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Treat a Disney Moana fan with this LEGO® I Disney Moana Village House & Boat (43282) building toy for young kids ages 4 and up. Inspire endless pretend play and storytelling with 3 Disney's Moana 2 characters: Moana, Pua and Simea, a house and palm tree, 2 beds, an eating area, a drum and more. There are also stickers to add realistic details, plus a boat with a removable oar. This Disney's Moana 2 building set makes a fun birthday gift-giving idea for preschool girls and boys.

IMAGINATIVE PLAY FOR KIDS – Treat preschool girls and boys to this Disney's Moana brick-built toy that's designed for limitless pretend play.

WHAT'S INSIDE – Kids can recreate scenes from Moana 2 with this Village House & Boat (43282) building playset that features a rotating palm tree, kitchen area, sleeping area, a small boat and more.

STORYTELLING ACCESSORIES – The building set includes 2 beds, 2 bowls, a barrel, drum, fish, banana, coconut, star and a gem, plus wall decorations for creative storytelling and play.

3 FAMILIAR MOVIE CHARACTERS – Includes Disney Moana, her little sister Simea and Pua the pig, who can be placed in the small boat.

DIMENSIONS – This 85-piece building toy includes a house section measuring over 4 in. (11 cm) high, 2.5 in. (6 cm) wide and 1.5 in. (3 cm) deep.

The front of the box shows Moana and Pua riding a boat to her village house! Simea is there waiting for them to come home!

The back of the box shows all the accessories that the set comes with! It comes with 2 minifigures, a pig, a village house, boat, fish, banana, starfish, an oar, and 2 bowls!

The top of the box shows a real size image of Moana!

The build is 85 pieces in total and is for ages 4+.

Welcome to Text-Based Building Instructions from Bricks for the Blind. Here is some helpful information on how to best use screen readers and browsers: bricksfortheblind.org/help-with-screen-readers. Before you start building, here are some terms we will be using:

- In Front of/Front: towards you.
- Behind/Back: away from you.
- Up: towards the ceiling.
- Down: towards the floor.
- Stud: the bump on a LEGO brick. Example: A 2x1 brick has two studs on it.
- Vertically: with the longest side going from front to back
- Horizontally: with the longest side going from left to right.
- Upright: pointing up towards the ceiling.
- Standing upright: The piece is perpendicular to the ground, like a wall.
- Lying flat: The piece is parallel to the ground, like a piece of toast which fell off the table.

- That one/ppp: previously placed piece.
- Plate: piece with studs.
- Tile: smooth piece without studs (unless otherwise specified)
- A jumper plate is a 1x2 plate with a single stud on top, or a 1x3 plate with only two studs on top.
- "Anti-stud" is a term for the portion of a LEGO piece which accepts studs, like the bottom of a plate or brick.
- Symmetrically: a mirror image. Example: If you place a 2x1 brick with technic connector on the front wall at the right, connector to the front, and then place another such piece symmetrically on the back wall, at the right, the technic connector of the second piece should point to the back, since it will be placed symmetrically.
- Centered-vertically: even amount of space in front of and behind piece
- Centered-horizontally: even amount of space left and right of piece.
- Row: studs lined up horizontally (left to right/side to side).
- Column: studs lined up upright or vertically (top to bottom/back to front).

A note on LEGO Technic™ part names. These parts are somewhat different from regular LEGO bricks. Here are some definitions in case the builder or helper is not familiar with LEGO Technic™.

Axles - An axle is a connector which has an X shaped cross-section. Because their cross section is not round, anything connected to an axle using an axle-hole will rotate with that axle. Axles are longer than they are wide, and the length of an axle corresponds with how many bricks long it is. Aka a 3L axle is three bricks long. Axles come in a variety of lengths, with a 2L axle being the shortest available. They may be combined with pins, or have circular stops on them. A stop prevents the axle from sliding through an axle-hole at a specific point on the axle.

Pins - A pin is a connector which has a circular cross section and a flanged notch out of one or both ends. This flanged notch allows them to click into bricks with a pin-hole. Pins come with and without friction ridges, which are small bumps on the pin which prevent them from rotating freely. For standard pins, black is a high friction pin, and gray is a low friction pin. A standard length pin is two brick lengths long, with a stop in the middle. This prevents a brick from being pushed from one side of the pin to the other. A 1L pin is one brick long and still retains the stop, however it also includes a hollow stud at the other end. A 3L pin is three bricks long, and only contains a stop at one side, allowing two bricks to be pushed onto the other side of the pin. Pins may also have one side which is an axle.

Technic brick - a brick which contains one or more holes which accept technic pins.

Lift-arms - A lift-arm is a basic structural element, similar to a brick or a plate, but usually without any studs. It is a beam with rounded ends and with holes in it, with the same spacing as the studs on a LEGO brick. lift-arms come in a variety of lengths, including a 1x1 lift-arm which looks like a cylinder. Thick lift-arms are as wide as a LEGO brick, and thin lift-arms are half as wide as a LEGO brick, but not the same thickness as a LEGO plate! The holes in a lift-arm arm may accept axles or pins. They also come in a variety of shapes, including tees, ells and triangles.

Gears - A gear is a functional element. They are typically discs with teeth on the outside, there are also worm gears which look like a spiraling cylinder! Gears connected by axles transmit or even transform rotational motion!

Axle and Pin Connectors - These elements are typically smaller than lift-arms and are used to connect some combination of pins or axles. They might have pins or axles, as well as axle or pin-holes. They have a lot of different angle combinations! The simplest just connects two axles or pins together in a straight line.

Bushes/Bushings - LEGO Technic™ uses bushes largely as spacers, but they also can reduce friction between rotating parts, or can form useful elements such as handles. Bushes are typically light gray, generally cylindrical, and have an axle-hole running through the middle. They have a flange at the front and back to make them easier to pull on and off.

For builders with low vision, or a sighted building partner may want to follow along with the printed visual instructions that come with each kit, or PDF versions are always online at LEGO.com for each set: (<https://www.lego.com/en-us/service/buildinginstructions/43282>) As low vision users may benefit from viewing the instructions on a personal device where they can zoom in on content and use assistive technologies to enhance the visuals.

Sorting the pieces:

To begin a successful build, it helps to sort the pieces into groups, bags, or small containers. Have a friend or family member do this in advance following the instructions below. You will see that the pieces should be sorted according to the building steps in the kit. Doing this in advance makes locating the pieces for each step easier. See below on how to sort the pieces to correspond to the steps in this set. Number the containers using letters A-Z, numbers, or meaningful names. The parts will be sorted into one or a small number of steps in the instructions. Example: Steps 1-3 means collect all the parts used in steps 1,2 and 3, and put them in one container.

This LEGO set comes with 2 bags labeled 1 to 2, 2 sets of instructions, and some loose pieces. Sort the pieces into groups or piles as described below. Note that where there are multiple colors of the same brick in a step, the colors will be split into 2 groups to make telling the difference easier for the builder! LEGO includes a few spare parts in case you lose something. Set these into their own group away from the rest, in case you need them later.

Bag 1 – Moana, Pua, and Boat

Group 1 – Pages 6-11.

Group 2 – Pages 12-31.

Bag 2 – Simea and Village House

Group 3 – Pages 4-9.

Group 4 – Pages 10-11 and 1 light orange 2x4 plate from Pages 12-13.

Group 5 – Rest of Pages 12-13 and Pages 14-37.

Group 6 – Pages 38-65.

Group 7 – Pages 66-74.

Let's get to building!

Building Instructions (Bag 1, Book 1):

Group 1 – Moana and Pua

Steps 6 to 7

Locate a light brown pair of legs printed with a tan dress with dark tan etchings, 1 light brown torso printed with a pink top and a seashell necklace, 1 light brown head printed with brown eyes, lips, and eyelashes, and 1 brown hair. Assemble your minifigure then put her in front of you.

Steps 8 to 9

Locate a brown oar and attach it to her hands! Now locate a white and light grey pig and place it next to her!

Steps 10 to 11

Let's make a part! Place a light brown 2x2 barrel in front of you. Then place a yellow banana and orange fish inside! Now put everything away while we make her boat!

Group 2 – Boat

Steps 12 to 13

Place a light brown 4x4 plate with inverted sloped sides in front of you so it slopes to the front and back. Then place a white 2x2 brick on top so it is centered horizontally and vertically.

Steps 14 to 15

Horizontally place a tan 2x3 inverted slope brick on the leftmost column so it is centered vertically and slopes and overhangs 2 columns to the left. Then repeat symmetrically to the right. Now horizontally place an orange 1x4 plate on the back row so it is centered horizontally.

Steps 16 to 17

Horizontally place an orange 2x4 tile in front of the ppp so it is centered horizontally and vertically.

Steps 18 to 19

Horizontally place a tan 1x2 plate with a clip on the front row so it is centered horizontally and the clip faces the front.

Steps 20 to 21

Horizontally place a light brown 1x4 double sloped curved tile on top of the ppp so it is centered horizontally.

Steps 22 to 23

Horizontally place a pink 1x2 tile on the 2 leftmost columns of the back row. Then place a pink 1x1 round flower plate on the rightmost column of the back row.

Steps 24 to 25

Place a pink 2x2 tile with a stud on the 2 rightmost columns.

Steps 26 to 27

Vertically place a pink 1x2 tile on the leftmost column. Then vertically place a light orange 1x2 panel with a middle wall to the right of the ppp so the middle wall faces the right.

Steps 28 to 29

Let's make a part! Place a brown 5.5L antenna in front of you. Then attach a pink flag with 2 clips to the top of it so the angled side faces up and it overhangs to the right.

Steps 30 to 31

Place your part on the 2nd column from the right of the back row so the flag faces the right. Now put away your boat while we make the next part!

Building Instructions (Bag 2, Book 2):

Group 3 – Simea

Steps 4 to 5

Locate a light brown body printed with tan shorts and a red shirt, 1 light brown head printed with brown eyes, lips, and eyelashes, and 1 brown hair. Assemble your minifigure then put her in front of you.

Steps 6 to 7

Let's make a part! Let's make a drum! Place an orange 2x2 inverted cone brick in front of you. Then place a tan 2x2 round tile on top.

Steps 8 to 9

Place your part next to your minifigure! Now put everything away while we make the village house!

Group 4 – Village House

Steps 10 to 11

Place a light brown 8x8 plate with 1x4 gaps in front of you.

Steps 12 to 13.1

Horizontally place a light orange 2x4 plate on the front row so it is centered horizontally and overhangs 1 row to the front.

Group 5 – Village House

Steps 12 to 13.2

Vertically place a lime green 2x4 plate on the leftmost column so it is centered vertically and overhangs 1 column to the left. Then repeat symmetrically to the right. Now horizontally place an orange 1x4 plate on the back row so it is centered horizontally.

Steps 14 to 15

Place a lime green 6x6 quarter circle plate underneath the leftmost column of overhang so 2 rows are exposed to the back and the curve faces the front left. Then repeat symmetrically to the right. Now horizontally place a light brown 4x8 plate with a round side underneath the front row so it is centered horizontally and the round side is exposed 3 rows to the front.

Steps 16 to 17

Horizontally place a tan 2x6x6 door frame with curved sides on the back 2 rows so it is centered horizontally and curves to the front.

Steps 18 to 19

Place a light grey 2x2 plate with a ball on top of the ppp so it is centered horizontally and the ball faces the front.

Steps 20 to 21

Horizontally place a green 2x3 plate on the 4th to 6th columns from the left of the back 2 rows. Then repeat symmetrically to the right. These are in the recessed areas to the left and right of the previous door frame!

Steps 22 to 23

Vertically place a tan 2x3 brick on the back 3 rows, to the left of the 2x6x6 curved door frame. Then repeat symmetrically to the right.

Steps 24 to 25

Horizontally place a light brown 1x2x5 brick printed with Moana holding an oar and steering her boat on the back row of the ppp so the print faces the front. Then repeat symmetrically to the left with another light brown 1x2x5 brick printed with Moana and Simea dancing so the print faces the front.

Steps 26 to 27

Horizontally place a light brown 1x3 plate on the back row of the 7th to 9th columns from the left so it sits to the left of a 2x2 plate with a ball. Then repeat symmetrically to the right.

Steps 28 to 29

Place a pink 2x2 tile with a stud to the left of the doorway so it sits in front of the left 1x2x5 brick with a print. Then repeat symmetrically to the right.

Steps 30 to 31

Place a gold 1x1 star on top of the ppp. Then repeat symmetrically to the left with a transparent aqua 1x1 hexagon tile.

Steps 32 to 33

Horizontally place a white 1x2 plate on the 3rd row from the back and in front of the 2 leftmost columns of the 2x6x6 doorway. Then repeat symmetrically to the right.

Steps 34 to 35

Place the back row of a white 2x2 sloped curved tile on top of the ppp so it slopes to the front. Then repeat symmetrically to the left.

Steps 36 to 37

Vertically place a teal 2x4 tile in front of the ppp. Then repeat symmetrically to the right. These are beds!

Group 6 – Village House

Steps 38 to 39

Horizontally place 2 tan 1x4 bricks, 1 in front of the other, on the 2nd and 3rd rows from the front so together they are centered horizontally.

Steps 40 to 41

Horizontally place a tan 2x4 tile with 2 studs on top of the 2 ppp.

Steps 42 to 43

Place 2 light brown 1x1 bowls, 1 to the right of the other, on top of the ppp.

Steps 44 to 45

Place a light brown 2x2x5 corner panel with a cutoff corner on the back 2 rows of the 4th and 5th columns from the left so the cutoff corner faces the back left. Then repeat symmetrically to the right. These will sit next to the 1x2x5 bricks from earlier!

Steps 46 to 47

Horizontally place the right column of a light orange 1x2 sloped curved brick on the back stud of the ppp so it slopes to the right. Then repeat symmetrically to the left.

Steps 48 to 49

Place a lime green 1x1 round plate with 3 leaves to the front left of the ppp so it sits on the front stud of the 2x2x5 corner panel with a cutoff corner and the leaves face the left. Then repeat symmetrically to the right.

Steps 50 to 51

Horizontally place an orange 1x2x2 brick on the back row so it is centered horizontally. Then horizontally place a tan 1x2 tile in front of the ppp.

Steps 52 to 53

Horizontally place a light orange 1x3x2 sloped curved brick on the back row to the left of the previous brick so it slopes to the left. Then repeat symmetrically to the right.

Steps 54 to 55

Horizontally place a light orange 1x2 brick on the back row so it is centered horizontally. Then horizontally place a light orange 1x2 inverted slope brick to the left of the ppp so it slopes to the left. Then repeat symmetrically to the right.

Steps 56 to 57

Horizontally place a light orange 1x6 tile on the back row on top of the 3 ppp so it is centered horizontally.

Steps 58 to 59

Attach the clip of an orange 1x2 rounded plate with leaves and a clip to the bar that is attached to the front-facing ball so the leaves face up.

Steps 60 to 61

Place 2 pink 1x1 round flower plates, 1 above the other, upright on the ppp.

Steps 62 to 63

Let's make the palm tree now! Place a green 2x2 brick on the back 2 rows of the 2nd and 3rd columns from the left.

Steps 64 to 65

Place a light grey 2x2 tile with a top-facing pin on top of the ppp.

Group 7 – Village House

Steps 66 to 67

Place a brown curved branch with a pinhole and bar hole on top of the top-facing pin of the ppp so it curves to the left and the barhole faces up.

Steps 68 to 69

Place a brown curved branch with a bar on top of the ppp so it curves up and to the right.

Steps 70 to 71

Let's make a part! Place a lime green 1x2 rounded plate with leaves and a clip upside down in front of you so the clip faces the right. Then place a brown head on the left anti-stud.

Steps 72 to 74

Attach the clip of your part to the top of the curved branch with a bar so the leaves face the left. This is a coconut tree!
