

10782 Hulk vs. Rhino Truck Showdown

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The LEGO® Marvel Spidey And His Amazing Friends Hulk vs. Rhino Truck Showdown (10782) building toy puts Super Heroes aged 4 and up in the driving seat as they race to save the day. Kids recreate scenes inspired by the popular Disney+ TV series as they help Spidey and the Hulk thwart Rhino's bank heist. Kids will love the battle wagons in this collectible, buildable toy set. Each monster vehicle features cool details – Rhino's truck has a ramming horn, while Hulk's has a pair of massive fists ready for smashing combat.

Spidey and Hulk stop Rhino in his tracks – Kids and grown-ups will love the smashing action as the two monster cars clash and Spidey flies in to trap Rhino in his web and save the day.

Birthday gift for preschool kids – This LEGO® Marvel gift comes with a Starter Brick and simple building guide so youngsters aged 4 and up can learn to build and develop creative confidence.

Feature packed – The buildable Hulk toy has 2 changeable heads with different expressions, Spider-Man's jet pack fires missiles, and the vault has a removable box that fits into Rhino's truck's trunk.

Dimensions – Hulk's truck measures over 1.5 in. (4 cm) high and 3 in. (10 cm) long, and Rhino's truck measures over 2 in. (6 cm) high and 4 in. (11 cm) long.

The front of the box shows Rhino using his truck to knock over a vault! Luckily Hulk is also there with his truck and he is using it to stop Rhino! Spider-Man is in the back flying with his jetpack trying to get Rhino into a web!

The back of the box shows all the accessories that the set comes with! It comes with 3 minifigures, a web, vault, jetpack, trash can, hotdog, gold bar, diamond, and 2 trucks!

The top of the box shows a real-size image of Hulk.

The build is 110 pieces in total and is for ages 4+.

Bag 1 includes the pieces for Spider-Man, Hulk, and his truck!

Bag 2 includes the pieces for Rhino, his truck, and a vault!

Welcome to Text-Based Building Instructions from Bricks for the Blind. Here is some helpful information on how to best use screen readers and browsers: bricksfortheblind.org/help-with-screen-readers. Before you start building, here are some terms we will be using:

- In Front of/Front: towards you.
- Behind/Back: away from you.
- Up: towards the ceiling.
- Down: towards the floor.
- Stud: the bump on a LEGO brick. Example: A 2x1 brick has two studs on it.
- Vertically: with the longest side going from front to back
- Horizontally: with the longest side going from left to right.
- Upright: pointing up towards the ceiling.

- Standing upright: The piece is perpendicular to the ground, like a wall.
- Lying flat: The piece is parallel to the ground, like a piece of toast which fell off the table.
- That one/ppp: previously placed piece.
- Plate: piece with studs.
- Tile: smooth piece without studs (unless otherwise specified)
- A jumper plate is a 1x2 plate with a single stud on top, or a 1x3 plate with only two studs on top.
- "Anti-stud" is a term for the portion of a LEGO piece which accepts studs, like the bottom of a plate or brick.
- Symmetrically: a mirror image. Example: If you place a 2x1 brick with technic connector on the front wall at the right, connector to the front, and then place another such piece symmetrically on the back wall, at the right, the technic connector of the second piece should point to the back, since it will be placed symmetrically.
- Centered-vertically: even amount of space in front of and behind piece
- Centered-horizontally: even amount of space left and right of piece.
- Row: studs lined up horizontally (left to right/side to side).
- Column: studs lined up upright or vertically (top to bottom/back to front).

For builders with low vision, or a sighted building partner may want to follow along with the printed visual instructions that come with each kit, or PDF versions are always online at LEGO.com for each set: (<https://www.lego.com/en-us/service/buildinginstructions/10782>) As low vision users may benefit from viewing the instructions on a personal device where they can zoom in on content and use assistive technologies to enhance the visuals.

Sorting the pieces:

To begin a successful build, it helps to sort the pieces into groups, bags, or small containers. Have a friend or family member do this in advance following the instructions below. You will see that the pieces should be sorted according to the building steps in the kit. Doing this in advance makes locating the pieces for each step easier. See below on how to sort the pieces to correspond to the steps in this set. Number the containers using letters A-Z, numbers, or meaningful names. The parts will be sorted into one or a small number of steps in the instructions. Example: Steps 1-3 means collect all the parts used in steps 1,2 and 3, and put them in one container.

This LEGO set comes with 2 bags labeled 1 and 2, 2 sets of instructions, and some loose pieces. Sort the pieces into groups or piles as described below. Note that where there are multiple colors of the same brick in a step, the colors will be split into 2 groups to make telling the difference easier for the builder! LEGO includes a few spare parts in case you lose something. Set these into their own group away from the rest, in case you need them later.

The steps in this set correspond to page numbers.

Bag 1 - Spiderman, Hulk, and Truck

Group 1 - Pages 6-9.

Group 2 - Pages 10-23.

Group 3 - Pages 24-57.

Bag 2 - Rhino, Truck, and Vault

Group 4 - Pages 4-7.

Group 5 - Pages 8-15.

Let's get to building!

Building Instructions (Bag 1, Book 1):

Group 1 - Hulk and Trash

Steps 6 to 7

Locate 1 green pair of legs printed with purple shorts, 1 green torso printed with a chest and abs, 1 green head printed with a mean-looking face, and 1 black hair. Assemble your minifigure and put him in front of you!

Steps 8 to 9

Locate 1 red hotdog and 1 tan hotdog bun. Insert the hotdog into the hotdog bun, then place it inside a dark grey trash can! Now put everything aside while we build Spider-Man!

Group 2 - Spider-Man and Jetpack

Steps 10 to 11

Locate 1 short blue pair of legs, 1 red and blue torso printed with a grid and a black spider on his chest, 1 red head printed with white eyes, and 1 large white web. Assemble your minifigure then attach the bar of the web to his hand! Put him aside for now while we make his jetpack!

Steps 12 to 13

Horizontally place a red 2x4 plate in front of you. Then vertically place a light grey 1x2 grill tile on the rightmost column.

Steps 14 to 15

Vertically place a blue 3x6 angled plate on the left 3 columns so it is centered vertically and the short side faces the left. Then vertically place a light grey 1x2 grill tile on the leftmost column so it is centered vertically.

Steps 16 to 17

Vertically place 2 red 1x2 plates with 1 stud and 1 hole, 1 in front of the other, to the right of the previous grill tile so the holes are in the front and back and face left and right.

Steps 18 to 19

Let's make a part! Place a transparent orange 1x1 cone brick on top of a light grey bar so it attaches to the stud. Then repeat again so you have 2 parts in total!

Steps 20 to 21

Insert the bar side of your parts through the left side of the holes so the cone bricks face the left.

Steps 22 to 23

Flip your build upside down so the cone bricks face the back. Then place the 2x2 side studs of a blue 1x2 plate with 2x2 side-studs on the front 2 rows so it is centered horizontally and the anti-studs face the front.

Now turn your jetpack so the 1x2 plate with 2x2 side studs is upright and faces the front! Then place Spider-Man on top of the 1x2 plate part of the 1x2 plate with 2x2 side-studs, so he faces the front! Now put everything away while we build Hulk's truck!

Group 3 - Hulk's Truck

Steps 24 to 25

Horizontally place a black 4x10 brick with 4 pins in front of you. Then vertically place a light grey 1x2 plate with a bar on the long side on the rightmost column so it is centered vertically and the bar faces the right.

Steps 26 to 27

Vertically place a light grey 1x2 grill tile to the left of your previous plate. Then horizontally place a purple 1x4 brick in the back right corner so there is no overhang.

Steps 28 to 29

Vertically place a purple 1x2 brick on top of the previous 1x2 plate with a bar.

Steps 30 to 31

Horizontally place a purple 1x4 brick in the front right corner so there is no overhang.

Steps 32 to 33

Vertically place a purple 1x4 sloped curved tile on the rightmost column so there is no overhang. Then horizontally place a purple 1x3 tile on the front and back rows to the left of the previous tile.

Steps 34 to 35

Place a dark grey 2x2 chair in between the left 2 columns of your previous 1x3 tiles so the back of the chair faces the right.

Steps 36 to 37

Vertically place 2 silver 1x4 rounded plates with a car exhaust, 1 to the left of the other, to the left of the chair so there is no overhang.

Steps 38 to 39

Vertically place a grey 1x2 steering wheel on the right 1x4 rounded plate with a car exhaust so the wheel faces the right.

Steps 40 to 41

Vertically place a black 1x4 plate with inverted sloped sides to the left of the steering wheel.

Steps 42 to 43

Vertically place a light grey 1x2 grill tile on top of your previous plate with inverted sloped sides so it is centered vertically.

Steps 44 to 45

Vertically place a purple 1x4 brick to the left of the previous grill tile so there is no overhang. Then vertically place a purple 2x4 brick to the left so there is no overhang.

Steps 46 to 47

Vertically place 2 black 1x2 bricks with 2 holes, 1 in front of the other, on the leftmost column.

Steps 48 to 49

Place a purple 4x4 car hood on top of the 4 leftmost columns so the studs are on the right. There should be no overhang.

Steps 50 to 51

Vertically place a transparent 1x4 curved windshield on top of the car hood so it slopes to the left.

Steps 52 to 53

Insert a green hulk hand into the front left-facing hole so the flat side of the hand faces the front and the thumb is on top in the back. There are 2 orientations to this hand so make sure it is the right one. Then repeat symmetrically to the back.

Steps 54 to 55

Insert 4 purple wheels into 4 black tires.

Steps 56 to 57

Insert the 4 wheels onto the front-facing and back-facing pins so the indented sides face outwards. Now put everything away so we can make Rhino!

Building Instructions (Bag 2, Book 2):

Group 4 - Rhino and Vault

Steps 4 to 5

Locate 1 dark grey pair of legs, 1 dark grey torso printed with armor, 1 light tan head printed with a mean smile and black eyebrows, and 1 dark grey shoulder armor and helmet with a rhino horn. Assemble your minifigure and make sure the rhino horn faces the front!

Steps 6 to 7

Let's make a safe! Place a light grey 2x2 cabinet in front of you so the opening faces the front. Then attach a transparent 2x2 cabinet door to the front clips on the bottom so it opens to the front! Now insert a transparent red gem and a gold 1x2 ingot into the cabinet! Now close it, then place a tan 2x2 tile on top so there is no overhang. Now put everything aside while we make the compartment that holds the safe!

Group 5 - Bank Vault

Steps 8 to 9

Place a light grey 4x4 plate in front of you. Then horizontally place a tan 2x4 brick on top so it is centered.

Steps 10 to 11

Horizontally place 2 tan 1x2 bricks with bars on the long side, 1 to the right of the other, on the front row of the 2x4 brick so the bars face the front. Then repeat symmetrically to the back. Now horizontally place 2 light grey 1x4 tiles with 2 studs on top of the previous bricks so there is no overhang.

Steps 12 to 13

Vertically place a light grey 1x2x2 panel on the leftmost column of the previous 1x4 tiles so the wall side faces the right. Then repeat symmetrically to the right. Now horizontally place 2 tan 1x4 sloped curved tiles on top of the previous panels.

Steps 14 to 15

Now insert your safe into the front gap underneath the previous tiles so it opens to the front! Now put it away while we build Rhino's truck!

Group 6 - Rhino's Truck

Steps 16 to 17

Horizontally place a black 4x10 brick with 4 pins in front of you. Then horizontally place a light grey 1x2 brick with a bar on the short side on the front right corner so the bar faces the right. Then repeat symmetrically to the back.

Steps 18 to 19

Horizontally place an orange 1x4 brick on the front row to the left of the previous 1x2 brick. Then repeat symmetrically to the back.

Steps 20 to 21

Horizontally place a light grey 2x3 plate in between the left 3 studs of the previous 1x4 bricks.

Steps 22 to 23

Horizontally place a dark grey 1x3 brick on the front right corner so there is no overhang. Then repeat symmetrically to the back.

Steps 24 to 25

Horizontally place a dark grey 3x3 sloped ridged tile on top of the previous 1x3 bricks so it slopes to the right.

Steps 26 to 27

Horizontally place a dark grey 1x2 panel on the front row to the left of the previous 3x3 sloped ridged tile so the wall faces the front. Then repeat symmetrically to the back.

Steps 28 to 29

Horizontally place an orange 4x6 inverted sloped curved plate on the 4 leftmost columns so the short end faces the left and it overhangs by 2 columns.

Steps 30 to 31

Make a part: Place a light grey 1x2 grill tile on top of a light grey 1x2 plate with a clip on the short end so there is no overhang. Now attach your part to the back right-facing bar so the grill tile faces the back. Now push the part towards you so the grill tile faces the right now!

Steps 32 to 33

Vertically place a light grey 1x2 grill tile on the 3rd column from the left so it is centered vertically.

Steps 34 to 35

Vertically place a dark grey 1x4 plate to the left of the 2 dark grey 1x2 panels so it is centered vertically.

Group 7 - Rhino's Truck

Steps 36 to 37

Vertically place a light grey 1x2 tile printed with buttons on top of the previous 1x4 plate so it is centered vertically.

Steps 38 to 39

Horizontally place 2 dark grey 1x3 bricks, 1 in front of the other, to the left of the previous 1x2 tile.

Steps 40 to 41

Horizontally place a dark grey 1x3 sloped curved brick on the front row to the left of the 1x2 panel so it slopes to the left. Then repeat symmetrically to the back.

Steps 42 to 43

Horizontally place a light grey 2x3 slope brick on top of the 2 previous 1x3 bricks so it slopes to the right.

Steps 44 to 45

Vertically place a dark grey 2x2 brick with angled 1x3 bricks on the 2nd and 3rd columns from the left so the short end faces the left. It should surround the studs of the previous 2x3 slope brick.

Steps 46 to 47

Place a pink 2x2 plate to the left of the previous 2x3 slope brick. Then vertically place a dark grey 1x2 brick with a clip on the long side on the leftmost column so the clip faces the left.

Steps 48 to 49

Vertically place a light grey 1x2 plate with a bar on the long side on top of the previous 2x3 slope brick so the bar faces the right.

Steps 50 to 51

Horizontally place a sloped curved tile printed with yellow eyes and a car grill on top of the 4 leftmost columns so it is centered vertically and it slopes to the left.

Steps 52 to 53

Attach the bar of a black horn to the left-facing clip so the horn faces up.

Steps 54 to 55

Make a part: Place an orange 2x2 round tile with a hole on top of a black 4x4 round brick so it is centered. Then repeat this 3 more times so you have 4 parts in total. These are the truck's wheels.

Steps 56 to 57

Attach 2 round bricks to the front-facing pins so the round tiles face the front. Then repeat symmetrically to the back.

Steps 58 to 59

Now place Rhino on top of your car so he can ride it!
