

42635 Dog-Grooming Car

Little animal-lovers can have lots of fun helping Paisley and Nova wash and groom the 2 pups – Pickle and Juno. They'll love putting the dogs into the pool for a bath. Use the shampoo and brushes to get the pups in tip-top condition – Pickle loves to get bubbles on his nose! Once the dogs are clean, load the accessories back into the car, ready to drive to the next customer.

Dog-Grooming Car toy for kids aged 4+ – Vehicle playset includes 2 mini-dolls, 2 dog figures, a buildable car, a pool, and lots of pet care accessories for girls and boys who love animals.

Made for young builders – Children who are learning to build can have buckets of fun with this kids' role-play toy as they help Paisley and Nova wash and groom pups, Pickle and Juno.

2 mini-dolls and 2 dog figures – This toy set comes with LEGO® Friends characters Paisley and Nova, plus Pickle and Juno dog characters, to inspire hours of imaginative animal-care pretend play.

Buildable car and dog-grooming accessories – This building toy for kids comes with a buildable car with wheels, a pool, and pet care accessories, including brushes, shampoo, and a fire hydrant.

Measurements – 60-piece LEGO® set with a car measuring over 1.5 in. (4 cm) high, 3.5 in. (9 cm) long and 1.5 in. (5 cm) wide.

The front of the box shows Paisley getting out of her car with a brush and waving hi to Nova who is already washing a dog with the water from the fire hydrant!

The back of the box shows all the accessories that the set comes with. It comes with Paisley, Nova, 2 dogs, bubbles, a soap dispenser, a brush, a dog pool, a fire hydrant, and a car.

The top of the box shows a 1 to 1 scale of Nova.

The build is 60 pieces in total and is for ages 4+.

Bag 1 includes the pieces for 2 minifigures, 2 dogs, a dog pool, a fire hydrant, and a car.

Welcome to Text-Based Building Instructions from Bricks for the Blind. Here is some helpful information on how to best use screen readers and browsers: bricksfortheblind.org/help-with-screen-readers. Before you start building, here are some terms we will be using:

- In Front of/Front: towards you.
- Behind/Back: away from you.
- Up: towards the ceiling.
- Down: towards the floor.
- Stud: the bump on a LEGO brick. Example: A 2x1 brick has two studs on it.
- Vertically: with the longest side going from front to back
- Horizontally: with the longest side going from left to right.
- Upright: pointing up towards the ceiling.
- Standing upright: The piece is perpendicular to the ground, like a wall.
- Lying flat: The piece is parallel to the ground, like a piece of toast which fell off the

table.

- That one/ppp: previously placed piece.
- Plate: piece with studs.
- Tile: smooth piece without studs (unless otherwise specified)
- A jumper plate is a 1x2 plate with a single stud on top, or a 1x3 plate with only two studs on top.
- "Anti-stud" is a term for the portion of a LEGO piece which accepts studs, like the bottom of a plate or brick.
- Symmetrically: a mirror image. Example: If you place a 2x1 brick with technic connector on the front wall at the right, connector to the front, and then place another such piece symmetrically on the back wall, at the right, the technic connector of the second piece should point to the back, since it will be placed symmetrically.
- Centered-vertically: even amount of space in front of and behind piece
- Centered-horizontally: even amount of space left and right of piece.
- Row: studs lined up horizontally (left to right/side to side).
- Column: studs lined up upright or vertically (top to bottom/back to front).

For builders with low vision, or a sighted building partner may want to follow along with the printed visual instructions that come with each kit, or PDF versions are always online at LEGO.com for each set: (<https://www.lego.com/en-us/service/buildinginstructions/42635>) As low vision users may benefit from viewing the instructions on a personal device where they can zoom in on content and use assistive technologies to enhance the visuals.

Sorting the pieces:

To begin a successful build, it helps to sort the pieces into groups, bags, or small containers. Have a friend or family member do this in advance following the instructions below. You will see that the pieces should be sorted according to the building steps in the kit. Doing this in advance makes locating the pieces for each step easier. See below on how to sort the pieces to correspond to the steps in this set. Number the containers using letters A-Z, numbers, or meaningful names. The parts will be sorted into one or a small number of steps in the instructions. Example: Steps 1-3 means collect all the parts used in steps 1,2 and 3, and put them in one container.

This LEGO set comes with 1 bag labeled 1, 1 set of instructions, and some loose pieces. Sort the pieces into groups or piles as described below. Note that where there are multiple colors of the same brick in a step, the colors will be split into 2 groups to make telling the difference easier for the builder! LEGO includes a few spare parts in case you lose something. Set these into their own group away from the rest, in case you need them later.

Bag 1 - Minifigures, Dogs, Fire Hydrant, and Car

Group 1 - Pages 6-7.

Group 2 - Pages 8-11.

Group 3 - Pages 12-13 and 1 white 3x3 sloped curved quarter-circle brick from Page 14.

Group 4 - Rest of Page 14 and Pages 15-17.

Group 5 - Pages 18-27.

Group 6 - Pages 28-47

Group 7 - Pages 48-63.

Let's get to building!

Building Instructions (Bag 1, Book 1):

Group 1 - Paisley Minifigure

Steps 6 to 7

Locate 1 light blue pair of legs printed with jeans and purple and white shoes, 1 light nougat torso printed with a white jacket with pink diamonds over a white t-shirt, 1 light nougat head printed with light blue eyes, dark red eyelashes, nose, and a mouth, 1 dark red hair, and 1 yellow hair brush. Assemble your minifigure then put the brush in her hand!

Group 2 - Nova Minifigure and Dogs

Steps 8 to 9

Locate 1 light nougat pair of legs printed with light green shorts and yellow flipflops, 1 light nougat torso printed with a light blue sleeveless shirt, light nougat head printed with grey eyes, brown eyebrows, nose, and smile on her face, 1 tan hair, 1 transparent pink 1x1 round brick, and 1 yellow nozzle. Assemble your minifigure then put the nozzle on top of the brick to make a soap dispenser! Now put it in her hand!

Steps 10 to 11

Locate 1 white dog with grey ears, 1 brown dog with a yellow harness and 2 hooks, and 1 black weight. This is not a weight but wheels for the dog! Attach the wheels to the bottom of the back legs of the dog. Now put them aside while we make the dog pool!

Group 3 - Dog Pool

Steps 12 to 13

Locate 1 light blue 6x6 round plate and 2 white 3x3 sloped curved quarter-circle bricks. Place the plate in front of you. Then place a brick in the back right corner so the curve follows the plate. Then place 1 in the front left corner so the curve follows the plate.

Group 4 - Dog Pool

Steps 14 to 17

Locate 2 yellow 3x3 sloped curved quarter-circle bricks and 1 tower of balls on a 1x1 plate. These are bubbles! Place the bricks in the back left and front right corners to follow the plate curve. Now in the center 2x2 studs, place the bubbles in the back right stud. Put this away while we make a fire hydrant!

Group 5 - Fire Hydrant

Steps 18 to 19

Locate 1 red 2x2 plate and 1 round 2x2 brick with grooves. Place the plate in front of you. Then place the brick on top so there is no overhang.

Steps 20 to 21

Locate 1 red 2x2 plate and 1 red 2x2 round brick with a hole. Place the brick on top of the previous round brick so the hole faces the front. Then place the plate on top.

Steps 22 to 23

Locate 1 red 2x2 dome brick. Place it on top of the 2x2 plate.

Steps 24 to 25

Locate 1 light grey 1x1 pin. Insert the pin into the front hole so the stud faces the front.

Steps 26 to 27

Locate 1 transparent light blue fire. Insert it into the pin. This is not fire, it is actually a stream of water bursting out of the fire hydrant!

Group 6 - Car

Steps 28 to 29

Locate 1 yellow 4x10 car base with arches and pins. Place it horizontally in front of you.

Steps 30 to 33

Locate 4 black tires and 4 white wheels. Insert the wheels into the tires. Now insert the wheels into the pins located in the front and back of the build.

Steps 34 to 35

Locate 1 white 1x2 steering wheel. Vertically place it on the leftmost column inside the gap of the car so it faces the right.

Steps 36 to 37

Locate 1 tan 2x2 tile and 1 tan 1x2 panel with a long wall and a wall down the middle. Vertically place the panel to the right of the steering wheel so the long wall is on the left. Then place the 2x2 tile to the right.

Steps 38 to 39

Locate 1 white 1x2 plate. Vertically place it to the right of the 2x2 tile.

Steps 40 to 41

Locate 1 pink 1x2 sloped curved brick. Vertically place it on top of the 1x2 plate so it slopes to the left. There will be a 2x1 gap in the gap portion of the car after you finish this step, but that's ok.

Steps 42 to 43

Locate 1 light blue 1x4 tile with 2 studs. Vertically place it on the leftmost column of the build.

Steps 44 to 45

Locate 2 light blue 2x2 corner plates and 2 light blue 1x4 tiles. Place the corner plates to the right of the previously placed 1x4 tile so there is no overhang. Then horizontally place the tiles to the right of the corner plates on the front and back rows.

Steps 46 to 47

Locate 1 yellow 1x4 curved fence. Vertically place it to the right of the 1x4 tiles.

Group 7 - Car

Steps 48 to 49

Locate 1 white 1x2 panel with a long wall, and 2 light blue 1x2 panels with a long wall and a wall at each end. Vertically place the 1x2 panel with a long wall to the right of the fence so it is centered and the wall is on the left. Then horizontally place the other panels in front of and behind the previously placed panel so the long walls are facing outwards.

Steps 50 to 51

Locate 1 white 1x2 panel with a long wall. Vertically place it in between the previously placed panels on the rightmost column so the wall faces the right.

Steps 52 to 53

Locate 1 light blue 1x4 sloped curved tile and 1 white 1x2 sloped curved tile with a wing end. This tile has an extended inverted slope hanging on 1 side. Horizontally place the 1x4 tile upright on the lower 4 studs of the right-facing side studs. Then horizontally place the wing end upright in the middle of the upper 4 studs of the right-facing side studs so the end part faces up.

Steps 54 to 55

Locate 2 transparent red 1x1 tiles. Place them upright on the right-facing side studs to the left and right of the wing end.

Steps 56 to 57

Locate 1 transparent 3x4 windshield. Vertically place it on the left side so it sits to the right of the 1x4 tile with 2 studs and slopes to the left.

Steps 58 to 59

Locate 1 white 3x4 tile with 2 studs printed with a cute light blue and white dog face sticking his tongue out and 2 yellow and white headlights. Horizontally place it upright on the left-facing side studs so the curved side of the tile faces up and overhangs. It should not overhang at the bottom.

Steps 60 to 61

Locate 1 light blue 1x2 grill tile. Horizontally place it upright on the 2 left-facing side studs of the 3x4 tile.

Steps 62 to 63

Locate 2 white 1x1 corner bricks. Place 1 in the front left corner so the right angle faces the front left corner. Then place 1 in the back left corner so the right angle faces the back left corner.
