

10418 Elsa and Bruni in the Enchanted Forest

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Immerse toddlers in a world of adventure with this LEGO® DUPLO® | Disney Elsa & Bruni in the Enchanted Forest (10418) building toy for ages 2+. This construction toy for preschool kids takes them to the Enchanted Forest with familiar characters from Disney's Frozen 2: Elsa, Bruni the salamander and the Nokk, the magical water horse.

Toddlers develop self-expression as they recreate scenes from the movie or invent their own adventures! This fantasy building toy has cool details to spark storytelling. Elsa's snow crystal shines the way through the dark. Bruni's flame element appears as the buildable toy Earth Giant approaches, but the characters become friends as they realize all creatures keep nature in balance. The Elsa mini doll climbs onto the Nokk horse figure to be spirited away in a flurry of autumn leaves to her next adventure.

Welcome to Text-Based Building Instructions from Bricks for the Blind. Here is some helpful information on how to best use screen readers and browsers: bricksfortheblind.org/help-with-screen-readers. Before you start building, here are some terms we will be using:

- In Front of/Front: towards you.
- Behind/Back: away from you.
- Up: towards the ceiling.
- Down: towards the floor.
- Stud: the bump on a LEGO brick. Example: A 2x1 brick has two studs on it.
- Vertically: with the longest side going from front to back
- Horizontally: with the longest side going from left to right.
- Upright: pointing up towards the ceiling.
- Standing upright: The piece is perpendicular to the ground, like a wall.
- Lying flat: The piece is parallel to the ground, like a piece of toast which fell off the table.
- That one/ppp: previously placed piece.
- Plate: piece with studs.
- Tile: smooth piece without studs (unless otherwise specified)
- A jumper plate is a 1x2 plate with a single stud on top, or a 1x3 plate with only two studs on top.
- “Anti-stud” is a term for the portion of a LEGO piece which accepts studs, like the bottom of a plate or brick.
- Symmetrically: a mirror image. Example: If you place a 2x1 brick with technic connector on the front wall at the right, connector to the front, and then place another such piece symmetrically on the back wall, at the right, the technic connector of the second piece should point to the back, since it will be placed symmetrically.
- Centered-vertically: even amount of space in front of and behind piece
- Centered-horizontally: even amount of space left and right of piece.
- Row: studs lined up horizontally (left to right/side to side).

- Column: studs lined up upright or vertically (top to bottom/back to front).

A note on LEGO Duplo: DUPLO parts are different from regular LEGO parts because they are much bigger, wider, and thicker. This makes them easier for small hands to hold and safer for young children. Even though DUPLO parts look larger, many of them can still connect with standard LEGO parts.

For builders with low vision, or a sighted building partner who may want to follow along with the printed visual instructions that come with each kit, PDF versions are always online at LEGO.com: (<https://www.lego.com/en-us/service/building-instructions/10418>) As low vision users may benefit from viewing the instructions on a personal device where they can zoom in on content and use assistive technologies to enhance the visuals.

Sorting the pieces:

To begin a successful build, it helps to sort the pieces into groups, bags, or small containers. Have a sighted friend or family member do this in advance following the instructions below. You will see that the pieces should be sorted into groups according to the building steps in the set. Doing this in advance makes locating the pieces easier. See below on how to sort the pieces to correspond to the steps in this set. Number the containers using letters A-Z, Numbers, or meaningful names. The parts will be collected into a small number from steps in the instructions. Example: Steps 1-3 means collecting all the parts used in steps 1, 2 and 3, and putting them in one container.

This set includes 2 plastic bags nonlabelled and one instruction book.

Sort the pieces into groups or piles as described below. Note that where there are multiple colors of the same brick in a step, the colors will be split into different groups to make telling the difference easier for the builder. LEGO includes a few spare parts in case you lose something.

Book 1

All bags

Group 1: Elsa, page 3.

Group 2: Snow scene, page 4.

Group 3: Forest build, pages 4-6, steps 1-3.1.

Group 4: Forest build, page 6, step 3.2.

Group 5: Earth Giant, pages 7-8, steps 1-2.1.

Group 6: Earth giant, pages 8-9, steps 2.2-3.

Group 7: Enchanted Forest scene, page 10.

Description:

Here is a description of the set to help you imagine what the set you are building will look like when it's finished. This set is made of several small builds that together create a play scene of the Enchanted Forest from Frozen 2. You will have a forest build with a lime-green base that represents grass, and a tree with flowering branches: red and orange flowers on the left branch, and medium-lavender and coral flowers on the right lower branch. There is a grey stone Earth Giant, shaped with feet but no arms. You will also have a snow scene decorated with aqua flowers. Bruni, the blue salamander with big eyes, comes with his pink-purple flame element placed beside him. You will have an Elsa doll holding a snow crystal and a blue horse that represents the Nokk, the water spirit. Elsa is riding it! Finally, there is a loose nougat 2x2 brick

with a printed pattern of colorful leaves on one side, representing autumn and the wind spirit. Have fun building your way into the Enchanted Forest adventure!

Let's get to building!

Building Instructions (All bags, Book 1):

Group 1:

Locate Elsa. Elsa looks ready for a forest adventure. She has long blonde hair tied up in a braid, light aqua trousers, and a white T-shirt decorated with blue, coral, and lavender diamonds. Her face has a gentle, happy smile.

Let's put on Elsa's skirt! Find the soft fabric piece with the long train — this is her skirt. Slide it up over her legs so the train is at the back. The skirt is white, with a lavender border at the bottom and light-blue teardrop shapes. The train is light aqua with silver stars.

Locate a transparent snow crystal and attach it to her right hand.

Group 2: Snow scene.

Place a white 2x2 brick in front of you. Place the right column of another on the left column of the ppp, so 1 column overhangs to the left. Place a light aqua flower plant on the front left corner of the ppp. Place the back right corner of a white 2x2 brick underneath the front row of the left overhang, so it only attaches by 1 stud. Then, place a light aqua flower element loosely in front of the snow scene build. Your snow scene is complete!

Group 3: forest build.

Step 1

Place a lime 4x4 plate in front of you. Place a nougat 2x2x2 round brick on top of the ppp, so it is centered horizontally and vertically. Horizontally place a nougat 2x4 double curved inverted slope brick on top of the ppp, so it is centered horizontally.

Step 2

Horizontally place the 2 left columns of a nougat 2x3 curved inverted slope brick on the 2 right columns of the ppp, so it slopes upright to the right and 1 column overhangs to the right. Place a brown 2x2 brick to the left of the ppp. Horizontally place the 2 right columns of a nougat 2x3 curved inverted slope brick on the ppp, so it slopes upright to the left and 1 column overhangs to the left.

Step 3.1

Place an orange 2x2 round brick with rounded flower on top on the 2 left columns of the ppp. Place a red flower with 1 stud on top centered horizontally and vertically on the ppp, so it does not sit on any studs.

Group 4:

Step 3.2

Place a medium lavender 2x2 round brick with rounded flower on the 2 right columns of the right horizontal 2x3 curved inverted slope brick. Place a coral rounded double petal flower with 1 stud on top centered horizontally and vertically on the ppp, so it does not sit on any studs. Place a nougat 2x2 brick with a printed pattern of orange, red, and brown leaves on one side loosely to the left of your tree build, so the printed pattern faces the front. Your forest build is complete!

Group 5: Earth Giant.

Step 1

Horizontally place a grey 2x6x2 curved slope arch brick in front of you. Place a grey 2x2 brick underneath the 2 left columns of the ppp. Repeat symmetrically to the right.

Step 2.1

Place the left column of a grey 2x2/1 ½ slope brick on top of your Earth Giant build on the rightmost column so it slopes to the right and 1 column overhangs to the right. Repeat symmetrically to the left.

Group 6:

Step 2.2

Place a dark grey 2x2x1 ½ slope brick between the 2 ppps, so it slopes to the front.

Step 3

Horizontally place a grey 2x4 plate on top of your Earth Giant build, so it is centered horizontally. Horizontally place a grey 2x4 double curved inverted slope brick on top of the ppp. Place a grey 2x4 brick with curved top and printed Earth Giant face on 1 side on top of the ppp, so the printed pattern faces the front. He has two big eyes, thick eyebrows, and a small smiling mouth. His face looks friendly, like a gentle stone giant. Your Earth giant is complete!

Group 7: Enchanted Forest scene. Find Bruni, the little blue salamander. He has molded white eyes and neck, black printed pupils, and small medium-lavender diamond shapes on his back. Place Bruni, the fire spirit, in front of you on the left.

Put Bruni's pink flame piece to his right, close to him. Place the Earth Giant behind Bruni and the flame, facing the front.

Put the snow scene to the right of the Earth Giant. Now place the Nokk, the water spirit — the blue horse — in front of the snow scene, lying horizontally so it faces the left. Elsa is riding the Nokk, so place her on top of the horse. Next, place the forest build to the right of Elsa and the Nokk. Finally, place the loose nougat 2x2 brick, printed with coral, brown, and red leaves, to the right of the forest, with the pattern facing the front.

You did it! The Enchanted Forest is complete, and even the Earth Giant is smiling about it. Elsa, Bruni, and the Nokk are ready for your next magical adventure. Bruni is so excited he almost set his own tail on fire again. Elsa says you're officially the new protector of the forest. Just remember to keep an eye on that little salamander!
