jar with the word HUNNY in brown, and the number 1 printed in light yellow; the other side shows an orange tipped over honey jar dripping honey with the number 1 in light yellow.

Place this brick on top of the table so it is centered horizontally and vertically, with the printing of the upright honey jar facing the front.

Group 5:

2. Place an orange 2×2 chair in front of you. Locate an orange 2×2×2 brick printed on two sides: one side shows two wrapped presents — one yellow with light-yellow spots and one green with yellow spots, both tied with yellow ribbon bows. The second printed side shows two party hats — one with green and white stripes, and the other white with yellow stars. Both sides include the number 2 in yellow.

Place this brick on top of the orange 2×2 chair so the wrapped presents face the front. Then place the chair to the right of the table.

Group 6:

3. Place an orange and a dark pink 2×2 chairs in front of the table.

#### Tree house

Group 7:

1. Place a lime 4x4 plate in front of you. Horizontally place a reddish brown 2x4 brick on top of the ppp on the 2 back rows.

2. Horizontally place a nougat 2x4 plate in front of the ppp.

3. Horizontally place a lavender 2x4x3 door frame on top of your build on the 2 back rows, so the ridges face the front. Attach the right side of a white 1x4x3 window pane to the front right facing ridges of the ppp. You should hear it snap in place.

4. Place the 2 right columns of a lime 2x3x2 curved inverted slope brick on top of your build on the 2 back rows on the 2 left columns, so it slopes upward to the left and 1 column overhangs to the left. Repeat symmetrically to the right. Horizontally place a green 2x6 plate on top of the 2 ppps.

5. Horizontally place a green 2x3x2 curved slope brick on the 3 right columns of the ppp, so it slopes to the right. Place a yellowish green 4x4x1.5 bush with 2x2 center hole to the left of the ppp. Locate a dark pink 2×2×2 brick printed on two sides. On the first side, there are three balloons: two yellow and one pink. On the second side, there are three striped, yellow-and-brown honeybees with white wings. Both sides also feature the number 3 in pink. Place it inside the top hole of the ppp, so the printing with the balloons faces the front.

#### Final party scene

Place the table with the honey in front of you. To the left of the table, place Winnie, facing the table and licking his lips. Behind Winnie is Piglet, seated on a chair. To Piglet's left, there is an empty chair. To the right of the table, place the chair with the unopened presents, and further to the right is Tigger, excited and looking to the left toward the table. Behind the table is the tree house, with the door facing forward.

Congratulations for finishing the build! Winnie the Pooh is so happy you shared this moment with him, sweeter than a big pot of honey. He's proud to call you a true friend, and now you're part of his story too, ready for many more adventures together.
