

30677 Draco in the Forbidden Forest

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Spark young Harry Potter™ fans' imaginations with this Forbidden Forest™ mini build, a Draco Malfoy™ minifigure, his glow-in-the-dark lantern, and owl and spider figures.

Welcome to Text-Based Building Instructions from Bricks for the Blind. Here is some helpful information on how to best use screen readers and browsers: bricksfortheblind.org/help-with-screen-readers. Before you start building, here are some terms we will be using:

- In Front of/Front: towards you.
- Behind/Back: away from you.
- Up: towards the ceiling.
- Down: towards the floor.
- Stud: the bump on a LEGO® brick. Example: A 2x1 brick has two studs on it.
- Vertically: with the longest side going from front to back
- Horizontally: with the longest side going from left to right.
- Upright: pointing up towards the ceiling.
- Standing upright: The piece is perpendicular to the ground, like a wall.
- Lying flat: The piece is parallel to the ground, like a piece of toast which fell off the table.
- That one/ppp: previously placed piece.
- Plate: piece with studs.
- Tile: smooth piece without studs (unless otherwise specified)
- A jumper plate is a 1x2 plate with a single stud on top, or a 1x3 plate with only two studs on top.
- "Anti-stud" is a term for the portion of a LEGO piece which accepts studs, like the bottom of a plate or brick.
- Symmetrically: a mirror image. Example: If you place a 2x1 brick with technic connector on the front wall at the right, connector to the front, and then place another such piece symmetrically on the back wall, at the right, the technic connector of the second piece should point to the back, since it will be placed symmetrically.
- Centered-vertically: even amount of space in front of and behind piece
- Centered-horizontally: even amount of space left and right of piece.
- Row: studs lined up horizontally (left to right/side to side).
- Column: studs lined up upright or vertically (top to bottom/back to front).

For builders with low vision, or a sighted building partner who may want to follow along with the printed visual instructions that come with each set, PDF versions are always online at [<https://www.lego.com/en-us/service/buildinginstructions/30677>]. As low vision users may benefit from viewing the instructions on a personal device where they can zoom in on content and use assistive technologies to enhance the visuals.

To begin a successful build, it helps to sort the pieces into groups, bags or small containers. Have a sighted friend or family member do this in advance following the instructions below. You will see that the pieces should be sorted into groups according to the building steps in the set.

Doing this in advance makes locating the pieces easier. See below on how to sort the pieces to correspond to the steps in this set. Number the containers using letters A-Z, numbers or meaningful names. The parts will be collected into a small number of steps in the instructions.

Example: Steps 1-3 means collect all the parts used in steps 1, 2 and 3, and put them in one container.

This will be a little easier for this build as this is a single bag polybag set, with only 33 pieces.

Group 1. Minifigure parts and accessories.

Minifigure parts - Steps 1 and 2 - Short Legs, torso, head, hair

Accessories - Steps 3 and 4

Group 2. Forbidden Forest Mini build

One assembly - Steps 1-7

Group 3. Adding Foliage

Adding to single assembly - Steps 8-10

Here we go! I solemnly swear I'm up to the build!

Group 1. Draco Malfoy Minifigure sub-build.

Start Building

Step 1

Locate 1 black pair of short legs, 1 black torso with Hogwarts robe clasped and the Slytherin crest pattern and light nougat hands, 1 bright light yellow minifigure hair - combed front to rear, and 1 light nougat minifigure head dual-sided with suspicious with left eyebrow raised on one side and an angry scowl on the other.

Step 2

Build your minifigure. Next up - adding some accessories!

Step 3

Locate a black 2 wand sprue, remove one from the sprue and place in Malfoy's right hand.

Step 4

Locate the black lantern element, and 1 1x1 glow in the dark cylinder brick. Place the cylinder brick with the stud up into the lantern. Place the lantern handle in Malfoy's left hand.

Group 2. Steps 1-10

The Forbidden Forest mini build.

Step 1

Locate 1 black 6x6 round plate. Orient the plate so that the studs run vertically and horizontally in front of you. Locate 1 dark brown 2x2 jumper plate, place this directly on the center 4 studs of the 6x6 round plate.

Step 2.1

Locate 1 black 1x2 brick with vertical bar on short side and place it horizontally with the bar on the left on the back row of studs aligned with the back row of the 2x2 jumper plate.

Step 2.2

Locate 1 bright light blue cone and place it to the right of the back row of the 2x2 jumper. Locate 1 black 1x1 brick with horizontal clip, and place it clip facing right to the right of the 1x1 cone. The back edge of the round plate should have 2 studs, then 4 studs open as it comes toward you before encountering the build so far.

Step 3

Locate 2 dark blue 1x2 bricks and place them horizontally in front of the bricks placed in steps 2.1 and 2.2.

Step 4

Locate 2 dark blue 2x2x2 65° slope bricks, place one on the 2 bricks on the left side with the slope facing left. Place the other on the 3 bricks on the right side with the slope facing right.

Step 5

Locate the dark tan owl and place in between the columns built on the 2x2 jumper plate.

Step 6

Locate 2 black 1x4 arch bricks and place them horizontally across the top of the 2 dark blue slopes in step 4.

Step 7

Locate 1 black 2x3 33° slope brick and place it on the 3 rightmost columns of the 2 arch bricks with the slope facing left. This should not overhang. Locate 1 black 1x2 rounded plate with open studs and place it on top of the 2x3 slope.

Group 3. Steps 8-10

Adding the foliage to our mini build.

Step 8

Locate 1 bright light blue cone and 1 dark blue 1L bar with angled stud. Place the cone on the back stud of the 1x2 rounded plate. Insert the 1L bar into the 1x2 rounded plate's front stud with the angled plate facing you.

Step 9.1

Build 2 duplicate 3x4 plant leaf foliage assemblies. Locate 2 dark blue 3x4 plant leaves, 2 dark purple 1x1 round plates with three leaves and 2 satin trans-light blue 1x1 round tiles. This is the foliage of our Forest mini build.

Step 9.2

Orient the 3x4 plant leaf with the "stem" in front of you and the rays of the leaf pointing away from you. Place the 1x1 round plate with three leaves on the front center stud leaf stem of the 3x4 plant leaf, with the 3 leaves pointing away from you. Place a 1x1 tile on the back left branch of the 3x4 plant leaf. Build your second plant leaf assembly the same way.

Step 9.3

Place one 3x4 plant leaf assembly leaf stem on top of the 1x1 cone facing to the left. Place the second 3x4 plant leaf assembly leaf stem on the 1L angled stud, turned towards you.

Step 10.1

Locate 1 bright light blue cone and insert 1 dark blue 1L bar with angled stud facing you into the top of the cone. Place the cone on the left stud in front of the left column of the forest mini build.

Step 10.2

Locate 1 dark green 1x1 round plate with three leaves and connect it to the angled stud placed in the previous step with the leaves toward you.

The black spider is left to crawl wherever it may, or squash that spider before Ron sees it and faints!

You've completed the build! Mischief Managed!
