

72040 Captain Toad's Camp

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Explore Captain Toad's camp and hunt for hidden treasure with this fun-packed LEGO® Super Mario™ toy playset for kids (72040). A fantastic small gift for boys, girls and any fans aged 6 and up, the toy building set features a buildable tent with bonfire for Captain Toad, a collapsible bridge, hidden diamond accessories and a treasure chest. There are also 3 LEGO Super Mario figures – Captain Toad, a Goomba and a turnip – plus accessories including a buildable backpack, and pickaxe and pan accessories to inspire creative role play. Add a LEGO® Mario™, LEGO® Luigi™ or LEGO® Peach™ toy figure (from sets 71439, 71440, 71441 or 72043 – sold separately) for interactive play, including digital reactions when jumping on the tent's Action Tag and defeating the Goomba.

The packaging captures the sense of a small LEGO Super Mario campsite adventure, with Captain Toad exploring a colorful rocky landscape full of hidden treasure and little play moments. The front of the box shows the finished camp scene arranged across bright green terrain, with the tan and brown tent on one side, the medium nougat bridge and raised platform on the other, and a small campfire placed near the middle. Captain Toad is shown wearing his red and white mushroom cap, backpack, and explorer accessories, standing near the tent as if ready to search for treasure. A Goomba and a turnip are also included in the scene, making the build feel like part of a Super Mario level. The build consists of 159 pieces in total, 3 minifigures, and is recommended for ages 6+. Once finished, you will have Toad's Camp and a piece of terrain. The set consists of 4 numbered bags and 1 instruction booklet.

Welcome to Text-Based Building Instructions from Bricks for the Blind. Here is some helpful information on how to best use screen readers and browsers: bricksfortheblind.org/help-with-screen-readers. Before you start building, here are some terms we will be using:

- In Front of/Front: towards you.

- Behind/Back: away from you.
- Up: towards the ceiling.
- Down: towards the floor.
- Stud: the bump on a LEGO brick. Example: A 2x1 brick has two studs on it.
- Vertically: with the longest side going from front to back
- Horizontally: with the longest side going from left to right.
- Upright: pointing up towards the ceiling.
- Standing upright: The piece is perpendicular to the ground, like a wall.
- Lying flat: The piece is parallel to the ground, like a piece of toast which fell off the table.
- That one/ppp: previously placed piece.
- Plate: piece with studs.
- Tile: smooth piece without studs (unless otherwise specified)
- A jumper plate is a 1x2 plate with a single stud on top, or a 1x3 plate with only two studs on top.
- Hollow stud: a bump on a LEGO brick with a hole, which allows attaching bars.
- "Anti-stud" is a term for the portion of a LEGO piece which accepts studs, like the bottom of a plate or brick.
- Left/right wedge parts: these are parts that when placed in front of you and are pointing to the back, their wedge is on the left/right side of the part.
- Symmetrically: a mirror image. Example: If you place a 2x1 brick with technic connector on the front wall at the right, connector to the front, and then place another such piece symmetrically on the back wall, at the right, the technic connector of the second piece should point to the back, since it will be placed symmetrically.
- Centered-vertically: even amount of space in front of and behind piece
- Centered-horizontally: even amount of space left and right of piece.
- Row: studs lined up horizontally (left to right/side to side).
- Column: studs lined up upright or vertically (top to bottom/back to front).

Additionally, it is worth mentioning that besides the printed visual instructions that come with each kit, a PDF version for the set's instructions is always available online at [\[https://www.lego.com/en-us/service/building-instructions/72040\]](https://www.lego.com/en-us/service/building-instructions/72040). This might help a sighted building partner that may want to follow along or low vision users that may benefit from viewing the instructions on a personal device where they can zoom in on content and use assistive technologies to enhance the visuals.

Sorting the pieces:

To begin a successful build, it helps to sort the pieces into groups, bags, or small containers. Have a friend or family member do this in advance following the instructions below. You will see that the pieces should be sorted according to the building steps in the kit. Doing this in advance makes locating the pieces for each step easier. See below on how to sort the pieces to correspond to the steps in this set. Number the containers using letters A-Z, numbers, or meaningful names. The parts will be sorted into one or a small number of steps in the instructions. Example: Steps 1-3 means collect all the parts used in steps 1, 2, and 3 and put them in one container.

This LEGO set comes with 4 numbered bags and 1 instruction booklet. Sort the pieces into groups or piles as described below. Note that where there are multiple colors of the same brick in a step, the colors will be split into 2 groups to make telling the difference easier for the builder!

LEGO includes a few spare parts in case you lose something. Set these into their own group away from the rest, in case you need them later.

Alright, we are done with sorting. Let's get building!

Building Instructions

Book 1, bag 1:

Group 1 – Captain Toad

Step 1

Place 1 red 2x2 round plate with 2 feet in front of you, so that its feet face to the front. Then, place 1 tan 2x2 round plate with axle hole on top of the ppp.

Step 2

Place 1 tan 2x2 round brick with pin holes on opposite sides with printed dark tan pockets and red bandana on top of the ppp, so that its pin holes face to the left and right. Ask a sighted friend to make sure that the ppp is oriented correctly.

Step 3

Insert the pin of 1 light nougat arm with hand into each of the 2 holes of the ppp, so that the hands face to the front.

Step 4

Place 1 tan 1x2 plate with 1x2 side studs hanging down horizontally on the back row, so that its side studs face to the back.

Step 5

Place 1 light nougat 1x2 brick horizontally on top of the ppp. Then, place 1 light nougat 1x2 brick with Toad face printed horizontally in front of the ppp. Ask a sighted friend to make sure that the ppp is oriented correctly.

Step 6

Place 2 tan 1x2 round tiles on the back row. Then, place 1 tan 1x2 hinge base horizontally in front of the 2 ppps, so that its flat wall faces to the front.

Step 7

Rotate 1 light bluish gray 2x2 plate with hinge bar underneath so that its hinge bar is to the front. Attach it to the ppp and angle it down as far as possible.

Step 8

Place 1 reddish brown 2x2 plate on top of the ppp.

Step 9.1

Attach 1 white hollow cube with 2x2 studs on top, printed with red circles on all four sides to the ppp

Step 9.2

Place 2 bright light orange 1x2 plates with handle on short edge vertically, one to the right of the other, on top of the ppp, so that their handles face to the front.

Step 9.3

Place 1 red 2x2 round tile on top of the 2 ppps.

Step 9.4

We need to assemble a small sub-build. Place 1 transparent yellow 2x2 inverted round plate with round bottom in front of you. Then, place 1 light bluish gray 2x2 round plate with axle hole on top of the ppp. Lastly, place 2 light bluish gray 1x2 plate with stud and upright clip on top of the ppp, one to the right of the other, so that their clips are to the front.

The sub-build is complete. Flip it 90 degrees from front to back, so that the clips face to the back and the transparent yellow round bottom faces to the front. Attach its clips to the front-facing handles.

Group 2 – Captain Toad's backpack and accessories

Step 10

Let's build Captain Toad's backpack. Place 1 reddish brown 2x2 plate in front of you.

Step 11

Locate 2 black 1x1 plates with clip. Place the first one on the back left corner of the ppp, so that its clip faces to the left. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically on the right. Then, place 1 reddish brown 1x1 plate with ring in front of the ppp, so that its ring faces to the front. Lastly, place 1 reddish brown 1x1 plate to the left of the ppp.

Step 12

Rotate 1 reddish brown 1x2 plate with 2x2 upright tile so that it is horizontal and the antistuds of the 2x2 tile face to the back. Place its 1x2 plate on top of the back row.

Step 13

Find 2 reddish brown 1x2 plates. Place the first one horizontally on top of the ppp. Then, place the second one horizontally in front of the ppp.

Step 14

Place 1 reddish brown 2x2 curved slope tile on top of the 2 ppps, so that it slopes to the front.

Step 15

Attach 1 reddish brown 1x1 round brick to the left-facing ring on the front of the backpack. Grab 2 tan 1x1 round tiles. Attach the first one to the left-facing stud of the ppp. Take the second one and attach it symmetrically on the right.

Step 16

Attach the handle of 1 black pan to the right-facing clip, so that the pan faces to the front and its open side faces to the right.

Step 17

The backpack is complete. Bring back Captain Toad's minifigure, so that it faces to the back and its side studs face to the front. Rotate the backpack so that it slopes to the top and its antistuds face to the back. Attach the top row of back-facing antistuds to the row of front-facing side studs on Captain Toad.

Step 18

Attach the handle of 1 red mug to the right-facing clip of Captain Toad's backpack. Lastly, place 1 dark bluish gray pickaxe in Captain Toad's right hand.

Group 3 – Captain Toad's tent

Step 1

Place 1 bright green 8x8 rounded plate in front of you. Then, place 1 red 1x4 half cylinder brick horizontally on the back row of the ppp, so that it is centered horizontally and it slopes to the back and front.

Step 2

Place 1 red 2x4 tile horizontally in front of the ppp. Then, place 1 white 1x4 tile horizontally in front of the ppp.

Step 3

Place 1 white 2x4 slope brick horizontally in front of the ppp, so that it slopes to the back.

Step 4

Place 1 reddish brown bottom part of treasure chest horizontally in front of the ppp, so that its hinges face to the back. Then, place 1 transparent clear diamond inside the ppp. Lastly, close the chest by attaching 1 reddish brown treasure lid to it, so that its hinges face to the back.

Step 5

Grab 2 tan 1x6 bricks. Place the first one vertically on the leftmost column, so that it is centered vertically. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically on the right. Locate 2 tan 1x4 half cylinder bricks. Place the first one vertically on top of the ppp, so that it is centered vertically. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically on the left. Lastly, find 4 reddish brown 1x1 tiles with upright clip. Place the first one behind the ppp, so that its clip hands face to the left and right. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically on the front. Take the remaining 2 and repeat symmetrically on the right.

Step 6

Grab 4 reddish brown 1x2 plates with handle on short edge. Attach 1 of them vertically upright to each of the 2 ppps, so that their antistuds face to the left. Take the remaining 2 and repeat symmetrically on the left.

Locate 2 tan 6x6 tiles. Rotate the first one upright, so that its antistuds face to the right. Attach the 2 bottom rows of the back and front columns to the 2 ppps. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically on the right. Angle the 2 ppps to bring them together as close as possible, creating the tent's roof.

Step 7

Rotate the build 180 degrees on the horizontal plane, so that its 2x4 brick slopes to the front. Rotate 1 lime 2x4 plate vertically. Place its back row under the front row of the build, so that it is centered horizontally and it has 3 exposed rows. Then, place 1 red 2x2 tile with the code for "tent" on the 2 front rows of the ppp. Ask a sighted friend to make sure that the ppp is oriented correctly. Then, place 1 dark green 1x1 round plate with petals behind the right column of the ppp.

Group 4 – Captain Toad's tent (continued)

Step 8.1

Rotate 1 lime 2x4 plate horizontally. Place its rightmost column under the leftmost column of the build, so that it is centered vertically and it has 3 exposed columns.

Step 8.2

Place 1 dark green 1x1 round plate with petals on the 3rd column from the left on the front row of the ppp. Then, place 1 yellow 1x1 round plate with petals on top of the ppp.

Step 8.3

Place the 2nd row from the front of the rightmost column of 1 bright green 4x4 tile with studs on perimeter to the left of the ppp.

Step 8.4

Locate 2 reddish brown 2x2 round tiles with stud. Place the first one on the back right corner of the ppp. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically on the opposite corner (place it on the front left corner of the 4x4 tile with studs on perimeter).

Step 8.5

Place 1 reddish brown 1x1 brick with side studs on 4 sides on top of the ppp. Then, attach 1 transparent orange 1x1 plate with horizontal tooth upright to each of the 4 side studs of the ppp, so that their teeth face to the top. Lastly, attach 1 transparent red 1x1 cone brick to the top of the 1x1 reddish brown brick with side studs on 4 sides, in the middle of the 4 ppps.

Book 1, bag 3

Group 5 – Turnip

Step 1

Let's build the Turnip minifigure. Place 1 white 2x2 round plate with axle hole in front of you.

Step 2

Find 2 light bluish gray 1x2x1 2/3 brick with side studs on 3 sides. Place the first one vertically on the left column of the ppp, so that its side studs face to the back, left, and front. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically on the right.

Step 3

Place 1 white 1x2 tile horizontally on the front row of the 2 ppps. Then, place 1 white 1x2 jumper plate horizontally behind the ppp.

Step 4

Attach 1 white 2x2 tile with printed eyes to the front-facing side studs. Then, attach 1 white 2x2 tile with the code for "turnip" to the back-facing side studs. Ask a sighted friend to make sure that the 2 ppps are placed and oriented correctly.

Step 5

Grab 2 white 1x2 plates. Attach the first one horizontally upright to the top row of left-facing side studs. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically on the right. Locate 2 white 2x2 curved slope tiles. Rotate the first one so that its antistuds face to the left and it slopes to the bottom. Attach its top row to the ppp. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically on the left.

Step 6

Place 1 white 1x1 plate with 1x1 upright side stud on top of the 1x2 jumper on top of the turnip. Then, attach 1 green 1x1 round plate with 3 leaves to the front-facing side stud of the ppp, so that its leaves face to the top.

Group 6 – Terrain

Step 1

Let's build the terrain. Place 1 light bluish gray 2x10 plate horizontally in front of you. Then, place 1 red 2x6 plate horizontally on top of the ppp, so that it is centered horizontally.

Step 2

Place the 2 leftmost columns of 1 light bluish gray 4x4 rounded tile with studs on perimeter on top of 2 rightmost columns of the build, so that it is centered vertically.

Step 3

Place 1 dark bluish gray 1x2 jumper plate horizontally on top of the back row of the ppp, so that it is centered horizontally.

Step 4

Insert 1 transparent clear gem into the hollow stud of the ppp.

Group 7 – Terrain (continued)

Step 5

Stack 2 light bluish gray 1x2 log bricks and place them vertically on the rightmost column, so that they are centered vertically. Then, place 1 dark bluish gray 1x2 brick with pin hole vertically on top of the 2 ppps, so that its pin hole faces to the left and right. Lastly, place 1 light bluish gray 1x2 rounded plate vertically on top of the ppp.

Step 6.1

Place 1 yellow 1x2 plate with handle on long edge horizontally on the front row of the 4x4 rounded tile with studs on perimeter, so that its handle faces to the front. Then, place 1 light bluish gray 1x2 log brick horizontally on top of the ppp.

Step 6.2

Place 1 yellow 1x2 plate with handle on long edge horizontally on top of the ppp, so that its handle faces to the front. Continue by placing 1 light bluish gray 1x2 log brick on top of the ppp.

Step 6.3

Next, place 1 yellow 1x2 plate with handle on long edge horizontally on top of the ppp, so that its handle faces to the front. Lastly, place 1 light bluish gray 1x2 rounded plate with open studs horizontally on top of the ppp.

Group 8 – Terrain (continued)

Step 7.1

Place 1 dark bluish gray 2x2 slope brick on the 4th and 5th columns from the right, so that it is centered vertically and it slopes to the left. Then, place 1 light bluish gray 1x2 log brick vertically on top of the ppp.

Step 7.2

Place 1 dark bluish gray 1x2 brick with pin hole vertically on top of the ppp, so that its pin hole faces to the left and right.

Step 7.3

Place 1 black 1x2 plate with clips on long edge vertically on top of the ppp, so that its clips face to the left.

Step 8

Place the leftmost column of 1 bright green 4x4 rounded tile with studs on perimeter on top of the ppp, so that it is centered vertically.

Book 1, bag 4

Group 9 – Terrain (continued)

Step 9

Place 1 black 10L axle horizontally in front of you. Then, slide 1 light bluish gray 2x2 dome onto the right end of the ppp. Insert the axle into right-facing pin hole located on the right edge of the terrain build, so that exits through the opposite (left-facing) pin hole and it protrudes to the left.

Step 10

Attach 1 black 1x2 axle connector with locking finger to the left end of the axle, so that its locking finger is vertical.

Put the main build of the terrain to the side for now.

Group 10 – Terrain (continued)

Step 11

Let's build the left, tall side of the terrain. Place 1 light bluish gray 4x4 rounded tile with studs on perimeter in front of you. Rotate 1 red 2x2 tile with 2 studs so that its studs face to the back. Place its studs under the front row of the ppp, so that it is centered horizontally and it has 1 exposed studless row. Note that we will not consider this exposed row when counting rows and columns.

Step 12

Place 1 dark green 1x1 round plate with petals on the back right corner. Rotate 1 red 2x2 tile with 2 studs so that its studs face to the front. Place its back row to the left of the ppp.

Step 13

Place 2 light bluish gray 1x2 plates with upright clip vertically, one to the right of the other, in front of the ppp, so that their clips face to the front and their clip hands face to the front and back.

Step 14

Rotate 1 red 2x2 tile with 2 studs so that its studs face to the front. Place its front row on top of the 2 ppps. Then, place 1 red 2x2 slope brick to the right of the ppp, so that it slopes and it overhangs to the right by 1 column. Note that we will not consider the overhanging column when counting rows and columns.

Step 15

Place 1 light bluish gray 1x4 brick vertically on top of the leftmost column. Then, place 1 light bluish gray 1x2 rounded plate with hollow studs horizontally to the right of the 2nd row from the front of the ppp.

Group 11 – Terrain (continued)

Step 16

Place 1 light bluish gray 2x4 plate horizontally on top of the build, so that it is centered vertically.

Step 17

Locate 2 dark green 1x1 round plates with petals. Place the first one on the back left corner of the ppp. Place the second one on the front right corner of the build.

Step 18.1

Place 1 light bluish gray 1x2 rounded plate with open studs vertically on the rightmost column, so that it is centered vertically. Then, place 1 light bluish gray 1x2x3 panel vertically on top of the ppp, so that its flat wall faces to the right.

Step 18.2

Place 1 light bluish gray 1x2 rounded plate with open studs vertically on top of the ppp.

Step 18.3

Place 1 yellow 1x2 plate with handle on long edge vertically on top of the ppp, so that its handle faces to the right.

Step 19

Find 2 light bluish gray 1x1x5 bricks. Place the first one behind the ppp. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically on the front.

Step 20

Place 1 light bluish gray 1x4 brick vertically on top of the 2 ppps, so that it also attaches to the 1x2 plate with handle on long edge. Then, place 1 yellow 1x2 plate with handle on long edge vertically on top of the ppp, so that it is centered vertically and its handle faces to the right.

Step 21

Grab 2 light bluish gray 1x1x5 bricks. Place the first one on the back left corner of the build. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically on the front.

Step 22

Place 1 light bluish gray 1x4 plate vertically on top of the 2 ppps. Then, place 1 light bluish gray 1x2 rounded plate with open studs vertically on top of the ppp, so that it is centered vertically.

Step 23

Place 1 bright green 4x4 rounded tile with studs on perimeter on top of the build.

Step 24

Place 1 dark green 1x1 round plate with petals on the 2nd column from the left on the back row of the ppp. Then, place 1 yellow 1x1 round plate with petals on top of the ppp.

Group 12 – Terrain trap door and bridge

Step 25

We need to assemble a sub-build for a trap door. Place 1 light bluish gray 2x6 plate horizontally in front of you. Then, place 1 yellow 1x2 plate with handle on long edge vertically on top of the leftmost column, so that its handle faces to the left.

Step 26

Rotate 1 light bluish gray 2x2 curved slope tile so that it slopes to the right. Place its leftmost column on top of the ppp. Then, place 1 dark bluish gray 2x4 double jumper plate horizontally to the right of the ppp.

Step 27

Flip the sub-build upside down, so that it is horizontal and its handle faces to the left. Attach 1 light bluish gray 1x2 rounded plate with open studs vertically to the leftmost column.

Step 28

Attach 1 light bluish gray 2x2 plate to the right of the ppp. Then, attach 1 dark bluish gray 2x2 plate to the ppp. Lastly, attach 1 light bluish gray 2x2 inverted slope brick to the ppp, so that it slopes to the left.

Step 29

Flip the build right side up, so that it is horizontal and its handle faces to the left. Insert 1 transparent clear jewel into the rightmost hollow stud.

Step 30

Bring back the left, tall side of the terrain build, so that its red slope brick slopes and overhangs to the right. Rotate the sub-build so that it is vertical and its handle faces to the back. Attach the sub-build's back-facing handle to the tall terrain's front-facing clips.

Step 31

Close the front hole of the tall terrain by angling the sub-build upwards as much as possible.

Bring back the main terrain build, so that it is horizontal and its protruding axle with axle connector with locking finger faces to the left. Attach the overhanging right column of the tall terrain to the 3rd column from the left of the main terrain build.

Step 32

Place 3 medium nougat link treads with pin holes vertically in front of you, one to the right of the other, so that their handles face to the right. Then, attach them by connecting the left-facing clips to the right-facing handles. Lastly, attach the right-facing handle of the assembly to the left-facing clips located on the top of the lowest column of the terrain build, so that the link treads rest on top of the protruding axle. When you pull the axle from left to right, the bridge created by the link treads will collapse.

Group 13 – Goomba

Step 1

Lastly, let's build a Goomba minifigure. Place 1 reddish brown 2x2 round plate with 2 feet in front of you, so that its feet face to the front.

Step 2

Find 2 light bluish gray 1x2x1 2/3 brick with side studs on 3 sides. Place the first one vertically on the left column of the ppp, so that its side studs face to the back, left, and front. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically on the right.

Step 3

Attach 1 dark orange 2x2 tile with printed Goomba face to the front-facing side studs. Then, attach 1 dark orange 2x2 tile with the code for "Goomba" to the top. Ask a sighted friend to make sure that the 2 ppps are placed and oriented correctly. Lastly, attach 1 dark orange 2x2 tile to the back-facing side studs.

Step 4

Grab 2 dark orange 1x2 plates. Attach the first one horizontally upright to the bottom row of left-facing side studs. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically on the right. Locate 2 dark orange 2x2 curved slope tiles. Rotate the first one so that its antistuds face to the left and it slopes to the top. Attach its bottom row to the ppp. Take the second one and repeat symmetrically on the left.

The build is complete! You can arrange the terrain and Captain Toad's tent as you wish. You can also pose Captain Toad, the Turnip, and the Goomba wherever you wish. You can play by dropping the bridge as well as discovering the jewel inside the terrain. As advertised at the end of the instructions, if you have any of the interactive figures (Mario, from set 71439; Luigi, from set 71440; or Peach, from set 71441), you can place them on top of any of the tiles with code so that they can produce matching sounds.
