

11201 Playground Fun with Bluey and Chloe

Playground Fun with Bluey and Chloe (11201) is a preschool toy for fans of the Bluey TV show and is designed to deliver endless creative-play possibilities that develop the confidence and problem-solving skills of kids aged 4 and up.

This versatile preschool playground toy features minifigures of popular TV dogs Bluey and Chloe in a vibrantly colored playground, complete with seesaw, slide, jungle gym and rotating pelican ride. There are also 3 plants for the characters to jump between, a tower with a telescope and a picnic area with drinks and cakes.

Bluey building kit – Playground Fun with Bluey and Chloe is a preschool LEGO® set especially for boys and girls aged 4 and up featuring characters, toys and activities from the Bluey kids' TV show.

Playground playset for preschoolers – This LEGO® Bluey toy comes with 1 buildable model per bag, plus a large Starter Brick and simple instructions to make building fast and fun for little builders.

Interactive toy for kids aged 4 and up – Fans of the Bluey TV show join Bluey and Chloe minifigures in a vibrantly colored playground, complete with seesaw, slide, jungle gym and more.

Many ways to play – There's a rotating pelican figure to ride on, 3 plants for the characters to jump between, a tower with a telescope and a picnic area with drinks and cakes.

104-piece set – The full model measures over 5.5 in. (14 cm) high, 9 in. (23 cm) wide and 6.5 in. (17 cm) deep.

The build is 104 pieces in total and is for ages 4+.

Welcome to Text-Based Building Instructions from Bricks for the Blind. Here is some helpful information on how to best use screen readers and browsers: <https://bricksfortheblind.org/help-with-screen-readers>. Before you start building, here are some terms we will be using:

- In Front of/Front: towards you.
- Behind/Back: away from you.
- Up: towards the ceiling.
- Down: towards the floor.
- Stud: the bump on a LEGO brick. Example: A 2x1 brick has two studs on it.
- Vertically: with the longest side going from front to back
- Horizontally: with the longest side going from left to right.
- Upright: pointing up towards the ceiling.
- Standing upright: The piece is perpendicular to the ground, like a wall.

- Lying flat: The piece is parallel to the ground, like a piece of toast which fell off the table.
- That one/previous: previously placed piece.
- Plate: piece with studs.
- Tile: smooth piece without studs (unless otherwise specified)
- A jumper plate is a 1x2 plate with a single stud on top, or a 1x3 plate with only two studs on top.
- "Anti-stud" is a term for the portion of a LEGO piece which accepts studs, like the bottom of a plate or brick.
- Symmetrically: a mirror image. Example: If you place a 2x1 brick with technic connector on the front wall at the right, connector to the front, and then place another such piece symmetrically on the back wall, at the right, the technic connector of the second piece should point to the back, since it will be placed symmetrically.
- Centered-vertically: even amount of space in front of and behind piece
- Centered-horizontally: even amount of space left and right of piece.
- Row: studs lined up horizontally (left to right/side to side).
- Column: studs lined up upright or vertically (top to bottom/back to front).

A note on LEGO Technic™ part names. These parts are somewhat different from regular LEGO bricks. Here are some definitions in case the builder or helper is not familiar with LEGO Technic™.

Axles - An axle is a connector which has an X shaped cross-section. Because their cross section is not round, anything connected to an axle using an axle-hole will rotate with that axle. Axles are longer than they are wide, and the length of an axle corresponds with how many bricks long it is. Aka a 3L axle is three bricks long. Axles come in a variety of lengths, with a 2L axle being the shortest available. They may be combined with pins, or have circular stops on them. A stop prevents the axle from sliding through an axle-hole at a specific point on the axle.

Pins - A pin is a connector which has a circular cross section and a flanged notch out of one or both ends. This flanged notch allows them to click into bricks with a pin-hole. Pins come with and without friction ridges, which are small bumps on the pin which prevent them from rotating freely. For standard pins, black is a high friction pin, and gray is a low friction pin. A standard length pin is two brick lengths long, with a stop in the middle. This prevents a brick from being pushed from one side of the pin to the other. A 1L pin is one brick long and still retains the stop, however it also includes a hollow stud at the other end. A 3L pin is three bricks long, and only contains a stop at one side, allowing two bricks to be pushed onto the other side of the pin. Pins may also have one side which is an axle.

Technic brick - a brick which contains one or more holes which accept technic pins.

Lift-arms - A lift-arm is a basic structural element, similar to a brick or a plate, but usually without any studs. It is a beam with rounded ends and with holes in it, with the same spacing as the studs on a LEGO brick. lift-arms come in a variety of lengths, including a 1x1 lift-arm which looks like a cylinder. Thick lift-arms are as wide as a LEGO brick, and thin lift-arms are half as wide as a LEGO brick, but not the same thickness as a LEGO plate! The holes in a lift-arm may accept axles or pins. They also come in a variety of shapes, including tees, elts and triangles.

Gears - A gear is a functional element. They are typically discs with teeth on the outside, there are also worm gears which look like a spiraling cylinder! Gears connected by axles transmit or even transform rotational motion!

Axle and Pin Connectors - These elements are typically smaller than lift-arms and are used to connect some combination of pins or axles. They might have pins or axles, as well as axle or pin-holes. They have a lot of different angle combinations! The simplest just connects two axles or pins together in a straight line.

Bushes/Bushings - LEGO Technic™ uses bushes largely as spacers, but they also can reduce friction between rotating parts, or can form useful elements such as handles. Bushes are typically light gray, generally cylindrical, and have an axle-hole running through the middle. They have a flange at the front and back to make them easier to pull on and off.

For builders with low vision, or a sighted building partner may want to follow along with the printed visual instructions that come with each kit, or PDF versions are always online at LEGO.com for each set: (<https://www.lego.com/en-us/service/buildinginstructions/11201>) As low vision users may benefit from viewing the instructions on a personal device where they can zoom in on content and use assistive technologies to enhance the visuals.

This LEGO set comes with 3 bags labeled 1 to 3, 1 set of instructions, and some loose pieces. Sort the pieces into groups or piles as described below. Note that where there are multiple colors of the same brick in a step, the colors will be split into 2 groups to make telling the difference easier for the builder! LEGO includes a few spare parts in case you lose something. Set these into their own group away from the rest, in case you need them later.

Bag 1 - Bluey, Telescope, and Playground

Group 1 - Pages 6-9.

Group 2 - Pages 10-29.

Group 3 - Pages 30-51.

Group 4 - Pages 52-59.

Bag 2 - Chloe, Picnic Area, and Playground

Group 5 - Pages 4-7 and 2 teal 2x2 tiles with a stud from Pages 8-9.

Group 6 - Rest of Pages 8-9 and Pages 10-11.

Group 7 - Pages 12-39.

Group 8 - Pages 40-41 and 1 orange 2x2 round brick with petals and 1 orange 2x2 round tile from Pages 42-45.

Group 9 - Rest of Pages 42-45 and Pages 46-51.

Group 10 - Pages 52-61.

Let's get to building!

Building Instructions (Bag 1, Book 1):

Group 1 - Bluey and Telescope

Steps 6 to 7

Locate 1 short light blue pair of legs, 1 light blue body printed with a lighter blue stomach, 1 blue head printed with eyes and a yellow nose. Assemble your minifigure, then put her away while we make a telescope.

Steps 8 to 9

Place a yellow 1x1 brick in front of you. Then place a yellow 1x1 tile with a clip on top so the clip hands face the left and right. Then attach a light grey 1x1 telescope bar to the clip so the stud faces the back. Now put it away while we make the playground!

Group 2 - Playground

Steps 10 to 11

Horizontally place a tan 8x8 plate with 1x4 gaps and an overhang part in front of you so the overhang faces the right.

Steps 12 to 13

Horizontally place a teal 1x4 plate on the front row, in the 1x4 gap. Then repeat symmetrically to the back. Now vertically place another 1 on the leftmost column so it is centered vertically.

Steps 14 to 15

Horizontally place a teal 2x8x6 door frame on the back 2 rows so the door way is in the back.

Steps 16 to 17

Vertically place a teal 1x2 brick in front of the leftmost column of the ppp. Then repeat symmetrically to the right.

Steps 18 to 19

Let's make a part! Horizontally place a teal 2x4 brick in front of you. Then horizontally place a white 2x6 plate with a round side on top so it is centered horizontally and the round side faces the back. Now place a light grey head on the leftmost stud of the back row. Then repeat symmetrically to the right.

Steps 20 to 21

Horizontally place your part on the 2nd and 3rd rows from the back so it is centered horizontally so the round side of the 2x6 plate with a round side faces the back.

Steps 22 to 23

Vertically place a transparent 1x2x5 brick in front of the leftmost column of the 2x8x6 door frame. Then repeat symmetrically to the right.

Steps 24 to 25

Horizontally place a teal 2x8x6 door way in front of the 2 ppp so the doorway is in the front.

Steps 26 to 27

Horizontally place a tan 1x4 tile with 2 studs on the front row of the ppp so it is centered horizontally. Then place a tan 2x2 corner tile to the left of the ppp so it looks like the braille letter h. Then repeat symmetrically to the right.

Steps 28 to 29

Vertically place a tan 1x4 tile with 2 studs behind the right column of the ppp. Then horizontally place a tan 1x6 tile to the left of the back row of the ppp. Now rotate your build 180 degrees.

Group 3 - Playground

Steps 30 to 31

Let's make a part! Let's make the slide! Vertically place a teal 2x4 plate in front of you. Then vertically place a tan 1x4 tile with 2 studs on the right column. Now vertically place 2 teal 1x2 slope tiles, 1 in front of the other, on the left column so they slope to the left.

Steps 32 to 33

Vertically place a yellow slide on top so it overhangs to the back and the studs are in the back.

Steps 34 to 35

Vertically place the back 4 rows of your part on the front right corner of the main build so the slide slopes to the front.

Steps 36 to 37

Horizontally place a tan 6x8 plate on top of the slide so it sits on the 3rd to 8th rows from the back.

Steps 38 to 39

Horizontally place a teal 2x8x6 window frame on the back 2 rows of the ppp so the window frame is in the back.

Steps 40 to 41

Attach a transparent 6x6 window pane printed with a tic tac toe game into the front-facing side of the window frame.

Steps 42 to 43

Vertically place a light magenta 1x4x2 fence on the front left corner so it sits in front of the previous 2x8x6 window frame.

Steps 44 to 45

Horizontally place a white 1x2 plate with a bar to the right of the front row of the ppp so there is a 2 column gap in between them and the bar overhangs to the front. Then place a yellow 1x1 round flower plate to the right of the ppp so there is a 2 column gap in between them. Now place a brown stem with 2 tips on top of the ppp so the tips face left and right.

Steps 46 to 47

Horizontally place a teal 1x3 sloped curved brick to the left of the ppp so it slopes to the right. Now horizontally place another 1 to the left of the ppp so it slopes to the left.

Steps 48 to 49

Attach the clips of a light magenta ladder with 2 clips to the front-facing bar so it overhangs to the bottom.

Steps 50 to 51

Place a lime green frog on the front left corner so it sits on the front row of the 1x4x2 fence and faces the front.

Group 4 - Playground

Steps 52 to 53

Horizontally place a yellow 2x8 plate on the 3rd and 4th rows from the back so it is centered horizontally on top of the 2x8x6 window frame.

Steps 54 to 55

Horizontally place a yellow 2x4 slope brick on top of the ppp so it is centered horizontally and slopes to the front.

Steps 56 to 57

Place a yellow 2x2 corner slope brick to the left of the ppp so it slopes to the front left. Then repeat symmetrically to the right.

Steps 58 to 59

Place a red 1x1 round tile printed with a ladybug on top of the ppp. Now put your playground away while we make the next part!

Building Instructions (Bag 2, Book 2):

Group 5 - Chloe

Steps 4 to 5

Locate 1 short white pair of legs printed with black spots, 1 white torso printed with black spots, and 1 white dog head printed with eyes, ears, snout, and black spots. Assemble your minifigure and put her in front of you while we make cupcakes!

Steps 6 to 7

Let's make 2 cupcakes! Place 2 orange 1x1 cupcake wrappers in front of you. Then place a light magenta 1x1 swirl on top of each of them. Now put everything away while we make the picnic area!

You will have 2 extra teal 2x2 tiles with a stud. Save them for later!

Group 6 - Picnic Area

Steps 8 to 9

Place a lime green 6x6 round plate in front of you. Then place a teal 2x2 tile with a stud from group 5 on the 2nd and 3rd rows from the back of the 2nd and 3rd columns from the right. Then repeat symmetrically to the front left corner.

Step 10

Place a pink 2x2 tile with a stud on the back left corner, behind the ppp. Then repeat symmetrically to the front right corner.

Step 11

Place a yellow 1x1 mug on the back left 2x2 tile with a stud so the handle faces the left. Then repeat symmetrically to the front right corner. Now locate the previous cupcakes you made, and place 1 on the back right 2x2 tile with a stud. Then repeat symmetrically to the front left corner. Now put your picnic area away while we make the rest of the playground!

Group 7 - Playground

Steps 12 to 13

Horizontally place a tan 8x8 plate with 1x4 gaps and an overhang part in front of you so the overhang faces the left.

Steps 14 to 15

Vertically place a tan 4x8 plate with a round side underneath the leftmost column so it is centered vertically and the round side is exposed 3 columns to the left.

Steps 16 to 17

Horizontally place a tan 2x4 tile on the front row of the 3rd to 6th columns from the right so it sits in the 1x4 gap and overhangs 1 row to the front.

Steps 18 to 19

Place a tan 2x2 plate with claws to the right of the ppp so the claws overhang to the front. Then repeat symmetrically to the left.

Steps 20 to 21

Place the back row of a teal 8x8 plate with a round side underneath the overhang of the 3 ppp so the round side is exposed 7 rows to the front.

Steps 22 to 23

Place a white 2x2 tile with an upright pin on the 4th and 5th rows from the back of the 4th and 5th columns from the right.

Steps 24 to 25

Place a yellow 4x4 round brick on top of the pin of the ppp so it is centered on it.

Steps 26 to 27

Let's make a part! Let's make the rotating pelican ride! Horizontally place a white 2x4 double inverted sloped curved brick in front of you. Then horizontally place a brown 1x4 rounded plate underneath the front row so it is centered horizontally. Then repeat symmetrically to the back.

Steps 28 to 29

Horizontally place 2 white 1x2 jumper plates, 1 in front of the other, on the 2 leftmost columns.

Steps 30 to 31

Vertically place a white 1x2 brick to the right of the 2 ppp. Now place an orange 2x2 inverted slope brick to the right of the ppp so it slopes and overhangs to the right.

Steps 32 to 33

Horizontally place an orange 2x3 plate on the 3 rightmost columns. Then vertically place an orange 1x2 plate on the 2nd column from the right.

Steps 34 to 35

Place an orange 2x2 sloped curved tile on the 2 rightmost columns so it slopes to the right. Then place a white 1x1 brick with a side stud on the front row, to the left of the ppp so the side stud faces the front. Then repeat symmetrically to the back.

Steps 36 to 37

Place a white 1x1 round tile printed with an eyelash upright on the front-facing side stud. Then repeat symmetrically to the back.

Steps 38 to 39

Horizontally place your part on the previous 4x4 round brick so it is centered horizontally and vertically on it. It should be able to freely spin now!

Group 8 - Playground

Steps 40 to 41

Rotate your build 90 degrees counterclockwise so the round side of the 8x8 plate with a round side faces the right. Place a brown 2x2 round plate on the 2nd and 3rd columns from the right so it is centered vertically. Then place an orange 2x2 round brick with 4 petals on top of the ppp. Now place an orange 2x2 round tile on top of the ppp.

Steps 42 to 43.1

Place a lime green 2x2 round brick on the front 2 rows of the 5th and 6th columns from the right. Then repeat symmetrically to the back.

Group 9 - Playground

Steps 42 to 43.2

Place a lime green 2x2 round brick with 4 petals on top of each of the 2 ppp.

Steps 44 to 45

Place a lime green 2x2 round tile on top of each of the 2 ppp.

Steps 46 to 47

Horizontally place a pink 2x4 brick on the front 2 rows of the 3rd to 6th columns from the left so it is centered horizontally.

Steps 48 to 49

Place a yellow 2x2 brick with a pin on top of the ppp so it is centered horizontally and the pin faces the front. Then vertically place a pink 1x2 brick to the left and right of the ppp.

Steps 50 to 51

Horizontally place a pink 2x4 tile on top of the 3 ppp.

Group 10 - Playground

Steps 52 to 53

Let's make a part! Let's make the seesaw! Horizontally place a pink 2x14 plate upside down in front of you.

Steps 54 to 55

Horizontally place a light grey 2x4 plate with a pinhole underneath on top so it is centered horizontally. Then horizontally place a white 2x3 plate on the 3 leftmost columns. Then repeat symmetrically to the right.

Steps 56 to 57

Flip your part over so it is right side up and horizontal. Now place a light pink 2x2 plate on the 2 leftmost columns. Then repeat symmetrically to the right.

Steps 58 to 59

Vertically place a tan 1x2 tile with an upright horizontal bar on the 3rd column from the left so it slopes to the left. Then repeat symmetrically to the right.

Step 60

Horizontally attach the back-facing pinhole of your part to the front-facing pin. Now rotate your build 90 degrees counterclockwise so the see-saw faces the right.

Step 61

Bring back your previous build and orient it so the slide is in the back left. Now place the rightmost column of overhang of your previous build on the 1x4 gap that is on the leftmost column of the current build.
