

11207 Spidey: Underwater Vehicles

Zoom into pretend play adventures with Spidey: Underwater Vehicles (11207), a building set for boys, girls and LEGO® I Marvel fans ages 4 years old and up. With Spidey, Ghost-spider and Doc Ock minifigures and 3 submarines, this build-and-play Spidey playset is a great way to develop kids' creative skills. The building toy features 3 vehicles: Spidey's crab submarine with a large web trap; Ghost-spider's turtle submarine with an opening transparent shell; and Doc Ock's whale submarine with shooters on the fins and storage space for the treasure chest. Spidey: Underwater Vehicles makes a great birthday gift for fans of the Spidey And His Amazing Friends show. Designed with budding builders in mind, it includes colorful pictorial instructions, large Starter Bricks and separate bags containing 1 buildable model per bag to make construction fast and fun.

The packaging transmits all the aquatic fun contained in the set. The front of the box shows a large illustration of the combat between the characters in their submarines. At the center, we see a small treasure island with a chest. To the left, Spider-man is behind the wheel of his crab submarine, about to reach the treasure, with Ghost-spider and her turtle submarine to the right of the chest. At the back, we see Doc Ock in her whale submarine firing projectiles to our heroes. The build consists of 154 pieces in total and is recommended for ages 4+. Once finished, you will have 3 water vehicles, one small treasure island, and 3 minifigures. The set consists of 3 numbered bags.

Welcome to text-based instructions from Bricks for the Blind! Before you start building, here are some terms we may be using:

- In Front of/Front: towards you.
- Behind/Back: away from you.
- Up: towards the ceiling.
- Down: towards the floor.
- Stud: the bump on a LEGO brick. Example: A 2x1 brick has two studs on it.
- Vertically: with the longest side going from front to back

- Horizontally: with the longest side going from left to right.
- Upright: pointing up towards the ceiling.
- Standing upright: The piece is perpendicular to the ground, like a wall.
- Lying flat: The piece is parallel to the ground, like a piece of toast which fell off the table.
- That one/ppp: previously placed piece.
- Plate: piece with studs.
- Tile: smooth piece without studs (unless otherwise specified)
- A jumper plate is a 1x2 plate with a single stud on top, or a 1x3 plate with only two studs on top.
- Open/hollow stud: a bump on a LEGO brick with a hole, which allows attaching bars. In the case of open studs, the hole goes all the way through. In the case of hollow studs, it does not.
- “Anti-stud” is a term for the portion of a LEGO piece which accepts studs, like the bottom of a plate or brick.
- Left/right wedge parts: these are parts that when placed in front of you and are pointing to the back, their wedge is on the left/right side of the part.
- Symmetrically: a mirror image. Example: If you place a 2x1 brick with technic connector on the front wall at the right, connector to the front, and then place another such piece symmetrically on the back wall, at the right, the technic connector of the second piece should point to the back, since it will be placed symmetrically.
- Centered-vertically: even amount of space in front of and behind piece
- Centered-horizontally: even amount of space left and right of piece.
- Row: studs lined up horizontally (left to right/side to side).
- Column: studs lined up upright or vertically (top to bottom/back to front).

Additionally, it is worth mentioning that besides the printed visual instructions that come with each kit, a PDF version for the set's instructions is always available online at [\[https://www.lego.com/en-us/service/building-instructions/11207\]](https://www.lego.com/en-us/service/building-instructions/11207). This might help a sighted building partner that may want to follow along or low vision users that may benefit from viewing the instructions on a personal device where they can zoom in on content and use assistive technologies to enhance the visuals.

Sorting the pieces:

To begin a successful build, it helps to sort the pieces into groups, bags, or small containers. Have a friend or family member do this in advance following the instructions below. You will see that the pieces should be sorted according to the building steps in the kit. Doing this in advance makes locating the pieces for each step easier. See below on how to sort the pieces to correspond to the steps in this set. Number the containers using letters A-Z, numbers, or meaningful names. The parts will be sorted into one or a small number of steps in the instructions. Example: Steps 1-3 means collect all the parts used in steps 1, 2, and 3 and put them in one container.

This LEGO set comes with 3 numbered bags, 3 instruction booklets, and 3 minifigures. Sort the pieces into groups or piles as described below. Note that where there are multiple colors of the same brick in a step, the colors will be split into 2 groups to make telling the difference easier for the builder!

LEGO includes a few spare parts in case you lose something. Set these into their own group away from the rest, in case you need them later.

Building Instructions

Book 1, bag 1: Spider-Man and Spidey's crab submarine

Group 1 – Spider-Man

Pages 6-7. Locate 1 blue pair of medium legs, 1 red torso with dark red webbing, black spider, dark orange belt with silver buckle, and red hands, and 1 red minifigure head with dark red webbing and large white eyes with black borders. Assemble the minifigure. Ask a sighted friend to make sure that the face print is facing the right way. Lastly, place 1 transparent light blue crystal on top of Spider-Man's right hand. Spidey is ready!

Group 2 – Treasure island

Pages 8-9. Place 1 medium azure 4x8 half round plate horizontally in front of you, so that its curved edge faces to the front. Then, place 1 dark bluish gray 2x4 double jumper plate horizontally on the 2 back rows of the ppp, so that it is centered horizontally.

Pages 10-11. Locate 2 light bluish gray 2x2 corner wedge bricks. Place the first one to the left of the ppp, so that it slopes to the front, front left, and left. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically on the right. Then, place 1 pearl gold 1x1 round plate with star on the 3rd column from the right on the front row.

Pages 12-15. Place 1 medium nougat treasure chest bottom horizontally on top of the 2x4 jumper plate from the previous step, so that its lower long edge faces to the back. Then, insert 1 transparent dark pink jewel into the ppp. Lastly, close the chest by attaching 1 medium nougat treasure chest lid to the treasure chest bottom.

Group 3 – Spidey's crab submarine

Pages 16-17. Place 1 blue 6x8 aircraft fuselage with curved bottom vertically in front of you, so that its curved edge faces to the front.

Pages 18-19. Place 1 white 1x2 plate with bar on long edge horizontally on the back row of the ppp, so that it is centered horizontally and its bar faces to the back. Then, place 1 yellow 1x2 plate horizontally in front of the ppp.

Pages 20-21. Place 1 black 2x2 plate on top of the 2 ppps.

Pages 22-23. Place 1 blue 2x6 plate horizontally on top of the 2 back rows.

Pages 24-25. Place 3 black 1x6 double inverted slopes horizontally, one in front of the other, in front of the ppp, so that they slope to the left and right.

Group 4 – Spidey's crab submarine (continued)

Pages 26-27. Find 2 red 1x3x2 inverted arches. Place the first one horizontally on the 3 left columns on the back row, so that it slopes to the left. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically to the right.

Pages 28-29. Place 1 red 1x2x2 brick horizontally on the 2nd row from the back, so that it is centered horizontally.

Pages 30-31. Place 1 black 2x2 plate on top of the 3 ppps.

Pages 32-33. Place 2 blue 1x2 plates with upright pin holes vertically, one next to the other, on top of the ppp, so that their pin holes are to the back and face to the left and right.

Pages 34-35. Place 1 red 1x2 jumper plate horizontally on top of the front row of the 2 ppps.

Group 5 – Spidey's crab submarine (continued)

Pages 36-37. Let's make a sub-build for the submarine's right pincer. Place 1 red 2x4 plate horizontally in front of you. Then, place 2 black 1x2 plates with clip vertically, one next to the other, on top of the 2 leftmost columns of the ppp, so that their clips face to the front.

Pages 38-39. Place 1 blue 2x2 round tile on top of the 2 ppps. Then, place 1 blue 1x4 double curved slope tile vertically on top of the rightmost column, so that it overhangs to the front and to the back by 1 row.

Pages 40-41. The right pincer is ready. Place its rightmost column on top of the 2nd to 5th rows from the back of the leftmost column of the crab submarine build.

Group 6 – Spidey's crab submarine (continued)

Pages 42-43. Let's make a sub-build for the submarine's left pincer. Place 1 red 2x4 plate horizontally in front of you. Then, place 2 black 1x2 plates with clip vertically, one next to the other, on top of the 2 rightmost columns of the ppp, so that their clips face to the front.

Pages 44-45. Place 1 blue 2x2 round tile on top of the 2 ppps. Then, place 1 blue 1x4 double curved slope tile vertically on top of the leftmost column, so that it overhangs to the front and to the back by 1 row.

Pages 46-47. The left pincer is ready. Place its leftmost column on top of the 2nd to 5th rows from the back of the rightmost column of the crab submarine build.

Group 7 – Spidey's crab submarine (continued)

Pages 48-49. Place 1 black 3x6 half round plate with 1x2 cutout horizontally on top of the 3 front rows of the crab submarine, so that its curved edge faces to the front.

Pages 50-51. Place 1 red 1x2 tile with steering wheel horizontally on the 3rd row from the front, so that it is centered horizontally and its wheel faces to the back.

Pages 52-53. Locate 2 black 2L pins. Attach the first one to the left-facing pinhole on the back row of the crab submarine, so that it protrudes to the left by 1L. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically on the right.

Pages 54-55. Find 2 red 4x4 cylinders with pin holes and center bar. Rotate the first one so that its edge pin holes face to the left and right, while its center bar curves to the front. Slide its left-facing edge pin hole into the ppp. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically on the left. These are the turbines of the crab submarine.

Pages 56-57. Insert the pin of 1 black engine with blades into the front-facing pin hole of the center bar of each of the 2 ppps.

Group 8 – Spidey's crab submarine (continued)

Pages 58-59. Hold 1 white hemisphere spider web vertically, so that its handle faces to the back, its clips face to the front, and it curves down. Attach its front-facing clips to the back-facing handle of the crab submarine. Then, bring the spider web as close as possible to the crab submarine by bringing the web's handle as close as possible to the crab submarine's turbines.

Page 60-61. Grab 4 fish tails with bar handle. Attach the first one vertically to the leftmost front-facing clip, so that its longest curved edge faces to the left. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically immediately to the right. Then, take the remaining 2 and repeat symmetrically on the right side of the crab submarine.

Pages 62-63. Place 1 red 3x6 quarter sphere with Spider-Man printed pattern (consisting of black webbing and large white eyes with blue edges) horizontally on top of the 3 front rows of the crab submarine, so that its curved side faces to the front.

Pages 64-65. The crab submarine is complete! If you wish, you can sit down Spidey behind the wheel. In the meantime, you can place the crystal on top of the 1x2 jumper plate located between the crab submarine's turbines.

Book 2, bag 2: Ghost-spider (aka Gwen Stacy) and Ghost-spider's turtle submarine.

Group 9 – Ghost-spider

Pages 4-5. Locate 1 dark purple pair of medium legs, 1 white torso with dark purple bodice, magenta web, medium azure spider, dark orange belt with round silver buckle, and magenta hands, and 1 white minifigure head with large white eyes with magenta contours. Assemble the minifigure. Ask a sighted friend to make sure that the face print is facing the right way. Then, attach 1 white headgear hood to the minifigure's head, so that it is open to the front. Lastly, put 1 banana into Ghost-spider's left hand. Ghost-spider is ready!

Group 10 – Ghost-spider's turtle submarine

Pages 6-7. Place 1 magenta 6x8 aircraft fuselage with curved bottom vertically in front of you, so that its curved edge faces to the front.

Pages 8-9. Place 1 medium azure 1x4 tile horizontally on the 2nd row from the back, so that it is centered horizontally.

Pages 10-11. Find 2 black 2x2 corner plates. Rotate the first one so that it resembles an F in Braille. Place its back row on top of the 2 leftmost columns of the turtle submarine. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically on the right.

Pages 12-13. Place 1 white 2x3 inverted slope brick vertically on the back row, so that it is centered horizontally and it slopes to the back.

Pages 14-15. Place 3 black 1x6 double inverted slopes horizontally, one in front of the other, on the 4th to 6th rows from the front, so that they slope to the left and right.

Pages 16-17. Place 1 black 3x6 half round plate with 1x2 cutout horizontally on top of the 3 front rows of the turtle submarine, so that its curved edge faces to the front.

Pages 18-19. Place 1 dark purple 1x2 tile horizontally on the 3rd row from the front, so that it is centered horizontally.

Group 11 – Ghost-spider's turtle submarine (continued)

Pages 20-21. Place 1 white 3x6 half round plate with 1x2 cutout horizontally on top of the 3 back rows of the turtle submarine, so that its curved edge faces to the back.

Pages 22-23. Grab 2 dark purple 3x3 round corner bricks. Rotate the first one so that its long curved edge faces to the back left. Place it on top of the left of the long curved edge of the ppp, so that their curves are aligned. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically to the right.

Pages 24-25. Locate 4 white 1x2 plates with handle on long edge. Place the first 2 vertically, one in front of the other, on the 4th to 7th rows from the front on the leftmost column, so that their handles face to the left. Take the remaining 2 and repeat symmetrically on the right.

Pages 26-27. Place 1 white 1x2 tile with bar handle horizontally on the 3rd row from the back, so that it is centered horizontally and it slopes to the front. Then, place 1 white 1x2 tile with steering wheel horizontally on the 4th row from the front, so that it is centered horizontally and its wheel faces to the back.

Pages 28-29. Find 2 dark purple 1x4 bricks. Place the first one vertically on the leftmost column on the 4th to 7th rows from the front (in front of the left column of the 3x3 rounded corner brick). Take the second one and repeat symmetrically to the right.

Pages 30-31. Grab 2 white 3x3 curved tiles. Place the first one on top of the 3x3 round corner brick located on the back left of the turtle submarine, so that their curves are aligned. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically to the right.

Pages 32-33. Place 1 white 1x4 tile with studs vertically in front of each of the 2 ppps.

Group 12 – Ghost-spider's turtle submarine (continued)

Pages 34-37. We need to make 4 identical sub-builds for the turtle submarine's flippers. Let's begin with the first one. Place 1 medium azure 1x2 plate with clips on long edge horizontally in front of you, so that its clips face to the front. Then, place 1 dark purple 2x2 curved slope tile on top of the ppp, so that it slopes and it overhangs to the back by 1 row. The flipper is complete. Attach its clips to the back left-facing handle of the turtle submarine.

Build 1 more flipper and attach to the front left-facing handle of the turtle submarine, in front of the previous one. Lastly, build 2 more flippers and attach them symmetrically on the right. Feel free to angle the turtle submarine's flippers as you wish.

Pages 38-39. Place 1 white 1x6x2 curved arch horizontally on the 4th row from the front, so that it is centered horizontally.

Pages 40-41. Locate 2 dark purple 3x3 round corner bricks. Rotate the first one so that its long curved edge faces to the front left. Place it on top of the left of the long curved edge of the 3 front rows, so that their curves are aligned. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically to the right.

Pages 42-43. Place 1 dark purple 3x6 quarter sphere with Ghost-spider printed pattern (consisting of dark blue webbing and large white eyes with dark pink edges) horizontally on top of the 3 front rows of the turtle submarine, so that its curved side faces to the front.

Then, place 1 transparent light blue 6x6x2 canopy vertically behind the white 1x6x2 curved arch, so that it slopes to the back.

Pages 44-45. The turtle submarine is complete! If you wish, you can open the canopy and sit Ghost-spider behind the wheel.

Book 3, bag 3: Doc Ock and Doc Ock's whale submarine

Group 13 – Doc Ock

Pages 4-9. Locate 1 yellow pair of medium legs and 1 yellow torso with green jacket over white shirt with dark orange belt with silver buckle, and yellow hands. Assemble the minifigure. Then, attach 1 black neck bracket with 4 handles to the minifigure's neck, so that the handles face to the back. Continue by attaching 1 light nougat minifigure female head with silver goggles with red circular lenses and coral lips to the minifigure. Ask a sighted friend to make sure that the face print is facing the right way. Then, attach 1 light bluish gray skeleton arm to each of the 4 handles of the neck bracket, so that they point to the front. Lastly, put 1 reddish brown short hair with spiked bangs and long part on top of the minifigure head, so that its long part faces to the right. Doc Ock is ready!

Group 14 – Doc Ock's whale submarine

Pages 10-11. Place 1 lime 6x10 aircraft fuselage with curved bottom and 2 pin holes vertically in front of you, so that it slopes to the back and its pin holes face to the front.

Pages 12-13. Insert 1 yellow 2L technic pin into each of the front-facing pin holes of the ppp, so that they protrude to the front by 1L.

Pages 14-15. Rotate 1 yellow 6x8 aircraft fuselage with curved bottom and 2 pin holes vertically, so that its curved edge faces to the front. Slide its 2 back-facing pin holes into the protruding pins of the whale submarine.

Pages 16-17. Place 1 yellow 1x4 brick horizontally on the 10th row from the front, so that it is centered horizontally.

Pages 18-19. Rotate 2 yellow 1x2 plates vertically. Place the back row of the first one to the left of the ppp. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically to the right. Then, place 1 white 2x3 plate vertically in front of the 2 center columns of the 1x4 brick.

Group 15 – Doc Ock's whale submarine (continued)

Pages 20-21. Place 1 lime 1x6 brick horizontally behind the ppp.

Pages 22-23. Place 1 lime 1x6 brick horizontally on top of the ppp.

Pages 24-25. Place 3 white 1x6 double inverted slopes horizontally, one in front of the other, on the 4th to 6th rows from the front, so that they slope to the left and right.

Pages 26-27. Place 1 white 3x6 half round plate with 1x2 cutout horizontally on top of the 3 front rows of the whale submarine, so that its curved edge faces to the front.

Pages 28-29. Place 1 yellow 1x2 tile with wheel horizontally on the 3rd row from the front, so that it is centered horizontally and its wheel faces to the back.

Pages 30-31. Locate 2 white 3x3 round corner bricks. Rotate the first one so that its long curved edge faces to the front left. Place it on top of the left of the long curved edge of the 3 front rows, so that their curves are aligned. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically to the right. Then, place 1 white 1x2 log brick vertically behind each of the 2 ppps. These are the whale submarine's teeth.

Group 16 – Doc Ock's whale submarine (continued)

Pages 32-37. We need to make 2 identical sub-builds for the whale submarine's flippers. Let's begin with the first one. Place 1 light bluish gray 2x4 plate with pin hole underneath horizontally in front of you. Then, place 1 lime 2x2 curved slope tile on top of the leftmost column of the ppp, so that it slopes and it overhangs to the left by 1 column. Lastly, place 1 lime 1x2 grille tile vertically to the right of the ppp. The flipper is complete. Attach its rightmost column to the 7th and 8th rows from the front on the leftmost column of the whale submarine.

Build 1 more flipper and attach it symmetrically to the right.

Group 17 – Doc Ock's whale submarine (continued)

Pages 38-39. Find 2 lime 1x2x2 brick with yellow robot eye and eyebrow with copper and silver armor pattern. Place the first one vertically behind the right teeth of the whale submarine, on the 6th and 7th rows from the front. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically on the left. Ask a sighted friend to make sure that the eye patterns are facing the right direction.

Pages 40-41. Place 1 lime 1x2x2 brick vertically behind each of the 2 ppps.

Pages 42-43. Place 1 white 3x6 half round plate with 1x2 cutout horizontally on top of the 3 front rows of the whale submarine, so that its curved edge faces to the front. Grab 2 lime green 1x2 bricks. Place the first one vertically behind the leftmost column of the ppp. Then, take the second one and repeat symmetrically on the right.

Pages 44-45. Rotate 2 yellow 1x6 plates vertically. Place the front row of the first one on top of the back row of the ppp. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically on the left. Lastly, place 1 yellow 1x4 brick horizontally between the back rows of the 2 ppps.

Pages 46-47. Place 1 green 1x4 tile with studs horizontally on top of the ppp. Rotate 2 green 1x2 jumper plates vertically. Place the back row of the first one to the left of the ppp. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically on the right. The last 3 ppps will be the attaching points for the whale submarine's tail.

Group 18 – Doc Ock's whale submarine (continued)

Pages 48-57. Let's build the whale submarine's tail. Place 1 lime 6x10 aircraft fuselage with curved top vertically in front of you, so that its curved edge faces to the back. Then, place 1 green 2x3 plate vertically on top of the 2 back rows of the ppp, so that it is centered horizontally and it overhangs to the back by 1 row. Continue by placing 1 green 2x6 double round corner plate horizontally on top of the 2 back rows of the ppp, so that its curved edge faces to the front. Lastly, rotate 1 lime 2x2 curved slope tile vertically, so that it slopes to the front. Place its back row on top of the front row of the ppp, so that it is centered horizontally. The whale submarine's tail is complete. Place its 2 front rows on top of its corresponding attaching points located on the 9th and 10th rows from the front.

Group 19 – Doc Ock's whale submarine (continued)

Pages 58-59. Place 1 green 1x2 tile with tail horizontally on top of the front row of the whale submarine's tail, so that it is centered horizontally and its tail faces to the back.

Pages 60-61. Place 1 transparent orange 3x6 quarter sphere horizontally on top of the 3 front rows of the whale submarine, so that its curved side faces to the front. Then, place 1 lime green 1x6x2 curved arch horizontally behind the ppp.

Pages 62-63. Place 1 green 1x2 jumper plate horizontally on top of the ppp.

Pages 64-65. Place 1 transparent light blue 1x1 round plate with open stud on top of the ppp.

Pages 66-67. Attach 1 transparent light blue water piece to the ppp.

Pages 68-70. Insert 1 medium azure 3L projectile with flat end into the front-facing pin holes under the whale submarine's flippers, so that their flat ends face to the front. You can fire them by flicking them from the back. Be careful not to point or fire the projectiles at someone's face!

Page 71. The whale submarine is complete! If you wish, you can Doc Ock behind the wheel.

We are done with the construction! Enjoy the aquatic adventures of Spidey and Ghost-spider vs Doc Ock.

At the end of the instruction booklet, you will find one page advertising other sets from the theme. On the left, you will find set 11206 (Spidey on his Motorcycle vs. Rhino), on the top right corner set 11208 (Team Spidey Pirate Ship), and on the bottom right corner set 11207 (Spidey Underwater Vehicles, this set).

Afterwards, you will find the set inventory. On the last page you will find an invitation to share feedback.
